W HEREAS by Order in Council dated the twentyfourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette, No. 16, of the twenty-seventh day of the same month, regulations were made prescribing the minimum size at which blue cod may be taken, bought, sold, exposed for sale, or kept in possession:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said regulations, and to make other regulations in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section five of the Fisheries Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the hereinbefore-recited regulations, and doth hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof. thereof.

REGULATIONS.

(1) No person shall take, buy, sell, expose for sale, or have in possession any blue cod of a less length than 12 in. in the natural state, or of a less length than 10 in. when properly headed—that is, the head cut off at the back of the eyes:

Provided that this regulation shall not apply to blue cod taken by licensed fishermen and retained by them solely for use as bait.

(2) Any person committing a breach of the foregoing regulation shall be liable to a fine of not less than £1 nor more than £20.

The water shall

be kept in air-tight metal tanks or in proper kegs, and shall be kept in such part of the raft as may be approved by the Surveyor. Each water vessel shall have attached to it a dipper or other approved means of getting the water out without waste, and when tanks are used they shall have screw tops $3\frac{1}{2}$ in. inside measurement, each top to have two snugs each $\frac{3}{4}$ in. deep and $\frac{3}{4}$ in. diameter. The biscuits and chocolates mentioned herein shall be kept in airtight and watertight tanks with screw tops 5 in. inside measurement, each top to have two snugs each $\frac{3}{4}$ in. deep and $\frac{3}{4}$ in. diameter, and such receptacles shall be securely fastened in the liferafts: Provided that screw tops which were procured without the prescribed snugs by shipowners prior to the 23rd November, 1903, may be used if they are made so that they can be screwed up and unscrewed without difficulty, and the Surveyor considers they are suitable. be kept in air-tight metal tanks or in proper kegs, and shall siders they are suitable.
