HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of Samoa conferred on him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the following regulations in amendment of the Samoa Immigration Consolidation Order, 1924 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order").

REGULATIONS.

1. (a) THESE regulations may be cited as "The Samoa Immigration Amendment Order, 1929."

(b) These regulations shall be read together with and deemed to form part of the principal Order (as amended by Order in Council made on the 20th day of June, 1927, and by Order in Council made on the 17th day of September, 1928).

(c) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of November, 1929.

2. (a) Clause 4 of the principal Order is hereby revoked.

(b) Clause 6 of the principal Order is hereby amended by omitting from subclause one paragraph (b) thereof.

to be a member of the Whakatane Harbour Board as a representative of the electors of the Rangitaiki Subdivision of the Harbour District, and

to be a member of the Board as a representative of the Taneatua Subdivision of the Harbour District, to fill the vacancies caused by the before-mentioned failures to elect.

BOROUGH OF NEW PLYMOUTH.

PURSUANT to section 13 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, I hereby give notice that a poll of the ratepayers of the Borough of New Plymouth was taken on the 25th day of

September, 1929, upon a proposal to raise a special loan of one hundred and seventy-two thousand pounds (£172,000) for the following purposes:—

(a) The particular purposes for which the loan is required are:—

£162,800 to provide a system of drainage for the Borough of New Plymouth, including in such purpose the purchasing, taking, or otherwise acquiring or providing land, buildings, easements, plants, materials, and other things for the good and efficient drainage of the borough, and for the exercise of the powers conferred for this purpose by Part XXII of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, or any statutory modification or re-enactment thereof for the time being in force; the extension of existing drains or sewers; the payment of compensation to persons injuriously affected by the carrying-out of the said purpose; or any matter or thing incidental or in relation to such purpose:

£9,200 for the purpose of providing funds out of which advances may be made to the owner or owners of any premises within the Borough of New Plymouth for the purpose of repaying the whole or any part of the expenditure incurred by the New Plymouth Borough Council for or in respect of any work, materials, or things executed, provided, or done by the said Council on or to the premises of any such owner or owners in pursuance of the provisions of Part XXII (Drainage and Sanitation) of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, or any statutory modification or re-enactment thereof for the time being in force, or in pursuance of any by-law of the Borough of New Plymouth relating to drainage or sanitation, and including the provision of all fittings necessary to enable the proper disposal of waste waters and sewage matter:

(b) The sum to be borrowed for all such purposes is £172,000 at a rate of interest not exceeding five pounds ten shillings (£5 10s.) per centum per annum, with a sinking fund of two pounds per centum per annum additional:

(c) The proposed security for the said loan of £172,000 and the interest and sinking fund thereon is an annually recurring special rate of two pence half-penny (2½d.) in the pound on the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value of all rateable property in the said Borough of New Plymouth), and it is proposed to repay the said loan on the 1st day of April, 1953:

(d) It is proposed to pay out of the said loan the cost of raising the said loan, but not the interest and sinking fund thereon for the first year:

The number of valid votes recorded for the proposal was 1,258; the number of valid votes recorded against the proposal was 431. The total number of valid votes recorded was 1,689.

I therefore declare the said proposal carried.

The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,056 as against 1,074 in August, a decrease of 18. The deaths in September were 616—a decrease of 96 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 349, females 267. Fifty-eight of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 9.42 per cent. of the whole number. Forty-three of these were under one year of age.

Amended Scheme for the Control of Dannevirke High School.

Education Department,

Wellington, 1st October, 1929.

WHEREAS on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and six, by virtue of the provisions of the Education Act, 1904, the Minister of Education did establish at Dannevirke a secondary school to be known as the "Dannevirke High School":

And whereas the said school has heretofore been controlled under a scheme of control approved by the Minister on the seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the sixteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, at page 2427, and subsequently amended by amendments duly approved and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* respectively on the nineteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, at page 3307, on the nineteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, at page 1848, on the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, at page 2757, and again on the nineteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, at page 579:

And whereas the governing body of the said school, having been notified pursuant to section ninety-two of the Education Act, 1914, to modify the said scheme, has proposed to modify the same as on and from the date of publication hereof, by revocation thereof and by substitution therefor of the scheme set out in the Schedule hereto, and has accordingly duly submitted to the Minister the scheme set out in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, I, Harry Atmore, Minister of Education, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the said section ninety-two, do hereby approve the modification as and from the said date of publication hereof, of the scheme heretofore in force as aforesaid, such modification to be affected by the revocation of the scheme heretofore in force, and the substitution therefor of the scheme set out in the Schedule hereto, and accordingly hereby approve of the said scheme set out in the Schedule hereto as the scheme of control of the Dannevirke High School, and of any other secondary school subsequently established and under the control of the Board of Governors of the Dannevirke High School.

SCHEDULE.

1. THE provisions of the document entitled "Standard Scheme of Control for Secondary Schools," published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1928, at page 3451 (hereinafter called "The Standard Scheme"), shall be incorporated herein as fully as if set forth at length hereunder but with the modifications and additions hereinafter contained.

2. The governing body of the School shall be known by the name of "The Board of Governors of the Dannevirke High School."

3. References in the Standard Scheme to the Borough Council shall be interpreted as references to the Borough Council of the Borough of Dannevirke.

4. Clause 11 of the Standard Scheme shall be amended to read as follows:—

"11. Such election shall be held in the first week of the month of May in the year 1931 and every alternate year thereafter, or as soon thereafter as may be convenient, on a date to be fixed by the Board."

5. Clause 19 of the Standard Scheme shall be amended to read as follows:—

"19. Except in the case of a casual vacancy every member shall hold office until the 31st day of May in the year 1931, and every member appointed or elected in the year 1931, or later, shall hold office until the 31st day of May in the second year after the year of his election or appointment, and if on such 31st day of May the appointment or election of his successor has not been notified to the Board he shall continue to hold office until the date on which such appointment or election is so notified."

6. Clause 43 of the Standard Scheme shall be read with the omission of the words "The Secretary shall be insured under a fidelity bond for a sum of not less than five hundred pounds."
