3. Clause (2) of Regulation 1 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, following the definition of "veterinary surgeon," the following additional definition:—
"Veterinary practitioner" means a person for the time

"Veterinary practitioner" means a person for the time being entitled to use in connection with his business the designation of "veterinary practitioner" in accordance with the provisions of subsection (2) of section 14 of the Veterinary Surgeons Act, 1926.

4. Clause (2) of Regulation 1 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by inserting in the definition of "practitioner," following the words "veterinary surgeon," the words "and veterinary practitioner."

5. Regulation 9 (Exemptions) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding thereto the following additional clauses:—

"(5) Notwithstanding anything contained in these regula-tions it shall be lawful for the master of any vessel trading in New Zealand waters to obtain from a licensee, and to have in his possession on board such vessel, and for a licensee to supply to such master accordingly such dangerous drugs as are included in the scale of medicines from time to time current issued by the Board of Trade under sections 200 and 300 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (Imperial), or prescribed by the Minister of Marine under section 112 of the Shipping and Section 1008 and Seaman Act, 1908.

"(6) No master of a vessel in possession of the dangerous drugs aforesaid by virtue of the authority conferred by the last preceding clause of this regulation shall use such dangerous drugs or cause or permit the same to be used for any purpose except for administration to the sick on the vessel of which

he is master.

Amendments and Additions to the Regulations under the Public Service Act, 1912.

In pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor-General in Council, doth hereby, in respect of the regulations made under the said Act on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and the amendments thereof made from time to time under the provisions of the said Act, make the amendments shown in the Schedule hereto.

Such amendments shall have effect on and from the date of publi-

cation thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATION 24 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

24. No fee, reward, or remuneration of any kind whatsoever, beyond his salary, shall be received and kept for his own use by any officer for the performance of any service for the Government unless specially authorized by the Commissioner.

All fees due to officers attending in their official character, under a subpoena or order to give evidence or to produce papers in any Court, shall be recoverable from the Justice Department by the Department concerned by means of transfer vouchers.

Such officers, however, on application to the Head of their Branch, may be paid all necessary reasonable expenses incurred by them in consequence of being so subpœned or called as witnesses.

Regulation 110 (5) is hereby revoked, and the following substituted

in lieu thereof:—
110. (5) Where an officer travelling by train uses a sleeping-berth, the cost thereof will be refunded to him on production of a receipt for the amount paid. In such a case the officer is required to reduce his claim for travelling-allowance by one-fourth of one day's scale rate. If a "special" sleeping-berth is used the additional cost above that of an "ordinary" sleeper must be borne by the

officer.

Regulation 111B is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

Relieving-allowances.

111B. Officers called upon to perform relieving duty which necessitates their absence at night from home may be paid allowances at the following rates:—

Officers entitled to lodging-allowance, when appointed to relieving duty involving separate payment for such duty, will not be entitled to claim lodging-allowance for a longer time than one week after the relieving duty commences.

Officers are not entitled to draw travelling-allowance for any time during which they perform relieving duty, except as follows: When in performing relieving duty an officer is not required to stay more than three nights in the place where such duty is performed, he may be paid travelling-allowance instead of relieving-allowance. But travelling-allowance may be paid for the day occupied in travelling to or from headquarters, provided that the time occupied exceeds six hours on each occasion.

In any special case the Commissioner may authorize payment of an allowance at a higher or lower rate.

An allowance in accordance with this regulation shall be granted only in cases where an officer is required to perform purely relieving duty.

A relieving-allowance shall not be paid to an officer for any period in excess of one month, or in cases where the period of relief is likely to be in excess of one month, without the previous approval of the Commissioner thereto. In such cases, where practicable, a commuted allowance will be payable.

Regulation 142 is hereby revoked.

A channel 250 yds. broad through the middle of the narrows has been completely swept, and no dangers other than the above and those already charted
