WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto forms portions of reserves duly set apart for scenic purposes:

And whereas the said land is no longer suitable for scenic purposes by reason of the absence of bush of scenic value thereon:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section eight of the Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1910, do hereby revoke the reservation for scenic purposes over the land described in the Schedule hereto.

LICENSES to fish for trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish (being fish not indigenous to New Zealand waters) within the said district may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the North Canterbury Acclimatization Society or any one authorized by the said Secretary in that behalf, and such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish in the said acclimatization district from the 1st day of October in any one year to the 30th day of April in the year following, subject to the said Acts, and any regulations made thereunder and in force in the said district, and to these regulations:

Provided that the season for fishing for salmon shall commence on the 1st day of October in each year and end on the 15th day of May in the year following:

Provided further that the Secretary may refuse to issue a license to any person who (within the previous five years) has been convicted of any breach of the provisions of any Act relating to fishing for salmon, trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish, or of any regulations made thereunder.

2. The fee to be charged for a license as aforesaid to each male person over the age of sixteen years shall be £1, and every such license shall be in the form set forth in the Third Schedule hereto. Licenses may also be issued to boys attending school or under the age of sixteen, or to women, at a fee of 5s. for each license so issued:

Provided that it shall be lawful for any Secretary or his deputy, in any case where application is made for a license on or after the 20th day of December in any year, to issue a license to any man for the sum of 12s. 6d., but so that such license shall extend only from the time of granting the same until the termination of the then trout-fishing season. No license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

3. The season for fishing for trout in Lakes Sumner, Sheppard, Taylor, Marion, Letitia, Rubicon, Meremere, Hawdon, Sarah, Grasmere, Pearson, Lyndon, Red Hill Lakes, Georgina, Coleridge, Evelyn, Selfe, Henrietta, Monck, Ida, Lilian, and such other small lakes and tarns situated in the high country of the society's district, shall commence on the 1st day of November in each year and shall end on the 30th day of April in the following year, with the exception of Lake Mason, in which no fishing of any kind is permitted.

4. It shall be unlawful to take trout by angling from boats of any description whatever on the lakes hereinbefore mentioned in the regulation immediately preceding, except Lakes Sumner, Coleridge, and Pearson.

5. The Secretary of the said society may issue day-licenses to *bona fide* travellers and strangers not resident within the district aforesaid on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d. for each day's fishing.

6. Trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish shall not be fished for, taken, or killed, otherwise than with one rod and line, but a landing net or gaff may be used to secure any trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish caught with such rod and line, and no lures or baits other than natural or artificial flies, insects, worms, or fish shall be used with such rod and line.

7. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish with more than two flies, or one fly and one minnow, or one fly and one natural bait, or two natural baits affixed to any trace. No fly shall have more than one hook, and it shall not be lawful to use more than one lead or sinker, and such lead or sinker must be tied above all flies, minnow, or natural bait used.

8. It shall be unlawful to use any wire, either plain or twisted, or gimp trace of a greater gauge than 21 standard wire gauge.

9. It shall be unlawful to use any wire or gimp trace of a greater length than 6 ft. The provisions contained in this and the two regulations immediately preceding shall not apply to single-hooked flies size 10 (old numbers), or smaller, or to wire traces not exceeding 28 standard wire gauge.

10. It shall be unlawful to fish in any part of the River Avon from the watercourse near the bend of the river on the Riccarton Road through the city to Colombo Street Bridge. No lures or baits other than artificial fly or artificial minnow shall be used during the months of October and November in the River Avon from the watercourse near the bend of the river on the Riccarton Road aforesaid to Helmore Bridge, and during the whole season in the Selwyn River and its tributaries from the Ellesmere Bridge upwards.

11. It shall be unlawful to fish with a set rod unattended.

12. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish.

13. No person shall take, kill, or have in his possession any trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish between the 1st day of May and the 30th day of September in any year, or any salmon between the 15th day of May and the 30th day of September, which periods are hereby appointed the close seasons for such fish respectively:

Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the Marine Department or of an acclimatization society, or the General Manager of the Department of Tourists and Health Resorts for the purpose of pisciculture or scientific investigation:

Provided, further, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect the provisions of any regulation now in force or hereafter made with respect to keeping such fish in freezing or cool chambers during the close season hereinbefore mentioned.

14. No person shall cast or throw into any stream in which salmon, trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish exist or have been liberated, or shall allow to flow into, or place near the bank or margin of any such stream, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flax-mill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is noxious, poisonous, or injurious to fish:

Provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to prohibit the depositing in such stream of debris from any mining claim.

15. Save as provided herein or by any other regulations under the said Acts, no person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

16. No person shall fish for trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish without a license; and every person fishing shall, on the demand of any ranger, constable, officer of the said society, or of any person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, officer, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such salmon, trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish.

17. Every trout not exceeding 9 in. in length from nose to tip of tail taken or caught by any person shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

18. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, wilful foul-hooking, spearing, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing salmon, trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish; nor shall any baits be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

19. Except as provided in these or other regulations under the said Acts, no person shall put, throw, drag, draw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, dragged, drawn, or placed, for any purpose whatsoever any net of any description except a landing-net, bully, or silvery net, or whitebait net in any of the waters, lakes, rivers, or streams in the said district in which salmon, trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish have been placed or exist, or in the outlet, mouth, or entrance of any such waters, lakes, rivers, or streams:

Provided that nothing herein contained shall permit the placing of any net other than a stake net in or across the parts of the rivers mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto for the purpose of taking indigenous fish by such means or render any person liable for so doing.

20. For the purpose of these regulations the mouth or entrance of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the seashore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of 500 yards from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea, or of any harbour at low water.

21. No person shall sell, or expose or offer for sale, trout, perch, tench, or any part thereof.

22. Any regulation regarding the number or weight of trout which a person may take or catch in any one day or other specified period which has been made by general regulations under the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments or regulations, shall not apply to the said district.

23. If any person shall be convicted of an offence against these regulations the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

24. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be more than £50.

NOTE.—A cloudy and wet month with moderate to strong N. and N.W. winds prevailing. Precipitation was 41 per cent. above the normal of Karori Reservoir, near Kelburn. Fog was in evidence on the 5th and 7th. Total bright sunshine, 183-9 hours, 48 per cent. of the possible, and three sunless days. Mean dew-point, 54-1°; and mean vapour pressure, 0-419 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH, 1929.

The month of March has been a very wet one over much the greater part of the Dominion. In many districts the average fall was greatly exceeded. Slight deficits were experienced at scattered places in the central parts of the North Island, from Taranaki to Hawke's Bay, and from the Bay of Plenty to the Wairarapa. A few places in Canterbury, South Westland, and Southland also had less than the normal. The rain, following on a dry February, was very beneficial. Pastures are in a good condition, and prospects for winter feed favourable over almost the whole country. Stock and crops also were in good condition at the end of the month.

About Waihi, milk yields are reported to have fallen off, but elsewhere they are generally good for the time of year. Temperatures were slightly below normal, especially in districts with an easterly aspect, where also there was considerable cloudiness. In a few cases the damp and dull weather has interfered with harvesting operations.

Among the outstanding features of the month was a cyclone of very small dimensions which, after having been met by the s.s. "Tofua" on her way to Auckland, crossed from the Bay of Plenty to Poverty Bay between the 17th and 18th. Gales of great severity, though fortunately of short duration, were experienced, and some damage was done in the environs of Opotiki and Gisborne. Another was the torrential downpour which occurred during a southerly gale over the eastern portions of Otago on the evening of the 19th. Around Dunedin the falls varied between about 4 in. and 11 in., the heaviest occurring in the watershed of the Leith Stream. The Leith rose rapidly to record flood-level and, in addition to doing very serious damage along its own banks, caused heavy flooding of the northern business portion of Dunedin. Oamaru also recorded over 6 in. of rain, and experienced heavy flooding accompanied by some damage to property.

Still another unusual phenomenon was the occurrence of Aurora Australis on four nights during the month—namely, the 10th, 12th, 13th, and 17th. The display of the 12th was particularly brilliant. Large spot groups were noted on the central portion of the sun on about these days.

On the 1st an intense cyclonic storm had developed east of Brisbane. This storm remained in the northern Tasman Sea until the 4th, after which it disappeared without affecting New Zealand to any very great extent. On the 5th, however, a deep southern depression advanced from the Tasman Sea and had not completely crossed the Dominion until the 8th.

when strong southerly winds set in. General rain fell, culminating on the 6th in very heavy falls over most of the North Island and the Nelson and Westland provinces. Some flooding was caused on the West Coast, especially at Greymouth.

On the 17th another deep depression developed in the South Tasman Sea and became cyclonic before reaching New Zealand. The centre crossed northern Otago on the evening of the 19th, and the floods mentioned above were associated with it. Southerly gales followed in its wake. In addition to the specially heavy falls described, rain was general in other districts. Snow fell on the ranges of the South Island. The weather was cold between the 20th and the 22nd, and frosts occurred at southern inland stations.

The storm of the 19th was followed by an intense anti-cyclone which did not move finally away eastward until the 25th. On this date another intense depression developed in the South Tasman Sea and caused unsettled weather until the end of the month. There were northerly gales on the 26th and 27th, especially about Cook Strait. Rain was again general with many heavy falls. The change to southerlies came on the 30th, when snow fell on the high country of the South Island and low temperatures were experienced. The 31st was still more severe, and frosts were recorded at many places. The southerlies were of gale force at many places on the 30th and 31st.

There was again a relative absence of westerly winds and a prevalence of southerlies during the month.
