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Altering Boundaries of Auckland and Suburban Drainage District.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Auckland and Suburban Drainage Board has presented a memorial requesting that the area described in such memorial be declared to form part of the Auckland and Suburban Drainage District (hereinafter referred to as "the said district"):

And whereas the Governor-General is satisfied that the inclusion of such area in the said district will prove beneficial to the inhabitants and the owners of property therein:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me in that behalf by section ninety-five of the Auckland and Suburban Drainage Act, 1908, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be included in and form part of the said district.

SCHEDULE.

AREA TO BE INCLUDED IN AUCKLAND AND SUBURBAN DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the One Tree Hill Road District bounded by a line commencing at a point on the existing boundary of the Auckland and Suburban Drainage District at the most southerly point of Lot 20 on plan Number 16452, deposited in the Land Registry Office at Auckland; on the north-east by the north-eastern boundary of Allotment 17A, Section 12, Suburbs of Auckland, to its intersection with the north-western boundary of portion Allotment 7, Section 12, Suburbs of Auckland, shown on plan No. 3286, deposited in the Land Registry Office at Auckland; thence on the north-west by the said north-western boundary of said portion Allotment 7, on the north-east by the Great South Road to its intersection with the south-eastern boundary of aforesaid Allotment 17A; thence on the south-east and the south-west by the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of said Allotment 17A to the intersection of the latter with the existing boundary of the Auckland and Suburban Drainage District; thence

WHEREAS by section three hundred and sixty-eight of the Native Land Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Crown may purchase any Native land in pursuance of a resolution of the assembled owners passed and confirmed in accordance with Part XVIII of the said Act, and on the resolution being adopted by the Native Land Purchase Board it shall become a contract of purchase as between the Crown and all persons who are the owners of the land; and the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, at any time after the contract of purchase has been so made, declare that the land so purchased is vested in His Majesty the King, and it shall vest accordingly and shall become Crown land:

And whereas a resolution was passed by a meeting of assembled owners, and duly confirmed by the Aotea District Maori Land Board, that the land set out in the Schedule hereto be sold to the Crown:

And whereas the Native Land Purchase Board has adopted such resolution:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three hundred and sixty-eight of the said Act, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land set out in the Schedule hereto is vested in His Majesty the King.

Amendments to the Regulations under the Government Railways Act, 1908.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 9th day of September, 1929.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Government Railways Act, 1926, and its amendments, by the Master and Apprentice Act, 1908, and its amendments, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend or further amend the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1908, on the twelfth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, in the manner set forth hereunder.

By cancelling paragraph (d) of Regulation 9 and inserting the following paragraphs :—

(d) In the case of an apprentice, the Sixth Standard of the Government schools, but applicants possessing higher educational qualifications may be given preference in the matter of appointment ;

(e) In every other case, the Fifth Standard of the Government schools.

By omitting from Regulation 16 the provisions as to age at entry of the following classes of workmen and substituting therefor the following :—

	Age at Entry.
As a labourer	21 to 39 years last birthday.
As a tradesman	20 to 39 ..

By omitting from paragraph (b) of Regulation 22 the words "three months" and substituting therefor the words "six months."

By omitting from the first sentence of Regulation 25 the words "three months" and substituting therefor the words "six months."

By cancelling Regulation 34 and substituting therefor the following :—

34. (a) Every apprentice shall be indentured to the Works Manager (or to the Foreman of Works or Works Foreman in cases where there is no Works Manager) who is in charge of the workshop in which such apprentice is to be employed: Provided, however, that apprentices in branches other than the Locomotive or Maintenance Branches shall be indentured either to the Officer in Charge of the branch or to any other person in the branch who may be in a position to give proper attention to the training of such apprentices.

(b) The Chief Mechanical Engineer in respect of apprentices in the Locomotive Branch, the Chief Engineer in respect of apprentices in the Maintenance Branch, the Officer in Charge of the Advertising Branch, and the Officers in Charge of other branches in respect of apprentices under their respective control, shall determine the course of shop training, and such course shall be arranged in accordance with and subject to the facilities for training at each shop respectively.

By cancelling Regulation 35 and substituting therefor the following :—

35. (a) The period of apprenticeship shall be five years, and each year of such apprenticeship shall be deemed to comprise 313 working-days: Provided that for the purpose of this regulation annual leave granted in pursuance of the regulations, leave granted in pursuance of subparagraph (i) of paragraph (1) of Regulation 143, time during which compulsory military training camps are being attended (provided attendance at any such camp is not due to the failure of the apprentice to fulfil his ordinary military obligations), time during which workshops are closed, or during which an apprentice shall be absent from work as the result of an accident arising out of and in the course of his employment, shall be deemed to be time worked.

(b) Every apprentice shall be required to make up any time lost by him in any year of his apprenticeship if the time lost does not come within the provisions of the last preceding paragraph as time deemed to be worked, and no increase in wages shall become payable to an apprentice until he has duly completed the previous year of his apprenticeship.

By cancelling Regulation 71 and substituting therefor the following :—

71. (a) This regulation shall apply only to apprentices in the Locomotive and Maintenance Branches.

(b) Every apprentice who shall obtain 80 per cent. or more of the possible marks at any of the annual examinations to be held in pursuance of subparagraph (a) of paragraph (2) of Regulation 143, and in the same year shall obtain a like percentage of the marks awarded in terms of subparagraph (b) of that paragraph, shall be awarded a diploma allowance of $\frac{2}{11}$ ths of a penny per hour, but such allowance shall not be paid to any apprentice who shall have failed in any previous year to attain the 65 per cent. standard required by subparagraphs (c) and (d) of the said paragraph (2). The said diploma allowance shall be subject to the provisions of paragraph (d) of this regulation.

(c) The said diploma allowance shall be paid for a period of twelve calendar months commencing on the day the results of departmental examinations are notified or on the day on which certificates issued by public technical schools or colleges are produced to the master as the case may be, and shall be in addition to the classified rate of pay.

(d) Diploma allowance shall not be paid to any apprentice during periods in respect of which he shall not be in receipt of wages from the Department, and diploma allowance shall cease to be payable immediately on completion of apprenticeship.

(e) Apprentices in localities where, or within a reasonable distance of which, no day classes are provided by the Department, or where no Instructor is placed, may arrange to sit for the departmental examination if they so desire. Alternatively, the production of examination certificates for equivalent examinations given by public technical schools or colleges may, at the discretion of the Permanent Head be accepted in lieu of certificates for Departmental examinations: Provided, however, that the subjects comprised in such examinations and the standard of such examinations shall be previously approved by the Permanent Head.

(f) If any apprentice shall become entitled to the payment of diploma allowance for three years in succession, such allowance shall be paid to him during the remainder of his apprenticeship conditionally upon his maintaining the standard required by subparagraph (d) of paragraph (2) of Regulation 143.

By cancelling Regulation 136 and substituting therefor the following:—

136. (a) Apprentices will be paid for shop holidays and for time during which they are absent from work with the permission of the master first had and obtained; they will also be paid for time during which they are absent from duty through illness, but in no case will such payment during illness extend (whether in one period or in the aggregate) for more than three months in any apprenticeship year. In no case shall any payment be made during illness or incapacity if such illness or incapacity has been caused by or has arisen from or out of the misconduct of the apprentice. Subject to the last preceding sentence of this paragraph apprentices shall be paid during periods they are absent from duty as the result of an accident which arises otherwise than out of and in the course of their employment, but the maximum time for which such payment shall be made (whether in one period or in the aggregate) shall be four weeks in each apprenticeship year.

(b) No apprentice who has been absent from duty on account of sickness or accident (whether or not such sickness or accident arose out of and in the course of the apprentice's employment) for any period exceeding three months shall be permitted to resume duty in the Department unless and until a medical practitioner nominated by the Permanent Head certifies that such apprentice is fit to complete his apprenticeship.

(c) Any apprentice who is incapacitated through illness, or other cause, shall provide such medical certificates as may be required by the master.

By cancelling Regulation 143 and substituting therefor the following:—

143. (1) (a) This paragraph shall apply only to apprentices in the Locomotive and Maintenance Branches.

(b) Every apprentice shall, as hereinafter more particularly set forth, attend such classes at public technical schools and colleges and at day schools provided by the Department, as may be directed by the Permanent Head, but it shall not be compulsory for an apprentice to attend night classes after shop hours on more than two nights per week, or for a longer period than two hours on any one night. Such compulsory course shall not extend beyond the first three years of the apprenticeship.

(c) During the first three years of apprenticeship, every apprentice shall, unless exempted by the Permanent Head, attend night classes at public technical schools or colleges on two nights per week for instruction in mathematics, drawing, strength of materials, and/or other subjects approved by the Permanent Head.

(d) During the first three years of apprenticeship every apprentice shall attend during working-hours such instruction classes as may be provided by the Department; such attendance shall be for not less than three hours on one day per week.

(e) The Department's day classes shall have as their object instruction in railway subjects, and as far as practicable such instruction shall not overlap the instruction given to apprentices in public technical schools or colleges. Examinations for these day classes, which shall be supervised by public technical school or college authorities, shall be held and certificates shall be issued to successful examinees by such authorities.

(f) Any apprentice who shall have passed the intermediate or higher examination of any public technical school or college may be exempted from attending the Department's day classes, but he shall take and persevere in such course of study as the Permanent Head may direct.

(g) The Department shall provide all instruments and apparatus required for use at departmental day classes, but not those required for use at technical schools or colleges.

(h) The Department shall refund the fees paid by any apprentice attending evening classes at a public technical school or college upon his furnishing to the Permanent Head satisfactory proof that he has attended at least 70 per cent. of the lectures or classes, and provided that the report of the Director is satisfactory. The Department will enter in the apprentice records, attendances and progress made at these classes.

(i) During the last two years of the apprenticeship, every apprentice may attend such day classes or lectures as are approved by the Permanent Head, and for this purpose may be granted leave of absence on full pay for any period not exceeding five hours in any week.

(2) (a) At a time to be specified in this behalf by the Permanent Head examinations for apprentices shall be held in each year in the work covered in the Department's day classes, and marks shall be awarded for such examinations.

(b) Marks shall also be awarded to apprentices, apart from the examination, for progress and efficiency in their trades, application to work, punctuality, obedience, and general conduct.

(c) No apprentice shall be eligible for retention in the service upon completion of his apprenticeship unless he shall have obtained at least 65 per cent. of the maximum marks at three of the annual examinations referred to in subparagraph (a) of this paragraph.

(d) No apprentice shall be eligible for retention in the service upon completion of his apprenticeship unless he shall have obtained 65 per cent. of the maximum marks allotted in pursuance of subparagraph (b) of this paragraph in each and every year during his period of apprenticeship: Provided, however, that if any apprentice shall fail to obtain the required standard in the first two years of his apprenticeship, but nevertheless obtains an average of 65 per cent. over his full period of apprenticeship, such apprentice shall be deemed to have obtained 65 per cent. in each and every year of his apprenticeship. Nothing in this subparagraph shall be construed as a waiver on the part of the Minister of Railways of his right at any time to dismiss any apprentice under any other power that he may have in that behalf.

(e) Nothing in this paragraph shall be construed as binding the Department to retain the services of any apprentice upon completion of his apprenticeship.

(f) Subparagraphs (a) and (c) of this paragraph shall not apply to apprentices in branches other than the Locomotive or Maintenance.

(3) (a) This paragraph shall apply only to the Locomotive and Maintenance Branches.

(b) There shall be available for award annually two or more scholarships tenable for four years each.

(c) The scholarships shall be open to tradesmen who shall have completed their apprenticeship not more than two years before the award and to apprentices whose period of apprenticeship will expire before the due date of the award of the scholarship.

(d) The scholarships shall be awarded on the basis of the highest all-round qualifications in learning, tradesmanship, and character.

(e) Scholarship-holders shall serve for the year following the completion of their period of apprenticeship at their own trades or at some occupation (as determined by the Permanent Head) related to the trade of the scholarship-holder in each case, and thereafter shall receive three years' special training by the Department as follows:—

(i) One year's training in a drawing office.

(ii) One year's training in shop management.

(iii) One year's training in the Locomotive Running Branch, or on such technical work as the Permanent Head may consider to be of mutual value to the scholarship-holder and to the Department.

(f) During the last three years of the scholarship, the scholarship-holder will be encouraged to qualify for the Engineering Preliminary and Entrance Examinations of the University of New Zealand, or for the examination for associated membership of the Institution of Mechanical Engineers in England.

(4) (a) This paragraph shall apply only to the Locomotive and Maintenance Branches.

(b) The holder of a scholarship under the provisions of paragraph (3) of this regulation, provided he has, prior to the award of such scholarship and before he has reached the age of twenty-one years, passed the Engineering Preliminary Examination, may be granted leave of absence on full pay not exceeding five hours in any week during the terms of the university college in his district in order to enable him to "keep terms" at such college with a view of passing the Engineering Entrance Examination.

(c) Any such scholarship-holder who shall pass the Engineering Entrance Examination before he has reached the age of twenty-three years shall become entitled to a two-years course at the School of Engineering of the Canterbury University College, and at the discretion of the Permanent Head (provided the scholarship-holder has made and is making satisfactory progress at his studies) may be granted an additional year to enable him to qualify for the engineering degree.

(d) Every scholarship-holder who shall take advantage of the provisions of this regulation shall be required to remain in the Railway Service for at least three years after the completion of his course, and must, before he embarks upon the course, undertake so to remain, and, if required by the Permanent Head, he shall enter into a bond, with or without bondsmen, in that behalf, but this subparagraph shall not be construed as a waiver on the part of the Minister of Railways of his right to dismiss any scholarship-holder under any power that he may have in that behalf.

(e) Every scholarship-holder who enters upon the course referred to in subparagraph (c) of this paragraph shall be paid as a tradesman during the time occupied by such course. He shall be required to devote himself wholly to the objects of the scholarship, and shall not, except as approved by the Permanent Head, hold any position of emolument.

(f) Any scholarship-holder may be required to take up duty with the Department during college vacations.

(g) Every scholarship-holder who attends a university college under the provisions of any of these regulations relating to scholarships shall furnish to the Permanent Head satisfactory proof that he is prosecuting his studies diligently and successfully.

(h) The Permanent Head may, if the scholarship-holder is guilty of misconduct, or fails to furnish the proof required by the last preceding subparagraph, or for any other reason deemed by him to be sufficient, determine the tenure of any scholarship.

WHEREAS by section three of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is provided that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Act, it shall not be lawful or competent for any local authority to borrow or contract to borrow any money (otherwise than in anticipation of its revenue within the limits of its powers, if any, in that behalf), whether from the State Advances Office or from any other source whatever, and whether in pursuance of a special Act or under any authority whatever, without the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council given after compliance with the provisions of the said Act :

And whereas section eleven of the said Act provides that the Governor-General in Council, in giving his consent to the borrowing of moneys by the local authority, may impose such conditions with respect to the time at which such moneys may be borrowed, the rate of interest that may be paid in respect thereto, the term for which they may be borrowed, and provisions for repayment thereof as he thinks fit, and that it shall not be lawful for the local authority to borrow such moneys save in accordance with the conditions so imposed :

And whereas the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto are desirous of raising the respective amounts set out opposite their names therein :

And whereas the said local authorities have complied with the provisions of the said Act, and it is expedient that the aforesaid precedent consent should be given to the raising of the loans on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth :

Regulations for Trout Fishing in the Feilding and District Acclimatization District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 9th day of September, 1929.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for all that part of the Dominion known as the Feilding and District Acclimatization District, and the waters thereof, as the same is defined in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all other regulations for the said district, and such regulations are hereby revoked.

REGULATIONS.

- LICENSES to fish for trout and other acclimatized fish within the said district may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Feilding and District Acclimatization Society, or any one authorized by the said Secretary in that behalf, and such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish in the said acclimatization district from the 1st day of October in any one year to the 30th day of April in the year following, subject to the said Acts, and any regulations made thereunder, and in force in the said district, and to these regulations.
- The fee to be charged for a license as aforesaid to each male person over the age of sixteen years shall be one pound (£1), and every such license shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto. Licenses may also be issued to boys attending school or under the age of sixteen, or to women, at a fee of five shillings (5s.) for each license so issued: Provided that it shall be lawful for any Secretary or his deputy, in any case where application is made for a license on or after the 20th day of December in any year, to issue a license to any man for the sum of twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.); but so that such license shall extend only from the time of granting the same until the termination of the then trout-fishing season. No license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.
- The Secretary of the said society or his deputy may issue day licenses to *bona fide* travellers and strangers not resident within the district aforesaid on payment of a fee of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for each day's fishing: Provided that the Secretary or his deputy may refuse to issue a license to any person who (within the previous five years) has been convicted of any breach of the provisions of any Act relating to fishing for trout, or of any regulations made thereunder.
- Trout shall not be fished for, taken, or killed, otherwise than with one rod and line, but a landing-net or gaff may be used to secure any trout caught with such rod and line, and no lines or baits other than natural or artificial flies, insects, worms, or fish shall be used with such rod and line: Provided that in that portion of the Oroua River between the Aorangi Bridge at Feilding and the Menzie's Ford Bridge on the Colyton Road artificial fly only may be used.
- No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish.
- No person shall take, kill, or have in his possession any trout or perch between the 1st day of May and the 30th day of September in any year, which period is hereby appointed a close season for trout: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the Marine Department or of an acclimatization society, or the General Manager of the Department of Tourists and Health Resorts for the purpose of pisciculture or scientific investigation.

7. No person shall cast or throw into any stream in which trout exists or has been liberated, or shall allow to flow into, or place near the bank or margin of any such stream, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flax-mill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is noxious, poisonous, or injurious to fish: Provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to prohibit the depositing in such stream of debris from any mining claim.

8. Save as provided herein or by any other regulations under the said Acts, no person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

9. No person shall fish for trout without a license; and every person fishing shall, on the demand of any ranger, constable, officer of the said society, or of any person producing a license, produce and show such ranger, officer, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout.

10. Every trout not exceeding 9 in. in length from nose to tip of tail taken or caught by any person shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

11. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, wilful foul-hooking, spearing, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout; nor shall any bait be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

12. For the purpose of these regulations the mouth or entrance of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the seashore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of 500 yds. from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea, or of any harbour at low water.

13. No person shall sell, or expose or offer for sale, trout, or any part thereof.

14. Any regulation regarding the number or weight of trout which a person may take or catch in any one day or other specified period which has been made by general regulations under the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments or regulations, shall not apply to the said district.

15. If any person shall be convicted of an offence against these regulations the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

16. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be more than £50.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

FEILDING AND DISTRICT ACCLIMATIZATION SOCIETY.

Amending Regulations for Trout Fishing in the Auckland Acclimatization District.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 70, of the twentieth day of the same month, regulations were made for trout-fishing in the Auckland Acclimatization District and waters thereof:

And whereas it is advisable to amend the hereinbefore-recited regulations, and to make others in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke clauses three, eight, and twenty-one of the said regulations of the seventeenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and the First Schedule thereto, and doth substitute the following in lieu thereof:—

3. During the period from the 1st day of October, 1929, to the 30th day of September, 1930, no person shall take trout by any means whatsoever in the tributary of the Waihou known as the Waiomou and Little Waipa Streams and all tributaries thereof, and also from that portion of the Wanganui River between the Matapuna Railway Bridge and the Victory Bridge. It shall also be unlawful during the period from the 1st day of October, 1929, to the 30th day of September, 1932, to take trout by any means whatsoever from the Waimakariri River.

8. No person shall use any bait or lure other than the natural or artificial fly, or natural or artificial minnow, and any small indigenous fish, insect, grasshopper, beetle, or spider. The use of shellfish, fish ova, koura, or the houhou or matai grub, or of earthworms shall be a breach of the regulations:

Provided that no bait other than natural or artificial fly shall be used for taking fish in the Mangakahu, Mangatangi Rivers, the South Wairoa River, the Maungatawhiri River, Hay's Creek (otherwise known as Hunua Gorge Creek), Ararimu Creek, the Ongarue River (above its intersection with the Waimiha River), and the Waimiha River:

Provided still further, that no bait other than natural or artificial fly, or natural or artificial minnow, or spoon bait shall be used in taking fish in the Waipa River throughout its course and tributaries thereof, or in the Ongarue River below its intersection with the Waimiha River:

Provided still further, that no bait other than artificial fly shall be used for taking fish in that portion of the Punui River lying between the junction of the Wairaka and Waipara Rivers:

Provided still further, that no person shall fish for trout in any portion of Lake Arapuni with any lure or bait other than natural or artificial fly, artificial minnow, or some form of spoon bait; provided that no spinning fly, lure, or bait other than the artificial fly shall be used from a point 80 chains above the dam down to the spillway:

Provided still further that no person shall fish for trout in any portion of Lake Arapuni wherein artificial fly, artificial minnow, or some form of spoon bait is authorized by these regulations, with any fly, minnow, or spoon bait which is of greater length than 2½ in.

The fine for every breach of this regulation shall not be less than £2 or more than £50.

21. No person shall troll from a launch or boat in any portion of Lake Arapuni or in the Waikato River as far south as the junction of the boundary of the Auckland Acclimatization District and the Rotorua Acclimatization District:

Provided that in that portion of Lake Arapuni above a point eighty chains above the dam, it shall be legal to troll from boats propelled by oars only.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the North Auckland, Auckland, Taranaki, and Wellington Land Districts, bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Mokau River, and proceeding thence along high-water mark, Tasman Sea, in a northerly direction generally (crossing the mouths of all harbours and rivers by the way) to the Kaipara Harbour entrance to a point midway between Kaipara Heads; thence up the centre of the channels, Kaipara Harbour, leading to the mouth of the Oruawhero River; thence by the southern boundaries of the Hobson and Whangarei Acclimatization Districts, hereinafter described, to the

Mangawhai Harbour; thence by the middle of that harbour to the sea; thence along high-water mark of the sea, Hauraki Gulf, and Firth of Thames (crossing the mouths of all harbours and rivers by the way), to the mouth of the Waikawau River in Block VI, Hastings Survey District; thence up the middle of that river to its source, and along a right line from said source to Northhead, Tairua Harbour; thence southerly along high-water mark, Bay of Plenty (crossing the mouths of all harbours and rivers by the way), to the mouth of the Waihi River, in Block III, Waihi North Survey District; thence south-westerly along a right line to Mount Te Aroha Trig. station; thence north-easterly along a right line (in the direction of Ngakuriwhare Trig. Station, Block I, Katikati North) to the western boundary of the Tauranga Confiscation Block; thence south-easterly by right lines from hill to hill along the summit of the range forming the western boundary of the aforesaid Tauranga Confiscation Block and passing over Ngatamahine-rau, Mimiotohanga, and Waianuanu to Te Weraiti Trig. Station; thence south-easterly along a right line to Puwhenua Trig. Station (in Block VII, Tapapa East Survey District); thence south-westerly along a right line to Pureora Trig. Station; thence southerly along a mountain range passing through Weraroa, Tuhingamata, Motere, and Hauhangaroa, Trig. Stations to Maungaku Trig. Station; thence southerly along the western boundary of the Waione Block to the Wanganui River; thence down the middle of that river to its confluence with the Ohura River; thence up the middle of the Ohura River to the 39th parallel of south latitude; thence westerly along the said parallel of latitude to the western boundary of Block IV, Pouatu Survey District; thence due north along that boundary and the western boundary of Block XVI, Waro Survey District, to the confiscation-line; thence north-easterly along that line to the Tangarakau Stream; thence up the middle of that stream and up the middle of the Waitaanga Stream to the Kotare Road, at the southern boundary of Section 2, Block VII, Waro Survey District; thence westerly along the Kotare Road to the south-west corner of Section 1, Block VII; thence along the south-west boundary of the said section and along the southern, western, and northern boundaries of Section 3, Block VI, Waro Survey District, to the western boundary of Section 4, Block VI, Waro Survey District; thence along the western boundaries generally of Sections 4 and 5 and along the south-western and northern boundaries of Section 6 (all in Block VI, Waro Survey District) to the Mohakatino Road; thence northerly along that road to a stream which crosses the Mohakatino-Parininihi 1st East Block, and flows into the Mohakatino Stream near the western-most corner of Section 1, Block III, Waro Survey District; thence down that stream to the said confluence and up the said Mohakatino Stream and along the northern boundary of Section 3, Block III, Waro Survey District, to Tawhitiraupeka Trig. Station; thence along the south-western and western boundaries of Mokau-Mohakatino 1st Block to the Mokau River; thence down the middle of that river to the sea, the place of commencement; including in the hereinbefore-described area Great Barrier Island and all islands (excepting Rangitoto) within the Hauraki Gulf.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore necessary for the erection of the house and outbuildings as shown on the plan marked M.D. 4419.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister an annual sum of £2, payable in advance, dating from the 1st day of April, 1929, the first of such payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said house and outbuildings without payment.

5. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned house and outbuildings in good order and repair.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said house and outbuildings and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such house or outbuildings, requiring him, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years, computed from the 26th day of April, 1929, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written authority of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

10. In case the licensee shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said house and outbuildings for a period of thirty days;
- (3) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid ; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said shop is erected, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said shop ; such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister :

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides :

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of the said shop as shown on the plan marked M.D. 4402, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £5, in advance, payable on the first day of April in each year, the first of such annual payments to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all persons in the Government service acting in the execution of their duties shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said shop without payment.

5. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned shop in good order and repair.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said shop and view the state of repair thereof ; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such shop, requiring the licensee within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the shop, the licensee shall with all reasonable speed cause such defects to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs or any regulation of the

Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the 25th day of March, 1929, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority ; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the shop at the licensee's own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

10. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said shop may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

11. In case the licensee shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them ;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said shop for a period of thirty days ;
- (3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions ; or
- (4) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,—

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatever ; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

12. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said shop entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be ; and, if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said shop to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensee.

The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,074 as against 1,054 in July, an increase of 20. The deaths in August were 712—a decrease of 18 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 378, females 334. Sixty-nine of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 9.69 per cent. of the whole number. NOTE.—A wet and cold month with light southerly winds prevailing. Precipitation at Karori Reservoir, near Kelburn, was 57 per cent. above the average. Total bright sunshine, 93.6 hours, 32 per cent. of the possible, and six sunless days. Frost was recorded on the grass on five mornings, hail fell on the 2nd, 14th, and 23rd, and fog was in evidence on ten days. Mean dew-point, 41.9°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.265 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JULY, 1929.

The month has been, on the whole, a cold, wet, and unsettled one, but, except for a few occasions, there has been an absence of strong winds. Rainfall was again considerably above the average over most of the Dominion, though deficiencies were recorded in some districts. In the South Island these deficiencies were experienced south of Westport, in Otago, and at a few scattered places in North Canterbury. In the North Island places on the east coast and about Wanganui and Taihape received less than the normal fall. The greatest difference from the average occurred at Lambrook Station, Fairlie, with 263 per cent. and Timaru with 169 per cent. above, and at Okuru, South Westland, with 60 per cent. below. The excessive rain in Canterbury interfered with ploughing, so that spring sowing of cereal crops will be retarded. In parts of the North Island there were more deaths amongst hoggets than usual.

Temperatures were everywhere lower than the average for July. Frosts were fairly numerous, and in some cases severe. There was, in consequence, little growth of pastures, but owing to the absence of high winds the actual damage to vegetation was very slight. Snowfalls were frequent and copious in the high country of both Islands, though none lay for any time on the low levels. There still appears, generally, to be ample green feed available, and in comparatively few cases only has resort to ensilage been necessary. Stock are, on the whole, in good condition and farming prospects favourable.

The most notable meteorological feature was the tendency for anticyclones to pass north of New Zealand. There was only one which proved an exception in this respect—namely, that which moved across the Dominion between the 3rd and the 5th. Fine weather prevailed generally on these three days.

Cyclones were again very prevalent, and even when depressions were of the westerly type originally, they had generally developed cyclonic form by the time they had reached the Dominion.

The first of the more severe cyclones experienced moved on to New Zealand on the 7th, and at 9 a.m. was centred off the west coast of the South Island. During the night of the 6th, north-easterly winds increased to gale force in many parts, and at Christchurch the wind was exceptionally violent. Rain set in and became general on the 7th. The Nelson and Marlborough districts experienced particularly heavy falls at this time, and the resulting floods caused considerable damage through low-lying ground becoming inundated and through numerous land slips.

A week later, on the 13th, another cyclone advanced on to New Zealand, its centre being located off Puysegur Point on that date. This disturbance proved to be a slow-moving one, and a controlling influence over our weather was exercised by it until the 19th. This period was the wettest portion of the month. Heavy rains were recorded every day over large areas of the Dominion, and the total amount of precipitation produced by the storm was very great. On the 14th the Nelson district again suffered from floods and serious damage was done. At Tahuna, a slip occurred on the hillside and some houses were wrenched from their foundations. In Canterbury and Otago, also, floods resulted from the prolonged heavy rains. Main road communication was interrupted both north and south of Timaru and on the Mount Cook route. The Taieri Plain was covered with water. Fortunately, ample warning was provided, and stock were removed to high land in time to prevent serious loss.

By the 20th the cyclone centre had passed eastwards, and a brief respite of almost spring-like weather was experienced on this day. During the night, however, rain again set in with cold southerly winds. On the 22nd and 23rd, while an anticyclone was passing north of New Zealand, fair weather prevailed. From this date onwards, however, cold, changeable, and showery conditions were the rule, though mainly fair weather was experienced on the 27th and 28th.
