The rates of pay for captains and engineers shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st April, 1927; provided that in the case of the captain of the s.s. "Mountaineer" the rate of pay shall be £300 per annum from 1st April, 1927, and £320 per annum from 1st April, 1929.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

1. NorwITHSTANDING the provisions as to annual increments contained in the foregoing scales, any member or probationer may on appointment or promotion be paid and be classified according to the rate of salary or wages prescribed or payable for any subgrade or (where there are no subgrades) for any year.

2. Cadets shall, when located and living away from their homes, be paid lodging-allowance at the rate of £35 per annum while in Subgrade 1, £25 per annum while in Subgrade 2, and £10 per annum while in Subgrade 3 of Grade 8 of the First Division.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the First Schedule or in any other regulation, the Minister may, in order to give effect to any agreement or contract of service or for any other special reason, fix the rate of salary which shall be paid to any member or probationer or be attached to any office, and may determine the classification of such member or probationer or of the occupant for the time being of such office.

4. Time worked by a cleaner or fireman in the capacity of fireman or engine-driver respectively in pursuance of any regulations in that behalf shall be taken into account in fixing the rate of pay of such cleaner or fireman in the event of his being subsequently appointed to the position of fireman or engine-driver, as the case may be. For this purpose every 313 days actually worked as aforesaid shall be counted as one year. Time worked by a fireman as a night foreman of cleaners shall, for the purposes of this paragraph, be deemed to be time worked as an engine-driver.

5. Boilermakers who, on 12th August, 1926, were engaged at operating acetone or quasiarc-electricwelding plant shall while so engaged be paid $1\frac{1}{2}d$. per hour in addition to the rates prescribed for boilermakers in Subclass 2 of Class 2, Locomotive (Second Division).

6. With respect to members in Grades 7 and 8 of the First Division the following provisions shall apply :----

(a) No member in Grade 7 shall be eligible for advancement to a higher grade until he has passed an examination in subjects relating to the work of the branch in which he is employed :

Provided that the provisions of this subparagraph shall not apply to any member whose period of service with the Department on the 1st day of June, 1926, amounted to twelve years or more; nor to any member whose position or occupation is such that in the opinion of the Permanent Head no such examination is necessary.

(b) No member in Grade 8 shall be eligible for advancement to a higher grade until he has passed such test of efficiency as may be prescribed by the Permanent Head.

7. Salaries in excess of £765 per annum shall be as provided for in the annual estimates of the Department and appropriated by Parliament.

8. In any grading or regrading of positions, whether made in pursuance of the provisions of section 8 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1927, or otherwise, the maximum salary for any position in the First Division may be fixed at the rate of salary prescribed for any subgrade of any grade. 9. As soon as conveniently may be after the 1st day of April in each and every year there shall be

published in the Gazette a list setting out in order of classification as on the said date, the name, status, and pay of each member, probationer, and apprentice, and the length of time he has been in the service of the Department, together with such other particulars as the Minister may think fit.

- Provided that-
 - (a) With respect to every member and probationer the right to advance from one subgrade to another, or, where there are no subgrades, the right to receive any increase of pay in any year, shall in each case depend upon the efficiency and good conduct of the member or probationer to whom such advancement is due or to whose pay such increase is attached in accordance with the aforesaid Schedule; and no such advancement shall be made, and no such increase shall be payable, unless the Permanent Head of the Department certifies in writing that the member or probationer is entitled thereto :
- (b) No engine-driver shall receive any pay in excess of the rate prescribed for an engine-driver in the fourth year, unless and until he has passed to the satisfaction of the Permanent Head the departmental examination for a first-class engine-driver:
- (c) In any case where, by the aforesaid Schedule, the rate of pay of any member or probationer is fixed by reference to his age, that member or probationer shall, subject to the foregoing provisions of this section, be entitled to an increase of pay in every year as from the date of his birthday.

1. The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Saturday, the fifteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, at eight o'clock p.m., at the Schoolhouse, Four Peaks, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Saturday in each quarter at the time and place aforesaid, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor. 3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman,

Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.
 Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.
 All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.
 If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman for such meeting.

If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member 8. The Board in his stead. 8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meet-

ing to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year.

A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserves in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.

wind, and rainfall were above the normal, while temperatures and sunshine were below. Total bright sunshine, 171.4 hours, 40 per cent. of the possible, and two sunless days. Fog was in evidence on the 24th, thunder was heard on the 27th, and lightning was seen on the 28th. No frosts were recorded. Mean dew-point, 50.3°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.363 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1929.

After a long dry spell, rainy conditions had set in over a large part of the country at the end of October. These continued throughout November, which proved a dull and humid month. Heavy rains were recorded in many districts, some places having the wettest November for many years. The totals for the month were below the normal in the low-lying country facing the Taranaki Bight, from Patea to Foxton, in the Wairarapa, and on the Plain country of Canterbury and North Otago. Elsewhere there was an excess, that was in most cases considerable. At Auckland, Tairua, Nelson, and Clyde, the rain was more than double the average for November, while at Tauranga and Maraehako Station, near Opotiki, it was approximately double.

approximately double. Temperatures, though there was much warm and humid weather, were, on the average, below normal, especially over the South Island. Sunshine records were also low, while the amount of cloud was correspondingly high. There was more wind than usual, north-westerlies predominating. In this respect the previous absence of westerlies was to some extent counterbalanced, and a more normal type of spring weather experienced. Most of the rain fell in the north-westerlies, comparatively little being brought by the southerlies, which were rather poorly developed. This fact accounted for the continued dry conditions in some areas. Feed is abundant in most districts and stock are in fair to good condition. In Otago and Southland conditions are especially good, but in the remaining areas which had excess rainfall the growth has been too rank, and the weather has favoured the appearance of fungus and other pests. A spell of dry, sunny weather would do good in these districts. In Canterbury and the Wairarapa further rain is needed to ensure good crops and adequate supplies of feed. There were two principal storm periods, the first being from the 4th to the 9th, during which two cyclonic depressions crossed the Dominion, the first over Otago and the second over Auckland. Rain was general, and many heavy falls were humid, and rainy spell. On the 6th, a sudden thunderstorm and a heavy downpour occurred at Crushington, near Reefton, recorded in the North Island and western districts. In the central part of the North Island, particularly, this was a very warm, humid, and rainy spell. On the 6th, a sudden thunderstorm and a heavy downpour occurred at Crushington, near Reefton, where some of the creeks were flooded. On the 8th there was a flood in the Wairau River due to heavy rain in the back country. On the 9th particularly severe thunderstorms, accompanied by exceptionally heavy rains, occurred over a large part of the north central portion of the North Island. Flooding was reported from Auckland as far north as Whangarei, in the Lower Thames valley, and in the Napier district. There were several instances of stock being killed by lightning, and a house near Hastings was struck. In parts of the Coromandel Ranges the rain amounted to a deluge. At the Ohine-muri Mines, near Paeroa, a wall of water, 14 ft. high, came down one of the creeks and extensive damage was done, one life

muri Mines, near Factor, a wan of march, and of the following this, from the 10th to the 12th, occurred one of the finest spells in the month. In the rear of a westerly depression which passed on the 14th, gales were experienced generally on the 15th and 16th. In Cook Strait they were from the north-west, but elsewhere from the south-west. Snow fell on the ranges on the morning of the 16th, reaching the lower levels at Greymouth, the Bluff, and Nugget Point. A severe frost was experienced in the morning in parts of the South Island, especially North Canterbury, where much damage was done to gardens, fruit, and small crops. Nelson also suffered considerably. The second of the stormiest periods referred to above was that from the 26th to the end of the month, when a double-

crops. Nelson also suffered considerably. The second of the stormiest periods referred to above was that from the 26th to the end of the month, when a double-centred cyclone crossed the South Island. West or north-west gales occurred from Cook Strait northward, accompanied by heavy rains. In the South Island, also, the rain was general, but only light to moderate in the eastern districts. Again there were many severe thunderstorms. An interesting feature was another copious deposit of red dust from Australia over a wide area in Taranaki, western Wellington, Nelson, and Marlborough.

Open Season for Deer-shooting, Wanganui Acclimatization District.

N exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, Philip Aldborough de la Perrelle, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 2nd day of April, 1930, to the 16th day of May, 1930 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the Wanganui Acclimatization District, described in the First Schedule hereto, for the taking or killing of the following imported game—viz., fallow-deer bucks and does—subject to the following conditions game --- viz., fallow--following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill fallow-deer bucks and does may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Wanganui, on pay-ment of a license fee of £1, in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and regulations thereunder and this notification. 2. Ball cartridge only to be used: Provided that no metal-patched or metal-cased bullet shall be used for killing such deer. 3. No licenses shall allow the deer the start

No licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.
 Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing

any person to sell any deer or portion thereof. 5. Nothing in any license to take or kill fallow-deer bucks and does shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill fallow-deer bucks or does on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatiza-tion purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or on any land excepted from the operation of the notification declaring an open season for the district.

6. The licensee must give notice to the said Chief Post-master of the date on which it is his intention to stalk deer, such notice to be posted or delivered or telegraphed three clear days before such date.

7. Any person committing a breach of any of these condi-tions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £20.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Station (Mount Humphries); thence along a right line to the con-All that area in the Wellington and Taranaki Land Districts (Mount Humphries); thence along a right line to the con-fluence of the Tangarakau and Wanganui Rivers; thence down the middle of the Wanganui River and up the middle of the Paparoa Stream; along the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 9 and 3, Block XI, Tauakira Survey District, the northern boundaries of Section 1, Block XII, Tauakira Survey District, the southern boundary of Section 1, Block IX, Ngamatea Survey District, the south-western boundary of Ohotu No. 9 Block, and its production to the Mangawhero River; down the middle of that river and up the middle of River; down the middle of that river and up the middle of Rangitatau Stream to Field's Track; thence generally north-easterly along that track to the stream forming the north-eastern boundary of Ohotu 6a 1 Block; down the middle of that stream and up the middle of the Wangaehu River to the point in line with the northern boundary of Section 1, Block IV, Ngamatea Survey District; thence to and along Block IV, Ngamatea Survey District; thence to and along that boundary and the northern boundary of Section 8 to the Owhakura Road; easterly along that road, and along the northern boundaries generally of Sections 1, 2, 3, and 4, Block I, Maungakaretu Survey District, Sections 1, 2, 3, and 4, Block II, and the production of the last-named boundary to the middle of the Turakina River; up that river, and along the northern boundaries of Raketapauma Nos. 3A2, 1A 1, 1A 2, 1G, 1I 2 Blocks, to the Waiouru-Moawhango Road; north-easterly along the middle of that road to its junction with the Waiouru-Tokaanu Road; thence along a right line to Auahitotara Trig.
