and may fix charges for such use, provided that the funds so received shall be expended in improving the foreshore for the benefit of the public.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to remove, or cause to be removed, any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

10. By-laws made by the Council under the said Act in respect of the foreshore shall not have effect unless and until approved in writing by the Minister.

11. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for twenty-one years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

12. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the Council in New Zealand.

IN terms of Regulation 2 of the Motor-vehicle (Supplementary) Regulations, 1928, I, William Andrew Verich, for Minister of Public Works, do hereby approve of the device known as the "Erka" Motor Direction Indicator for fitting to and use on a motor-vehicle in terms of paragraph (b), clause (2), Regulation 12, of the Motor-vehicle Regulation 12, 1928; provided that and so long as the said device is fitted to a motor-vehicle so that a right-turn indication and a leftto a motor-vehicle so that a right-turn indication and a lett-turn indication are given from approximately the same place on the off side of the car near the driver's seat; and provided that and so long as the said device is identical in effect, make, construction, and design with the sample thereof deposited in the offices of the Transport Department at Wellington, and marked "Sample Number B."

The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 998 as against 1,002 in March, a decrease of 4. The deaths in April were 479—an increase of 30 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 257, females 222. Fifty-six of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 11.69 per cent. of the whole number. Thirty-eight of these were under one year of age.

Notice to make Returns of Income under the Land and Income Tax Act, 1923.

OTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the above Act and the regulations made thereunder, every person and company, whether a taxpayer or not, having derived income within the meaning of the said Act during the year ending 31st March, 1929, from any source or by any means which is made the subject of taxation under the said Act, is hereby required to make and furnish to me, in the prescribed form, returns of such income on or before the 1st day of June, 1929.

Returns of income are required to be furnished by all companies and persons in business, whether for the whole or part of the income year. They are also required from all persons in receipt of income from salary, wages, interest, rents, annuity, or other annual payment, where such income exceeds £250 per annum. The returns are required annually from such persons notwithstanding that by reason of the special exemptions allowable by law they may not be liable to pay tax.

In cases where the Commissioner has agreed to accept returns for twelve meather additional contents.
