A PROCLAMATION.

**W**HEREAS by section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, as amended by section ten of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1926, it is enacted that on the disposal of any national-endowment land by way of sale, or on the acquisition of the fee-simple of any such land, the Governor-General may by Proclamation declare that such land shall, as from a date to be specified in the Proclamation, cease to be national-endowment land:

And whereas the fee-simple of the land described in the Schedule hereto has been acquired, and it is expedient that the said land should cease to be national-endowment land:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the aforesaid section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, I, Michael Myers, Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the sixteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, the land described in the Schedule hereto, which was set apart as national-endowment land under the provisions of section two hundred and fifty-eight of the Land Act, 1908, ceased to be national-endowment land.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section eleven and by section seventeen of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1929 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act, and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall come into force on the day of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. In respect of every application for an advance under section seven or section fourteen of the said Act a fee of two pounds two shillings shall be payable to cover valuation and other expenses: Provided that in the case of any application made in respect of a newly selected holding no fee shall be payable.

2. If the application is refused without a valuation of the proposed security having been made, or if the applicant declines to accept the advance offered to him, the Lands Development Board may refund to the applicant the whole or such part as it thinks fit of the valuation fee so paid.

3. Advances made on current account pursuant to the provisions of section seven or of section fourteen of the said Act shall bear interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, and shall be secured by mortgage in the form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto, with such modifications as may be necessary.

4. (a) On the cessation of progress payments in respect of advances made pursuant to the provisions of section seven or of section fourteen of the said Act, the amount owing in respect of such advances may be discharged from the flat mortgage securing such advances, and the amount so discharged shall thereupon be secured by a mortgage over the land or the mortgagor's interest in the lease or license thereof in the form No. 2 in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

(b) All moneys so secured by the last-mentioned mortgage, together with interest thereon at the rate of six and a quarter per centum per annum, shall be repayable by half-yearly instalments over a period of thirty-six and one-half years. Amended Regulations under the Mining Act, 1926.

AMENDMENTS TO REGULATIONS.

REGULATION 115 is hereby amended by revoking paragraphs 5 (c) and 5 (e) thereof and substituting therefor the following:—

115. (5) (c) For sinking in solid rock where blasting is necessary, the shaft being not less than 4 ft. by 3 ft., 11s. 6d. per foot.

Where it is shown to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Mines that the cost exceeds £2 6s. per foot then 15s. 6d. per foot may be paid.

115. (5) (e) For tunnelling or driving through hard rock where blasting is necessary, the tunnel or drive being not less than 5 ft. by 3 ft.: For the whole distance 8s. per foot.

Where it is shown to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Mines that the cost exceeds £1 11s. per foot then 10s. 6d. per foot may be paid.
