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Altering Boundaries of Stratford and Clifton Counties, and including Area in Uruti Riding, Clifton County.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection two of section fourteen of the Counties Act, 1920, that the boundaries of any one or more counties may be altered in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Council of each of such counties in which the Counties Act is in force :

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Stratford County Council on the twenty-first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine :

And whereas a similar resolution was passed by the Clifton County Council on the sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, praying for the alteration of the boundaries of the Stratford and Clifton Counties in the manner described in the said resolutions and in the First Schedule hereto :

And whereas it is expedient to make such alteration in accordance with the said resolutions, and that the area to be added to the Clifton County should be included in the Uruti Riding of that County :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Stratford County, shall be added to and form part of the Clifton County; that the boundaries of the Stratford and Clifton Counties as so altered shall be those set forth under the respective headings in the Second Schedule hereto; that the area added as aforesaid to the Clifton County shall be included in the Uruti Riding of the said county; and that the boundaries of that riding shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule hereto :

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA EXCLUDED FROM STRATFORD COUNTY AND INCLUDED IN CLIFTON COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the northern side of Tarawai Road and the Ngatoto Road; thence easterly

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generally along the northern side of the Tarawai Road to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Section 9, Block XI, Upper Waitara Survey District; thence along that line to the middle of the Waitara River; thence down the middle of the Waitara River to a point in line with the intersection of the northern side of Tarawai Road and Ngatoto Road; thence along a right line to that point, the place of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

STRATFORD COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded on the north by Clifton County, hereinafter described, from the south-eastern corner of Section 6, Block X, Upper Waitara Survey District, to the north-western corner of Section 2, Block XVI, Upper Waitara Survey District; thence southerly generally along the western boundaries generally of Sections 2 and 1 (Forest Reserve), Block XVI, and Section 9, Block XV, Upper Waitara Survey District, to the Tirangi Road; thence south-easterly along the northern side of that road to a point in line with the western boundary of Section 11, Block XV, aforesaid; thence to and along that boundary and the south-western boundary of the said Section 11 to the Confiscation-line; thence south-westerly along the Confiscation-line to the Te Wera closed road; thence along the Te Wera closed road to the Mohakau Road; thence along the southern side of the Mohakau Road to the western boundary-line of Section 10, Block X, Ngatimaru Survey District; thence southerly generally along the western boundaries of Sections 10 and 15, Block X, Ngatimaru Survey District, to the southern boundary of Block X aforesaid; thence easterly along that boundary to the western side of the Ohura Road; thence along the Ohura Road to a point in line with the southern boundary of Strathmore Township; thence to and along that boundary to the south-western corner of Section 12, Block XIV, Ngatimaru Survey District; thence along the south-western boundaries of the said Section 12, the south-western boundaries of Sections 9, 8, 7, and 6, Block XV, Ngatimaru Survey District, and the south-western and southern boundaries of Section 16, Block XV aforesaid, to the north-eastern corner of Section 15; thence along the western and southern boundaries of Block XVI, Ngatimaru Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of Section 21; thence along the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 20 and 19, Block XIII, Mahoe Survey District, to the

south-western boundary of the Pahautuhia Block; thence south-easterly along that boundary to trig. station, Mount Humphries; thence along the western watershed of the Wanganui River to a point in line with the southern boundary-line of Block VII, Taurakawa Survey District; thence along a right line running due west to Koane Road; thence by the said Koane Road to Section No. 17, Block XII, Omona Survey District; thence by that section to Moeawatea Road; thence by Moeawatea Road to a point in line with the northern boundary-line of Section No. 3, Block VIII, Omona Survey District; thence across the Moeawatea Road and by the northern boundary-lines of Sections 3, 4, and 1, Block VIII aforesaid, across the Karewa Road, and by the northern boundary-lines of Sections 21, 4, and 1, Block VII, Omona Survey District, to Waitiri Road; thence along Waitiri Road to the south-western corner of Section No. 14, Block VII aforesaid; thence by the western boundary of that section and the southern boundary of Section No. 8, Block II, Omona Survey District, to the westernmost corner of Subsection 1 of Subdivision 1 of Matemateonga Block; thence by the south-eastern boundaries of Subsections 1 and 6 of Subdivision 1 aforesaid and the eastern and southern boundaries of Subsection No. 7 to the Patea River; thence along the Patea River to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 11, Block VIII, Ngaire Survey District; thence to and by that section and by Block XII to Trig. Station B, Rahui, by Subdivision 15, Pukengahu Block, to the eastern corner of the northern part of that subdivision of 23 acres 1 rood 8 perches; thence by the southern boundary of the said northern part and by the said Subdivision 15 to the Pukengahu Road, by that road to a point due west of Trig. Station B, Rahui; thence by a line running due west to the north-western boundary of Subdivision 13, Pukengahu Block, and by that subdivision to the northern boundary of Block XI, Ngaire Survey District; by that block to the northernmost corner of Section 35, and by that section to Oru Road, by that road and by Ngaire Road to its junction with Karepo Road, by Karepo Road to and by the northern boundary of Block X, Ngaire Survey District, to the middle of Waingongoro River; thence by a line along the middle of that river to the middle of Finnerty Road; thence by a line along the middle of Finnerty Road to Hastings Road; thence by a line along the middle of Hastings Road to a point opposite the northern boundary of Section No. 32, Block VIII, Kaipokonui Survey District; thence by a right line to the north-eastern corner of that section; thence by Sections 32 and 31, Block VIII aforesaid, to Duthie Road, across that road, and by Section 29, said Block VIII, and the production of the northern boundary of that section to the middle of Palmer Road; thence by a line along the middle of that road to the north-eastern corner of Block XI, Kaipokonui Survey District; thence by Blocks XI and X to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 1, Block VI, Kaipokonui Survey District; thence by the eastern boundary of that section to Opunake Road, and by the southern side of that road to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Section 16, Block VI aforesaid; thence across Opunake Road and by Sections 16, 13, and 11, Block VI aforesaid, to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by a right line to the summit of Mount Egmont; thence by a right line to the intersection of the west side of Forest Road and the Waipuku Stream; thence by a line down the middle of the Waipuku Stream to its confluence with the Manganui Stream; thence up the Manganui Stream to the northern boundary of Block IX, Huiroa Survey District; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of Block IX aforesaid to Croydon Road; thence along the northern side of Croydon Road to the south-eastern corner of Section 11, Block X, Huiroa Survey District; thence by the eastern boundary of Section 11 and the southern boundary of Section 14, Block X aforesaid, to the western side of the Mangaotea Road; thence along the western side of that road to a point in line with the southern boundary of Section 20, Block X aforesaid; thence to and along the southern boundary of said Section 20 and the western and southern boundaries of Section 26 to Makara Road; thence along the western side of Makara Road to a point in line with the southern boundary of Section 28; thence to and along that boundary to the eastern boundary-line of Block X aforesaid; thence along that boundary-line to the middle of the Makino Stream; thence along the middle of that stream to the eastern boundary of Section 5, Block XI, Huiroa Survey District; thence along the eastern boundary of said Section 5 to the Makara Road; thence along the middle of Makara and Mana Roads to the northern boundary of Block XI, Huiroa Survey District; thence along the northern boundaries of Blocks XI and XII, Huiroa Survey District, to the middle of the Makino Stream; thence down the middle of the Makino Stream to the Waitara River; thence along the middle of the Waitara River to a point in line with the western boundary of Section 9, Block VIII,

Huiroa Survey District; thence to and along the western and northern boundaries of Sections 9 and 13, Block VIII, Huiroa Survey District, the eastern boundaries of Section 2, Block I, Ngatimaru Survey District, to Pita Road; thence across that road, and easterly generally along its northern boundary to the westernmost corner of Section 14, Block I, Ngatimaru Survey District; thence along the southern boundaries of Sections 14 and 13, Block I aforesaid, to the Waitara River; thence to and up the middle of that river to a point in line with the western boundary of Section 1, Block X, Upper Waitara Survey District; thence to and along that boundary to the south-eastern corner of Section 6, Block X, Upper Waitara Survey District, the point of commencement, excluding therefrom the Borough of Stratford.

CLIFTON COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District, bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Mokau River; thence up the middle of that river to a point in line with the eastern boundary of the Mokau-Mohakaitino IG Block; thence to and along the said eastern boundary and the eastern boundary of No. 1J through Trig. Station Tawhitiraupeka to the Mohakaitino Stream, and down that stream to its confluence with a stream intersecting the Mohakaitino-Parinihi No. 1D East Block, the said confluence being near the westernmost corner of Section 1, Block III, Waro Survey District; thence up the latter stream to the Mohakaitino Road, and along that road to the north-eastern corner of Section 6, Block VI, Waro Survey District; thence along the northern and south-western boundaries of that section and the western boundaries generally of Sections 5, 4, and 3, and the southern boundaries of said Section 3, and Section 1, Block VII, Waro Survey District, to the Kotare Road, then along that road to the Waitaanga Stream, and down that stream to the northern block-line of Block XVI, Waro Survey District; thence westerly along the northern block-line of Blocks XVI and XV to Mount Damper Road, and along that road to the easternmost corner of Section 8, Block XIV, Waro Survey District; thence along the northern boundaries of Sections 8 and 5, Block XIV, and Sections 10 and 9, Block XIII, along the western boundaries of Sections 9 and 2, Block XIII, Waro Survey District, and Section 4, Block I, Pouatu Survey District, to its south-western corner; thence across a road and railway reserve to the northernmost corner of Section 8; thence along the north-eastern and eastern boundaries of that section to its southernmost corner; thence along a right line to the boundary between Sections 7 and 4, Block V, Pouatu Survey District; thence along the south-eastern boundaries generally of Sections 7, 6, and 5, Block V, and Sections 4 and 3, Block VIII, Upper Waitara Survey District, to the Rerekino Road, and along the eastern side of that road and of the Waitara Valley Road to the western boundary of Section 2, Block XVI; thence along the production of that boundary to the middle of the Waitara River and down the middle of that river to a point in line with the north-eastern corner of Section 1, Block X, Upper Waitara Survey District; thence to and along the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of Section 1, and the north-western boundaries of Section 18 to the northern side of the Mangapito Road, south-easterly along the northern side of that road to a point due north of the northernmost corner of Section 6, Block XIII; thence due south along a right line to said corner, and along the western boundaries of Sections 6 and 9 to the north-eastern corner of Section 2; thence along the northern boundaries of Sections 2 and 1, Block XIII, Upper Waitara Survey District; thence along the northern boundaries of Sections 7, 6, and 5, to the Mataro Road; thence along the southern side of the said Mataro Road, to and along the northern side of Taramoukou Road to the eastern boundary of Section 21, Block XV, Waitara Survey District; thence along the eastern boundary of Section 21, along the northern boundaries of Sections 21, 20, and 12 of the Otaraoa Road, across that road, and along its western side to the western boundary of Section 15, Block XV, Waitara Survey District; thence along the western boundary of said Section 15 to the Waitara River, and down the middle of that river to the boundary of the Borough of Waitara; thence along the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of that borough to the middle of the Waitara River, and down the middle of that river to the sea; thence northerly along the sea-coast to the mouth of the Mokau River, the point of commencement.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

URUTI RIDING, CLIFTON COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Mimi, Upper Waitara, and Pouatu Survey Districts, in the County of Clifton, the boundaries of which are more particularly described as follows: Commencing at a point on the sea-coast, the south-west corner of

Mokau Riding, and bounded towards the north generally by the said Mokau Riding, as described in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 83, page 2759, for the thirtieth day of September, 1920, to its junction with Clifton County boundary; thence towards the east and south generally by Clifton County boundary, as described in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 18, page 627, for the fourteenth day of March, 1929, to a point in the Waitara River in line with the southern boundary of Section 2, Block X, Upper Waitara Survey District; thence to and by the south boundary of Section 2; thence towards the west by the western boundary of Section 2 to the Okoke Road; thence northerly along the west side of Okoke Road to a point in line with the north-west boundary produced of Section 5, Block X, Upper Waitara Survey District; thence across the Okoke Road to and along the north-west boundary of the said Section 5, along the west boundary of Section 9, Block VI, Upper Waitara Survey District, to the Kaka Road; thence north-westerly along the west sides of the Kaka and Mangamaeho Roads to a point in line with the east boundary produced of Section 12, Block II, Upper Waitara Survey District; thence northerly and westerly along the east and north boundaries of said Section 12, Block II, and Sections 28 and 15, Block I, Upper Waitara Survey District, to the Mokau Road; thence northerly by the east boundary produced of Section 15, Block I, Upper Waitara Survey District, to the north side of Mokau Road; thence by the north side of Mokau Road to the south-east corner of Section 31, Block I, Upper Waitara Survey District; thence north-easterly along the east boundary of said Section 31 to the Wai-iti Road; thence northerly along the west side of Wai-iti Road to a point in line with the east boundary produced of Section 68, Block X, Mimi Survey District; thence northerly along the boundaries between Blocks X and XI, and between Blocks VI and VII, Mimi Survey District, to Section 1, Block VII, Mimi Survey District; thence easterly and northerly by the east boundary of said Section 1 to the Gilbert Road; thence due north by a right line across the Gilbert Road; thence westerly by the north side of the Gilbert Road to its junction with the road reserve; thence due west by a right line to the Tasman Sea; thence north-east along the sea-coast to the south-west corner of Mokau Riding, the point of commencement.

Revoking the Setting-apart of Lands for Selection by Discharged Soldiers, under Special Tenures, in the Auckland Land District.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made on the twenty-seventh day of November, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the fourth day of December, then instant, setting apart lands for selection by discharged soldiers under the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, in so far as it relates to the lands in the Schedule hereto.

Classification of Secondary-school Assistant Teachers.

License authorizing the Dannevirke Electric-power Board to use Electric Lines within the Dannevirke Electric-power District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 5th day of December, 1929.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth—subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and dated the eleventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twelfth day of the same month, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor (and hereinafter collectively referred to as “the regulations”), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein—hereby authorize the Dannevirke Electric-power Board, duly constituted under the provisions of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918 (hereinafter with its successors and assigns referred to as “the licensee”), to use electric lines for power, lighting, heating, or other uses within the Dannevirke Electric-power District, as defined by Proclamation dated the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 75, of the eleventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, such electric lines at present proposed to be used being indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 76940, and deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington.

SCHEDULE.

1. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (e) of clause 5 of the regulations.

Electrical energy shall be received in bulk from the Public Works Department's substation near Dannevirke at a pressure of approximately 11,000 volts.

2. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating stresses as provided in clause 108 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

3. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

The licensee shall maintain the works used under this license in proper working-order during the continuance of such license.

4. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

5. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that “lighting purposes” shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes; and provided further that if accounts are paid within fourteen days of due date the charges shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes and 4½d. per unit for motor-power, cooking, and heating purposes.

In the case of wholesale supply the charge shall not exceed £12 per kilovolt-ampere per year, plus ½d. per unit. “Wholesale supply” for this purpose shall be held to be a supply in respect of which the consumer shall guarantee to pay not less than £180 per year.

6. VARIATIONS IN CONDITION OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may be at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

7. BARE WIRES.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, no bare wires shall be erected unless in accordance with clause 151 (3) of the regulations.

8. LOCATION OF OVERHEAD LINES.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, one side of every road or street shall be left free by the licensee for telegraph-lines. Lines shall not be erected on both sides of a road or street unless the permission of the Minister of Telegraphs or the Post and Telegraph Department is first obtained in accordance with clause 9 of the regulations.

9. CONVERSION OF LINES FROM EARTH-WORKING TO METALLIC.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained the licensee shall bear the cost of converting the Post and Telegraph Department's lines which are now erected from earth-working to metallic if required by the Minister of Telegraphs.

10. RAILWAY OR TELEGRAPH DEPARTMENT'S LINES.

The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs and the Minister of Railways any interference or disturbance caused by the licensee's lines that affects the satisfactory working of the telegraph lines which are the property of the Telegraph Department or Railway Department, and which were erected before the erection of the lines hereby authorized.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Dannevirke Electric-power Board to construct the works indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 76940, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, for the purpose of enabling the Board to erect electric lines as shown on the said plan, and such further lines as may from time to time be required in the Dannevirke Electric-power District as hereinafter defined, and substations for the transmission and distribution of electrical energy in the Dannevirke Electric-power District, as defined by Proclamation dated the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 75, of the eleventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. No electric lines shall be used for the distribution of electrical energy until the Dannevirke Electric-power Board has obtained a license for such purposes in accordance with the provisions of section 119 of the Public Works Act, 1928.

2. Any conditions inserted in such license shall be strictly complied with by such Board.

3. Such Board shall forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works such further plans and particulars as the Minister may require.

4. The Board shall not, without the consent in writing of the Minister of Public Works, erect any electric lines along the routes of the Government main trunk transmission-lines.

5. The works hereby authorized shall be constructed so as to comply with the regulations made under section 2 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, dated the 11th day of July, 1927, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 12th day to the same month, or any regulations made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor, which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein.

6. The licensee shall substantially complete the works hereby authorized within a period of five years from the date of this license, or within such further time as the Minister may allow in the event of the work being delayed by strikes, lockouts, breakdowns, or other unavoidable causes not due to any neglect of the licensee.

TIRAU DISTRICT.

PUTARURU DISTRICT.

Station through Tuwhirau Trig. Station to the Whakatane River; by that line to Paeroa Trig. Station aforesaid; thence by a right line to Uraura Trig.
