And whereas the said land is no longer suitable for scenic purposes by reason of the absence of bush of scenic value thereon:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section eight of the Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1910, do hereby revoke the reservation for scenic purposes over the land described in the Schedule hereto.

Constituting the Hurunui Electric-power District and Outer Area.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the district described in the First Schedule hereto to be an electric-power district, and I hereby assign to such district the name of the "Hurunui Electric-power District"; and I do further proclaim that the areas described in the Second Schedule hereto shall be the outer area of such electric-power district.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

HURUNUI ELECTRIC-POWER DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District situated in the Waipara, Amuri, and Cheviot Counties, and bounded as follows: Commencing at the most westerly corner of Rural Section 37089, in Block V, Okuku Survey District; thence by the north-west boundary of said Section 37089 and the Seaward River in a north-easterly direction to the Hurunui River; by the Hurunui River to a point in line with the continuation of the south-western boundary of Section 18, Square 105; thence to and by the south-western and north-western boundaries of said Section 18, and by the north-western boundaries of Sections 9, 25, 24, 8, 34, 33, and 32, Square 105, to the northernmost corner of Section 38, Square 105; thence bounded towards the south-east by said Section 38, towards the south-west generally by Section 39, Square 105 and 109, to the north branch of the Hurunui River; thence by that river to Lake Sumner, and by the middle of Lake Sumner aforesaid, to a point opposite Marion Stream; thence to and by the said Marion Stream through Lake Marion to its northernmost point; thence in an easterly direction following along the boundary between the Pahau Riding, and the Hanmer Riding of the Amuri County to Trig. Station S; thence by a line, being the boundary between Pastoral Run 13 to the Mandamus River; thence again following the aforesaid boundary between the Hanmer and Pahau Ridings to the Pahau River; thence to and by the southern boundary of Lot 3, D.P. 3948 and 3953 to Brown's Stream, and by that stream to the Waiau River; by the said Waiau River and the Hanmer River, and by the boundary-line between the Lyndon and Hanmer Ridings and the Waiau and Hanmer Ridings of the Amuri County to the land district boundary between Canterbury and Marlborough; thence by the last-named boundary to the Conway River, and in a south-easterly direction by the said Conway River to the sea; thence by the sea to the Waipara River, the southern boundary of the Waipara County; thence by the last-named boundary to the commencing-point; saving and excepting therefrom the areas described in clauses 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto. As the said district is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 75546 (sheet 1), deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Hutt Valley Electric-power Board to erect electric lines as shown on plan marked P.W.D. 61998, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, and such further lines as may from time to time be required in the Johnsonville Town District and the Porirua Riding of the Makara County, subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. No electric lines shall be used for the distribution of electrical energy until the Hutt Valley Electric-power Board has obtained a license for such purpose in accordance with the provisions of section 319 of the Public Works Act, 1928.

2. Any conditions inserted in such licenses shall be strictly complied with by such Board.

3. Such Board shall forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works such further plans and particulars as the Minister of Public Works may from time to time require.

4. The Board shall not, without the consent in writing of the Minister of Public Works, erect any electric lines along the routes of the Government main trunk transmission-lines.

5. The works hereby authorized shall be constructed so as to comply with the regulations made under section 2 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, dated the 11th day of July, 1927, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 12th day of the same month, or any regulations made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor, which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein.

6. The Board shall substantially complete the works hereby authorized within a period of three years from the date of this license, or within such further time as the Minister may allow in the event of the work being delayed by strikes, lock-outs, breakdowns, or other unavoidable causes not due to any neglect by the Board.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and thirty-five of the Native Land Act, 1909, it is provided that, with the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, a body corporate constituted under Part XVII of the said Act may, on the security of a mortgage or charge of the land vested in it, borrow money for any of the purposes therein mentioned :

And whereas the body corporate constituted as aforesaid described in the Schedule hereto has applied for the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council accordingly, and also that consent be given to any money so borrowed being paid to the committee of management of such body corporate :

And whereas the Tairāwhiti District Māori Land Board has recommended that such consent be granted, and it seems expedient so to do :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby, pursuant to section three hundred and thirty-five of the Native Land Act, 1909, and all other powers him enabling, grant precedent consent to the said body corporate, on the security of a mortgage or charge of the land vested in it, borrowing from a State Loan Department, or from any person or body corporate, whether by cash credit in current account with a bank or otherwise, for the purpose of enabling the said body corporate to liquidate existing liabilities in respect of, and to further improve and more efficiently farm the lands of the said body corporate, the sum set out hereunder opposite the name of such body corporate ; and doth authorize the payment of any money so borrowed to the committee of management of the said body corporate, and doth consent to any instrument of alienation by way of mortgage of the lands of the said body corporate given in pursuance of this Order in Council being confirmed by the Tairāwhiti District Māori Land Board.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth—subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and dated the eleventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twelfth day of the same month, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof (and hereinafter collectively referred to as “the regulations”), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein—hereby authorize the Hutt Valley Electric-power Board, duly constituted under the provisions of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925 (hereinafter with its successors and assigns referred to as “the licensee”), to use for power, lighting, heating, or other uses within the area of supply hereinafter described, the electric lines indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 61998, and deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, and any other lines heretofore erected by the licensee and such further lines as may hereafter be erected by the licensee.

SCHEDULE.

1. AREA OF SUPPLY.

THE area of supply comprises all those areas in the Wellington Land District being the Johnsonville Town District and the Porirua Riding of the Makara County. As the said areas are more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 61998, deposited as aforesaid, and thereon bordered blue.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (e) of clause 5 of the regulations.

Electrical energy shall be received in bulk from the Public Works Department's substation at Khandallah at a pressure of approximately 11,000 volts between phases.

3. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

The licensee shall maintain the works used under this license in proper working-order during the continuance of such license.

4. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of twenty-one years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine, but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

5. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that “lighting purposes” shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes; and provided further that if accounts are paid within fourteen days of due date the charges shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes and 4½d. per unit for motor-power, cooking, and heating purposes.

In the case of wholesale supply the charge shall not exceed £12 per kilovolt-ampere per year plus ½d. per unit. “Wholesale supply” for this purpose shall be held to be a supply in respect of which the consumer shall guarantee to pay not less than £180 per year.

A minimum charge of 5s. per month in boroughs and town districts and 7s. per month in country districts, including meter rent in both cases (if any), may be collected if required by the licensee, and shall be printed on the licensee's conditions of supply.

6. ROUTES RESERVED FOR GOVERNMENT LINES.

The licensee shall not, without the consent in writing of the Minister of Public Works, erect any electric lines along the routes of the Government main trunk transmission-lines.

7. LOCATION OF OVERHEAD LINES.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, one side of every road or street shall be left free by the licensee for telegraph-lines. Lines shall not be erected on both sides of a road or street unless the permission of the Minister of Telegraphs or the Post and Telegraph Department is first obtained in accordance with clause 9 of the regulations. Except at crossing-places the minimum separation between a telephone-line and poles carrying high or extra-high tension circuits shall be equal to the height of the taller pole.

8. CONVERSION OF LINES FROM EARTH-WORKING TO METALLIC.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the licensee shall bear the cost of converting the Railway or Post and Telegraph Department's lines which are now erected from earth-working to metallic if such conversion is required by the Minister of Railways or the Minister of Telegraphs owing to electrical interference arising from the licensee's lines.

9. RAILWAY AND TELEGRAPH LINES.

The licensee shall from time to time rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Railways or the Minister of Telegraphs any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of any telegraph-line which is under the control of or in use by the Railway Department or the Telegraph Department respectively, and which was erected prior to the licensee's lines. All electric lines must be erected with sufficient clearance to permit telegraph-lines to pass under the said electric lines.

On the average of the last five seasons (viz., 5.49 tons per acre) the total yield from the estimated area shown for 1929-30 should approximate 124,000 tons, as against 123,607 tons last season.

It may be well to note that only holdings of 1 acre and over outside borough boundaries are covered by these figures. In the case of potatoes a fair amount is undoubtedly grown on the smaller holdings and on holdings situated within boroughs.

Examination Rules under the Surveyors Registration Act, 1928.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section 20 of the Surveyors Registration Act, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), the Survey Board doth hereby revoke the regulations under the Surveyors' Institute Act, 1908, dated the 13th day of July, 1913, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 7th day of August, 1913; and doth also revoke the amendments thereof made on the 22nd November, 1922; the 26th day of March, 1918; the 19th day of June, 1919; and the 21st day of January, 1926; and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following rules for the guidance of persons who desire to be examined in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or to obtain registration thereunder, and prescribing the form of register to be kept, and doth hereby declare that such rules shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

INTERPRETATIONS.

IN the interpretation of these rules, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms shall have the meaning set against each respectively—

- The "Act" shall mean the Act under which these rules are made, and shall include such other enactments with regard to land surveying as may be made by Parliament or are in force at the date hereof.
- "Real Property Acts" shall mean and include the Land Transfer Acts, the Deeds Registration Acts, and such other Acts relating to or affecting the subdivision of land as have been or may be passed by Parliament.
- "Reciprocating State": Any State, colony, Dominion, or Commonwealth within His Majesty's Dominions which, in the opinion of the Board, reciprocally recognizes the status of surveyors in accordance with the conditions set forth in these rules, and includes New Zealand.
- "Board": The Survey Board constituted under the Act.
- "Reciprocating Board": The duly constituted Board in a reciprocating State.
- "Secretary": The Secretary appointed by the Board.
- "Registered surveyor": Any person who is registered by a reciprocating Board as a licensed, qualified, authorized, certificated, or land surveyor.
- "Articles": An indenture or writing containing a contract or an agreement for tuition in land surveying, made between a registered surveyor and a person seeking to qualify himself for registration as a surveyor.
- "University": A University in a reciprocating State or a University recognized by such University.
- "Register": The register directed by the Act to be kept.

RULES.

EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES.

Date of Examinations.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates of competency as surveyors shall be held in Wellington in the month of September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

The Board may also hold examinations in such other place or places than Wellington as it may deem desirable.

Candidates to apply.

2. Each candidate shall forward to the Secretary an application for permission to present himself for examination, together with the documentary evidence specified in Part I hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least fourteen days before the date fixed for the commencement of the examination, due notice of which will be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

The examination fee prescribed in the Third Schedule must be paid on or before the date of commencement of the examination.

Division of Examination.

3. The examination shall be divided into three parts :—

- Part I : Preliminary.
 Part II : Written.
 Part III : Oral and practical.

Each candidate must fulfil the requirements of Part I before admission to Part II; and must pass in Part II before admission to Part III; but the Board may in its discretion examine in Part III during the currency of Parts I or II, but the results thereof shall not be available or disclosed until the candidate has complied with the rules.

PART I.

Preliminary Conditions.

4. Each candidate shall submit certificates to show—

- (a) That he has passed the Matriculation Examination at a University; or a test accepted by a University as being of Matriculation standard, provided that such examination includes a pass at the Matriculation standard in English and mathematics.
- (b) That, in addition to the above pass, the candidate has passed in the special trigonometry paper for the Engineer's Preliminary of the Matriculation Examination of 1926 or subsequent date; or instead thereof in the subject "pure mathematics" of Part III of the Examination for Class "C" conducted by the Education Department.
- (c) That he has served professionally under articles with a registered surveyor or surveyors for a period of not less than four years, three of which must have been in the field and one year in office, and that he is competent to effect surveys on his own responsibility. The last-mentioned certificate shall be in Form I in the First Schedule hereto.

Registration of Articles.

5. All articles of indenture or other similar agreement, duly completed, and accompanied by evidence that the applicant has attained the educational requirements prescribed in rule 4 (a), shall be forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months after the commencement of the term of the articles. Similarly, notification of transfer of such articles shall be forwarded for registration within three months of the date of such transfer. In each case the application must be accompanied by the prescribed fee set out in the Third Schedule.

Original Field Notes and Plans to be submitted.

6. Each candidate shall submit with his application for examination—

- (a) His original field notes, and plan drawn by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a watercourse or other natural feature, or an irregular road.
- (b) His original field notes, plan, and technical description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Acts.
- (c) His original field notes, plan, and section of a proposed road, railway or drainage work, of a length of not less than ten chains.
- (d) A plan and particulars of the measurement of a base line, not less than 80 chains in length, connected by a series of at least three triangles with the triangulation of the district.
- (e) A plan of a topographical survey of not less than one square mile of hilly country.

Each plan shall bear the following certificate, signed and dated by the candidate :—

"I hereby certify that this survey was made by me personally, and that this plan and the accompanying field notes are entirely my own work."

PART II.

WRITTEN EXAMINATION.

Appliances to be provided.

7. Each candidate shall provide himself with book of mathematical tables; a 20-40 scale, a parallel ruler (15 in. most suitable), a protractor, and all necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

Traverse tables may be used. Calculating machines, slide rules, &c., are not allowed in the examination-room.

Books of tables shall be subject to the approval of the Board, and shall not contain notes.

Subjects of Examination.

8. The examination shall embrace the following subjects:—

(a) Principles and Practice of Surveying—

Details of practice, including the keeping of field notes.

Cadastral, Stadia, Topographical, Trigonometrical, and Underground Surveying.

Setting out areas and curves.

Barometric and other measurements of heights.

The use of contour maps for locating and laying out roads.

Designing for the subdivision of town, suburban, and country lands.

Principles of town planning.

Surveying under the Real Property Acts.

Redetermination of boundaries.

Writing technical descriptions of boundaries.

Plotting and drawing plans, sections, and contours.

(b) Computations—

Reduction of traverses, co-ordinates, computations connected with triangulation and the setting-out of roads and curves, adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

(c) Solution of spherical triangles, azimuth, altitude, hour angle, right ascension, declination, and the relations between them; use of ephemerides; time, correction to sun or star observations, effect of errors of adjustment of instruments, the principles of elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of magnetic needle, projection of maps and charts.

(d) Engineering Surveys—

Computations in connection with levelling, grading, setting out, and measurement of earthworks.

(e) Miscellaneous—

Elementary physics, elementary geology, and elementary forestry.

Physics. The subject generally as contained in any good elementary text-book, with a more detailed knowledge of the laws underlying the construction and use of surveying instruments—*e.g.*, the pressure of liquids and gases, as affecting the barometer, thermometer, and level.

The allowances to be made for the effects of heat in the practical work of the surveyor.

The reflection and refraction of light; lenses, &c.

Terrestrial magnetism and variation of the compass.

Geology: The subject generally as contained in any good elementary text-book, with special reference to—

The classification of areas of land according to their formation, rocks, soils, &c., and to their adaptability for industrial purposes.

NOTE.—Specimens of rock will be submitted for classification and description.

Forestry: The distribution of native timbers and their economic values. The influence of forests on climate and water-supply, the principles of afforestation.

PART III.

ORAL AND PRACTICAL.

9. Each candidate may be required to effect surveys under supervision, and shall submit himself for *viva voce* examination in the following subjects :—

- (a) The principles of construction, and practical tests in the adjustment and use of all instruments required in modern field practice and office work.
- (b) The practice of surveying, with a knowledge of the Acts and regulations bearing on same.
- (c) Field Astronomy—practical determination of time, latitude, and azimuth in the field.

Exemptions.

10. If a candidate has qualifications as detailed hereunder, documentary evidence of which must be produced, the following exemptions may be granted :—

- (a) A field experience of not less than twelve months with a civil engineer approved by the Board.

Exemption, six months' professional service in the field.

- (b) A satisfactory certificate or diploma from a University or recognized public technical school or college, in any one or more of the following subjects—*i.e.*, elementary physics, geology, and forestry.

Exemption: Examination therein. The candidate will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted to each subject for which he holds such certificate or diploma.

- (c) A University pass certificate for the first year's course in civil engineering or for a special course in surveying.

Exemption: Six months' professional service in the field and six months' office experience.

- (d) A University degree of Bachelor of Engineering.

Exemption: Twelve months' professional service in field and twelve months' office experience.

- (e) Where this degree has been obtained at a University where a representative of the Board acts as a co-examiner in surveying.

Exemption—(1) Examination in subjects of Part II, except such subjects as are enumerated under "Principles and Practice of Surveying"; and (2) eighteen months' professional service in the field and twelve months' office experience.

In all other respects the conditions set forth in rules 4 and 9 must be complied with :

Provided that a candidate holding an accepted University degree shall not be required to gain the necessary professional experience required in rule 4 (c) under articles of indenture-ship, but notice of commencement of such professional experience must be given to the Board.

GENERAL RULES.

ALLOCATION OF MARKS.

11. The maximum marks allotted to each subject shall be as detailed in the Second Schedule.

DEFINITION OF A PASS.

12. In order to pass the examination each candidate shall—

- (a) Satisfy the Board with regard to all certificates and credentials specified in Part I. The experience indicated by plans submitted in accordance with rule 6 will be valued according to the work, nature of field service, &c., the maximum marks obtainable being 50. The marks so obtained will be added to the sum of the marks gained in Part II.
- (b) Obtain not less than 60 per cent. of the total maximum marks allotted to the papers of Part II, the marks obtained in Part I being included.

- (c) Obtain not less than 60 per cent. of the total maximum marks allotted to the compulsory subjects, *i.e.*,—
Principles and Practice of Surveying,
Computations A and B,
Levelling and Earthworks,
Astronomy and Geodesy,
and not less than 50 per cent. of the allotted marks in any one of these subjects.

NOTE.—Under (c) the marks obtained in Part I are not taken into account.

District Land Registrar

- (d) Obtain not less than 60 per cent. of the total maximum marks allotted to Part III, and not less than 50 per cent. of the marks allotted to each subject therein.

CONSEQUENCE OF FAILURE.

13. (a) Candidates who fail to satisfy the requirements of rule 12 (a) will not be eligible to proceed in the examination.

(b) Candidates who fail to obtain sixty per centum of marks as specified in rule 12 (b) will not be eligible to proceed to Part III of the examination and must take the whole of Part II again, but the enforcement of this rule will be at the discretion of the Board, which may examine such candidate in Part III at Wellington during his first examination, but his results therein shall not be available or disclosed until he has satisfied the Board in his whole examination. (See also rule 3.)

(c) Candidates who succeed in accordance with rule 12 (b) but fail to obtain the necessary total marks in the compulsory subjects, as detailed in rule 12 (c), must take the whole of these subjects again.

(d) Candidates who obtain the requisite number of marks in the compulsory subjects as a whole, but do not secure half marks in any one, or not more than two thereof, may be allowed to take a "Post" examination in accordance with rule 14.

POST EXAMINATIONS.

14. Should a candidate fail in not more than two subjects of Part II, the Board may allow him, if his papers are considered of sufficient merit, to sit again for examination in those subjects only, at either or both of the next two succeeding examinations. If he fails to pass at these examinations, he will be required to take the whole of Part II of the examination again, excepting his original exemptions, if any. A similar concession may be allowed in Part III of the examination.

CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY, AND REGISTRATION.

15. Each candidate who has passed the examination prescribed in these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate of competency (in Form II in the First Schedule) as a surveyor, and upon furnishing satisfactory evidence of good character, and upon complying with the provisions of the Act and rules thereunder and payment of the prescribed fee set out in the Third Schedule, to registration as a surveyor in the Dominion of New Zealand. The certificate of registration shall be in Form III in the First Schedule.

LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION.

16. Either without further examination or upon such *viva voce* examination as may be deemed necessary, the Board may grant a letter of recommendation (in Form IV in the First Schedule) to any person to whom a certificate of competency has been issued, and who desires to be registered in another reciprocating State. The application for such letter of recommendation must be accompanied by the prescribed fee set out in the Third Schedule.

REGISTRATION UPON QUALIFICATIONS OBTAINED IN A RECIPROCATING STATE.

17. A Surveyor who applies to the Board for registration without examination, on qualifications obtained in another reciprocating State, shall submit—

- (a) His certificate of competency, or of registration, or his license to practice as a surveyor of such State.

- (b) Evidence as to identity and character.
- (c) Provided that should such certificate or license have been issued upon examination prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a letter or certificate or letter of recommendation, dated not more than twelve months previously, from the Board of the State in which the certificate or license applies; and
- (d) Should the applicant be prevented by absence from the State in which the certificate or license was granted, from obtaining such letter of recommendation, he shall pass such examination under these rules as the Board may require.

Subject to compliance with the foregoing provisions and such statutory requirements as may be necessary, together with payment of the prescribed fee set out in the Third Schedule, he shall be entitled to registration as a surveyor in the Dominion of New Zealand.

REGISTRATION UPON QUALIFICATIONS OBTAINED ELSEWHERE.

18. A surveyor who applies to the Board for registration on qualifications obtained in any other country, being part of the British Empire, prepared (in the opinion of the Board) to reciprocate in this particular with the reciprocating States, shall submit—

- (a) His credentials or qualifications as a surveyor;
- (b) Evidence that such document is still in force;
- (c) Evidence as to identity and character;
- (d) Evidence that he has completed not less than six months' service in the field with a practising registered surveyor in New Zealand; and
- (e) A certificate of competency from that surveyor.

If the Board is satisfied with the evidence submitted and that the qualifications covered by the credentials are equivalent to those prescribed under these regulations he shall pass such further examination as the Board may require, and upon compliance with the provisions of the Act and payment of the prescribed fee set out in the Third Schedule shall be entitled to registration as a surveyor in the Dominion of New Zealand.

REGISTER TO BE KEPT.

19. The Secretary shall keep a register of—

- (a) The names, qualifications, and addresses of all persons registered by the Board as surveyors, together with the dates of registration, and where necessary, records of their careers as surveyors.
- (b) All letters of recommendation with dates of issue.

20. In addition to the register required by the Act, the Secretary shall also keep lists respectively of—

- (a) The names and addresses of all articulated pupils who have complied with the requirements herein set forth, together with the names of the surveyors to whom they are articulated, and a complete record of all transfers of such articles.
- (b) The names, addresses, and qualifications of all persons to whom certificates of competency have been issued, together with the dates of issue.

RECORD OF CHARGES AGAINST SURVEYORS.

21. The register shall also contain a brief record of any charge that may be laid against a surveyor, together with the finding of the Board.

NOTE.—September was a cold month, with mean temperature some three degrees below the average. Total bright sunshine, 203.2 hours, 57 per cent. of the possible, and one sunless day. The rainfall was 15 per cent. above the mean at Karori Reservoir, near Kelburn. Frost was recorded on the grass on seven mornings, lightning was seen on the 10th, and hail fell on the 3rd, 11th, 27th, and 28th. Mean dew-point, 41.1°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.257 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1929.

This year we have experienced the coldest September for a considerable time. All parts of the country report low average temperatures, and frosts were unusually numerous. Although cold, the month was a sunny one, there being numbers of beautifully fine days. Rainfall was, on the whole, below average. This was almost generally the case over the North Island, except about Wellington. In the South Island, both east and west coasts experienced a dry month, but Stewart Island, Southland, and much of the central portions of the Island had more than the normal fall. The low temperatures gave a distinct setback to growing vegetation, and feed is rather short in most districts. Parts of the North Island escaped the severity of the storms and are in good condition. There have been losses of lambs in the Wellington Province and parts of the South Island, especially the foothills of Canterbury.

The storms recorded during the month were in no case responsible for any very heavy rains except at a few isolated places. Snow, however, fell frequently, especially in the high country of the South Island. In the interior of Canterbury it has been one of the worst seasons on record for snow, but no very severe losses of stock are reported.

The tendency for storms to take on cyclonic form was again in evidence during the month. Subtropical waters to the north and north-east have been unusually frequently disturbed by storms of this type.

On the 1st a deep depression of the southern or westerly type was approaching the Dominion. A small cyclonic centre developed in its northern portion, and this crossed Canterbury on the afternoon of the 2nd. Heavy north-westerly gales blew in the Cook Strait region and over the South Island. The greatest severity was felt in Canterbury, and much damage was done to plantations in the Ashburton County. Cold southerlies followed, gale force again being reached in places. Snowfalls were recorded in Canterbury and Otago.

Following a fine spell, another southern depression passed on the 8th. Northerly gales again blew in and south of Cook Strait. A tornado visited the Seddon district, in Marlborough. Some places reported thunderstorms.

A moderate cyclone crossed the North Tasman Sea during the period from the 10th to the 13th, passing between Norfolk Island and Cape Maria van Diemen on the last-mentioned date. Being so far north its effect was to produce fine rather than wet weather over New Zealand. When it was well to the eastward, however, on the 16th, south-westerly gales were experienced.

Numbers of thunderstorms occurred on the 18th in association with the passage of a westerly depression, which brought very low pressures and westerly gales to the far South. These storms were particularly severe in north Taranaki (where at one station a cow was electrocuted), and at Murchison. Following this depression there was a severe cold snap, with snow again in many parts of the South Island. Some was seen, also, on the hills near Wellington. On the 21st a cyclone, coming from the North, appeared to the north-east of East Cape. South-easterly gales were experienced in parts of the North Island and more snow fell in the South Island. The most severe period of the cold snap—from the 20th to the 22nd—became later the further northward one proceeded. A very severe frost was felt in the Auckland and Thames districts on the 22nd, and great damage was done to potato and tomato plants.

A fine interval followed, but between the 24th and the 27th a series of cyclones moved from the Tasman Sea across the Dominion. Southerly gales set in from Cook Strait southwards on the 27th while the last centre was crossing the Auckland Peninsula. A cold snap, reminiscent of that of a week previous, resulted. Snowfalls were again reported from the South Island and hail in places. There was considerable mortality amongst lambs in Canterbury. Thereafter mild and fair conditions developed.
