## A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the district described in the First Schedule hereto to be an electric-power district, and I hereby assign to such district the name of the "Waimea Electric-power District"; and I do further proclaim that the areas described in the Second Schedule hereto and therein respectively distinguished by the letters "a" and "b" shall be the outer areas of such electric-power district.

## WAIMEA ELECTRIC-POWER DISTRICT.

(a) ALL that area of land situate in the Land District of Nelson and bounded as follows: Commencing at the point of intersection of high-water mark of Tasman Bay with a public road forming the south boundary of Section 67 and Section E, Block X, Kaiteriteri Survey District; thence in a westerly direction along the northern side of the said road; thence in a northerly direction along the eastern side of the public road forming the western boundary of the said Section 67; thence in a westerly direction along the south boundary of Section 94 to a public road; thence in a northerly direction along the said road and along the western boundary of the said Section 94 and Section 2, Block X, Kaiteriteri Survey District; thence in a westerly direction along the south boundaries of Sections 95 and 82 to a public road; thence across the said road and along the south boundary of Section

35; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of the said Section 35; thence in a westerly direction along the south boundary of the said Section 35; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundary of the said Section 35; thence in a westerly direction along the south boundaries of the said Section 35 and Section 37, all in Block VIII, Kaiteriteri Survey District, to the north-western corner of Section 77, Block X, Kaiteriteri Survey District; thence in a southerly direction along the western boundary of the aforesaid Section 77 to a public road; thence across the said road, again along the western boundary of the aforesaid Section 77 to a public road; thence across the said road and again along the western boundary of the aforesaid Section 77 to the northern bank of the Riwaka River; thence in an easterly direction along the northern bank of the said river to the south-eastern corner of Section 76; thence in a southerly direction across the Riwaka River to the north-eastern corner of Section 81; thence along the eastern boundaries of Sections 81, 59A, and 87 to a public road; thence in a southerly direction across the said road and along the eastern boundaries of Sections 91 and 11 of 61 to a public road; thence in a southerly direction across the said road and along the western boundary of a closed road intersecting Sections 45 and 14 to the southern boundary of the latter section, all the aforesaid sections being in Block X, Kaiteriteri Survey District; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of Section 5 of 61 to a public road; thence in a southerly direction across the said road and along the eastern boundary of Sections 1, 2 of 61, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned Section 2 of 61; thence in a westerly direction along the southern boundary of the said Section 2 of 61 to the north-eastern corner of Section 60; thence generally in a south-westerly direction along the south-eastern boundaries of Section 60 aforesaid, Section 59, parts of Section 58, and Section 22, all the aforesaid sections being in Block III, Motueka Survey District; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundaries of Sections 25, 26, and 15, in Block II, Motueka Survey District; thence in a southerly and westerly direction along the eastern and southern boundaries of Sections 9, 2, 3, 90, 89, 2 of 109, and part of 110, to the south-western corner thereof; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundaries of Sections 14 and 28 to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned sections, all the aforesaid sections being in Block VI, Motueka Survey District; thence in a southerly and westerly direction along the eastern and southern boundaries of Sections 54, 55, 56, 57, and 107 to the southern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence in a northerly

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direction along the western boundaries of the said Section 107 and Sections 9 and 11 to the eastern corner of Section 79; thence in a south-westerly direction along the southern boundary of the said Section 79 to the Graham River; thence in an easterly direction along the north bank of the Graham River to a point in prolongation of the eastern boundary of Section 80; thence in a south-westerly direction across the Graham River and along the eastern boundary of the said Section 80 to the south-eastern corner thereof, all the aforesaid sections being in Block IX, Motueka Survey District; thence in a south-westerly direction along the eastern boundaries of Sections 3, 4, and 1, in Block XII, Mount Arthur Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence in an easterly and southerly direction along the eastern and southern boundaries of Sections 82, 81, 3, 1, 2, 11, 10, 13, 21, and 23, all in Block XVI, Mount Arthur Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence generally in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of Section 1, Block IV, Wangapeka Survey District, to the Baton River; thence along the northern bank of the Baton River to a point in prolongation of the eastern boundary of Section 6 in the aforesaid block and survey district; thence generally in a southerly direction across the Baton River and along the eastern boundaries of Sections 6 and 4 in the aforesaid block and survey district, to the Motueka River; thence due south across the said river to the eastern bank thereof, and by the eastern bank of the said river to the south-western corner of Section 47, Block VIII, Wangapeka Survey District; thence in a south-westerly direction to a public road forming the northern and eastern boundaries of Section 129, at the north-eastern corner of the said section, in Block VIII of the aforesaid survey district; thence generally westerly and south-westerly along the eastern side of a public road on the east bank of the Wangapeka River to the western corner of Section 19, Block XI, Wangapeka Survey District; thence in an easterly direction along a public road forming the southern boundaries of Section 19 aforesaid, Sections 22 and 34, Block XI, Wangapeka Survey District; thence in a south-easterly direction along a public road forming the western and southern boundaries of Sections 33, 32, 31, 63, 149, and 11, Block XV, Wangapeka Survey District, to the Tadmor River; thence due south across the Tadmor River to the south-eastern bank thereof; thence generally in a south-westerly direction along the south-eastern bank of the Tadmor River to the western corner of Section 21, Block XV, Wangapeka Survey District; thence in an easterly direction along the southern boundary of Section 21 aforesaid and the south-western and south-eastern boundary of Section 20, Block III, Tadmor Survey District, to the northern corner of Section 2 of the last-mentioned block and district; thence generally in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of Section 2 aforesaid, the western boundary of Section 43 of the aforesaid block and district, and along the western boundaries of Sections 6, 4, 7, and 8, Block XVI, Wangapeka Survey District; thence generally in a southerly direction along the eastern boundaries of Sections 8, 33, and 36, Block XVI, Wangapeka Survey District, Sections 15, 8, 6, 7, 12, and 13, Block IV, Tadmor Survey District, Sections 10, 7, 8, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 18, Block VIII, Tadmor Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of Section 18 last mentioned; thence in an easterly direction along the southern boundary of Section 70, Block VIII, Tadmor Survey District, to the Motupiko River, and across same to the eastern bank thereof; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern bank of the Motupiko River to the north-western corner of Section 48; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of Section 48 to the south-western corner of Section 20; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of Sections 20, 19, 18, and 17, Block XII, and 20, Block VIII, all the aforesaid sections being in Tadmor Survey District, to a public road on the east bank of the Motupiko River; thence in a northerly direction along the eastern side of the said road, being the western boundary of Section 1, Block VIII, Tadmor Survey District, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundaries of Sections 1 aforesaid, 2 and 25, Block VIII, Tadmor Survey District; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of Sections 3 and 2, Block V, Gordon Survey District, to the southern boundary of Section 16, Block IV, Tadmor Survey District; thence westerly then northerly along the southern and western boundaries of the latter section to the north-west corner of Section 151, Block V, Gordon Survey District; thence easterly and then southerly along the northern and eastern boundaries of the latter section to the intersection of the latter boundary with the western boundary of Section 4, Block V, Gordon Survey District; thence in a north-easterly direction along the northern boundaries of Sections 4 and 3, Block I, Gordon Survey District; thence in a southerly

direction along the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned Section 3 to the north-western corner of part Section 15, Block I, Gordon Survey District; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of part Section 15 aforesaid to the Motueka River, across the said river, and again along the northern boundary of part Section 15 aforesaid to a public road known as the Upper Motueka Valley Road, across the said road, and in a northerly direction along the eastern side thereof to the Nelson-Glenhope Railway Reserve; thence generally in an easterly direction along the south side of the said reserve to the north corner of Section 7, Block II, Gordon Survey District; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of the last-mentioned Section 7 and the northern boundary of Section 15, Block III, Gordon Survey District, to the Wai-iti River, and across same to the eastern bank thereof; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern bank of the Wai-iti River to the south side of a public road intersecting Section 1 of 57, Block VII, Gordon Survey District; thence in a north-easterly direction along the south side of the last-mentioned road to the north-western corner of Section 17 of 45, Block VII, Gordon Survey District; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundaries of Section 17 of 45 aforesaid, Section 63, and Section 63A, Block VII, Gordon Survey District, to the western corner of Section 6 in the last-mentioned block and district; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of Section 6 aforesaid and Sections 4 and 3, Blocks VII and VIII, and Sections 18, 6, 1, and 3, Block IV, Gordon Survey District; along the western boundaries of Section 9, Block I, Rintoul Survey District; and along the western boundary of Section 64, Block XIII, Waimea Survey District, to a public road on the northern boundary thereof; thence generally in an easterly direction along the south side of the road last mentioned to a point thereon in prolongation of the south-east boundary of Section 8, Block XIII, Waimea Survey District; thence in a northerly direction along the south boundary of Section 8 last mentioned to the Wairoa River, and across same to the eastern bank thereof; thence in a northerly direction along the eastern bank of the Wairoa River to its confluence with the Roding River; thence in an easterly direction along the south bank of the Roding River to a point thereon in prolongation of the western boundary of Section 4, Block X, Waimea Survey District; thence in a northerly direction across the Roding River and along the western boundaries of Sections 4, 74, 72, 3 of 1, 2 of 1, 1 of 1, 37, 36, 4 of 1, 33, and 11 of 1, Block X, 32, 3, 85, and XIX, Block VII, the western boundaries of Sections VIII and XVII, Block VIII, all in Waimea Survey District, to the north corner of the last-mentioned section; thence in a south-easterly direction along the north-eastern boundaries of the last-mentioned Section XVII and Section XVIII; thence in a northerly direction along the north-western boundary of Section 30 to the south boundary of the City of Nelson, the last-mentioned sections being in Block VIII, Waimea Survey District; thence generally in an easterly, northerly, and westerly direction along the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of the City of Nelson, to the south-western corner of Section 59, Block IX, Wakapuaka Survey District; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the said Section 59 and Sections 60 and 61, Block IX, Wakapuaka Survey District; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of the said Section 61 to the south-western corner of Section 62; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of Sections 62, 63, and 64, Block IX, Wakapuaka Survey District, to the north-western corner of the said Section 64; thence in a south-easterly direction along the north-eastern boundary of the said Section 64 to the south-western corner of Section 13; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of Sections 13, 66, 14, 16, and 76, Block IX, Wakapuaka Survey District, along the western and northern boundaries of Section 18 and the western boundary of Section 5, Block V, Wakapuaka Survey District, to the north-western corner of the said Section 5; thence in a south-easterly direction along the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 5 and 78, Block V, Wakapuaka Survey District; thence in an easterly and northerly direction along the northern and western boundaries of Section 4, Block VI, Wakapuaka Survey District, to a public road; thence in an easterly direction along the said road and in an easterly direction along a closed road to a point in prolongation of the eastern boundary of Section 25, Block VI, Wakapuaka Survey District; thence in a northerly direction across the said closed road and along the eastern boundary of Section 25 aforesaid to the north-eastern corner thereof; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of Section 24 aforesaid to the southern corner of Section 70; thence generally in a westerly direction along the western boundaries of Sections 70, 11, and 73, Block VI, Wakapuaka Survey District, to the north-western corner of Section 73; thence in a westerly direction along the southern

boundary of the Section 3, Native Reserve, Block VI, Waka-puka Survey District, to high-water mark of Tasman Bay; thence in a southerly, westerly, and northerly direction along high-water mark of Tasman Bay to the point of commencement excepting thereout—(1) All that area of land being the City of Nelson; (2) all that area of land being the Borough of Motueka; (3) all that area of land being the Borough of Richmond; (4) all that area of land being the Town District of Tahunanui.

(b) All that area of land in the Nelson Land District being the whole of the Borough of Motueka, as at present constituted.

(c) All that area of land in the Nelson Land District being the whole of the Borough of Richmond, as at present constituted.

(d) All that area of land in the Nelson Land District being the whole of the Town District of Tahunanui, as at present constituted.

As the said areas are more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 75221, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, and thereon edged red.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

IN pursuance of the power and authority conferred upon me by section four of the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area of Crown land described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby set apart and declared open for disposal by way of sale or lease to discharged soldiers, under special tenures, in the manner provided in the said Act: and I do further declare that for the purposes of section one hundred and thirty-three of the Land Act, 1924, the said lands shall be deemed to be "heavy bush" lands, and that after the first half-year's rent has been paid by the selector the further instalments of rent payable by him for a period of two years and a half shall not be demanded: Provided that if at any time during the first five years of his occupancy the selector disposes of his interest in the land the rent so conceded shall be paid by him in full,

and thereupon the Land Board may remit such instalments of rent payable by the incoming tenant, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of rent previously conceded to the selector, as the Board thinks fit.

REGULATIONS.

1. (a) THESE regulations may be cited as the Samoa Health Amendment Order, 1929.

(b) These regulations shall come into force on the 13th day of May, 1929.

(c) These regulations shall be read together with and deemed to form part of the Samoan Health Order made on the 7th day of February, 1921 (hereinafter called "the principal regulations").

2. Any regulations made by the Administrator on the advice of the Board of Health pursuant to clause numbered 19 of the principal regulations may provide for the payment of fees and charges for all or any of the following matters :—

(a) The inspection of any building, place, work, or article, inspection of which is authorized or required by such regulations.

(b) The examination of any plan or other document relating to any building, place, work, or article, plans or other documents relating to which are authorized or required to be examined by such regulations.

(c) The taking of any step or the doing of any matter authorized or required to be taken or done by such regulations.

3. Any such regulations may provide for the manner in which and the persons by whom such fees and charges shall be payable, and any such fees and charges shall be recoverable as debts due to the Crown by the persons by whom the same are payable.

4. Any such fees or charges may be so fixed as to vary according to the value of the work or matter affected, and for the purposes of assessing any such fees or charges such value may be estimated in the manner provided by any such regulations.

*Regulations under the War Regulations Continuance Act, 1920, respecting Passports.*

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the War Regulations Continuance Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, for the purpose of giving full effect to the intent and purport of the regulations relating to permits and passports as set out in the Part numbered ten and clause two in the Part numbered sixteen of the Second Schedule to the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the previous regulations"), hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act, and doth, for the purpose aforesaid and so far as the previous regulations are replaced by the regulations hereby enacted, hereby revoke the previous regulations.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATION 1.—PRELIMINARY.

- (1) THESE regulations may be cited as the Passport Regulations, 1929.
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on publication hereof in the *Gazette*.
- (3) In these regulations, where not inconsistent with the context, passport means a passport or other like document—
  - (a) Which establishes to the satisfaction of the Collector of Customs the nationality of the person to whom it relates; and



- (b) Which has been issued by the Government of the country of which the person to whom it relates is a subject or citizen, and which is still in force, and to which there is attached a photograph of the person to whom it relates; and
- (c) Which relates to the person in whose possession it is; and
- (d) Which, in the case of a person landing in New Zealand from any place beyond the seas which is a foreign country (except as provided by paragraph (e) of this definition), has been issued by a British Diplomatic or Consular Officer or some British public official duly authorized in that behalf, or vised by some such officer or official with a visa which is still in force;
- (e) Provided that the requirements of the last preceding paragraph of this definition regarding British visas shall not apply in respect of the subjects of any country between which and His Majesty's Government in New Zealand there is for the time being in force an agreement to dispense with the requirement of passport visas, the existence of which agreement is notified by the Minister from time to time in the *Gazette*.

#### REGULATION 2.—REQUIREMENT OF PASSPORT.

Except as provided by Regulation 3 hereof, no person shall land at any place in New Zealand from any place beyond the seas unless he has in his possession a passport which complies with the requirements of these regulations.

#### REGULATION 3.—EXEMPTIONS.

- (1) No passport will be required in the case of—
- (a) Any person under the age of sixteen years accompanied by a parent—
- (i) If the name of such person is included in a family passport; or
  - (ii) If such parent is exempted from the requirement of a passport under any of the following paragraphs of this clause.
- (b) Any person visiting New Zealand from the Commonwealth of Australia if such person is—
- (i) A natural born British subject; or
  - (ii) A British subject naturalized in New Zealand if in possession of naturalization papers; sufficient in the opinion of the Collector of Customs to establish the fact of his naturalization; or
  - (iii) A British subject naturalized elsewhere than in New Zealand who, according to the laws for the time being in force in the Commonwealth of Australia, is entitled to land in Australia from New Zealand without being in possession of a passport, if such person is in possession of naturalization papers, sufficient in the opinion of the Collector of Customs to establish the fact of his naturalization; or
  - (iv) The wife of any such person as is referred to in paragraphs (i), (ii), and (iii) of this subclause.
- (c) Any person visiting New Zealand from the Cook Islands or Western Samoa if in possession of a permit issued by a Resident Commissioner of the Cook Islands or by the Administrator of Samoa as the case may be;
- (d) Any person resident in New Zealand returning to New Zealand on a return ticket issued to him in New Zealand;
- (e) Any member of the naval or military forces of any part of the British dominions entering New Zealand on duty;
- (f) Any person whose home is in New Zealand being the master or a member of the crew of any vessel arriving in New Zealand.
- (2) The Minister of Internal Affairs, or any person authorized by him in that behalf, may by writing under his hand grant to any person or class of persons permission to land in New Zealand without being in possession of a passport, or without being in possession of a passport which complies with all the requirements of these regulations, either at any place or at some defined place, and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit to impose.
- (3) Where any person being the master or a member of the crew of a vessel arriving in New Zealand is under the provisions of these regulations prohibited from landing in New Zealand the Collector of Customs may nevertheless, by writing under his hand, grant him temporary permission to land at any port for such purposes and subject to such conditions as the Collector thinks fit to impose.

#### REGULATION 4.—SEAMEN WITHOUT PASSPORTS.

Where any person, being the master or a member of the crew of a vessel arriving in New Zealand, is under the

provisions of these regulations prohibited from landing in New Zealand, the master of such vessel shall, as soon as may be after the arrival of the vessel at any port, give written notice of the presence of that person on board the vessel to the Collector of Customs, and that person shall leave New Zealand with that vessel.

#### REGULATION 5.—POWER TO SEIZE PASSPORTS.

Any Officer of Customs, Police Officer, or other person authorized by the Minister of Internal Affairs in that behalf, may take possession of any passport in the possession of any person entering New Zealand, and may, if considered necessary, retain the same until the said Minister authorizes its return.

#### REGULATION 6.—OFFENCES AND PENALTIES.

If any person, having landed in New Zealand pursuant to any permission granted under these regulations, fails to comply with any condition imposed in the granting of such permission, such person shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and liable accordingly to the penalties imposed by the War Regulations Act, 1914.

*Amending By-law under the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922.*

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922, the control and ownership of electric light and power for supply of electric energy to the Borough of Rotorua is vested in the Department of Tourists and Health Resorts, as incorporated by the Rotorua Town Act, 1907, and the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922: And whereas in respect of these works the said Department has all the power for the time being conferred by law on Borough Councils, except the power to borrow money or make and levy any special rate:

Now, therefore, the said Department, in pursuance of such power, hereby makes the following amendment of the by-laws made under Part XIII of the Rotorua Borough By-laws made under the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 12th October, 1922, and revokes By-law 37 as published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 1st July, 1926, and amended as published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 14th July, 1927, and substitutes therefor the following new by-law, and doth hereby declare that the said new by-law and such revocation shall take effect and shall come into force on the 1st day of May, 1929.

## BY-LAW.

37. The price for electrical energy supplied by the Department will be calculated on the Board of Trade unit consisting of 1,000 watt-hours. All energy will be charged according to meter register, but should a supply be given before a meter is installed the consumer shall pay for current supplied during such period a sum based upon the number and capacity of lamps and other apparatus installed.

In all cases units may, at the option of the Department, be measured as kilovolt-ampere hours instead of kilowatt-hours if the power factor of the consumer's load falls below 90 per cent.

Should the meter prove defective in any way, or be removed for testing or repair, the consumer shall pay per month for energy supplied during such period a sum based on the average former reading of the meter.

The charges for energy supplied shall be as follows, viz. :—

(a) For each unit for lighting, 9d. (subject to a discount of 2d. per unit).

(b) For floodlights, or advertising-lighting, the following alternative to clause (a) is available: The consumer may pay a monthly charge at the rate of 2s. per 100-watt lamp, the energy consumed to be charged for at ordinary heating-rates (clause (c)).

(c) For each unit for ordinary power, heating, and domestic appliances, up to and including 1,000 units, 4d. per unit. For each unit over 1,000 units, 1d. per unit net, subject to the following discounts:—

(1) On the first 20 units 1d. per unit; on all units over 20 and not exceeding 1,000, 2d. per unit; except that when energy for commercial or industrial purposes is used during evening hours, in addition to daylight hours, the total consumption will be charged at 4d. per unit, and the discount shall be (irrespective of units consumed) 1d. per unit.

(2) When an electric cooking-range, or apparatus of a similar nature, is installed the discount will be 2½d. per unit for all units over 50 per month used by such range or apparatus. This rate shall not apply to office radiators or ordinary motor-supply.

(3) When a consumer installs an electric cooking-range a special discount of 3d. per unit will be allowed on all energy consumed by such range during the six months immediately following its installation.

(4) When a consumer installs a synchronous motor, and such motor is operated at not less than unity power-factor, a special and additional discount of 10 per cent. will be allowed.

(d) For each unit for arc generators for picture-theatres, or for similar supply, 6d. (subject to a discount of 2d. per unit).

(e) (1) For commercial or domestic hot-water heating, where the use is limited to "off peak" hours, supply will be given at a special net rate per unit of ¾d., with an additional minimum charge for this service of 2s. 6d. per month.

Such minimum charge shall be additional to the minimum charges provided for in subclause (g) hereof.

(2) If to control this use of energy it is necessary to use a time switch, the consumer shall supply an approved time switch.

(3) If the switch is supplied by the Department the consumer shall pay rent for such at the rate of 12s. per annum.

- (4) Under special conditions this rate will be available for energy consumed for industrial purposes between the hours of 10.30 p.m. and 7 a.m. These conditions will be supplied on request.
- (f) For farms and milking plants the charge shall be as follows, such charges being subject to a special minimum charge based on the distance of the consumer's installation from the point of supply:—
- Lighting: 1s. 6d. per month per 60-watt lamp.  
Heating: 4s. per month per 600-watt for ironing and cooking.  
Water-heating: Energy for water-heating in the milking-shed will be supplied at the rate of £5 per kilowatt per annum, provided that the water-heater is on a change-over switch with the motor, so that the heater and motor cannot be used simultaneously.
- Larger apparatus will be assessed proportionately. Special rates will be quoted for radiators, &c.

For the purpose of computing the foregoing charge, the output of butterfat for one year divided by 180 shall be reckoned as the number of cows milked.

The charges under this clause (f) are net, and if not paid on or before the twenty-fourth day of the month on which the account is issued, a penalty of twenty per cent. shall be added to the charges then unpaid.

- (g) The minimum charge to all consumers shall be 2s. 6d. per month, except that consumers in rural areas shall be charged an additional amount of 1s. 6d. per month on their net total charge for the month, and the minimum charge to such consumers shall be 4s. per month.
- (h) Discount will be allowed on current accounts only, and is subject to the following conditions, namely:—
- (1) On accounts when meters have been read between first and fifth days of the month, if payment is made on or before the fifteenth day of the same month.
- (2) On accounts when meters have been read after the fifth day of the month, if payment is made within ten days after date of reading, except that on all accounts when meters have been read after the twenty-first day of the month, discount will only be allowed if payment is made on or before the last working day of such month. Should the last day of the period allowed for discount be a Saturday, Sunday, or public holiday, discount shall be allowed on the working-day immediately following.
