WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the third day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, and gazetted on the tenth day of the same month, open seasons for the taking or killing of opossums were declared in the Westland, Grey District, and Buller Acclimatization Districts from the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, both days inclusive:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Orders in Council in manner hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, both hereby order and declare that the period within which opossums may be taken or killed within the Westland, Grey District, and Buller Acclimatization Districts, except in any sanctuary other than a scenic reserve, shall be from the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred

and twenty-nine, to the fourteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, both days inclusive; and the said Orders in Council are hereby amended accordingly. And all licenses issued under the authority of the said Orders in Council are hereby extended until the said fourteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Fireblight Act, 1922 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations in further amendment of the Fireblight Regulations, 1927 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"), under the said Act, made by Order in Council on the sixteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and published in the *Gazette* on the nineteenth day of the same month at page 1469, and doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall take effect from the date of the publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as "The Fireblight Regulations 1927 Amendment No. 3," and shall be read together with and be deemed to form part of the principal regulations.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Explosive and Dangerous Goods Amendment Act, 1920, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make for the purposes of the said Act the following regulations in amendment of the Dangerous Goods Regulations, 1928 (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Goods Regulations, 1928. Amendment No. 1.

2. Regulation 103 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted :—

“103. (1) The fees to be paid for licenses to keep, store, or use dangerous goods in any place not within a borough shall be the respective fees specified hereunder :—

“(a) For the storage of any quantity of dangerous goods of Class I or of Class II, not exceeding 50 gallons, kept for private use only and not for trade purposes or purposes of sale No fee.

“(b) For the storage of a quantity of dangerous goods of Classes I, II, and IV, not exceeding 1,000 gallons, and in addition such quantities of dangerous goods of Class III as may be approved by an Inspector £ s. d.

“(c) For the storage of a quantity of dangerous goods of Classes I, II, and IV, exceeding 1,000 gallons but not exceeding 2,000 gallons, and in addition such quantities of dangerous goods of Class III as may be approved by an Inspector 1 0 0

“(d) For the storage of a quantity of dangerous goods of Classes I, II, and IV, exceeding 2,000 gallons but not exceeding 16,000 gallons, and in addition such quantities of dangerous goods of Class III as may be approved by an Inspector 2 0 0

“(e) For the storage of a quantity of dangerous goods of Classes I, II, and IV, exceeding 16,000 gallons, and in addition such quantities of dangerous goods of Class III as may be approved by an Inspector 5 0 0

“(f) For the storage of dangerous goods of Class III only 0 5 0

“(2) The fees to be paid for licenses to keep, store, or use dangerous goods in any place within a borough shall be the respective fees specified hereunder :—

“(a) For the storage of any quantity of dangerous goods of Class I not exceeding 50 gallons, kept for private use only and not for trade purposes or purpose of sale, and in addition such quantity of calcium carbide as may be approved by an Inspector 0 5 0

“(b) For the storage of a quantity of dangerous goods of Classes I and II not exceeding 225 gallons, or dangerous goods of Class IV not exceeding 1,000 gallons, and in addition such quantities of dangerous goods of Class III as may be approved by an Inspector 1 0 0

“(c) For the storage of a quantity of dangerous goods of Classes I and II, exceeding 225 gallons but not exceeding 1,000 gallons, and in addition such quantities of dangerous goods of Class III as may be approved by an Inspector 2 0 0

“(d) For the storage of a quantity of dangerous goods of Classes I, II, and IV, exceeding 1,000 gallons but not exceeding 2,000 gallons, and in addition such quantities of dangerous goods of Class III as may be approved by an Inspector 3 0 0

“(e) For the storage of a quantity of dangerous goods of Classes I, II, and IV exceeding 2,000 gallons but not exceeding 16,000 gallons, and in addition such quantities of dangerous goods of Class III as may be approved by an Inspector 5 0 0

“(f) For the storage of dangerous goods of Classes I, II, and IV, in quantities exceeding 16,000 gallons but not exceeding 250,000 gallons 10 0 0

“(g) For the storage of dangerous goods of Classes I, II, and IV in quantities exceeding 250,000 gallons 15 0 0

“(h) For the storage of dangerous goods of Class III only 0 10 0

“(3) Every application for a license shall be accompanied by the fee payable under this regulation.

“(4) In the case of storage of dangerous goods of Classes I, II, and IV, in bulk, the license shall be issued for the maximum capacity of the tank or tanks, less an allowance for expansion of 5 per centum.”

3. Regulation 107 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following substituted :—

“107. The fees for the issue of a license issued pursuant to section 10 of the said Act by a local authority shall for the purposes of subsection (5) of the said section 10 be the respective amounts set out in clause (1) of Regulation 103.”

4. Regulation 108 of the said regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted :—

“108. (1) Every licensing authority shall, within fourteen days after the last days of March, June, September, and December, respectively, of each year, pay to the Public Account to the credit of the Consolidated Fund an amount in respect of licenses issued by that licensing authority equal to one-half of the fees prescribed by Regulation 107 hereof, and shall forthwith furnish to the Chief Inspector a return in such form as the Chief Inspector may from time to time require, of all licenses issued by that local authority under the said Act.

“(2) The provisions of Regulation 107 and clause (1) of Regulation 108 hereof are, without prejudice to the right or duty of a local authority which is a licensing authority or the Governor-General to make by-laws under section 13 or section 15 of the said Act, prescribing the fees payable in respect of licenses to keep or store dangerous goods, and in so far as a fee prescribed by any such by-law exceeds the fee for the issue of a license prescribed by Regulation 107 hereof the provisions of subsection (5) of section 10 of the said Act shall not be deemed to apply to a fee so prescribed.”

And whereas it is provided by section eight of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1923, that any such Order in Council may be extended from time to time:

NOTE.—A cloudy, cold, wet, and unsettled month. The rainfall was 78 per cent. above the mean of Karori Reservoir, near Kelburn. Total bright sunshine, 110.5 hours, 33 per cent. of the possible, and three sunless days. Fog was in evidence on the 10th, 12th, 13th, 26th, and 28th. Thunder was heard on the 13th and 28th, and lightning was seen on the 13th. Mean dew-point, 50.3°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.364 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1929.

The general character of the weather experienced in April over the North Island and the northern and eastern districts of the South Island may be described as dull and moist, with, in most districts, an absence of strong winds. In Westland, Otago, and Southland, on the other hand, it was fine, clear, and pleasant for the greater part of the month.

The total rainfall was below the normal over the South Island except in the north-east portion, and deficiencies were recorded also in the central districts of the North Island. In Marlborough and Nelson provinces the falls considerably exceeded the average, as also was the case in the northern and eastern districts of the North Island.

Although temperatures were slightly below normal there were no extremes, and frosts were few and usually of only slight intensity. As a result, the growth of pasture was remarkable in all districts for the time of the year. The prospects of good supplies of feed in winter are, therefore, everywhere bright. Stock have kept in good condition, but the soft state of the grass, owing to excessive moisture, has prevented the fattening of sheep in some parts of the North Island, and in parts of Hawke's Bay has caused scouring and liver fluke amongst the hoggets.

A characteristic of the month has been the frequency with which cyclones have controlled the meteorological situation, and the almost total absence of the westerly type of pressure distribution. Two of the cyclones had noteworthy features, and may be briefly described:—

The first, which was the one which caused serious floods in Tasmania about the 5th, moved very slowly in a north-east direction across the Tasman, and by the 8th was centred between Norfolk Island and Cape Maria van Diemen, where it remained stationary for several days. On the 11th it had passed east of Cape Maria van Diemen, and then moved gradually

southwards off the east coast until the 14th. From the 8th to the latter date, much dull, misty weather prevailed. Temperatures were mild until the 13th, after which southerly wind became general and temperatures fell rapidly. Rain was fairly widespread during this period, and many heavy falls occurred in the northern and east coast districts of the North Island. Some flooding was experienced in the East Cape area.

On the 27th another cyclonic disturbance developed south-west of Norfolk Island. It increased rapidly in extent and intensity as it moved southwards and, by the 28th, pressure had fallen to below 29 in. at many places in New Zealand. Special warnings of stormy weather and the likelihood of flood rains were issued on this date. The movement of the storm centre was slow until the morning of the 29th, when it was situated west of Farewell Spit. Thereafter it moved rapidly across the northern portion of the South Island and, by the evening of the 30th, had disappeared to the southeastwards of the Chatham Island. General heavy rains were associated with this disturbance, and considerable flooding resulted in the Nelson and Marlborough districts. In Nelson City the flood was the worst experienced in the past twenty years. Over the northern half of the North Island strong north-east to northerly gales were experienced. Generally, however, the winds were less severe than might have been expected in view of the fact that the cyclone was one of the most intense experienced in recent years.
