 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS a petition publicly notified, has been presented to me under section seventeen of the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1928, by the Council of the Borough of Hastings, praying me to alter the boundaries of the Borough of Hastings so as to exclude therefrom, and include in the County of Hawke's Bay, the lands described in the Schedule hereto, being lands in the said borough in respect of which there are no electors:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said borough are hereby altered so as to exclude therefrom and include in the County of Hawke's Bay the lands described in the said Schedule hereto, being lands in the said borough in respect of which there are no electors, and I do further proclaim and declare that the areas included as aforesaid in the County of Hawke's Bay shall be added to and form part of the Heretaunga Riding of that county.

Timaru Prison to cease to be a Prison.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled the Prisons Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, declare that any prison shall no longer be a prison; and upon the gazetting of such Proclamation, or from and after any later date fixed in such Proclamation for the purpose, such prison shall cease to be a prison:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the above-recited power and authority, do hereby declare that from and after the thirty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, the area of land described in the Schedule hereto, and all the buildings and enclosures used or occupied thereon, known as the Timaru Prison, shall cease to be a prison.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District, containing by admeasurement 1 acre 3 roods, more or less, being part Reserve 203 (formerly Timaru Town Sections 132, 133, 134, 135, 136, 147, and 148), situated in the Borough of Timaru. Bounded towards the north by North Street, 500 links; towards the east by Section 131, 250 links; towards the south by Sections 144, 145, and 146, 300 links; again towards the east by Section 146, 250 links; again towards the south by Heaton Street, 200 links; and towards the west by Sections 149 and 137, 500 links. And whereas the purchase of the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, and its amendments:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so conferred upon me by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has become Crown land.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that part of Horowhenua 9A 2 Block, situate in Block II, Waitohu Survey District, containing by admeasurement 1 rood 3.5 perches, more or less, and being all the land comprised in certificate of title, Vol. 410, folio 19, of the Land Registration District of Wellington.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Immigration Restriction Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth, and doth hereby revoke, as from the coming into force of the regulations hereby made, the regulations next hereinafter referred to.

REGULATIONS.

CITATION.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Immigration Restriction Regulations, 1930, and shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

INTERPRETATION.

2. In these regulations—

“Immigration Restriction Acts” means the Immigration Restriction Act, 1908, and the amendments thereof and the regulations made thereunder, including these regulations :

“Restricted immigrant” means any passenger to whom Part I of the Immigration Restriction Act, 1908, applies :

“Student” means a person concerning whom an application in Form 7 hereinafter mentioned has been received by the Minister or to whom a permit in Form 8 hereinafter mentioned has been granted.

FORMS.

3. (1) The forms in the Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be prescribed.

(2) Where a prescribed form contains by way of note or otherwise a clear direction or indication of any requirements as to—

(a) The number of copies of any document to be tendered ;

(b) The nature or form of the document or information to be furnished ;

(c) Any action, either by way of signing a form of declaration or otherwise, to be taken by any person ; the requirement so directed or indicated shall be deemed to be prescribed.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in these regulations, the following provisions shall apply :—

(a) In lieu of any prescribed form any document may be used which is substantially in accordance with the prescribed form :

(b) In cases where forms heretofore prescribed differ from forms hereby prescribed the first-mentioned forms

may, so far as consistent with the Immigration Restriction Acts, be used until the expiry of one year from the date of the publication of these regulations in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

(4) The Minister may require copies of any prescribed form or of any document in addition to the number (if any) indicated on the form in the Schedule hereto.

TEMPORARY PERMITS.

4. Every person who desires a temporary permit to enter New Zealand under section 8 of the Immigration Restriction Amendment Act, 1920, shall, if required by the Collector, make and deliver to him an application in Form 1, and shall make before an officer of Customs the declaration set out in the said form.

5. (1) The temporary permit under section 8 of the Immigration Restriction Amendment Act, 1920, shall be in Form 2.

(2) Every such permit may, at the discretion of the Minister, either with respect to any person or to any class of persons, be granted—

(a) Subject to any or all of the following conditions, namely :—

(i) That before the issue of the permit a sum of £10 is deposited with the Collector of Customs at the port of arrival by or on behalf of the visitor, to be held by such Collector on the terms that if the visitor, together with his wife and/or children (if accompanying him), shall—

(a) Report personally to the Collector of Customs at the port of departure within a reasonable time before such departure ;

(b) Furnish to the satisfaction of the last-named Collector proof of identity of the visitor, his wife, and/or children (if mentioned in the permit) ;

(c) Surrender the permit to the last-named Collector at the time of departure from New Zealand ;

(d) Leave New Zealand within the period for which the permit is granted ;

(e) Comply in all respects with the Immigration Restriction Acts and with every condition imposed on the granting of the permit pursuant to these regulations—

then and in such case the said sum of £10 shall be refunded to the depositor, but otherwise the said sum shall be forfeited and paid to the Public Account :

(ii) That the person to whom the permit is granted will on request at any time by an officer of Customs or a member of the Police Force produce the permit to him for inspection :

(iii) That it shall be sufficient notice to the person to whom the permit is granted as to any matter which the Minister or Collector of Customs desires to communicate to such person (including the revocation, if any, of the permit) if a letter is sent by post to the address shown in his application for a temporary permit or furnished to the Collector of Customs as the address in New Zealand to which communications can be sent to him :

(iv) That the visitor will not, without the special permission in writing of the Collector, engage in any work or occupation, or carry on or assist in carrying on, or accept any employment in or in connection with, any business, calling, or pursuit, other than as stated in the permit :

(v) That the visitor will forthwith on demand as and when the same become payable, and unless theretofore paid to the Crown or the public body concerned, pay to the Collector, to be received on behalf of the Crown or the public body concerned, all costs, charges, and expenses that may at any time be incurred by the Crown or any public body in or about the maintenance, relief, arrest, or detention in New Zealand of the visitor, his wife, and/or children (if accompanying him), or his or their deportation from New Zealand, whether arising from sickness or poverty, or from default by him or them in compliance with any requirements of law, or from any other cause, and whether or not such costs, charges, and expenses may, apart from this condition, be a debt recoverable by the Crown or such public body from the visitor or any other person ; provided always that in the case of any such costs, charges, or expenses as are not actually

disbursements by the Crown or a public body, or the amount of which is not fixed by law or contract or otherwise so as to amount to a liquidated sum, the amount thereof shall be such sum as is certified as being reasonable in the circumstances by the Minister of Justice, the Minister in Charge of Prisons, the Minister of Health, the Minister in Charge of the Mental Hospitals Department, the Minister of Customs, the Hospital Board, or other person (including the Permanent Head of a Government Department) or body administering the Department or institution by, through, or in connection with which such costs, charges, and expenses were incurred; and

- (b) If the Collector in his discretion so decides, either—
- (i) Subject to a deed in Form 3 or other security to his satisfaction and to a like effect being executed by some person or persons resident in New Zealand approved by the Collector; or
- (ii) Subject in any special case, if the Collector thinks fit, to the deposit, in lieu of the deed or other security referred to in the last preceding subparagraph hereof, of a sum of money satisfactory to the Collector, together with the execution of a deed in Form 4 or to a like effect.

(3) The Minister may, as he thinks fit, in respect of any person or class of persons, direct that a temporary permit shall not be granted to a person who has already entered New Zealand on a temporary permit, except after a period of two years from the date of that person's previous departure from New Zealand.

6. Notwithstanding anything in the preceding regulation, the Minister may, if he thinks the circumstances warrant it, direct that any deposit forfeited thereunder be refunded to the depositor as though no forfeiture had occurred.

ADMISSION OF IMMIGRANTS AS PERMANENT RESIDENTS.

7. Except as hereinafter provided, the application for a permit to enter New Zealand as required by section 9 of the Immigration Restriction Amendment Act, 1920, shall be in Form 5.

8. (1) Except as hereinafter provided, the permit to enter New Zealand which may be granted under section 9 of the Immigration Restriction Amendment Act, 1920, shall be in Form 6.

(2) Every such permit may be granted subject to the condition that the person named therein shall satisfy the Collector of Customs at the port of arrival as to the correctness of the particulars inserted therein, and that it shall be delivered up to the Collector of Customs at the first port of arrival in New Zealand.

(3) Every such permit shall be deemed to be revoked at the expiry of two years from the date of the same.

(4) Every person to whom such a permit is granted shall, unless exempted by the Minister, verify the correctness of the particulars respecting the person or persons mentioned in the permit by a declaration made before an officer of Customs in the form set out in Form 6.

(5) Notwithstanding anything in this regulation, any permit which is deemed to be revoked in pursuance of sub-clause (3) hereof may, at the discretion of the Minister, be made valid during such further period as he thinks fit.

ADMISSION OF STUDENTS TEMPORARILY.

9. Any person to whom Part I of the Immigration Restriction Amendment Act, 1920, applies who desires to enter New Zealand as a student shall make application in Form 7; provided that the Minister may, if he thinks fit, accept an application made on behalf of the student by his father or other person satisfactory to the Minister.

10. (1) The permit to enter New Zealand as a student shall be in Form 8.

(2) Before any such permit is granted the following conditions must, unless the Minister otherwise directs, be complied with:—

- (a) Security by deed in Form 9 or to a similar effect must be given to the satisfaction of the Minister, and, except where the Minister specially directs, at least one of the covenanting parties to the deed must be a corporate body having power to enter into such a deed, and approved by the Minister, and carrying on business in New Zealand.
- (b) The following must be produced to the Minister:—

- (i) A statutory declaration made by the father of the student, or other person approved by the

Minister, as to any statements made in the application for a permit or as to any other matters concerning the student which in the opinion of the Minister require verification:

- (ii) Except in the case of a British subject, a certificate in Form 10 or to a like effect issued by a Consul of the country of the student's nationality:

- (iii) Evidence to the satisfaction of the Minister that the student will not at the date of intended arrival in New Zealand be under the age of ten years.

(3) Except with the special authority of the Minister, a permit shall not be granted under this regulation to any person unless his father is domiciled in and is residing in New Zealand.

(4) Every permit granted under this regulation may, at the discretion of the Minister, either with respect to any person or to any class of persons, be granted subject to any or all of the following conditions:—

- (a) That the permit will not entitle the person to whom it is granted to enter New Zealand after the expiry of one year from the date of the same:

- (b) That at the port of arrival in New Zealand the student—

- (i) Shall produce the permit to the Collector of Customs;
- (ii) Shall satisfy him as to the correctness of the particulars concerning such student inserted therein; and

- (iii) Shall make a declaration before an officer of Customs in the following form respecting such particulars—

" I [*Full name*] do hereby declare that the above particulars respecting myself are true and correctly stated in every respect ":

- (c) That the permit shall authorize the student to remain in New Zealand until the end of the calendar year in which he enters New Zealand; provided that it may at or before the commencement of each succeeding year be renewed for another calendar year if the Collector of Customs is satisfied that the Immigration Restriction Acts and the conditions under which the permit was granted have been complied with by the student:

- (d) That, except with the special permission of the Minister, nothing in the permit shall be deemed to authorize the student to remain in New Zealand after he has reached the age of twenty-four years:

- (e) That while the student is allowed to remain in New Zealand under the authority of the permit he will attend a school, college, or University approved by the Minister on every day on which the said school, college, or University is open, unless prevented by sickness or other cause satisfactory to the Collector of Customs:

- (f) That while the student is allowed to remain in New Zealand under the authority of the permit he will not engage in any work of any kind whatsoever (other than study):

- (g) That while the student is allowed to remain in New Zealand under the authority of the permit evidence is produced at the end of each school, college, or University term to the satisfaction of the Collector of Customs that the student has carried on a substantial portion of the course of study for which the student was permitted to enter New Zealand:

- (h) That while the student is allowed to remain in New Zealand under the authority of the permit he will not without the previous permission in writing of the Collector of Customs, attend any school, college, or University other than that stated in the permit:

- (i) That if while the student is allowed to remain in New Zealand under the authority of the permit he changes his place of residence he shall immediately notify the Collector of Customs in writing as to such change of place of residence:

- (j) That the student will, on request at any time by an officer of Customs or a member of the Police Force, produce the permit to him for inspection:

- (k) That while the student is allowed to remain in New Zealand under the authority of the permit the Minister may, in lieu of or in addition to any security already given, require with respect to any student such other or additional security as the Minister thinks fit:

- (l) That it shall be sufficient notice to the student or to any other person concerned as to the revocation of the permit, or as to any matter which the Minister or Collector desires to communicate to such student or person, if a letter is sent by post to the place shown in the application for a permit as the student's intended place of residence in New Zealand or to the last place of residence which has been notified to the Collector in accordance with paragraph (k) hereof:
- (m) That if the student does not, in the Minister's opinion, faithfully observe and obey the laws of New Zealand, or if the Minister is satisfied that he is not of good character and reputation, or if he does not comply with any of the conditions under which the permit was granted to him, or if he marries in New Zealand, or if he leaves New Zealand without notifying the Collector of Customs, or if when required by an officer of Customs or member of the Police Force, he does not produce the permit for inspection, or if his father ceases to be domiciled in or to reside in New Zealand, the permit may, at the discretion of the Minister, be revoked.
- (5) Notwithstanding anything in this regulation, the Minister, if he thinks fit, may, with respect to any permit granted to a student, impose any conditions either in addition to or in substitution of, and whether of a like nature or not to, the conditions mentioned in this regulation.

PROCEDURE ON ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE OF SHIPS.

11. (1) For the purpose of ensuring compliance with the Immigration Restriction Acts an officer of Customs shall board every ship arriving from places beyond New Zealand forthwith after its arrival at any port in New Zealand. He may also for the purpose aforesaid board any ship about to depart for a place beyond New Zealand.

(2) The master of a ship arriving from a place beyond New Zealand shall forthwith on arrival deliver to the officer of Customs (a) the passenger-list and crew-list, or a true copy thereof, and (b) a list in Form 11 showing the particulars indicated therein respecting the persons on board his ship, and shall make the declaration with respect to such particulars set out in the said form. The said master shall also truly answer any questions relating to the passengers and crew put to him by the officer for the purposes of the said Acts.

12. The master of any ship (a) arriving from a place beyond New Zealand, or (b) about to depart for a place beyond New Zealand, shall, if required by the officer of Customs, make suitable arrangements to the satisfaction of such officer to enable him to inspect and examine each passenger and each member of the crew, and shall also provide such reasonable accommodation and writing-materials as may be required by that officer for the purposes of the Immigration Restriction Acts.

13. The officer of Customs may put such questions as he deems necessary to any passenger or member of the crew for the purposes of the said Acts, and every person who refuses or fails to answer any such question, or who answers any such question in a manner which is false or misleading in any material particular, commits a breach of these regulations.

14. The Health Officer shall inform the officer of Customs as to any person on board the ship who comes within the restrictions of section 4 or of paragraph (b) or paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 14 of the Immigration Restriction Act, 1908.

15. The master of any ship arriving from a place beyond New Zealand who brings such ship alongside any wharf or landing-place without the permission of an officer of Customs commits a breach of these regulations.

16. Subject to the powers conferred on any Officer of Health under the Health Act, 1920, no person other than a pilot or other person necessary for the navigation of the ship shall, without the permission of an officer of Customs, board or leave any ship arriving from beyond New Zealand until the said ship shall, with the permission of such an officer, have come alongside a wharf or landing-place, or until the expiry of such further time as may be required by the officer of Customs for the inspection and examination of the passengers and crew.

PERSONS EN ROUTE TO PLACES BEYOND NEW ZEALAND.

17. Any prohibited immigrant arriving at a port in New Zealand who satisfies the Collector of Customs that he is en route to some place beyond New Zealand may be permitted

to land for a period not exceeding twenty-one days; provided that in every such case security by way of cash, bond, or otherwise to the satisfaction of the Collector of Customs shall be given to the Collector that the said prohibited immigrant will depart from New Zealand within the period allowed, and that he will report himself to the Collector prior to departure.

CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION.

18. (1) Every person permanently resident in New Zealand who desires to leave New Zealand with the intention of returning thereto, and who is a person who would require a permit to enter New Zealand, shall make application in Form 12 to the Collector of Customs at the port nearest to his place of residence or at the final port of his departure for a certificate of registration under the Immigration Restriction Acts, and shall verify the particulars supplied in his application by a declaration made before an officer of Customs; provided that if the person desiring to leave New Zealand as aforesaid is under the age of fifteen years the application and declaration may be made by his father or by such other person as the Minister may permit. The declaration aforesaid shall be that set out in the said Form 12.

(2) Every such person shall provide two unretouched and unmounted half-length recent photographs of himself, of a size not exceeding $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. by $3\frac{1}{2}$ in. and not less than 3 in. by 2 in. He shall also furnish, at his own expense, such evidence as to his identity and residence in New Zealand, or as to any other fact or circumstances connected with him, as the Collector considers necessary to enable him to determine whether or not a certificate of registration should be issued.

(3) One of the photographs aforesaid shall be securely attached to the certificate, and the other shall be retained by the Collector.

(4) If the Collector is satisfied that the applicant is, under these regulations, entitled to a certificate of registration he shall issue the same in Form 13; but if he thinks it necessary or advisable he may refuse to deliver the said certificate to the applicant until the latter is on board the ship by which he is to leave New Zealand.

(5) Such certificate shall entitle the applicant to return to New Zealand within four years from the date of the same, or within such other period as the Minister may in any case determine.

(6) On the return to New Zealand of a person holding a certificate of registration issued in accordance with these regulations the Collector at the first port of arrival of the ship by which he so returns, if satisfied as to the identity of the holder with the person to whom the certificate was issued and that he has returned within the period specified in the certificate for his return, shall permit such person to land in New Zealand.

(7) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Minister may direct that any certificate of registration shall be or shall be deemed to be revoked if in the application for such certificate any statement is made or any information is furnished which is incorrect in a material respect.

OATH OF OBEDIENCE TO LAWS OF NEW ZEALAND.

19. Any person may take the oath prescribed by section 16 of the Immigration Restriction Amendment Act, 1920, by signing in the presence of an officer of Customs a written copy of the oath in the form prescribed by that section, whether in the English or any other language.

DECLARATION BY PERSONS ARRIVING IN NEW ZEALAND.

20. The declaration under section 3 of the Immigration Restriction Amendment Act, 1923, to be made and delivered to officers of Customs by persons before they land in New Zealand from places beyond the seas shall be in Form 14.

BREACHES OF REGULATIONS.

21. Every person who, in any declaration under these regulations, makes any statement which is incorrect in a material respect commits a breach of these regulations.

22. Every person to whom a permit is issued under these regulations shall comply with all the conditions contained in such permit, and a breach of any such conditions shall accordingly be a breach of these regulations.

23. Every person who commits a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine of £50.

- (1) Persons not of British birth and parentage within the meaning of section 5 of the Immigration Restriction Amendment Act, 1920, whether or not they are in possession of permits to enter New Zealand or of certificates of registration entitling them to enter New Zealand on compliance with the conditions set forth therein.
 - (2) Persons who are insane, lunatic, idiotic, deaf, dumb, blind, or infirm.
 - (3) Persons who are suffering from tuberculosis, syphilis, leprosy, and any contagious disease which is loathsome or dangerous.
 - (4) Any person the date of whose arrival in New Zealand is earlier than two years after the termination of any imprisonment suffered by him in respect of any offence which, if committed in New Zealand, would be punishable by death or imprisonment for two years or upwards, not being a mere political offence, and no pardon having been granted.
- The list must include not only passengers, but also members of crew, who are prohibited or restricted immigrants or in possession of permits or certificates of registration.

(3) In the application to such works of section 3, subsection (2), paragraph (d), and section 25 of the Copyright Act, 1913, the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the said Act in section 25, subsections (7) and (8), wherever that expression occurs.

(4) In the application to such works of section 32 of the Copyright Act, 1913, the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the said Act wherever that expression occurs in subsection (1), paragraph (a), and for the 1st July, 1913, in subsection (1), paragraph (b).

This order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, which date is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

The Samoa Seditious Organizations Regulations, 1930.

HIS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of Samoa conferred upon him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. PRELIMINARY.

- (1) THESE regulations may be cited as the Samoa Seditious Organizations Regulations, 1930.
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day following the date of publication thereof in the *Western Samoa Gazette*.
- (3) In these regulations—
 - (a) "Organization" includes as well as any society or body any two or more persons associated for any purpose who act or intend to act in conjunction with each other, or who associate together with the object of considering or carrying out purposes as an organization, whether such purposes are to be carried out by any number of such persons or any other person or persons acting on their behalf:
 - (b) A "seditious organization" means an organization declared to be seditious by the Administrator of Western Samoa.

2. SEDITIOUS ORGANIZATIONS.

- (1) The Administrator may, by Proclamation published in the *Western Samoa Gazette*, declare the organization known as the Mau or any other organization which in his opinion has been formed in support of or in substitution for the Mau to be a seditious organization within the meaning of these regulations, or, with the consent of the Governor-General in Council, any other organization which in his opinion has similar methods, aims, and objects.
- (2) Any such Proclamation may at any time be revoked.

3. RESTRICTIONS ON SEDITIOUS ORGANIZATIONS.

- (1) No person shall summon, organize, conduct, or address, or attempt or assist to summon, organize, conduct, or address, any meeting held or proposed to be held by or for the purposes of a seditious organization.
- (2) No person shall use any premises or grant or offer or agree to grant the use of any premises for a meeting held or proposed to be held by or for the purpose of a seditious organization.
- (3) No person shall attend or invite any other person to attend any meeting held or proposed to be held by or for the purposes of a seditious organization.
- (4) No person shall participate in the activities of, or aid, abet, or encourage in any way whatsoever the continuance, activities, or objects of any seditious organization, or by any badge, symbol, uniform, flag, banner, or any other means whatsoever, identify himself with or express his approval of any seditious organization.

4. PENALTIES.

Every person who commits an offence against Regulation 3 hereof shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months, or to a fine not exceeding two hundred pounds (£200).

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth—subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and dated the eleventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twelfth day of the same month, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor (and hereinafter collectively referred to as “the regulations”), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein—hereby authorize the Christchurch Tramway Board (hereinafter referred to as “the licensee”) to erect and maintain electric lines along the routes described in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of supplying power to trackless electric cars.

SCHEDULE.

1. ALL those routes shown by red and blue lines on the plans deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington and marked P.W.D. 76752 (sheets I to VIII), the said routes being generally described as follows:—

A. Lines for one-way traffic commencing from the centre of Cathedral Square and running southwards across the said Cathedral Square and along Colombo Street to High Street; thence via High Street to its junction with Manchester Street; thence northerly along Manchester Street to Armagh Street; together with cross connecting lines from the intersection of Manchester Street and Cashel Street, westerly along Cashel Street to High Street; from the intersection of Armagh and Manchester Streets, continuing by lines for two-way traffic along Manchester Street to Oxford Terrace; thence generally in a north-easterly direction along Oxford Terrace and Kilmore Street to Fitzgerald Avenue; thence northerly along Fitzgerald Avenue, Avalon Street, Hills Road, Warden Street, and Petrie Street to its junction with Shirley Road, a distance of 2 miles 60 chains, more or less, with a Y-loop at that junction for turning purposes; as shown more particularly on sheets I, II, III, and VIII of plan above referred to.

B. Lines for two-way traffic commencing from the junction of Petrie Street and Shirley Road, and proceeding thence easterly along that road and the New Brighton Road to its junction with Francis Street; thence via Francis Street, Bassett Street, Travis Road, Rockwood Avenue, and Bowhill Road to the Esplanade, a distance of 4 miles 17 chains, more or less, and terminating in a balloon loop as shown on sheets III, IV, V, and VI of the plan above referred to.

C. Lines for one-way traffic from the intersection of Manchester Street and Armagh Street and running westerly along Armagh Street to Colombo Street; thence southward via Colombo Street to the centre of Cathedral Square, the commencing-point of Route A hereinbefore described, a distance of 23½ chains, more or less, as shown on sheet I of the plan hereinbefore referred to.

D. Lines for one-way traffic commencing from the junction of Colombo Street with Cathedral Square, and proceeding thence easterly through the said Cathedral Square along Worcester Street to its junction with the route in Manchester Street described in Route A hereinbefore described, being a distance of 13 chains, more or less, as shown on sheet I of the plan above referred to.

E. Lines for two-way traffic commencing from the intersection of Hereford Street and Manchester Street, and proceeding thence in an easterly direction along Hereford Street to Madras Street; thence southerly along Madras Street to Moorhouse Avenue; thence easterly along Moorhouse Avenue, and terminating in a balloon loop through a depot in Moorhouse Avenue adjoining the Tramway Repair Shops, a distance of 79 chains, more or less, as shown more particularly on Sheets I and VII of the plan above referred to.

F. Lines for two-way traffic commencing from the intersection of Lichfield Street and High Street for two-way traffic south-easterly along High Street and Lower High Street to its junction with Fitzgerald Avenue; thence

southerly along that avenue and terminating in a loop passing through the depot at the corner of Fitzgerald Avenue and Moorhouse Avenue, a distance of 72 chains, more or less, as shown more particularly on sheet VIII of the plan hereinbefore referred to.

2. The trolley-wires shall not be less than No. 2/0 S.W.G. hard-drawn solid copper or cadmium-copper wires, firmly attached to approved insulators, and erected on supports placed not more than 130 ft. apart.

Trolley-wire feeder-cables, if carried overhead, shall be covered with weatherproof triple braiding: Provided that, where circumstances permit, the Minister may approve of bare conductors being used; and provided that where electric feeder-cables intersect the Post and Telegraph Department's lead-covered cables, vulcanized indiarubber insulation of not less than 600 megohm grade shall be substituted for weatherproof triple braiding.

Double insulation shall be provided between the positive and negative trolley-wires and between the positive trolley-wire and earth. Single insulation shall be provided between the negative trolley-wire and earth on all span wires and pull-offs.

The maximum difference of potential between the positive and negative trolley-wires, and between trolley-wire feeders and the ground shall not exceed 650 volts.

The best means available shall be adopted for preventing the occurrence of undue sparking at the rubber or rolling contacts in any place.

3. The conductors shall be carried on substantial and durable supports, which shall be designed to have a factor of safety of four in the case of steel, iron, or ferro-concrete, and five in the case of wood, calculated upon the ultimate strength of the material, assuming the wind-pressure to be 30 lb. per square foot upon a plane surface and 18 lb. per square foot upon a diametral plane upon a cylindrical surface.

4. The trolley-wire shall not in any part thereof be at a less height than 18 ft. from the surface of the ground.

5. (1) Where telegraph, telephone, or electric-fire-alarm wires (hereinafter referred to as “the first-mentioned wires”), are carried along either overhead or underground on one side of the road to be used by the trackless electric car, the said electric lines (either overhead or underground) of the trackless electric-car system shall be carried along on the other side thereof unless otherwise approved by the Minister of Telegraphs.

(2) At all points where it is necessary for the said electric lines to be carried across the first-mentioned wires, they shall be carried across and under the same at right angles if possible, and the first-mentioned wires shall be carefully insulated at the expense of the licensee over a sufficient length to prevent any contact in the event of accident to either line, and proper guard-wires effectively earthed shall be provided where necessary, at the like expense, to prevent the first-mentioned wires, or any other overhead wires, from getting into contact with the said electric lines. Where the first-mentioned wires run parallel to and higher than the said electric lines, and the poles supporting the pull-off or span wires are on the same side of the road as those supporting the first-mentioned wires, and wherever it is considered that by reason of accident or otherwise there is a danger of the first-mentioned wires falling across the said electric lines or their supports, guard-hooks and approved insulators, or other approved protective devices, shall be provided and erected by and at the expense of the licensee to the satisfaction of the Minister.

(3) Where poles are erected on both sides of the road those on the one side of the road must comply with the requirements of the Minister of Telegraphs in order to provide reasonable facilities for their joint use.

6. The design of all poles, posts, standards, brackets, and other attachments used in connection with the said electric lines shall be subject to the approval of the Minister, and they shall be constructed in accordance with such approved design, and erected in such manner, as is approved in writing by the Minister.

7. The licensee shall take all reasonable precautions in constructing, placing, and maintaining the said electric lines and other works of all descriptions, and also in working the undertaking so as not to injuriously affect by fusion or electrolytic action any gas or water pipes, sewers, drains, or conduits, or other pipes, structures, or substances, or to injuriously interfere with the working of any telegraph, telephone, electric-lighting, or electric-fire-alarm lines or apparatus.

8. This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinbefore expressed, continue in force for a period of ten years from the date hereof. Upon expiry of the said term, or upon sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

9. The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs or the Minister of Railways any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of the telegraph-lines which are the property of the Telegraph or Railway Departments and which were erected prior to the licensee's lines.

10. Notwithstanding anything contained in the regulations incorporated herein, no extensions or lines other than those along the routes hereinbefore described shall be deemed to be authorized by this license.

BY-LAWS (INCLUDING AMENDMENTS TO 19TH NOVEMBER, 1929) RELATING TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE CHRISTCHURCH FIRE BRIGADE AND REGULATIONS FOR ENSURING DISCIPLINE AND GOOD CONDUCT OF PAID AND AUXILIARY MEMBERS OF THE BRIGADE.

In pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in the Fire Brigades Act, 1926, and of all and each and every other power in that behalf enabling it, the Christchurch Fire Board makes and ordains this by-law.

The Short Title of this by-law shall be the Christchurch Fire Board By-law No. 1, and shall come into force on 16th January, 1930.

PART I.

INTERPRETATION.

1. In this by-law, if not inconsistent with the context, the words and phrases following shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:—

“Fire District” shall mean the Christchurch Fire District as constituted under the Fire Brigades Act, 1926, and any amendments thereto.

“Board” shall mean the Christchurch Fire Board.

“Brigade” shall mean the Christchurch Fire Brigade hereinafter established and so named.

“Members” shall mean paid and auxiliary members of the Brigade as hereinafter classified, and shall include paid and auxiliary officers thereof.

Words importing the singular include the plural number, and words importing the plural number include the singular number.

NAME OF BRIGADE.

2. The Brigade shall be known as “The Christchurch Fire Brigade.”

3. (1) The Brigade shall consist of two classes:—

(a) Paid officers and members—namely, persons who are employed solely in the service of the Board as members of the Brigade, and who are not permitted to engage in any employment outside the Brigade, except with the special permission of the Board.

(b) Auxiliary officers and members—namely, persons who are enrolled as members of the Brigade engaged in certain drills and practices, and at fires, but who follow their ordinary avocation.

(2) The rates of pay for officers and members, and the rates of pay or allowances to auxiliary officers and members shall be as may be determined from time to time by the Board, or as provided under any award made under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, or any Act passed in substitution therefor.

OFFICERS.

4. The officers of the Brigade shall consist of the Superintendent, a Deputy-Superintendent, and such number of officers as the Board may from time to time determine.

APPOINTMENTS AND PROMOTION OF OFFICERS.

5. The appointment of the Superintendent shall be made by the Board.

The appointments of the Deputy-Superintendent and officers shall be made by the Board on the recommendation of the Superintendent, either by promotion of officers or men in the Board's service or by engagement of men not heretofore in the service of the Board. Promotion to rank above that of first-class fireman shall not necessarily be by seniority.

RANKING OF OFFICERS.

6. After the Superintendent and Deputy-Superintendent, officers shall rank as follows: Foreman, Motor foreman, Station Officers, Senior Firemen, and no other titles will be recognized.

QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERSHIP OF THE BRIGADE.

7. Candidates for appointment must be physically strong men, free from any defect in limb, hearing, or sight, and will be required to undergo a medical examination by such legally qualified practitioners as the Board may appoint.

They must be not less than 21 (twenty-one) years of age nor more than 32 (thirty-two) years, unless they have been previously and recently engaged as active and efficient firemen, or are otherwise thoroughly competent. In such cases the limit may be extended to forty years. They must not be less than 5 ft. 6 in. in height, nor less than 36 in. in natural chest measurement. They must be able to read and write, and will be required to produce testimonials as to character and ability. They will also be required to produce certificate of birth or other satisfactory proof of age.

APPLICATION FOR APPOINTMENT TO BRIGADE.

8. Application for appointment to either the paid class or the auxiliary class must be made on a form approved by the Board, and such form shall require answers to questions regarding the particular requirements set forth in clause No. 7.

MEMBERS ON APPOINTMENT TO SERVE A TERM OF PROBATION.

9. Eligible candidates, when finally approved, will be accepted as members of the Brigade on probation only, the time of which shall not be less than three months for paid members and auxiliary members. If at the end of such term the probationer shall have given satisfaction to the Superintendent and has proved himself suitable, his appointment to the Brigade may be confirmed by the Board.

TERM OF ENGAGEMENT.

10. The engagement of the Superintendent and Deputy-Superintendent shall be for one month, and shall so continue until determined by one month's notice in writing given by or to the Board.

ENGAGEMENT TERMINABLE BY BOARD.

11. All engagements or appointments made by the Board may be cancelled, annulled, or terminated by the Board.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

12. Leave of absence of officers and members of the Brigade shall be as may be decided from time to time by the Board or as provided under any Award made under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, or any Act passed in substitution therefor.

RETIRING AGE.

13. The ages at which members of the Brigade must retire from the service shall be as follows: Superintendent, 60 years; Deputy-Superintendent, 55 years; Foreman, 50 years; Fireman, 50 years; Motor-drivers, 50 years; but the Board may if it thinks fit in any special cases extend these limits for a further five years or more.

THE SUPERINTENDENT.

14. The duties and powers of the Superintendent shall be as follows:—

(a) He shall be responsible to the Board for the efficiency of the members of the Brigade and all gear used in its service.

(b) He shall have power during the probationary term of service to dispense with the services of such probationer for any cause which he, the Superintendent, shall think fit.

(c) He shall have power if he deem it necessary to engage Auxiliary Firemen or other men to temporarily fill the place of permanent firemen. And he may from time to time dispense with the services of all or any such men.

(d) He shall have power to deal with all cases of breaches of regulations, orders, directions, duty, or discipline committed by members of the Brigade in manner set forth in these regulations; and he shall have power to suspend any member for breach of discipline or misconduct of any description at any time, but must at once report such suspension to the Board. The member who has been dealt with or who has been suspended may appeal to the Board, who may hold an inquiry into the alleged breach of discipline or misconduct. At such inquiry the suspended member shall be present, and have the right to speak in his defence, and, if he desires, bring witnesses in support of same.

(e) He shall allot quarters to the members of the Brigade, and such members shall reside in such quarters as he may from time to time direct.

(f) He shall allot such duties to the members of the Brigade as he shall deem necessary for ensuring the efficiency thereof, and may withdraw any member from any special duty and allot him fresh duties at his (the Superintendent's) discretion.

- (g) He shall keep an order-book in each station, in which all orders and instructions to the members of the Brigade shall be entered. Such orders shall be dated and signed by the Superintendent. This order-book shall be kept at such place in each station that all members may have access to it, and it shall be the duty of the members to make themselves acquainted with the orders and instructions contained therein. One of the order-books shall be produced at each meeting of the Board if required.
- (h) He shall prepare requisitions for all goods, materials, or stores required for the service of the Brigade, and submit same on the first day of each month to the Secretary of the Board. On the requisitions being approved, and the goods, materials, or stores delivered, he shall check same as to numbers, weights, and quantities, and shall certify to having received same, and that they are in accordance with the approved requisitions. In cases of urgency, he may purchase goods or order repairs to the value of (not exceeding) £5, and shall at once report such purchases or orders for repairs to the Secretary of the Board, and state the reason of the urgency. Except as herein provided, he shall have no power to purchase on behalf of the Board, nor to in any way pledge the Board's credit for goods, materials, or stores, or for repairs. The Superintendent to strictly adhere to any arrangements made by the Board for obtaining goods in accordance with accepted tenders, or to advise the Board that better results can be obtained by calling for tenders.
- (i) He shall keep, or cause to be kept, an inventory ledger in which shall be entered all property of the Board in charge of the Brigade.
- (j) He shall have power to arrange the days in each week and the times in each year when and during which paid members shall be entitled to leave of absence as provided by clause 12 of this by-law, and not exceeding the hours therein mentioned; and he shall have power to grant leave of absence to the auxiliary members for any period not exceeding one month in any one year; and he may, for sufficient reason, either from stress of work or other cause, cancel any or all leave at any time. Any leave of absence for longer periods than stated shall only be granted by the Board on a written request from the member to the Superintendent, and accompanied by a recommendation from the Superintendent that the same be allowed.
- (k) He shall, as soon as conveniently may be done after the receipt by the Brigade of a call to attend any fire or false alarm, report to the Secretary of the Board on the form provided for that purpose such particulars as to the call as shall be required by the said form.
- (l) He shall keep, in a book provided for that purpose a roll of the members of the Brigade. Such roll book to contain the names, ages, occupations, and addresses of members.
- (m) He shall prepare all returns that may be required under the Fire Brigades Act.
- (n) He shall perform any duty the Board may from time to time assign to him.

15. In the absence of the Superintendent from any cause, the Deputy-Superintendent, or, in his absence, the next senior officer, shall have and exercise all the powers and duties laid down for the Superintendent.

16. Every member of the Brigade must obey the lawful orders of his superior officers only, and must conform to all the rules and regulations which have been made or which may be made from time to time by the Board, and all orders and instructions which may be issued from time to time by the Superintendent in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Board and entered in the order-book hereinbefore provided to be kept.

17. In the absence of the Superintendent or Deputy-Superintendent at any fire, the senior officer present shall assume command of all members attending such fire, including volunteers and private brigades, and all members shall work under his orders only.

18. Misconduct or breach of discipline by any member of the Brigade shall constitute a breach of the by-laws, and the Board may in its discretion inflict fines up to a sum not exceeding £2 in the case of a paid member, or £1 in the case of an auxiliary member receiving any pay or allowance, for every separate offence, or may dismiss such member. Any fines as aforesaid shall be stopped from any pay or allowance due to the offending member.

19. For misconduct or breach of discipline by any officer, in addition to the fines provided by paragraph 18, the Board may reduce such officer in rank.

20. On discharge from the Board's service, either by resignation or dismissal, each member must return to the station to which he may be posted, in good order and condition (fair wear and tear excepted) every article of clothing or equipment the property of the Board which may be on issue to him, and in the event of his failing so to do, the cost of any article of clothing or equipment not returned or returned in a damaged condition shall be charged to him and deducted from any pay or money that may be due to him or recovered by process of law.

21. Donations by the public in recognition of the Brigade's services shall be the property of the Brigade to be used in providing for the comfort and recreation of the members, or otherwise for the benefit of the Brigade, in accordance with the regulations the Brigade may make and the Board approve.

22. The Board may from time to time establish and maintain, protect, remove, or otherwise deal with electrical fire alarm circuits within the fire district as may seem fit.

23. The Board shall have power from time to time to fix a scale of charges for maintenance or control or use of the fire-station or fire alarm circuits connected therewith.

24. The Superintendent may, with the permission of the Board, or Chairman or Deputy-Chairman, should occasion require, permit a portion of the Brigade and plant to be taken outside the limits of the fire district, or on shipping, subject to the payment by the owner or occupier of any building, and by the owner or agent of any ship or vessel of such charges as the Board shall from time to time consider adequate.

25. The Board may arrange that an annual fee be paid for retaining the services of such plant at such charges as may have been determined by the Board; provided always that the services of such plant are available, and the same are not required within the fire district.

26. The Board may permit a portion of the Brigade or plant to render services other than at fires under special circumstances, and in such cases such charges may be made as for services of the brigade and use of plant for attending fires outside the fire district, or as the Board may consider adequate.

27. The charge for services of members of Brigades at theatres, music halls, and the like, shall be for each fireman, 5s. 6d. for each evening attendance and 5s. for each afternoon attendance. Not more than two firemen for each building.

PART II.

BEING REGULATIONS FOR ENSURING DISCIPLINE AND GOOD CONDUCT OF PAID MEMBERS OF THE BRIGADE.

The conditions of service for paid members of the Brigade shall be as hereunder set out, and such conditions of service shall be signed by every member on entering the service of the Board.

1. Every member is to devote the whole of his time to the services of the Board and in any capacity as may be required of him by the Board.
2. He is to serve and reside wherever it may suit the requirements of the Superintendent.
3. He is promptly to obey all lawful orders from the persons in authority over him.
4. He is to obey all the by-laws and regulations of the service which may be made from time to time by the Board.
5. One week's notice shall be given by a member to the Superintendent of his intention to terminate his agreement of service with the Board, and the service of a member shall be liable to be terminated by the Superintendent on one week's written notice being given to such member. If any member withdraws without such notice, he will forfeit all pay to him, and be formally dismissed from the service, but this condition shall not apply to officers.
6. Every member is liable to immediate dismissal without any notice for unfitness, negligence, or misconduct, independently of any fines to which he may be liable, as provided by clause 18 of this by-law, and if he be dismissed from the service he is liable to forfeit the whole of his pay then due.
7. Members of the Brigade must address in writing all applications and communications on Brigade matters to the Superintendent, who will consider them and forward them on to the Board, with a recommendation for or against, unless they are such as he is empowered to deal with himself.
8. Members must keep their boots and uniforms in a neat tidy condition and in good repair, and any failure to do so will be considered neglect of duty.

PART III.

BEING REGULATIONS FOR ENSURING DISCIPLINE AND GOOD CONDUCT OF THE AUXILIARY MEMBERS OF THE BRIGADE.

The conditions of service for auxiliary members of the Brigade shall be as hereunder set out, and such conditions

of service shall be signed by every officer and member on entering the service of the Board.

1. Every member shall reside at the station, or within such easy distance therefrom as the Superintendent may approve.
2. Every member in the employ of the Board will be supplied with suitable uniform and accoutrements, for the safety, cleanliness, good order, and repair of which the member will be held responsible. Such uniform, boots, and accoutrements remain and are the property of the Board, and may be worn only when the members are on duty. Any member wilfully damaging or disposing of all or any portion thereof, will be liable to be prosecuted.
3. Every member on joining the Brigade is required to make himself acquainted with the by-laws and regulations in force, and also with such drills and orders as may be made from time to time by the Board or the Superintendent.
4. Every member is required to obey all lawful orders given by persons placed in authority over him, and also strictly to comply with all regulations and orders issued by the Board or the Superintendent and entered in the order-book.
5. If the Board so decide, any member absenting himself without leave of the Superintendent from any fires or alarms, after working hours, may be fined 2s. 6d. for first offence; 5s. for second; and on the third consecutive absence to be dismissed; any officer shall be liable to double fines.
6. No member under any pretence whatever is permitted to leave the locality of a fire without the instruction or permission of the officer in charge at the fire.
7. Members shall not be allowed to take any intoxicating liquors or smoke while on duty without permission from the officer in charge at a fire or practice, or other duties.
8. Any member guilty of negligence or misconduct, whether on duty or not, or found in such a state as to unfit him to perform the duties required, may, at the discretion of the Superintendent, be suspended for the time being, and in extreme cases may be summarily dismissed the service.
9. In all cases of suspension the circumstances connected therewith and the Superintendent's decision are to be reported to the Board, which will deal with the matter at the next meeting, when the offending member may if he so wish, appeal against the Superintendent's ruling.
10. No member shall be entitled to any pay during the period he may remain under suspension from duty unless the Board, on investigation of the circumstances, acquit him from all blame in the matter.
11. Unless otherwise provided, one week's written notice given on either side shall terminate the agreement for service of members.
12. Auxiliary members of the Brigade are to be in uniform and report themselves for duty in the occurrence-book at 7 p.m. on alternate nights in each week. Members being absent from duty, unless with special permission, will be considered unsuitable for the Board's service.
13. Any member absenting himself from the city from any cause must consult the Superintendent, and should the Superintendent so desire, the member must provide a substitute during such absence, and payment of the substitute must be made by the member.
14. Members working at fires during their ordinary working hours, or in the time necessary to prepare for their daily duties, shall receive additional pay at the rate of 3s. per hour or part of an hour. These payments will only apply to work done between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.
15. The Superintendent shall have sole discretion as to the number of men to whom leave may be granted at any time.
16. The Superintendent may appoint all temporary members. All appointments, suspensions, or dismissals shall be immediately notified to the Chairman of the Board.

THE following by-law, made by the Opotiki Fire Board, is published in accordance with the Fire Brigades Act, 1926.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

MADE by the Opotiki Fire Board for the maintenance of discipline and to ensure the good conduct of the members of the Fire Brigade.

1. APPOINTMENT AND PROMOTION OF OFFICERS.

The Superintendent shall be appointed by the Board. The Deputy-Superintendent shall be appointed by the Board (due consideration being given to the recommendation of the Superintendent) either by selection from existing members or from outside the Brigade.

2. QUALIFICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP.

Candidates for appointment must be strong physically and free from any bodily defects. They must be not less than nineteen years of age.

3. APPLICATION FOR APPOINTMENT.

Application for appointment to the Brigade must be made on a form approved by the Board.

4. PROBATIONARY TERM.

Eligible candidates, when finally approved, will be accepted as members of the Brigade on probation only, the term of which shall not be less than three months. If at the end of such term the probationer shall have given satisfaction to the Superintendent, and shall have proved himself otherwise suitable, his appointment to the Brigade may be confirmed by the Board.

5. TERMINATION OF ENGAGEMENT.

All engagements or appointments made by the Board may be cancelled or annulled without any reason being assigned.

6. RETIRING AGE.

The age at which members of the Brigade must retire from the service shall be as follows: Superintendent or Deputy-Superintendent, sixty-five years; foreman, fifty-five years; firemen, fifty years; but the Board may, if it thinks fit, in any special cases, extend these limits for a further period.

7. THE SUPERINTENDENT.

In addition to the duties and powers contained in section 48 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1926, the duties and powers of the Superintendent shall be as follows:—

- (1) He shall be responsible to the Board for the efficiency of the members of the Brigade, and all gear used in its service.
- (2) He shall have the power to suspend any member for breach of discipline or misconduct of any description at any time, but must at once report such suspension to the Board. The member suspended may appeal to the Board, who will hold an inquiry into the alleged breach of discipline or misconduct. At such inquiry the suspended member may be present, and have the right to speak in his defence, and if he desires, bring witnesses in support of same.
- (3) He shall allot quarters to the resident members of the Brigade, and such members shall reside in such quarters as he may from time to time direct.
- (4) He shall allot such duties to the members of the Brigade as he shall deem necessary for ensuring the efficiency thereof, and may withdraw any member from any special duty and allot him fresh duties at his (the Superintendent's) discretion.
- (5) He shall keep a store book, in which shall be entered all property of the Fire Board, the date of the purchase, and the date it was used or condemned.
- (6) He shall keep the service-record book, containing the names, occupations, places of birth, dates of birth, dates of joining and discharge from the Brigade, with awards and punishments by the Board, in a proper manner.
- (7) He shall perform any duty the Fire Board may from time to time assign to him.

8. THE DEPUTY-SUPERINTENDENT.

He shall be under the direction of the Superintendent, in whose absence he shall take command of the Brigade.

9. THE FOREMAN.

He shall receive orders from the officer in charge, and see that they are all properly carried out. In the absence of the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent he will take command of the Brigade.

10. DUTIES OF RESIDENT MEMBERS IN CHARGE OF A STATION.

To be at station from 10.30 p.m. till 6 a.m., or a substitute in the absence of one or both.

To keep the premises and all appliances in thorough working order, and to see that the reels, engines, and escapes are in position, and ready in every particular to turn out immediately on a call being received.

To see that all electrical and other communicating appliances are maintained in proper working order.

To see that the watch-room clock is set at 9 o'clock every night.

Upon receiving a call to a fire the resident men will immediately communicate with the Superintendent, and, if knowing the locality of the fire, to inform him and then ring the bell to warn the members of the Brigade.

Upon the alarm of fire all members will immediately repair to the Station and bring reels, gear, &c., to the fire. The Superintendent and Deputy go direct to the fire.

On arriving at a fire and finding that other engines or appliances are already on the spot, to ascertain as soon as possible who is the senior officer present and to report himself to, and place himself under, the direction of such officer. If he himself is the senior officer, to take immediate command over all Brigade men and appliances present.

To implicitly obey all orders of his superior, and to exact the same implicit obedience from those serving under him.

To see that all orders of his superior, as far as they refer to matters under his control, are carried out in the most effective manner.

To make himself acquainted, as far as possible, with the exact position of all hydrants and fire plugs in his district.

Under no circumstances must any purchase of tools, stores, fodder, or materials of any description be made without first obtaining an order of the Board in writing on the requisition forms provided. Accounts for gas, water, and all other supplies or repairs must be duly certified as correct, and forwarded to the Superintendent monthly.

11. GENERAL RULES OF A FOREMAN.

To be always available for duty unless booked otherwise.

To be civil and respectful in demeanour, and clean in appearance.

To perform all duties entrusted to him in a prompt and efficient manner.

To study and otherwise endeavour to be able to perform the duties of his superiors should he be called upon to do so.

12. WATCH-ROOM DUTY.

Upon receiving a call from outside the town limits the man on station duty must at once inform the Superintendent or officer in charge, but must not ring the bell unless ordered to do so.

The watch-room at all stations is to be used for brigade business only.

The telephone in the watch-room is to be used for brigade business only.

Firemen on duty at night must remain partly dressed, except as to boots.

13. UNIFORM.

Officers and men of the Brigade shall at all times wear the regular uniform when on duty.

Members of the Brigade shall be mustered once a month, and their uniforms inspected.

14. GENERAL BEHAVIOUR.

A fine of 5s. is inflicted for absence from fires, and a fine of 2s. 6d. for absence at inspection parades unless the member is ill, incapacitated, out of town, or can satisfy the Superintendent of the cause of his absence.

A fine of 2s. 6d. is inflicted on any member who fails to return to the fire-station after working at a fire or fires, to clean up the gear and wash the hose and attend to his duties, unless leave is granted by the officer present.

A fine of 2s. 6d. is inflicted on any member who neglects orderly duties. These duties are: Keeping the plant, gear, &c., clean and in order, putting away hose left out to dry, and performing any services the Superintendent may require. Substitutes may be made, but the member first appointed will be held responsible for the work to be done. The men in charge of out-stations are exempt from the above, but are responsible for the care of the gear in their charge.

The Board shall have power to waive any fines so incurred if recommended by the Superintendent.

Any member of a brigade guilty of intoxication, disobedience of orders, insubordination, abusive or obscene language, shall thereby render himself liable, under the conditions of service, to instant suspension or dismissal.

Gambling is strictly forbidden on any part of Brigade premises.

Any member or members of a brigade who shall wilfully damage the property of the Fire Board must make the same good at his or their own cost.

No member of a brigade shall enter or in any way use the Board room except on business.

Persons calling to see members of brigades may be taken inside the station; but on no account shall any fireman invite a number of persons to visit a fire-station.

No noisy recreation shall be indulged in on brigade premises on Sundays.

15. GENERAL OUT-STATION DUTY.

The firemen in charge of a station must be promptly informed of all messages or other business requiring the attention of the Superintendent, and shall give or send the same to the Superintendent on the first opportunity.

No member of a brigade shall, under any circumstances, write any letters or furnish any information to the newspaper Press, except the foreman in charge of a station, who may give particulars respecting a fire which has been attended, provided a superior officer is not present.

Foreman or fireman in charge of a station shall, upon return from a fire, at once advise the Superintendent of all particulars within their knowledge, regarding the occurrence.

Members of the Brigade, after the Superintendent, shall be classed as follows: Deputy Superintendent, first branchman, foreman; and they shall rank according to numbers or rotation of service in their respective station. Promotion will be awarded at the discretion of the Superintendent.

In the absence of all officers, the senior fireman present shall assume command of the Brigade.

No man dismissed from the Brigade will be reinstated, except upon recommendation of the Superintendent.

Any member or members of the Brigade wishing to make a statement to the Superintendent may do so on request.

16. PROCEDURE AT ROLL CALL.

The men shall fall in single rank, and the officer in charge shall order the right-hand man of the front rank to take a pace and a half to the front.

At the command "DRESS UP," the whole of the rank except the right-hand man will take a pace to the front with their left feet, glance their eyes to the right, with a slight turn of the head in the same direction, and, commencing from the right, will shuffle up with short quick steps until each man can see the lower part of the face of the second man from him.

The officer will place himself about two paces from the right flank. The faces of the men, not their breasts or feet, are to form the line of dressing.

When the officer is satisfied that the line is correct, he will give the words "EYES FRONT," on which the men will turn their eyes and heads to the front.

The officer will then call the roll and enter in the "occurrence-book" the number of men available for duty or out-duty; also the numbers and names of all on leave, or sick, or suspended.

17. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS.

Orders must be given clearly and distinctly.

At fires and drills and at all other times orders must be given in a clear and distinct manner, and continual shouting must be avoided as much as possible. Every officer should cultivate his manner and tone of voice in giving orders, and no officer shall use violent language to the members of the Brigade.

Firemen should keep to the left when meeting in narrow places.

When men are approaching one another on a stairway, in a passage, or in a narrow place, each should keep to his left if possible.

Senior Officer's Appliance must not be passed.

When the senior officer is in charge of an appliance, none other moving in the same direction may pass him without permission.

How to stop vehicles approaching one another.

When two engines or reels are approaching each other from different directions, the officer in charge of either can stop the other by raising or lowering his lamp. The lamp on the off-side of the vehicle should be used.

Performance of particular service at fires must be reported immediately.

When working at a fire, any officer or fireman instructed by the Superintendent or officer in charge to perform any particular service must, at the earliest moment report that he has executed the same, or why he has failed.

Drill calls to be varied as regards time.

In the practice of turning out the reels and engines for drill, an officer should vary the time of call as much as possible, so that it may be unexpected by the men, and thus prove a true test of their readiness and general efficiency.

Excessive routine to be avoided.

Officers must use discretion, so as to avoid excessive routine and consequent worrying of the men.

Promptness at the beginning of a fire all-important.

Officers must remember that at the commencement of a fire avoidance of loss of time is all-important, and that quickness and judgment are therefore the qualities most required of them. Enormous loss of property may result from too much attention to detail at such a moment.

No unnecessary lengths of hose to be run out at the beginning of a fire.

In the first stages of a fire only sufficient hose to reach the fire should be run off, so that no time may be lost by passing the water through unnecessary lengths of hose, and in unnecessary handling.

Doors and windows of a burning building to be kept closed until the fire is attacked.

Special care must be taken at all times to keep the doors or windows of a burning building closed until every preparation has been made for attacking the fire. Neglect of this pre-

caution gives the flames a chance to spread, with the result that a fire which might have been extinguished with one jet of water may attain a strength beyond the power of all the appliances of the brigade to subdue.

18. WATCHING.

The Superintendent shall, wherever he deems it necessary, engage any member of the Brigade or other person to watch the premises where a fire has occurred until such time as he shall be relieved, at a wage of not more than 2s. per hour. The expenses to be paid by the owner of the property.

19. BUGLE AND WHISTLE CALLS.

The hydrants will be distinguished by numbers—viz., 1, 2, 3, and so on. One long call denotes that the call which will follow is for No. 1 hydrant.

Two long calls denote that the call which will follow is for No. 2 hydrant.

When either of the above calls is given, it is a caution to the hydrant man that the calls which follow are for him only.

One short call for turning on No. 1 delivery and two short calls for No. 2 delivery. Same calls for turning off water. One long continuous call to muster. Four calls to pack up gear. Going to or returning from a fire or practice, one to go on, two to halt.

The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 982 as against 1,080 in November, a decrease of 98. The deaths in December were 531—a decrease of 5 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 275, females 256. Forty-seven of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 8.85 per cent. of the whole number. Thirty-four of these were under one year of age.
