Declaring National - endowment and Crown Lands in Hauraki Mining District, Auckland Land District, open for Disposal on Renewable Lease.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and fifty-four of the Land Act, 1924, it is enacted that the Governor-General, by Proclamation, may from time to time declare any Crown lands within any mining district to be open for disposal as provided in section one hundred and fifty-three of the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by the one-hundred-and-fifty-fourth section of the said Act, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto shall be open on Friday, the twenty-third day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, for disposal as provided in section one hundred and fifty-three of the said Act.

Coromandel County.—Coromandel Survey District.

WHEREAS a requisition in writing, signed by a majority of the occupiers of all the chemists' shops within the Combined District of Dunedin, comprising the City of Dunedin, and the boroughs of St. Kilda, Port Chalmers, West Harbour, and Green Island, has been forwarded to me, desiring that all such shops within the said combined district, save and except the shop (hereinafter referred to as "the exempted shop") established at 22 Dowling Street, within the City of Dunedin, for the purpose only of the sale of medicines and surgical appliances that are urgently required, and known as the "Associated Chemists, Limited," be closed as set out below, and that subsection (4) of section 35 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, should not apply to any shop within two miles and a half of the exempted shop while medicines and surgical appliances are obtainable from the exempted shop: On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays at 6 p.m., on Fridays at 9.30 p.m. and on Sundays except during the time from 7 p.m. to 8.30 p.m., with the following exceptions—(1) Should the working-day that first precedes Christmas Eve and should the working-day that first precedes New Year's Eve fall on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday, then and in such case the closing-hour on such working-days shall be 9.30 p.m.; (2) on the working-day that first precedes Christmas Day, and on the working-day that first precedes New Year's Day, the closing-hour shall be 11 p.m.; (3) on the working-day that first precedes Good Friday, the closing-hour shall be 9.30 p.m.:

And whereas I, William Andrew Veitch, Minister of Labour, am satisfied that the signatures to such requisition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the said shops within the said combined district, and that all the occupiers of the said shops within the said combined district affected by section 35

(1) of the said Act have been afforded an equal right to share at a reasonable cost in the profits of the business carried on by the exempted shop:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of sections 32 and 35 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, and in pursuance of section 15 of the Shops and Offices Amendment Act, 1927, I do hereby direct that on and after the 29th day of July, 1929, all the chemists' shops within the Combined District of Dunedin, save and except the exempted shop, shall be closed accordingly.

The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 958 as against 1,149 in May, a decrease of 191. The deaths in June were 567—a decrease of 28 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 319, females 248. Forty-nine of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 8.64 per cent. of the whole number. Thirty-five of these were under one year of age.
