## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Proclamation made on the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and published in the *Gazette* on the fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, at page 601, the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the power conferred on him by section one hundred and fifty-two of the Mining Act, 1891, proclaimed and declared that certain watercourses, including the Waihou or Thames River, and all its tributaries, from its source to where it discharges into the Firth of Thames, should be watercourses into which tailings, mining debris, and waste water from mining operations should be suffered to flow or be discharged:

And whereas the said Proclamation enures for the purposes of the Mining Act, 1926:

And whereas the watercourse described in the Schedule hereto, being a tributary of the said Waihou or Thames River, is no longer required for the purposes of the said Proclamation, and it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation in so far as it relates thereto:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on me by the Mining Act, 1926, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation in so far as it relates to or affects the watercourse described in the Schedule hereto.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1928 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations under the said Act relating to the registration of orchards, and doth hereby revoke as from the date of the coming into force of the regulations hereby made the regulations under the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1908, made by Order in Council on the thirteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and published in the *Gazette* on the nineteenth day of the same month at page 105.

## REGULATIONS.

## REGULATION 1. PRELIMINARY.

(1) THESE regulations may be cited as the Orchard Registration Regulations, 1929.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1930.

(3) For the purposes of these regulations—

"Director" means the Director of the Horticulture Division of the Department of Agriculture:

"Fruit-tree" means any variety of apple, pear, quince, peach, nectarine, plum, cherry, apricot, nut, or citrus tree, or grape-vine:

"Occupier" means the occupier within the meaning of the Rating Act, 1925:

"Orchard" means any land used for the growing of fruit-trees and the production of fruit for sale and includes any such land, notwithstanding that the fruit-trees thereon may not have come into bearing.

## REGULATION 2. THE REGISTER.

(1) For the purpose of the registration of orchards a Register of Orchards shall be kept by the Director at his office in Wellington.

(2) The register may be kept bookwise or in card form, or in such other manner as may be deemed convenient, and an application for registration in regular form may be incorporated with and form part of the register.

(3) The entries in the register may be arranged in order of localities and in suborder of names of occupiers, arranged alphabetically, or in such other order as may be deemed convenient, and may from time to time be rearranged in different order.

(4) The particulars to be entered in the register shall be those set out in form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto.

(5) The Director may from time to time direct any entry in the register to be amended, corrected, cancelled, or deleted upon such documentary or other evidence as he shall deem sufficient.

(6) No person shall be entitled to inspect or search the register except by permission of the Director, which permission it shall be in the discretion of the Director to grant or withhold.

## REGULATION 3. EVIDENCE OF REGISTRATION.

(1) On the registration of any orchard there shall be issued, without charge to the occupier of such orchard, a certificate of registration in or to the effect of form No. 2 set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) At any time thereafter the Director may, if he thinks fit, and shall, if required for the purposes of any legal proceedings, issue to such occupier a further certificate of registration in respect of such orchard.

(3) Any such certificate of registration shall be *prima facie* evidence of the registration of the orchard to which the same relates.

(4) A copy certified by the Director of any entry in the register shall be *prima facie* evidence of such entry.

(5) A certificate under the hand of the Director of the absence of an entry in the register shall be *prima facie* evidence of the facts stated in such certificate.

(6) The absence of an entry in the register relating to any orchard shall be *prima facie* evidence that no application has been made for the making of such entry.

## REGULATION 4. APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION.

(1) Every occupier of an orchard on the date of the coming into force of these regulations shall forthwith apply for registration of such orchard in manner hereinafter provided.

(2) Every occupier who, after the date of the coming into force of these regulations, proposes to establish an orchard shall forthwith on the establishment thereof apply for registration of such orchard in manner hereinafter provided.

(3) Every application for registration of an orchard shall be made in writing to the Director on a form of application obtained for that purpose, which form shall be in or to the effect of form No. 1 set out in the Schedule hereto, and shall contain the information indicated in the said form and shall be signed by the applicant.

(4) The Director, on receipt of any application for registration may, by notice in writing posted to the applicant at the address set out in his application, require the applicant to furnish further or better particulars of any of the matters information as to which is required by the said form No. 1.

(5) Every applicant shall forthwith comply to the reasonable satisfaction of the Director with the requirements of any such notice as aforesaid, and until he so complies he shall not be deemed to have applied for registration of the orchard concerned within the meaning of these regulations.

(6) Forms of application for registration of an orchard may be obtained free of charge from the Director or from any District Office or Orchard Instructor of the Department of Agriculture.

## REGULATION 5. ALTERATIONS IN RESPECT OF THE OCCUPATION OR POSSESSION OR AREA OF ORCHARDS.

(1) Every occupier who has applied for registration of his orchard in respect of which a certificate of registration has been issued shall, immediately any increase or decrease takes place in the area of such orchard, or in the number of fruit-trees planted therein, or immediately such orchard ceases to be so used by the occupier aforesaid, or immediately any changes takes place in the occupation or possession of such orchard, give the Director notice thereof and of the particulars of such change as the case may require, and shall, in the event of any change occurring in the occupation or possession of such orchard, return to the Director the certificate of registration issued in respect thereof, but compliance with the requirements of this clause shall not relieve any person from the duty of complying with clause (3) of this regulation.

(2) No person shall use any land as an orchard in respect of which notice of any increase or decrease in the area thereof, or in the number of fruit-trees planted therein, has not been given to the Director as required by the last preceding clause hereof.

(3) Every person who, after the date of the coming into force of these regulations becomes the occupier of any registered orchard shall forthwith give notice thereof to the Director applying to be registered as such occupier.

(4) The Director on receipt of any such notice may, by notice in writing posted to the person giving the notice at the address of the registered orchard, require that person to furnish particulars of any of the matters information as to which is required by the said form No. 1.

(5) Every such person shall forthwith comply to the reasonable satisfaction of the Director with the requirements of any notice so given by the Director, and until he so complies he shall not be deemed to have complied with the requirements of clause (3) of this regulation.

(6) Upon receipt of any notice pursuant to this regulation and on verification thereof to his satisfaction, the Director shall make such entries in the Register as the case may require, and shall, if need be, issue a fresh certificate of registration in respect of such orchard.

## REGULATION 6. OFFENCES AND PENALTY.

Every person commits an offence against the said Act who directly or indirectly by himself, his servant, or agent fails to faithfully observe and perform any duty or obligation imposed upon him by these regulations, and is liable to a fine not exceeding £20 pounds.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of Samoa conferred upon him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the following regulations in amendment of the Samoa Maintenance and Affiliation Order, 1920.

## REGULATIONS.

## PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1. (a) THESE regulations may be cited as "The Samoa Maintenance and Affiliation Amendment Order, 1929."

(b) These regulations shall be read together with and deemed to form part of the Samoa Maintenance and Affiliation Order, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order").

(c) These regulations shall come into force on the 13th day of December, 1929.

## PART II.—MISCELLANEOUS AMENDMENTS.

2. Clause 3 of the principal Order is hereby amended by revoking the definition of "child" and substituting the following:—

"Child" means a child under the age of sixteen years.

3. Subclause (4) of clause 7 of the principal Order is hereby amended by deleting the words "twelve years of age" and substituting the words "sixteen years of age."

4. Clause 26 of the principal Order is hereby amended by revoking subclause (2) and subclause (3) thereof and substituting the following subclauses:—

"(2) Under any maintenance order the intervals between successive payments shall not exceed one month.

"(3) No maintenance order made against the father of any child in favour of that child shall be for payments at a rate exceeding the rate of twenty-one shillings a week.

"(4) No maintenance order made against the father of any child in favour of that child shall operate to impose any liability for payments first due after that child attains the age of sixteen years, but this provision shall not effect the continuing liability of any person under the order in respect of payments becoming due before that time."

## PART III.—RECIPROCAL ENFORCEMENT OF ORDERS.

*General Provisions.*

5. In this Part of this Order, unless inconsistent with the context,—

"Overseas Court" means any Court in His Majesty's Dominions (including New Zealand) or in any British protectorate, mandated territory, or place where His Majesty exercises judicial powers;

"Judge" includes every person exercising judicial powers in any overseas Court;

“Overseas maintenance order” means an order which is—

(a) Made by any overseas Court; and

(b) Made for the periodical payment of sums of money towards the maintenance of the wife of the person against whom the order is made or of any dependant of such person whom that person is liable to maintain according to the law in force in the place where the maintenance order is made; and

(c) Made either before or after the coming into force of this Order; and includes an overseas provisional order;

“Overseas provisional order” means an overseas maintenance order appearing from the terms thereof to be provisional, and to have no effect, or not to have complete effect, unless and until confirmed by some other Court;

“Samoan provisional order” means an order made pursuant to clause 25 hereof.

6. This Part of this Order shall not apply to affiliation orders nor to any order for payment by the person against whom the order is made of sums of money towards the maintenance of a dependent whom that person is liable to maintain only by reason of the existence of any affiliation order or order in the nature of an affiliation order.

7. All the provisions of the principal Order shall apply to an order made under this part of this Order as fully as to maintenance orders made under the principal Order.

8. On the registration of an overseas maintenance order (other than an overseas provisional order) or on the confirmation of an overseas provisional order the High Court shall, on the registration or confirmation, and unless satisfied that it is undesirable to do so, direct pursuant to clause 23 of the principal Order that all payments due under such Order shall thereafter be made through the Registrar of the High Court or such other person as the Court may specify for the purpose.

9. It shall be presumed, until the contrary is proved, and without the necessity of proving any seal or signature, that the seal of any Court purporting to be affixed to any document is the seal thereof and was lawfully affixed thereto, and that the signature appearing on any document and purporting to be that of a Judge or officer of any Court is the signature of such Judge or officer, and that such Judge or officer had the judicial or official capacity which he purports to have, and that such document was lawfully and properly signed by the person purporting to sign it.

10. It shall be presumed, until the contrary is proved, that the Court purporting to make any overseas maintenance order had full power and jurisdiction to make such order in the terms in which it purports to be made, including jurisdiction over any person against whom it is made or whom it purports to bind so far as such jurisdiction appears to be exercised, whether provisionally or otherwise, by the terms of the order.

11. Every deposition verified as prescribed in this Order, and every verifying certificate, shall be received in evidence according to its tenor.

#### ENFORCEMENT OF OVERSEAS MAINTENANCE ORDERS.

12. Any officer of the Government or other person may apply to the High Court for registration of an overseas maintenance order.

13. The person making such application shall file in the High Court the overseas maintenance order verified under the seal of the overseas Court or under the signature of a Judge, or a copy of such order certified as a true copy under the seal of the overseas Court or under the signature of a Judge or officer of that Court.

14. The High Court may order that such overseas maintenance order be registered accordingly, and shall thereupon endorse such order or certified copy with a statement under the seal of the High Court to the effect that the order, or the order whereof it is a copy, is registered in the High Court pursuant to the Samoa Maintenance and Affiliation Amendment Order, 1929.

15. An overseas maintenance order (other than an overseas provisional order) when registered as aforesaid shall, from the date of registration, be of the same force and effect and all proceedings may be taken thereon, including proceedings by reason of any default arising after the date when the order was originally made, but prior to the date of registration, in the same manner as if it had been a maintenance order made by the High Court under the authority of the principal Order and as if the High Court had jurisdiction to make an order in the terms thereof.

#### CONFIRMATION OF OVERSEAS PROVISIONAL ORDERS.

16. Any officer of the Government or other person may apply to the High Court for confirmation of an overseas provisional order registered as aforesaid.

17. The person making such application shall file in the High Court the depositions of witnesses taken by the overseas Court when making the overseas provisional order, and a statement of the grounds on which the overseas provisional order might have been opposed, or a copy of such depositions and statement respectively.

18. The High Court may issue a summons calling upon the person against whom any overseas provisional order is made or whom it purports to bind to appear before the High Court to show cause why such order should not be confirmed.

19. At the hearing such person may raise any defence which he might have raised in the original proceedings in the overseas Court had he been a party thereto but no other defence.

20. The statement referred to in clause 17 hereof shall be conclusive evidence that the grounds therein set out are grounds on which the overseas provisional order might have been opposed or on which a defence might have been raised in the original proceedings in the overseas Court.

21. If at the hearing the person served with the summons does not appear or, on appearing, fails to satisfy the High Court that the overseas provisional order ought not to be confirmed, the Court may confirm the order either without modification or with such modifications as to the Court after hearing the evidence may seem just.

22. If the person against whom the summons was issued appears at the hearing and satisfies the High Court that for the purpose of any defence it is necessary to remit the case to the overseas Court for the taking of any further evidence, the Court may so remit the case and adjourn the proceedings for the purpose.

23. An overseas provisional order confirmed as aforesaid shall, from the date of confirmation, be of the same force and effect, and all proceedings may be taken thereon by an officer of the Government or any other person in the same manner (subject to the next succeeding clause hereof) as if it had been a maintenance order made by the High Court under the authority of the principal Order, and as if the High Court had jurisdiction to make an order in the terms thereof.

24. Where, on an application for rescission or variation of an overseas provisional order confirmed as aforesaid, the High Court is satisfied that it is necessary to remit the case to the overseas Court for the purpose of taking any further evidence, the Court may so remit the case and adjourn the proceedings for that purpose.

## SAMOAN PROVISIONAL ORDERS.

25. Where any application is made to the High Court for a maintenance order against any person not resident in Samoa, and it appears that an overseas Court may have jurisdiction to confirm such order, the High Court may in the absence of that person if, after hearing the evidence, it is satisfied of the justice of the application, make any such order as it might have made if a summons had been duly served on that person and he had failed to appear at the hearing.

26. An order made under the last preceding clause hereof shall be termed a Samoan provisional order, and shall be provisional only, and shall have no effect unless and until confirmed by a competent overseas Court.

27. On the hearing of an application under clause 25 hereof the evidence of any witness who is examined shall be put into writing, and such deposition shall be read over to and signed by him.

28. The High Court shall also prepare a statement of the grounds on which the making of the order might have been opposed if the person against whom an order is made had been duly served with a summons and had appeared at the hearing, and also such information as the Court possesses for facilitating the identification of that person and ascertaining his whereabouts.

29. The Registrar shall deliver to the Administrator a certified copy of the order, the original depositions so taken, the statement prepared as aforesaid, and the said information as to identification, including in particular the originals of any certificates of marriage, birth, or baptism, or any other documents that may assist in identification, and the said documents shall be transmitted in the appropriate manner to the Government of the place in which the person affected is believed to be resident for the purpose of confirmation of the order by a competent overseas Court.

30. Where a Samoan provisional order has been remitted by an overseas Court to the High Court for the purpose of taking further evidence the High Court may, upon reasonable notice to the person applying for the Samoan provisional order, proceed to take the evidence in like manner and subject to the like conditions as the evidence in support of the original application.

31. If upon the hearing of such evidence it appears to the High Court that the Samoan provisional order ought not to be made the Court may rescind that order, but in any other case the depositions taken on the hearing of such further evidence shall be dealt with in like manner as the original depositions.

32. The powers of the High Court under section 22 of the principal Order to cancel, vary, or suspend any maintenance order or substitute a new maintenance order therefor shall be exercisable in respect of a Samoan provisional order notwithstanding the confirmation thereof by any overseas Court :

Provided that a certified copy of any order made under the authority of this clause shall be sent to the Administrator for transmission in the appropriate manner to the Government of the place in which the original Samoan provisional order was confirmed :

Provided also that an order cancelling or suspending any Samoan provisional order shall take immediate effect according to its tenor, but an order varying any Samoan provisional order or substituting a new Samoan provisional order therefor, but not cancelling or suspending a Samoan provisional order, shall not have any effect unless and until confirmed by an overseas Court in like manner as the original order.

33. The applicant shall have the same right of appeal against a refusal to make a Samoan provisional order as he would have had against a refusal to make an order if a summons had been duly served on the person against whom the order is sought to be made.

34. A Samoan provisional order may be made in the like terms and with the like restrictions as a maintenance order under the principal Order.

35. The powers conferred by clause 25 hereof shall not restrict the powers of the High Court to make a maintenance order under the powers conferred by clause 19 of the principal Order.

And whereas the said land is not a Native reserve within the meaning of section one hundred and seven of the said Act :

And whereas it is expedient that the Native Land Court should be authorized to exercise in respect of that land the jurisdiction conferred by Part V of the said Act :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the authority conferred upon him by section one hundred and three of the Native Land Act, 1909, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Native Land Court to exercise in respect of the land described in the Schedule hereto the jurisdiction conferred upon that Court by Part V of the Native Land Act, 1909.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section three of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is provided that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Act, it shall not be lawful or competent for any local authority to borrow or contract to borrow any money (otherwise than in anticipation of its revenue within the limits of its powers, if any, in that behalf), whether from the State Advances Office or from any other source whatever, and whether in pursuance of a special Act or under any authority whatever, without the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council given after compliance with the provisions of the said Act :

And whereas section eleven of the said Act provides that the Governor-General in Council, in giving his consent to the borrowing of moneys by the local authority, may impose such conditions with respect to the time at which such moneys may be borrowed, the rate of interest that may be paid in respect thereto, the term for which they may be borrowed, and provisions for repayment thereof as he thinks fit, and that it shall not be lawful for the local authority to borrow such moneys save in accordance with the conditions so imposed :

And whereas the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto are desirous of raising the respective amounts set out opposite their names therein :

And whereas the said local authorities have complied with the provisions of the said Act, and it is expedient that the aforesaid precedent consent should be given to the raising of the loans on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the respective local authorities whose names are set out in the Second Column of the said Schedule of the loans referred to in the Third Column of the said Schedule, up to the respective amounts set out in the Fourth Column of the said Schedule, for the respective terms set out in the Fifth Column of the said Schedule, at rates of interest being such as shall not produce to the lenders rates exceeding the respective rates specified in the Sixth Column of the said Schedule, subject to the condition that the respective local authorities shall, before borrowing the said respective sums or any part thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, or under such other statutory enactment as may be applicable in any respective case, and shall thereafter make to such sinking fund payments at intervals of not more than one year at a rate or rates which shall be not less than the respective rates per centum set out in the Seventh Column of the said Schedule, such payments to be made in respect of every part of the said respective sums for the time being so borrowed and not repaid, and the first payment to be made not later than one year after the first day from which interest to the lender is computed on any moneys so borrowed.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the respective local authorities whose names are set out in the Second Column of the said Schedule of the loans referred to in the Third Column of the said Schedule, up to the respective amounts set out in the Fourth Column of the said Schedule, for the respective terms set out in the Fifth Column of the said Schedule at rates of interest being such as shall not produce to the lenders rates exceeding the respective rates specified in the Sixth Column of the said Schedule, subject to the condition that the respective local authorities shall, before borrowing the said respective sums or any part thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926,

WHEREAS by section three of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is provided that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Act, it shall not be lawful or competent for any local authority to borrow or contract to borrow any money (otherwise than in anticipation of its revenue within the limits of its powers, if any, in that behalf), whether from the State Advances Office or from any other source whatever, and whether in pursuance of a special Act or under any authority whatever, without the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council given after compliance with the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas section eleven of the said Act provides that the Governor-General in Council, in giving his consent to the borrowing of moneys by the local authority, may impose such conditions with respect to the time at which such moneys may be borrowed, the rate of interest that may be paid in respect thereto, the term for which they may be borrowed, and provisions for repayment thereof as he thinks fit, and that it shall not be lawful for the local authority to borrow such moneys save in accordance with the conditions so imposed:

And whereas the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto are desirous of raising the respective amounts set out opposite their names therein:

And whereas the said local authorities have complied with the provisions of the said Act, and it is expedient that the aforesaid precedent consent should be given to the raising of the loans on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the respective local authorities whose names are set out in the Second Column of the said Schedule of the loans referred to in the Third Column of the said Schedule, up to the respective amounts set out in the Fourth Column of the said Schedule, for the respective terms set out in the Fifth Column of the said Schedule at rates of interest being such as shall not produce to the lenders rates exceeding the respective rates specified in the Sixth Column of the said Schedule, subject to the condition that the respective local authorities shall, before borrowing the said respective sums, or any part thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, or under such other statutory enactment as may be applicable in any respective case, and shall thereafter make to such sinking fund payments at intervals of not more than one year at a rate or rates which shall be not less than the respective rates per centum set out in the Seventh Column of the said Schedule, such payments to be made in respect of every part of the said respective sums for the time being so borrowed and not repaid, and the first payment to be made not later than one year after the first day from which interest to the lender is computed on any moneys so borrowed, and subject to the further condition that in no case shall any portion of interest or sinking fund be paid out of loan-moneys.

ON the recommendation of the Native Land Purchase Board, referred to in section three hundred and sixty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909, and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon him by that section, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby extend for a further period of six months the Order in Council dated the tenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and gazetted the thirteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, prohibiting all alienation of the Native land specified in the Schedule hereto other than alienation in favour of the Crown.

Vesting Land owned by Natives in a Maori Land Board for Non-payment of Rates.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section thirty-two of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1928, it is provided that a notice shall be inserted in the *Kahiti* to the effect that all Native land or land owned by Natives situate within the Borough of Otaki will become subject to the provisions of the said section thirty-two if the rates due thereon as at the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, are not paid within three months from a date to be named in such notice :

And whereas, in pursuance of the said section thirty-two, a notice was inserted in the *Kahiti* published on the eighteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, to the effect that all Native land or land owned by Natives situate within the said borough would become subject to the provisions of the said section thirty-two if the rates due thereon as at the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, were not paid within three months from the twenty-sixth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine : And whereas it is further provided that upon the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice, if the rates are still unpaid, the Governor-General may, by Order in Council, vest all or any of such lands in respect of which the rates then remain unpaid, in the Ikaroa District Maori Land Board, and the land so vested shall thereupon become subject to the said section thirty-two : And whereas the time mentioned in the said notice has expired, and the rates due as aforesaid upon the lands (being Native land or land owned by Natives) mentioned in the Schedule hereto still remain unpaid :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section thirty-two of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1928, and of all other powers him enabling, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby vest in the Ikaroa District Maori Land Board all those lands situate in the Borough of Otaki, and specified in the Schedule hereto, to the intent that the said lands so vested in the said Maori Land Board shall become subject to the provisions of the said section thirty-two, and be held, administered, and dealt with accordingly.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said dwellinghouse is to be erected, as shown on the plan M.D. 6742, so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said dwellinghouse, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

- In these conditions the term—  
 "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister;  
 "Foreshore" means such part of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides;  
 "Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides.
- The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the erection and maintenance of the said dwellinghouse, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 6742, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.
- In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £5 in advance, payable on the first day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the date hereof until the thirty-first day of March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.
- His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all persons in the Government service acting in the execution of their duties, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said dwellinghouse without payment.
- The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned dwellinghouse and all erections in connection with the dwellinghouse in good order and repair.
- Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said dwellinghouse and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such dwellinghouse, requiring the licensee within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.
- Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs or any regulation of the

Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the dwellinghouse at the licensee's own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on the licensee being given three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

10. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which may be caused by the said dwellinghouse to any vessel or boat, through any default or neglect on the part of the licensee.

11. In case the licensee shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said dwellinghouse for a period of thirty days;
- (3) Fail to pay the sum specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
- (4) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,—

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

12. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said dwellinghouse entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three calendar months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said dwellinghouse to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensee.

*Regulations for Trout-fishing in Waiapu Acclimatization District.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 5th day of December, 1929.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the Waiapu Acclimatization District and the waters thereof; and doth hereby declare that the regulations shall take effect as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout in all waters within the said district, as described in the First Schedule hereto, shall be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Waiapu Acclimatization Society (hereinafter termed "the said society"), or any one duly authorized by such Secretary in that behalf. Such licenses shall be whole-season, half-season, or day licenses.

2. Every such whole-season license shall entitle the holder thereof to fish for trout in all the waters of the said district

for a period extending from the first day of October in any one year to the thirtieth day of April in the year following, both days inclusive; subject, however, to the special limitations and restrictions hereinafter provided.

3. Every half-season license shall entitle the holder thereof to fish as aforesaid in the waters of the said district for a period extending from the first day of February to the thirtieth day of April in any one year.

4. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred upon holders of such aforesaid licenses shall be exercised subject to the provisions of the said Act, and to the regulations made or hereafter to be made thereunder during the currency of such licenses, and to regulations made or hereafter to be made as aforesaid in force in or affecting any particular acclimatization district, or having special reference to any particular water, stream, river, or lake: Provided always that the Secretary of the said society, or any person authorized by him as aforesaid shall not be compelled to issue a license to any person who, within two years previously to the date of his application therefor has been convicted or shall have been convicted of any breach of the provisions of the said Act or the regulations thereunder, or of any Act relating to trout-fishing, or any regulations thereunder.

5. Licenses shall be issued by the said society at the following rates: For men—Whole-season licenses, 20s.; half-season licenses, 12s. 6d.; day licenses, 2s. 6d. For women—Whole-season licenses, 5s.; half-season licenses, 3s. 6d.; day licenses, 1s. 6d. For boys attending school or under the age of sixteen years—Whole-season licenses, 5s.; half-season licenses, 3s. 6d.; day licenses, 1s. 6d. Such licenses shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

6. The holder of any such license as aforesaid may fish as aforesaid with one rod and line only, and may use a landing-net or gaff to secure any trout caught with such rod and line.

7. No person shall use any bait or lure other than the natural or artificial fly, or natural or artificial minnow, and any small indigenous fish, insect, grasshopper, beetle, or spider. The use of shellfish, fish ova, koura, or the houhou or matai grub, or of earthworms shall be a breach of the regulations.

8. No license shall be transferable, or be deemed to authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish.

9. The period from the first day of May to the thirtieth day of September, in any one year, both days inclusive, is hereby appointed a close season, during which it shall be unlawful for any person to fish for or take trout, or to in any way injure or disturb the same. No person shall have in his possession, whether frozen, chilled, or otherwise, any trout between the fifth day of May and the first day of October in any one year.

10. No person shall cast or throw into any stream or waters in the said district in which trout exist or have been liberated, nor shall allow to flow into or place in or near the bank or margin of such stream or waters, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flax-mill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is noxious, poisonous, or injurious to fish: Provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to or prohibit the depositing in any such stream or waters of debris from any mining claim.

11. No person shall fish for trout without a license, and every person fishing in such waters shall, on demand of any fishery officer, constable, officer of the said society, or person producing a license to fish issued in New Zealand, give his true name and place of residence, either permanent or for the time being, and on the like demand produce and show to such fishery officer, constable, officer of the said society, or person producing a license as aforesaid, his license to fish, and the contents of his creel, bag, or other receptacle for carrying fish, and also the bait or lure used or intended to be used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout.

12. Every trout not exceeding 8 in. in length from tip of nose to tip of tail taken or caught by any person shall immediately be returned alive, with as little damage or hurt as possible, into the water from which the same has been taken.

13. No hand-line, night-line, or crossline fishing, stroke-hauling, trimmer, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking or attempting to take, catch, kill, or capture trout; nor shall any of the hereinbefore-mentioned permitted baits or lures be prepared or used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

14. Except as provided in Regulation 6 no person shall fish with or use any net or engine, instrument, or device of any kind, whatever for taking or attempting to take trout in any lake, river, or stream within the said district, or at the mouth or entrance of any such lake, river, or stream. Any trout taken by such net or other means shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

15. For the purposes of these regulations a lake and the mouth of a river or stream shall respectively be deemed to include every outlet of such lake, river, or stream respectively, and the seashore between the outlets of any such river or stream, and shall extend over a radius of one quarter of a mile from the point or line where the waters of such river, lake, or stream meet those of the sea or of any harbour at low water.

16. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any trout, or any portion thereof.

17. No person shall on any one day, take or kill more than fifteen trout, and no person shall continue to fish for trout on any day on which he has already taken or killed fifteen trout.

18. No person shall fish for, take, or kill trout between the hours of 10 p.m. on any day and 4 a.m. on the following day.

19. Except as provided for by the regulations regarding keeping trout in freezing-works or freezing-chambers during the close season which were made by the Governor in Council on the 6th day of October, 1908, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 8th day of the same month, no person shall have in his or her possession, whether frozen, chilled, or otherwise, any trout between the fifth day of May and the first day of October in any year: Provided that this regulation shall not apply to any trout taken by officers of the Government or by officers of the Waiapu Acclimatization Society for the purpose of fish culture or scientific investigation.

20. The penalty for every breach of any of the preceding regulations shall be not less than 40s., and not more than £50.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and eighty-six of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor-General in Council may vest the management of any wharf, the property of His Majesty the King, in any local authority upon such terms and conditions as the Governor-General in Council thinks fit :

And whereas it is thought desirable to vest in the Collingwood County Council (hereinafter called "the Council," in which term is to be construed, unless the context requires a different construction, its successors or assigns) the management of the wharf at Collingwood, erected in accordance with the plan marked M.D. 4324, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, and to make regulations for the management of the said wharf, and also to prescribe the dues and rates to be taken and charged by the Council for the use of the said wharf :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby vest the management of the said wharf in the Council, subject to the conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and doth further make the regulations for the management of the said wharf as set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and doth prescribe that the dues and rates specified in the Third Schedule hereto shall be taken and charged by the Council for the use of the said wharf.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS OF MANAGEMENT.

1. IN these conditions the terms—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides :

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides :

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seaman Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the maintenance of the said wharf at the site shown on the plan marked M.D. 4324.

3. All His Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.

5. The Council shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf, and all erections on or in connection with the said wharf, in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the Council's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

6. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharf by the Council shall be applied to keeping the said wharf and all erections on or in connection with such wharf in good order and repair.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and any buildings erected on the wharf, or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof, and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to make good and repair the same, the Council shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made;

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister.

10. The Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the thirty-first day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

11. The Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the said wharf.

12. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

13. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

14. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council, may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar month's previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.

15. The Council shall be liable for any injury which may be caused by the said wharf to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.

16. In case the Council shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days;

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

17. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Council shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the Council fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Council.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS.

1. IN these regulations, unless there be something in the context inconsistent therewith or repugnant thereto,—

The term "Council" shall mean the Collingwood County Council :

The term "vessel" shall include any description of vessel, whether used in navigation or in any way kept or used as a hulk or storeship, or for any other purpose, and not propelled exclusively by oars, in the Harbour of Collingwood :

The term "harbour" shall mean the Harbour of Collingwood.

2. Masters of vessels lying alongside the wharf shall be responsible for all damage caused to goods lying on such wharf by water used for washing down the decks or for any other purpose upon such vessel.

3. The Council shall not be responsible for the wrong or non-delivery of goods which are erroneously or deficiently marked, or which have old or imperfectly erased marks thereon.

4. All goods in respect of which the Council elect not to supply labour, or which shall not be tallied by the Council, shall not be deemed for any purpose to be in the custody of the Council as wharfinger, nor shall the Council be responsible for

their safe keeping, or for any damage or loss that may accrue to the same in any manner whatsoever.

5. All goods landed on the wharf or brought thereon for shipment are to be placed as the wharfinger may direct, and no goods or other articles shall be placed in any shed or on any wharf so as to be an impediment to the approach or an obstacle to the removal of other goods from such wharf or shed, or so as to encumber the mooring-posts.

6. No ballast, timber, coal, produce, or cargo of any description shall be embarked or shipped, disembarked or unshipped, except at such time and place and in such order or mode as may be directed and deemed expedient by the wharfinger for the proper working of the wharf.

7. No ballast, coal, coke, or other fuel shall be deposited on the wharf or in the sheds without special permission from the wharfinger.

8. The Council shall not be responsible for the safe custody of packages containing acids, chemicals, or other dangerous goods.

9. The time allowed to vessels carrying full cargoes to occupy berths at a wharf for the purpose of discharging or loading shall be, exclusive of Sundays, holidays, and the day of removal—

- For vessels under 100 tons : Three days.
- "          150 tons : Four days.
- "          200 tons : Five days.

Vessels taking in ballast shall be allowed one day for every 50 tons of ballast, unless special permission shall be obtained from the Council to remain longer.

10. Cargo landed without the permission of the wharfinger first obtained shall not be deemed to be in the custody of the Council, nor shall the Council be responsible for any loss or damage that may accrue to such cargo by the elements or otherwise.

11. The master, owner, or agent of every vessel shall give to the wharfinger, or other person deputed by the Council, a copy of the bill of lading, freight-list, or manifest of the cargo, or other proper account of all goods intended to be unshipped from the vessel, and the name or names of the owners or consignees to whom all or any of the goods in such vessel are intended to be delivered.

12. Shippers and consignees of all goods shipped from or landed on the wharf shall, before shipping or landing such goods, deliver to the wharfinger a full account of all such goods, stating the respective weights or measurements of the same according as freight is payable thereon.

13. All goods of a dangerous or inflammable character shall be removed by the owner, agent, or consignee immediately on being landed; and such owner, agent, or consignee failing to do so shall be responsible for any damage or loss that may accrue from any accident arising therefrom, in addition to being liable to the penalty provided for breach of the regulations; and the Council shall not be responsible for any damage or loss which may accrue to such goods.

14. Vessels arriving with kerosene or other material of an inflammable nature on board may land it on the wharf for carting to town or for transhipment, provided the same be removed forthwith. In no case will such goods be allowed to be stored on the wharf.

15. No goods or articles of any description which in the opinion of the wharfinger are likely to occasion damage to the wharf or shed connected therewith shall be discharged or landed on the wharf or placed in any shed.

16. Any vegetable or animal matter or goods which are in a state of decay, or which in the opinion of the wharfinger are unfit to remain, or harmful to other goods stored on the wharf, may be removed from the wharf at the expense of the owner or consignee.

17. All goods, other than perishable produce, landed on the wharf shall be removed therefrom or stored during the working-hours. Perishable produce may be placed upon the wharf before or after working-hours at the risk of the consignee, but the Council will not hold itself responsible in any way for its safety.

18. The wharfinger is empowered to take charge of and store cargo and goods if not removed from any wharf by the consignee within the time limited for that purpose, or cause the same to be delivered to the consignee at his expense and risk.

19. The Council shall not be bound to find storage room either in the shed or on the wharf when, in the opinion of the wharfinger, no sufficient accommodation is available. After notification to the owners, shippers, or consignees of any goods, or to the vessel's agent, that room is not available, the Council shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage that may accrue to the goods by the elements or otherwise during the time they may remain on the wharf.

20. The Council will not be responsible for any damage sustained by goods while in their custody by fire, or by water used in extinguishing fire, or by vermin, unless in case of proved negligence.

21. No person shall be allowed on the wharf or in the sheds or buildings used therewith unless they have, in the opinion of the wharfinger, legitimate business thereon.

22. The wharfinger shall have power to close the wharf, or any portion of it, whenever in his opinion it is advisable to do so.

23. No person shall disobey the orders of the wharfinger when acting in the due performance of his duty, nor in any way obstruct the traffic on the wharf.

24. Every boatman, stevedore, porter, carter, cab-driver, motor-driver, or any person employed on the wharf shall be under the control and shall obey the orders of the wharfinger.

25. No child of tender years shall be allowed on the wharf unless accompanied by an adult.

26. No person shall scribble upon, cut, scratch, or otherwise deface any part of the wharf, or any shed thereon or connected therewith.

27. All complaints against the wharfinger or any person under his direction must be made in writing to the Chairman of the Council, and a copy of each complaint shall first be furnished to the wharfinger.

28. No person taking a vehicle on the wharf shall allow the same to go at a greater than a walking-pace.

29. All persons in charge of vehicles, whether for the conveyance of passengers or goods or otherwise, shall, when on the wharf or its approaches, be under the control of the wharfinger; and such persons shall, immediately upon being so ordered by the wharfinger, remove such vehicles to any part of the wharf or its approaches to which he may be directed, or shall, if so desired by the wharfinger, remove such vehicle altogether from the wharf; but the wharfinger shall not order such removal without reasonable cause.

30. Any person who accidentally or otherwise damages or destroys any of the Council's property shall be liable for the cost of repair or renewal thereof.

31. The ordinary business hours upon the wharf shall be from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Sundays and holidays excepted; and on Saturday from 8 a.m. to noon.

32. The cost over and above the ordinary cost of day-work of all labour during any hours not being ordinary business hours as above defined shall be paid by the master or owners of the vessel, in addition to the usual charges, at the rate of 2s. 6d. per hour or part of an hour.

33. The following days shall be observed as holidays by the Council and its officers—namely, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Labour Day.

34. Consignees shall be liable for all wharfage and other charges on all inward cargo; shippers shall be liable for all wharfage and other charges on all outward cargo. All charges to be paid at the time of receiving and shipping.

35. If any person fails, or refuses, or neglects to do anything required by these regulations to be done, observed, or performed, or in any manner obstructs, impedes, or interferes with the doing of anything enjoined, required, or authorized to be done, or wilfully does anything prohibited by these regulations, every such person in each and every case so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

36. The Council shall appoint the wharfinger and all other persons necessary for the working of the wharf.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize Harry Williams, of Waipiro Bay, General Storekeeper, to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the Schedule hereto on the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. PURPOSES OF LINES.

The said lines may be used for lighting, power, and heating purposes.

2. LICENSES TO BE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

The license hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the regulations made under section 2 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, on the 11th day of July, 1927, and published in the *Gazette* on the 12th day of the same month at page 2360 (hereinafter called "the said regulations"), and with all regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

3. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be the system described in paragraph (c) of clause 5 of the said regulations.

4. GENERATING VOLTAGE.

Electrical energy shall be generated at a pressure of 32 volts between terminals.

5. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined, whether by surrender by the licensee or by revocation under the provisions contained in the said regulations or in any amending or substituted regulations, continue in force for a period of twenty-one years from the date hereof.

6. PURCHASE OF INSTALLATION BY ELECTRIC-POWER BOARD OR CROWN.

Any Electric-power Board duly constituted in terms of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, or any Act passed in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor, if its district includes the area in which are erected the lines described in the Schedule hereto, or the Crown shall have the right, at any time during the currency of this license, to purchase and take over the licensee's installation at a valuation to be agreed upon between the said Board or the Crown, as the case may be, and the licensee; and, failing such agreement, at a valuation to be fixed by a single arbitrator to be appointed pursuant to the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1908, and thereupon the Governor-General may by Order in Council revoke this license.

7. EFFECT OF DETERMINATION OF LICENSE.

*Open Season for Deer-shooting, Westland Acclimatization District.*

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, Philip Aldborough de la Perrelle, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 1st day of March, 1930, to the 30th day of April, 1930 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in those parts of the Westland Acclimatization District, described in the First and Second Schedules hereto, for the taking or killing of the following imported game—viz., red-deer stags and hinds—subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill red-deer stags and hinds may be issued by the Postmaster at Hokitika, on the recommendation of the Secretary of the Westland Acclimatization Society, on payment of a license fee of £2, in respect of the area described in the First Schedule hereto, and on payment of a license fee of £5 in respect of the area described in the Second Schedule hereto, in the form prescribed in the Third and Fourth Schedules hereto respectively, and subject to the said Act and regulations thereunder and this notification: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person: Provided, further, that the number of licenses in respect of the area described in the Second Schedule hereto which may be issued by the said Postmaster shall not exceed thirty; and that in regard to such area stalkers shall shoot only on the blocks specified in their respective licenses: Provided, further, that if the number of applicants for licenses in respect of the said area described in the Second Schedule hereto shall exceed the number of available licenses, then the persons to whom such licenses are to be issued shall be decided by ballot.
2. Ball cartridge only to be used: Provided that no metal-patched or metal-cased bullet shall be used for killing such deer.
3. No licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.
4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.
5. Regulations as to the use of marks of identification of deer-heads contained in section 6 of the regulations under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 7th February, 1924, page 437, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the Secretary of the Westland Acclimatization Society, Hokitika, immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with a statement of the number of deer shot.

6. Nothing in any license to take or kill red-deer stags and hinds shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill red-deer stags or hinds on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or on any land excepted from the operation of the notification declaring an open season for the district.

7. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £20.

## RULES.

Under the Law Practitioners Amendment (Solicitors' Fidelity Guarantee Fund) Act, 1929.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Law Practitioners Amendment (Solicitors' Fidelity Guarantee Fund) Act, 1929 (hereinafter called the said Act), the Council of the New Zealand Law Society, incorporated by the Law Practitioners Act, 1908, hereby makes the following rules:—

1. The fee payable for the purposes of the said Act by every solicitor to whom the said Act applies shall, as from the day the said Act comes into force and until a different fee shall be lawfully prescribed, be the sum of five pounds five shillings (£5 5s.).

2. The several persons receiving such fees shall pay or forward them to the Secretary of the New Zealand Law Society for the purposes of the fund established by the said Act.

3. Any bank charge for exchange payable in respect of moneys forwarded as above-mentioned shall be paid out of the fund established by the said Act.

4. Any solicitor making application in any year for a certificate under section forty-five of the Law Practitioners Act, 1908, and claiming that he is not a solicitor to whom the said Act applies, shall satisfy the person to whom the application is made that he is not for the time being engaged in the practice of his profession of a solicitor either on his own account or in partnership with any other person or persons.

NOTE.—A cool spring month and, except for the last day, a very dry one. The rainfall at Karori Reservoir, near Kelburn, being 35 per cent. below the mean. Total bright sunshine, 193.3 hours, 47 per cent. of the possible, and one sunless day. Frost was recorded on the grass on the 16th and 27th, and fog was in evidence on the 16th, 29th, and 30th. Mean dew-point, 46.4°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.315 in.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR OCTOBER, 1929.

The month has been notable for the exceptionally dry conditions experienced over nearly the whole of the Dominion. A few places, from Auckland northwards, had an excess, and in the East Cape, Gisborne, and Napier districts, more especially the coastal portions, the average was also exceeded, but elsewhere in the North Island and the whole of the South Island recorded below normal falls. Oamaru had only five points, which is the lowest month's total ever recorded there. In the East Coast provinces of the South Island and Otago generally the deficiencies were considerable, and this, combined with the cold temperatures experienced, severely retarded the growth of vegetation.

Throughout the country districts in the South Island the backwardness of the season was clearly evident, and feed, in some cases on well stocked land, was rather scarce. In the North Island there were more days on which rain fell, and the scarcity of feed was not so apparent, so that usually stock kept in good condition, although feed was rather short for cattle.

Temperatures were, on the whole, below average, and there were rather more frosts than is usual at this period, those on the 15th and 25th doing some damage to early-sown crops.

From the 1st to the 7th, and again from the 10th to the 17th, fine weather was experienced practically generally under the influence of well developed anticyclones. The remainder of the month, however, except for occasional brief intervals, was subject to changeable and unsettled conditions.

On the 8th, the front of a vigorous depression moved on to southern New Zealand, while a cyclone was passing to the northward. Strong east winds prevailed at this time north of Auckland, with some rain. Unsettled conditions gradually became general with the advance of the southern depression, and on the 9th rain fell in most districts, but in the South Island the falls were only light and scattered. Motu, in the Gisborne district, had as much as 421 points on the 9th. The passage eastwards of this depression brought a cool southerly change during the night of the 10th.

The most severe weather during the month was that experienced during the 23rd and 24th, and was associated with an intense cyclone. The latter had moved slowly from the New South Wales coast on to the Central Tasman Sea, but from the 22nd it made more rapid progress, and by the night of the 22nd had moved on to northern New Zealand. General rain fell in connection with this disturbance, except in Westland, where fine weather continued to prevail. By 9 a.m. on the 23rd winds had changed to south-east or southerly south of New Plymouth and East Cape, with a considerable drop in temperature, and on the 24th southerlies were prevailing generally, with strong gales in and north of Cook Strait. Exceptionally heavy rain fell at this time in the Auckland, Gisborne, and Hawke's Bay districts. On the 22nd, at Waipawa, a violent hail storm occurred.

Considerable damage was done by the south-east gale at New Plymouth on the 24th, iron roofs being twisted and trees uprooted, while two partially built houses were demolished.

Fairly general rain fell, also, on the 31st while a double-centered disturbance was crossing the Dominion. One of the centres was located west of the North Island, and during the night of the 31st it was responsible for stormy conditions in parts of the Auckland Province. Its effects were particularly severe in the Riverhead, Kumeu, and New Lynn districts, and in some places thunderstorms were experienced, accompanied by very heavy rain.

Although there were short periods when the winds were severe, on the whole there was a relative absence of strong winds during the month.

The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,080 as against 1,031 in October, an increase of 49. The deaths in November were 536—a decrease of 107 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 296, females 240. Fifty-six of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 10.45 per cent. of the whole number. Forty-two of these were under one year of age.
