A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS His Majesty King George V was graciously pleased, by Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, and bearing date at Westminster, the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, to constitute the office of Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Dominion of New Zealand and its dependencies: And whereas His said Majesty was also pleased, by a Commission under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date at Saint James's, the twentieth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, to appoint General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, to be Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over the said Dominion and its dependencies during His said Majesty's will and pleasure: And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by a Commission under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date at Saint James's, the twenty-third day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, amongst other things, to appoint the Chief Justice of the said Dominion for the time being to administer the Government thereof in case of the death, incapacity, or removal, or of the departure from the said Dominion of the Governor-General appointed under the said hereinbefore-in-part-recited Letters Patent, with all and singular the powers and authorities granted by the said Letters Patent: And whereas the said General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, departed from the said Dominion on the eighth day of February, instant:

Now, therefore, I, Michael Myers, the Chief Justice of the Dominion of New Zealand for the time being, do hereby proclaim and declare that I have this day taken the oaths prescribed by the hereinbefore-in-part-recited Letters Patent before the Honourable John Ranken Reed, C.B.E., one of the Judges of the Supreme Court of the said Dominion, and that I have assumed the administration of the Government of the said Dominion under and by virtue of His Majesty's said Commission.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Weights and Measures Act, 1925, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act.

REGULATIONS.

PRELIMINARY.

1. (1) THESE regulations may be cited as the Weights and Measures Regulations, 1926, Amendment No. 2.
(2) These regulations shall be read together with and be deemed to form part of the Weights and Measures Regulations, 1926 (hereinafter called the principal regulations).
(3) These regulations shall come into force on the date of publication hereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

PERSONAL WEIGHING-MACHINES.

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting therein, following Regulation 86 in Part II thereof, the following additional regulation:—
86a. (1) The term "personal weighing-machine" means

86A. (1) The term "personal weighing-machine" means any weighing instrument of a type specially designed for weighing persons, and for the use of which a charge is made.
(2) Every new personal weighing-machine shall—
(a) Comply with the requirements of these regulations relating to platform weighing-machines where applicable to its type;
(b) Have the same minimum graduation throughout its range and the weight corresponding to the minimum graduation not more than 1 lb.
(3) Every person who uses, or has in his possession for use.

(3) Every person who uses, or has in his possession for use, or makes available for use by the public any personal weighing-machine which is not stamped as required by these

weighing-machine which is not stamped as required by these regulations, or which is incorrect or not in accordance with these regulations, commits an offence.

(4) The errors permissible on verification shall not exceed the weight corresponding to one-half of the interval between consecutive graduations. On inspection, double the above errors shall be permitted.

Regulations for the Peace, Order, and Good Government of Western Samoa.

CHARLES FERGUSSON, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At Government House at Wellington, this 7th day of February, 1930.

Present: HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of Samoa conferred upon him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. This Order may be cited as the Samoa Administrator's Additional Powers Order, 1930.

2. For the purpose of ensuring the peace, order, and good

government of Samoa-

(a) The Administrator may, by Proclamation published in the Western Samoa Gazette, direct that any person travelling by land or by sea in such parts of Samoa as he shall define shall follow only such roads, paths, or routes, and travel only during such hours as the Administrator shall define

and prescribe by such Proclamation.

(b) The Administrator may authorize by writing under his hand any constable or constables of the Police Force of Samoa, or any member or members of the Samoan Constabulary or of the Samoa Military Police or of the Naval or Military Forces of His Majesty to detain and search any person travelling in the parts of Samoa defined as aforesaid, and to seize, open, and examine, and (where any person so authorized deems it necessary) take possession of and retain any goods, packages, messages, letters, pamphlets, or printed matter in the possession of such person or persons. Any person so authorized may employ such force as is necessary to obtain possession of such goods, packages, messages,

letters, pamphlets, or printed matter aforesaid.

(c) The Administrator may, by Proclamation published in the Western Samoa Gazette, limit or prohibit over such routes or areas by land or by sea as he thinks necessary the carrying of goods or supplies of food by any person other than those required by the person carrying the same for his own use and consumption during his journey, except in pursuance of a permit issued by the Administrator or any person authorized by him in that behalf. The goods and supplies of food in the possession of a person in breach of such Proclamation may be seized and detained by any constable of the Police Force of Samoa or any member of the Samoan Constabulary or the Samoa Military Police or of His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces, and detained for a period not exceeding fourteen days pending the decision of the High Court in respect thereof.

3. Any such Proclamation may at any time be revoked by the

Administrator by notice published in the Western Samoa Gazette.

4. Every person who disobeys the directions contained in a Proclamation issued under Regulation 2 (a) hereof shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not

exceeding fifty pounds.

5. Every person who refuses to deliver up for examination under Regulation 2 (b) hereof any such goods, packages, messages, letters, pamphlets, or printed matter upon being requested to deliver the same by a person duly authorized as aforesaid, or resists such person obtaining possession of the same, shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or a fine not exceeding twenty pounds.

6. Every person who disebeys the directions contained in a Proclamation issued under Regulation 2-(c) hereof shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds, and the goods or supplies of food seized in pursuance of the said Proclamation and regulation may be ordered to be confiscated, and may be disposed of in such manner as the

High Court may direct.

Bonus for a Commercially Practicable Method or Process of effecting Major Improvements in connection with the Preparation and Manufacture of New Zealand Hemp.—(Notice No. Ag. 2881.)

UBJECT to the conditions hereinafter appearing, the
New Zealand Government hereby offers to pay £10,000 New Zealand Government hereby offers to pay £10,000 as a bonus or bonuses for major improvements in connection with the extraction and dressing of fibre from the New Zealand hemp plant (Phormium tenax):—

(1) The machine or process in regard to which the whole or any part of the bonus is to be paid shall be recommended by a committee set up by the Government, and shall be approved by the Government.

(2) The £10,000 will be paid wholly or in part for a commercially practicable process of extracting and dressing the fibre of New Zealand hemp (Phormium tenax), whether by machinery or otherwise, whereby there shall be obtainable—

(a) A greatly improved quality of fibre marketable at a higher price.

(b) A considerably greater quantity of strong white fibre per ton of green leaf.

(c) A substantial reduction in the cost of producing the fibre.

Provided that in determining the amount of the

fibre.

Provided that in determining the amount of the bonus to be paid for any such process due regard shall he had to the rate of any royalty required to be paid by millers for the use of such process, and no bonus whatever will be paid—

(i) Unless it can be satisfactorily demonstrated that the improved process submitted in comparison with the best of present methods will enable the net returns from an efficient flaxmill to be increased by at least 15 per cent.;

(ii) If the amount of any such royalty will absorb
the whole or substantially the whole of the
increased net return above referred to.

(3) Any applicant for the bonus or part of the bonus must
have fulfilled the following conditions at the time of applica-

(a) The machine or process in question must have extracted the fibre from not less than 500 tons of green leaf.

(b) The fibre extracted from the 500 tons of green leaf must have been graded by a Government Grader, and not less than 90 per cent. of such fibre must have reached a grade not lower than "good fair."

(4) Applications for the bonus must be addressed to the Director-General, Department of Agriculture, Wellington, and must reach him not later than noon of the 30th November, 1931. They must be enclosed in an envelope clearly marked "Application for Phormium bonus."

(5) Each applicant shall state what royalty, if any, would require to be paid by millers for the use of his process during the currency of his patent rights.

(6) As soon as possible after the expiry of the time for receiving applications for the bonus (30th November, 1931), the Government will appoint a committee of not less than five—of whom two shall be New Zealand hemp millers—to open and examine the applications, to investigate such of the competing machines or processes as it considers worthy of trial, and to make recommendations to the Government as to

the payment of the bonus, having regard to the amount of royalty, if any, specified in such applications.

(7) Each applicant must give, at his own expense, such reasonable demonstrations of the working of his machine or process as shall be demanded by the said committee, and such demonstrations shall take place in New Zealand.

In accordance with the above estimates, the total yield of wheat for the Dominion should be approximately 7,100,000 bushels, as against an actual yield of 8,832,864 bushels for the season 1928–29.

The percentage of oats threshed for the five seasons ending with 1928-29 was 28.87 of the total area under that crop. Assuming that a similar proportion is threshed this year,

the total yield of grain should be approximately 3,150,000 bushels, as against an actual yield of 3,065,113 bushels for the season 1928-29.

The percentage of barley threshed for the five seasons ending with 1928–29 was 98·23 of the total area under that crop. Assuming that a similar proportion is threshed this year, the total yield of grain should be approximately 680,000 bushels, as against an actual yield of 781,102 bushels for the season 1928–29.

The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,109 as against 982 in December, an increase of 127. The deaths in January were 507, a decrease of 24 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 282, females 225. Fifty-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 10-26 per cent. of the whole number. Forty-five of these were under one year of age.

Distress Signals.

The experience of the Board of Trade shows that two of the existing statutory distress signals, viz.: "a continuous sounding with any fog-signal apparatus" and "flames on the vessel" are not only liable to abuse, but when used as distress signals have often given rise to misunderstanding. A succession of signals on the whistle or siren is frequently made cession of signals on the whistle or siren is frequently made for other purposes than of indicating distress, e.g., for summoning a pilot, and may be mistaken for a "continuous sounding." Similarly, working lights and "flare up" lights are authorized for use by fishing vessels and other small craft, and the simplest way of making a "flare up" light is to dip a rag in paraffin and set it alight. Unfortunately, small vessels in distress frequently make the signal "flames on the vessel" in the same manner. Thus it is often impossible to decide whether "flare up" lights are being shown or whether distress signals are being made, especially in areas where fishing is carried on. As a result uncertainty and delay have occurred As a result uncertainty and delay have occurred and lives have been lost in consequence.

Distress signals should be as distinctive as possible, so that

they may be recognized at once and assistance despatched

without delay. Thus, instead of making an indefinite succeswithout delay. Thus, instead of making an indefinite succession of blasts on the fog signalling apparatus when in distress, mariners should make the "continuous sounding" by repeating the Morse signal SOS (...,) on the whistle or fog-horn. If this is done there can be no mistake as to the meaning of the signal. Similarly, by night, if signalling for help by means of a lamp or flashing light the same signal SOS should always be used.

As regards the "flames on the vessel" signal, unless the flames making the signal are sufficiently large to attract immediate attention their chances of being recognized as a

flames making the signal are sufficiently large to attract immediate attention their chances of being recognized as a distress signal are very poor. The best distress signal is the signal rocket, and wherever possible a supply of rockets should be carried. Where this is not practicable an effective firework signal, which can be held in the hand while being discharged, should be provided in place of the rockets; such a signal should show a brilliant red flare and throw five or more red stars to a height of 80 feet. Failing either of these two signals a supply of ordinary red flares should always be carried. These red flares are now recognized by general custom as distress signals and, though not so effective as either rockets or the hand firework, are much more distinctive than the burning of rags, articles of clothing, &c., soaked in paraffin which should be used only as a last resource. Use should not be made of these red flares in any circumstances for any other purpose than that of indicating distress.—18th November, 1929 (36/2060.)
