Amending Regulations under the Dairy Industry Act, 1908, relating to the Inspection and Registration of Dairies.— (Notice No. Ag. 2884.)

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Dairy Industry Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend, to the Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend, to the extent and in the manner hereinafter provided, the regulations (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations") under the said Act relating to the inspection and registration of dairies, made by Order in Council on the twenty-fourth day of December, one thousand nine hundred, and published in the Gazette on the tenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and one, at page 66, and doth hereby declare that such amending regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the Gazette.

REGULATIONS.

1. CLAUSES 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of the principal regulations, and Order in Council made on the twentieth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and published in the Gazette on the twenty-second day of the same month, at page 3355, in amendment of clause 6 of the principal regulations are hereby revoked, and the following clauses substituted in lieu thereof. in lieu thereof:

REGISTRATION OF DAIRIES.

2. Every owner or occupier of a cow-shed or other building or place where cows are stalled or kept for the purpose of milking (whether now in existence or hereafter to be constructed) who sells, or offers for sale, either solely or partly for human consumption, as milk or cream within the Dominion any milk or cream produced from cows in or upon any such premises shall register such premises as a dairy with the Inspector for the district in which such premises are situated.

3. (1) Every application for registration shall be in the form No. 1 set forth in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect. Copies of such form may be obtained at the office of any

Inspector.
(2) Every application for registration shall be lodged with the Inspector for the district at least one month prior to the commencement of operations.

4. (1) Every certificate of registration shall be in the form No. 2 set forth in the Schedule hereto, and any such certificate may be withheld pending the completion in accordance with these regulations of the premises sought to be registered.

these regulations of the premises sought to be registered.

(2) Every certificate of registration shall continue in force, unless previously cancelled in accordance with these regulations, until the 31st day of March following the date of registration, and shall then expire: Provided that if the holder of any such certificate of registration shall apply in each succeeding year for a renewal of such certificate in pursuance of clause 5 hereof then such certificate shall, unless previously cancelled, remain in force for further successive periods of twelve months longer than it would have done but for each twelve months longer than it would have done but for each

such application.

5. (1) Every owner of a dairy registered in accordance with these regulations shall, if he desires the registration to continue in force after the 31st day of March in any year, make application to the Inspector for the district not later than the 1st day of March in that year for the renewal of the certificate of registration in force in respect thereof, but no renewal of such certificate shall take effect in respect of such dairy

prior to the 1st day of April in that year.

(2) Every such application shall be in the form No. 3 in

(2) Every such application shall be in the form No. 3 in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect. Copies of such form may be obtained at the office of any Inspector.

6. (1) The fee to be paid on the application for every registration, and on the application for every remewal of a certificate of registration subsisting and in force in accordance with these regulations, shall be the sum of ten shillings. In the event of registration being refused a refund of the fee so paid shall be made to the applicant.

(2) The fee to be paid on the application for every duplicate certificate of registration shall be the sum of two shillings and sixpence.

(3) No such duplicate certificate shall be issued except upon such documentary evidence of the loss of the original certificate as the Inspector shall deem sufficient.

2. ALL certificates of registration which originated under the provisions of the principal regulations and are subsisting and in force on the coming into operation of these regulations shall enure for the purposes of such regulations as fully and effectually as if they had originated under the corresponding provisions thereof, and accordingly shall be deemed to have so

originated.

2. UTILIZATION OF THE WATER.

The said water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity.

3. LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said water shall be taken from a pipe-line situated in Derwent Street, in the Borough of Naseby, as indicated in the plan marked P.W.D. 77039 (hereinafter referred to as the "said plan"), deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington.

4. General Description of Works.

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions herein contained, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the position of the said works being indicated on the said plan:—

(a) Headworks consisting of necessary intake:
(b) Pipe-line leading from such intake to the power-house hereinafter referred to; also tail-race from the power-

hereinafter referred to; also tail-race from the powerhouse to sludge channel.

(c) Power-house with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity:

(d) Transmission and other lines over the routes shown by means of green dotted lines on the said plan:

(e) Such further transmission and other lines within the premises of the licensee as may from time to time be required. Any extensions or alterations of lines pursuant to this paragraph shall be made only after compliance with the provisions of clauses 21, 22, and 23 of the regulations.

5. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

The licensee shall maintain the works used under this license in proper working-order during the continuance of such license.

6. Duration of License.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of twenty-one years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine, but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

7. RENTAL.

The licensee shall in respect of this license pay to the District Engineer, Public Works Department, Dunedin, a yearly rental of 4s. per kilowatt of maximum output generated during each and every year from 1st April, 1929, with a minimum of 8s. per annum. The output either shall be recorded by means of a watt-hour meter installed by the licensee, or, failing such installation, it shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating-plant installed.

8. Granting of other Water-rights.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from the same source except at the place where the licensee is by this licensee empowered to take it: Provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said source.

9. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

10. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon remove from the ground (if so required by the Minister) all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment of compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

11. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (c) of clause 5 of the regulations.

12. RIGHT TO ENTER LANDS, ETC.

The licensee shall have the right at any time or times during the continuance of this license, with the consent of during the continuance of this license, with the consent of the Minister, to enter upon any road or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such transmission-lines, poles, or other things as are required for the transmission of elec-tricity between the power-house hereinbefore referred to and any place to which the licensee is authorized to transmit electricity in pursuance of this license.

13. Power to take Land.

The licensee is hereby empowered to take, under the Public Works Act, 1928, as for a public work, such land as may, in the opinion of the Governor-General, be necessary or advisable to enable the licensee to construct and maintain the various works authorized by this license.

14. Compensation payable for Land injuriously AFFECTED, ETC.

In respect of all land injuriously affected, and in respect In respect of all land injuriously affected, and in respect of all damages done by the exercise of any of the powers conferred upon the licensee by this license, the licensee shall from time to time, as and when any such injury or damage accrues or happens, pay compensation in accordance with the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1928, in the same manner (subject to all necessary modifications) as if the licensee were a local authority and the claim were one for injury or damage arising out of the construction of a public work.

15. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to impose any liability Nothing in this incense shall be held to impose any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensee of the authority hereby granted; but the licensee shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensee of any of the powers granted by this license.

17. DEFAULT.
