REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Motor-vehicle Amendment Regulations, 1929.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Motor-vehicle Regulations, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"), and the amendments thereof.

3. Clause (12A) of Regulation 16 of the principal regulations as inserted by the Motor-vehicle (Additional) Regulations, 1929, is amended by inserting before the words "every local authority" the words "with the prior consent in writing of the Minister."

4. Regulation 16 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by inserting, following clause (12A) thereof, the following additional clause :—

"(12B) When application is made for the consent of the Minister in terms of the last preceding clause, there shall be

sent with each application a sketch plan or map of the road and locality showing the proposed position of the traffic sign of Class F, and the application shall also set forth the reasons for which it is desired to erect the said traffic sign."

And whereas section eleven of the said Act provides that the Governor-General in Council, in giving his consent to the borrowing of moneys by the local authority, may impose such conditions with respect to the time at which such moneys may be borrowed, the rate of interest that may be paid in respect thereto, the term for which they may be borrowed, and provisions for repayment thereof as he thinks fit, and that it shall not be lawful for the local authority to borrow such moneys save in accordance with the conditions so imposed :

And whereas the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto are desirous of raising the respective amounts set out opposite their names therein :

And whereas the said local authorities have complied with the provisions of the said Act, and it is expedient that the aforesaid precedent consent should be given to the raising of the loans on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth :

(1) From time to time, in accordance with the directions of the Minister of External Affairs, there shall be transferred from the New Zealand Reparation Estates Account to the Public Account of New Zealand, to the credit of the Consolidated Fund, such balances as in the opinion of the Minister are not required to meet expenditure in the execution of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Order, 1920, and its amendments, or in the administration of the New Zealand Reparation Estates.

(2) Subclause (1) of clause 6 of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Amendment Order, 1924, is hereby revoked.

3. (1) There shall be an officer of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Service, to be called the "Manager of the New Zealand Reparation Estates," who shall, subject to the general direction of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Board and the Minister of External Affairs, be charged with the execution of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Order, 1920, and its amendments, and with the administration of the New Zealand Reparation Estates.

(2) Subclause (1) of clause 3 of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Amendment Order, 1924, shall be read subject to the foregoing provisions of this clause.

(3) All references in the New Zealand Reparation Estates Service Amendment Order, 1926, to the Accountant shall hereafter be deemed to be references to the Manager of the New Zealand Reparation Estates.

4. Clause 3 of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Amendment Order, 1924, is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (2) the words "two other persons chosen by the Administrator and" and substituting the words "such other persons as may be."

5. Clause 4 of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Amendment Order, 1924, is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (2) the second sentence thereof and substituting the following sentence: "The Chairman shall have a casting-vote as well as a deliberative vote."

being the person holding the office of Relieving Postmaster, Auckland, is authorized to take and receive statutory declarations under the three-hundred-and-first section of the Justices of the Peace Act, 1927.

1.
