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Altering the Boundaries of the Otago Electric-power District.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and of every other power in anywise enabling me in that behalf, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter, so as to include the area described in the Schedule hereto, the boundaries of the Otago Electric-power District, being an electric-power district duly constituted under the said Act.

SCHEDULE.

FIRSTLY, all that area comprised within the boundaries of the Borough of Naseby as at present constituted; and, secondly, all that area within the Otago Land District, being portions of Taieri, Maniototo, and Waihemo Counties, bounded by a line commencing at a point being the south-west corner of Block 13, Sutton District; thence north along block-line to the south-west corner of Section 1, aforesaid Block 13, then west along road-line to the south-west corner of Section 14, Block 5, Sutton District; then north to the northern corner of the aforesaid Section 14; then north-west along the south-west boundaries of Sections 10 and 9, Block 5, Sutton District, to the western corner of the aforesaid Section 9; then north-east along block-line to the boundary of Block 8, Strath Taieri District; then north-west along block-line to the western corner of Section 45s, Block 8, Strath Taieri District; then in a north-easterly direction along block-line to the northern corner of Section 43s, Block 8, Strath Taieri District; then south-east along block-line to the western corner of Section 4, Block 8, Strath Taieri District; then north-east and east along block-line to boundary of Block 9, Strath Taieri District; then north-east and east along such block-line to the south-west corner of Block 5, Strath Taieri District; then north-east along road-line forming the western boundaries of

Sections 50, 49, 48, 46, 45, 44, and 43, Block 5, Strath Taieri District, to the northern corner of the aforesaid Section 43; then in a north-easterly direction along block-line forming the western boundaries of Blocks 5 and 2, Strath Taieri District, to the northern corner of the aforesaid Block 2; then north-west along boundary of Run 205E to the southern boundary of Block 9, Rock and Pillar District; then east along block-line to the south-east corner of the aforesaid Block 9; then north along block-lines being the boundaries of Blocks 10, 6, and 2, Rock and Pillar District, to the north-west corner of the aforesaid Block 2, then west along block-line to the north-east corner of Block 4, Upper Taieri District; then south and then east along block-line to the south-east corner of Block 1, Upper Taieri District; then south along block-lines being the eastern boundaries of Blocks 7, 10, and 15, Upper Taieri District, to the south-east corner of the aforesaid Block 15; then west along block-line to the south-west corner of the aforesaid Block 15; then north and east along block-line to the south-west corner of Block 10, Upper Taieri District; then north along block-line to the north-west corner of Block 10, Upper Taieri District; then in a westerly direction along block-line to the north-east corner of Section 20, Block 11, Upper Taieri District; then south along the eastern boundaries of Sections 20, 1, and 24, aforesaid Block 11, to the Taieri River; then north-west along such river to road-line; then across river and south along road-line, being the eastern boundary of Run 308E, to block-line, being the southern boundary of Block 12, Upper Taieri District; then west along block-line to Trig. E; then south-west to Trig. F, Upper Taieri Side District; then north-west to Trig. A, Upper Taieri Side District; then north-east to Trig. I on block-line, being the western boundary of Block 5, Gimmerburn District; then north-west along block-line to the north-west corner of the aforesaid Block 5; then east along block-line to the south-west corner of Block 3, Gimmerburn District; then north along block-line to the north-west corner of the aforesaid Block 3; then east along block-line to the south-west corner of Block 1, Gimmerburn District; then in a northerly direction along block-line to the north-west corner of the aforesaid Block 1; then north-west along block-line to the

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western corner of Block 8, Gimmerburn District; then south-west along block-line to the south-east corner of Block 17, Blackstone District; then west along block-line to its intersection with the south-west boundary of Run 225ii; then north-west along run boundary to the western corner of the aforesaid Run 225ii; then south-west along road-line to block-line, being the western boundary of Block 16, Blackstone District; then north along block-line to the north-west corner of the aforesaid Block 16; then south-west along block-line to the southern corner of Block 20, Blackstone District; then north-west along block-line to the western corner of Run 224x; then north-east along the boundaries of Runs 224x, 224y, 224c, 224r, 224s, 224r, 224q, 224p, 224o, 224n, and 224m to the northern corner of the aforesaid Run 224m; then south-east along the boundary of such run to the boundary of Block 6, Blackstone District; then north-east and north-west along block-line to the western corner of Section 11, Block 9, Blackstone District; then north-east along the north-west boundaries of Sections 11 and 10, aforesaid Block 9, to the block-line; then south-east along block-line to the southern corner of Block 22, Blackstone District; then north-east along block-line to the northern corner of Block 6, Blackstone District; then south-east to Trig. E, Idaburn District; then south-east to the north-west corner of Block 6, Naseby District; then east along block-line to the north-east corner of Block 1, Naseby District; then in a southern direction generally along the eastern boundary of the aforesaid Block 1, to its south-west corner; then east along block-line to the Kyeburn River, being the north-east corner of Block 4, Maniototo District; then south along Kyeburn River to a point due west of the north-west corner of Section 15, Block 1, Swinburn District; then east across river, and along the northern boundary of the aforesaid Section 15, to road-line; then south-east along road-line, being the north-east boundaries of Sections 15, 13, and 12, Block 1, Swinburn District, to the eastern corner of the aforesaid Section 12; then south-west along road-line, being the southern boundaries of Sections 12, 14, and 17, Block 1, Swinburn District, to the Kyeburn River; then south along such river to block-line, being the northern boundary of Block 4, Swinburn District; then east along block-line to its north-east corner; then south along block-line to the south-east corner of the aforesaid Block 4; then east along block-line to the north-east corner of Block 8, Swinburn District; then south along block-line to the southern boundary of Run 203b; then in a westerly direction along run boundary to the north-east corner of Section 3, Block 8, Swinburn District; then south along the eastern boundaries of Sections 3 and 4, Block 8, Swinburn District, to block-line; then in a westerly direction along block-line to the north-east corner of Block 11, Swinburn District; then south along block-line to the south-east corner of the aforesaid Block 11; then east along block-line to the north-east corner of Block 3, Rock and Pillar District; then south along block-line to the south-east corner of the aforesaid Block 3; then east along block-line to the north-east corner of Block 8, Rock and Pillar District; then south along block-line to the south-east corner of the aforesaid Block 8; then west along block-line to the north-west corner of Section 11, Block 12, Rock and Pillar District; then south along block-line to the south-east corner of Section 4, Block 11, Rock and Pillar District; then west along block-line to Trig. W, Rock and Pillar District; then south-west to Trig. O, Strath Taieri District; then south-west to Trig. WHEREAS by section three of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is provided that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Act, it shall not be lawful or competent for any local authority to borrow or contract to borrow any money (otherwise than in anticipation of its revenue within the limits of its powers, if any, in that behalf), whether from the State Advances Office or from any other source whatever, and whether in pursuance of a special Act or under any authority whatever, without the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council given after compliance with the provisions of the said Act :

And whereas section eleven of the said Act provides that the Governor-General in Council, in giving his consent to the borrowing of moneys by the local authority, may impose such conditions with respect to the time at which such moneys may be borrowed, the rate of interest that may be paid in respect thereto, the term for which they may be borrowed, and provisions for repayment thereof as he thinks fit, and that it shall not be lawful for the local authority to borrow such moneys save in accordance with the conditions so imposed :

And whereas the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto are desirous of raising the respective amounts set out opposite their names therein :

And whereas the said local authorities have complied with the provisions of the said Act, and it is expedient that the aforesaid precedent consent should be given to the raising of the loans on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth :

WHEREAS it is enacted by section one hundred and fifty-eight of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that where the foreshore outside the limits of a harbour is not vested in any Harbour Board or other local authority the Governor-General may by Order in Council grant, for a period not exceeding twenty-one years,

the control of such part or parts thereof as he thinks fit in any local authority, Domain Board, or persons acting as trustees for the inhabitants of the locality, upon such conditions as may be prescribed in the Order:

And whereas the foreshore hereinafter described is not vested in any Harbour Board or other local authority, and the Mount Maunganui Domain Board (hereinafter called "the Board") has applied to the Governor-General in Council for the control thereof:

And whereas it is desirable that the control should be granted to the Board:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant to the Board the control of the foreshore as described in the First Schedule hereto, and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

THAT portion of the foreshore at Mount Maunganui, Tauranga, commencing at the north-western side of Beach Road, and extending generally south-eastwards to the eastern boundary of the Signal Station Reserve: As the same is shown between points marked "A" and "B," and edged red on plan marked M.D. 6639, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seaman Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. In these conditions the term "foreshore" means all land between high-water mark at ordinary spring tides and low-water mark of ordinary spring tides.

3. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to those parts of the foreshore as shown edged red on plan marked M.D. 6639, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress out and over the said foreshore without payment.

5. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provision of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are or may hereafter be in force.

6. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph-cables that are at present or may be at any time laid down within the said area of foreshore.

7. The Board may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games, and may by by-law fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts, provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed six in any one year.

8. The Board may, subject to the provisions of section 171 of the Harbours Act, 1923, erect or license or permit the erection of bathing-sheds or boat-sheds on the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto, and may make by-laws regulating the use thereof, and may fix charges for such use, provided that the funds so received shall be expended in improving the foreshore for the benefit of the public.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to remove or cause to be removed any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

10. By-laws made by the Board under the said Act in respect of the foreshore shall not have effect unless and until approved in writing by the Minister.

11. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for twenty-one years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

12. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Board six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the Board in New Zealand.

Regulations providing for Appeals under Sections 308 and 312, Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, as amended, in respect of Buildings for Public Meetings, &c.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made under the said Act on the twenty-fifth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and published in the *Gazette* on the twenty-seventh day of the same month, at page 3345, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations prescribing, pursuant to subparagraph two of paragraph four of the Eleventh Schedule to the said Act, as amended by section thirty-seven of the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1928, the manner in which an appeal under the said paragraph four shall be made to a Magistrate's Court, and doth hereby declare that such revocation shall take effect and the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. IN these regulations, if not inconsistent with the context,—
"The said Act" means the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920;

"Appellant" means the applicant for a license referred to in the said Eleventh Schedule, and includes any person having under section 312 of the said Act or section 38 of the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1928, the same right of appeal as is given by the said Eleventh Schedule;

"Council" means the Council of the borough within which the building is situated;

"Court" means the Magistrate's Court, sittings of which are held in or nearest to the borough;

"License" means a license to use any building within a borough for any one or more of the purposes set out in section 308 of the said Act.

2. Within fourteen days after receipt of notice of any decision of the Council which may be the subject of an appeal the appellant shall state and sign a case setting forth the facts and the grounds of objection to the decision of the Council, and the redress to which the appellant considers himself to be entitled, and shall, within the period aforesaid, file the same in the Court and serve a copy thereof on the Council.

3. Such case shall state an address for service within the borough at which address the appellant may be served with any document or written communication in connection with the appeal.

4. Within seven days after service on it of the case stated, the Council shall file in the Court an answer to the case, and serve a copy thereof on the appellant. Such answer shall set forth the facts as alleged by the Council and the grounds of its decision.

5. After the filing of the case by the appellant the Magistrate or the Clerk of the Court shall, on the application of either party, appoint a place and time for the hearing of the appeal, such time not being earlier than twenty-one days after the date of the filing of the case.

6. The party at whose instance a place and time for hearing have been appointed shall, within four days after the making of such appointment, serve upon the other party a notice stating the place and time so appointed.

7. Subject to the provisions of these regulations the appeal shall be heard and determined in accordance with the ordinary practice of the Court as on the trial under the Magistrates' Courts Act, 1928, of an action instituted between the appellant as plaintiff and the Corporation of the borough as defendant, and the rules of the Court shall apply thereto accordingly.

8. Any time fixed by these regulations may be shortened or extended by the written consent of the parties filed in the Court, or may be extended by a Magistrate on the application of either party, on such terms as the Magistrate may think fit, and whether such application or extension be made before or after the expiry of the time so fixed by these regulations.

9. The like fees shall be taken by the Clerk of Court in respect of any proceedings under these regulations as are for the time being directed to be taken in actions under the Magistrates' Courts Act, 1928, and the Court shall have the same power as it enjoys under the last-mentioned Act of ordering that the costs of any such proceedings, including fees of Court and witnesses expenses and other necessary payments or disbursements and solicitors' fees, be paid by the appellant or by the Corporation of the borough to the other of them, and the Court may for the purpose of assessing any such fees make an estimate of the value of the rights which are the subject of the appeal, but so that such estimate shall not in any case exceed the sum of £300, and any sums ordered to be paid under this regulation shall be recoverable in like manner as upon a judgment under the last-mentioned Act.

10. Any matter or proceeding commenced under the regulations hereby revoked and pending or in progress on the coming into force of these regulations may be continued and completed and enforced under these regulations.

Warrant vesting the Control of Portion of Portage Road, in the Otahuhu Borough Council, and apportioning the Cost of Maintenance.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby direct that the portion of Portage Road described in the Schedule hereto shall, on and after the date of the gazetting hereof, be under the control of the Otahuhu Borough Council; and I do hereby further direct that the cost of maintaining the said portion of road shall be borne by the Otahuhu Borough Council and the Mount Wellington Road Board in the following proportions—viz.: the Otahuhu Borough Council shall bear sixty-six and two-thirds (66 $\frac{2}{3}$) per centum of such cost and the Mount Wellington Road Board shall bear thirty-three and one-third (33 $\frac{1}{3}$) per centum of such cost, respectively; and I do also further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Mount Wellington Road Board shall be paid from time to time in the proportion hereinbefore prescribed, out of the funds of the said Board, within a period of one month after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Otahuhu Borough Council, and that such payment

shall be made from time to time to the Town Clerk, Otahuhu, for and on behalf of the Mount Wellington Road Board.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that portion of street situated in the North Auckland Land District, known as Portage Road, and situated on portion of the boundary between the Borough of Otahuhu and the Mount Wellington Road District. SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1929.

February was a very dry month, the far southern portions of Otago and Southland being the only part of the Dominion to receive more than the average rainfall. Numbers of places in Canterbury recorded no rain at all. South of Dunedin rain fell on a fair number of days, but elsewhere almost the whole of the month's precipitation occurred during the first five days and most of it on the 1st and 2nd.

Meteorologically, the month was a quiet one. There was a comparative absence of wind, the prevailing direction being south-westerly. The thundery conditions of the previous months were not maintained. Thunderstorms were, however, reported from a number of stations on the 3rd, and a hailstorm in the Oamaru district did much damage to the vineries at Kakanui. Temperatures and sunshine were above normal.

The continued dry weather caused pastures to become very parched during the latter half of the month, and milk yields have declined. Otherwise stock are in good condition, and the dry spell was advantageous to the extent that it checked the rank growth of feed produced by the heavy rains of the earlier months. Reports indicate fair or good yields from crops of all sorts, and harvesting and haymaking have been carried out under favourable conditions.

The strongly developed monsoonal conditions over Australia which characterized January were again in evidence in February. Pressures were low for most of the time in Northern Australia. These low pressures were counterbalanced by a stationary high-pressure system over the Tasman Sea, which was responsible for the prevalence of south-westerly winds over New Zealand and the dry weather which prevailed between the 6th and the 23rd. The area of low pressure extended eastward from tropical Australia during the third week of February, and a cyclone developed between Fiji and the New Hebrides. The centre passed close to the Kermadec Islands on the 21st, but the effect on New Zealand weather was slight.

The rain during the first days of the month was due to a deep depression of the southern or westerly type which was centred in the South Tasman Sea on the 1st. This was followed by a series of secondaries, of which the last crossed the Dominion on the 5th. There were northerly gales in Cook Strait on the 2nd, and southerly gales round the southern extremity of the South Island between the 5th and the 7th.

From the 23rd to the end of the month another series of depressions of the westerly type affected the South Island, but the rain was confined practically to the West Coast and far southern districts.
