Alteration of Boundaries of Waimatuku River District, Counties of Southland and Wallace.

## MICHAEL MYERS, Administrator of the Government. A PROCLAMATION.

I N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the River Boards Act, 1908, as amended by the River Boards Amendment Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, Sir Michael Myers, Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Waimatuku River District shall be altered so as to include in the said district the area of land described in the First Schedule hereto; and do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said river district, with such alteration as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

shall be altered so as to include in the said district the area of land described in the First Schedule hereto; and do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said river district, with such alteration as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto: And I do also proclaim and declare that the Waimatuku River District, as hereinbefore altered, shall be divided into four subdivisions, to be called respectively the Waimatuku Subdivision, and the Otahuti Subdivision; the Drummond Subdivision, and the Otahuti Subdivision; the boundaries whereof shall be those described in the Third Schedule hereto; that the number of members who are to constitute the Board of the said district shall be eight; and that two members shall be elected for each of the said four subdivisions:

shall be elected for each of the said four subdivisions: And I do also proclaim and declare that an election shall be held for the purpose of electing two members for each of the said four subdivisions of the said district; that Wednesday, the second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, shall be the day, and the Waimatuku Public Hall shall be the place, for holding such election; and that John Fisher, of Otautau, shall be the person to prepare the roll of electors and Returning Officer for the purpose of such election.

#### BY-LAWS.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities Vested in it by the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928, the Arthur Pass National Park Board of Control doth hereby make the following by-laws.

#### 1. INTERPRETATION.

- In these by-laws, unless inconsistent with the context,— "Park" means the Arthur Pass National Park as con-stituted by Order in Council dated 29th July, 1929,

  - in pursuance of section 71 of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928 :
    "Board " means the Arthur Pass National Park Board of Control constituted by virtue of section 73 of the

  - of Control constituted by the said Act: said Act: "Chairman" means the person appointed under sec-tion 75 of the said Act as Chairman of the Board: "Ranger" means the person appointed to that office by the Board under the powers of section 79 of the said
  - Act: "Stock" includes any horse, donkey, mule, goat, pig, sheep, or cattle beast.

#### 2. USE OF PARK.

The park shall be open to the public throughout the year, without charge for admission thereto except as hereafter provided.

#### 3. FLORA AND FAUNA.

No person shall, without the written authority of the Chairman, acting on a decision of the Board, place in the ground, sow, or plant any seed or plant in the park, whether such seed or plant be native in New Zealand or not; nor shall birds, insects, or other animals be liberated therein except under like authority.

## 4. CAMPING.

All persons wishing to camp in the park shall apply to the ranger for assignment of camping sites, and shall pay such fees or charges as may from time to time be fixed by the Board, and shall not change camp-site without permission from the ranger.

The following conditions must be strictly observed in connection with camp-sites :-

- (a) Combustible rubbish must be burned on camp fires and all other garbage and refuse of all kinds shall be placed in garbage-cans, or, if cans are not available, placed in pits provided at the edge of the camp. At new or unfrequented camps garbage must be burned
- new or unfrequented camps garbage must be burned or carried to a place hidden from sight.
  (b) No person, whether camping in the park or otherwise therein, shall, except at places which may be indicated by the ranger or other officer of the Board, pollute in any manner the waters of the park, nor shall he bathe in any of the streams near the regularly travelled thoroughfares in the park without suitable bathing-clothes. bathing-clothes.
- (c) No person shall tie or tether stock in such a way that they may be able to enter any of the streams of the park. All animals shall be kept at sufficient distance
- from camping-grounds so as not to littler the ground and render the area unfit for use as tent-sites.
  (d) No person shall take any wood for fuel except from dead trees or from trees which have been cut for the purpose by the Board's employees.

## 5. HUTS.

5. HUTS. (a) Any person desiring the use of any huts or other build-ings as the Board may erect, shall apply to the ranger who shall in his discretion grant to such applicant such usage of the hut or building as he shall deem advisable, either ex-clusively or concurrently with any other person or persons. (b) The charges, restrictions, and conditions of usage of any hut or building shall be as fixed by the Board from time to time

(c) The ranger or other officer of the Board is empowered

(c) The ranger of other other of the Board is empowered to determine forthwith any usage of any hut or building where such is in excess of that granted, or where the user acts in such a manner as in the opinion of the ranger or other officer is likely to cause damage to the Board's property, or

other is likely to cause damage to the Board's property, or give offence to other persons. (d) No person shall use or attempt to use any hut or build-ing without the written consent of the ranger. (e) Should any organization be empowered to erect any buildings for accommodation within the park, and such accommodation is at any time not fully occupied by members of that organization, then others shall be entitled to make use of the same under whatever conditions the Board and organization may determine. organization may determine.

## 6. FIRES.

No person shall light any fire, except at camp-sites, without the express permission of the ranger. Fires shall not be kindled near trees, dead wood, moss, dry leaves, tussock, forest mould, or other vegetation, but in some open place on rocks or earth. Should camps be made in a locality where no such open space exists, or is provided, the dead wood, moss, dry leaves, &c., must be scraped away to the rock or when no longer needed shall be completely extinguished, and all embers and the bed smothered with earth and water so that there remains no possibility of re-ignition. Special care must be taken that no lighted match, cigar, or cigarette is dropped in any grass or other inflammable matter. Nothing in this by-law shall exempt an offender from his or here lightly under the sold Act or say, other Act with

or her liability under the said Act or any other Act with respect to the lighting of fires.

#### 7. HUNTING.

All hunting or the killing, wounding, frightening, or captur-ing of any wild bird or animal, except such as are by the Board permitted to be caught or killed, is prohibited within the limits of the park.

No person entering or travelling through the park shall carry firearms, traps, nets, or explosives, without the written permission of the ranger.

## 8. BUSINESS PERMITS.

No person shall reside permanently, engage in any business or erect buildings in the park without permission in writing from the Chairman of the Board.

## 9. Advertising.

No person shall post or display any notices or advertise-ments within the park, except such as the Board may deem necessary for the convenience and guidance of visitors to the park.

#### 10. STOCK.

(a) Live stock of any kind found improperly within the limits of the park may be impounded and held until the usual

driving fees and impounding charges and other expenses have been paid. Nothing in this by-law shall be deemed to limit or prevent

the taking of any proceedings for the recovery of any penalty or otherwise in respect of the trespass of such stock.

(b) Any authorized officer or officers of the Board may destroy all unbranded stock of any kind above the age of six months, or apparently above that age, found within the park.

#### 11. REMOVAL OF CERTAIN PERSONS.

Any person who renders himself obnoxious by bad be haviour or disorderly conduct in the park may be summarily removed therefrom by the ranger or other officer of the Board.

12. Dogs.

The ranger is empowered to destroy any dog found in the park, not being under proper control.

NOTE.—December for a summer month was very unsettled, especially during the latter half. Strong and squally north-west winds predominated, and precipitation at Karori Reservoir, near Kelburn, was 2 per cent. above the mean of previous years. Total bright sunshine, 1975 hours, 42 per cent. of the possible, and three sunless days. Lightning was seen on the 2nd, 20th, 22nd, and 23rd; and thunder was heard on the 20th, 22nd, and 23rd. Mean dew-point, 50:7°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.369 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1929.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1929. December was a wet and stormy month. Although eastern districts experienced some hot and sultry days, there was less than the average amount of sunshine, and temperatures were considerable below normal. The only considerable areas where rainfall was below the December average were in the northern half of the Auckland Peninsula and in eastern portions of the North Island from Hawke's Bay to East Cape. Over all western districts and in the high country of the interior precipitation was heavily in excess of the normal. Most of the stormy weather was associated with the passage of cyclone centres across the South Island. Gales from between north and west were experienced to the north of the centres, while to the south of them easterly or south-easterly winds prevailed. It was these latter which accounted, to a large extent, for the high rainfalls in Canterbury and Otago. Thunderstorms have been rather frequent and, in many cases, severe. A large proportion were accompanied by showers of hall. A considerable amount of fog was reported from both northern and southern extremities of the Dominion. The Union Steamship Company's s.s. "Manuka" was lost during a dense fog prevailing between the Bluff and Dunedin on the night of the 16th. Although rather late for some crops, especially oats, the rains were of very great benefit to farmers in Canterbury and Otago. The prospects, especially for wheat and root crops, have improved very much, and feed is plentiful. The abnormal number of wet days and the heavy rain have proved adverse to haymaking over a large part of the country, and shearing has been retarded. The weather has been too humid, too, for fodder to be in its most nourishing condition. But on the whole, stock and crops are in a satisfactory state, and the season is a good one. A spell of fine and dry weather would

Their movement was very rapid, and this was on the whole fortunate, since although there were numbers of rivers reaching flood stage, they usually receded just when serious floods appeared to be imminent, and

the actual damage was slight. The first of the cyclones referred to crossed the south-western extremity of the Dominion on the evening of the 4th to 5th, and caused boisterous weather. Rain was widespread, with many heavy falls, especially from Taranaki and Wellington southwards. On the 5th there were many thunderstorms, and at Edendale, in Southland, damage was done

by a severe hallstorm. From the 6th to the 9th weather of the westerly type prevailed. Squally winds blow from some westerly quarter, frequently reaching gale force, and western districts, especially, experienced showery weather. On the 6th a tornado, moving from the sea, visited Greymouth, houses were unroofed and much other damage done in Cowper Street and Blaketown. The whirling column of vapour and debris was very clearly seen.

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The finest spell of weather during the month followed the westerly weather, and persisted till the 15th. During this period a severe tropical cyclone developed in the Fiji group and moved slowly away. On the night of the 11th and the morning of the 12th, a heavy fog in Cook Strait caused delays to shipping. On the 17th the second cyclone crossed Southern Otago, and again northerly gales and almost general rain accompanied its passage. Thunderstorms were a marked feature of this cyclone during the whole time that it was moving over the Tasman Sea and New Zealand. The accompanying "atmospheries" were particularly frequent and violent, and wireless communication with shipping was at times greatly interfered with. On the 16th a cloud-burst at Norris Mill, six miles from Westport, raised a flood in the Waimea Creek, and several bridges were damaged. Another cloud-burst was reported from Pukemiro, in the Thames Valley, on the 18th. A third cyclone traversed the Dominion on the 22nd, the centre this time crossing South Canterbury. Precipitation was again general, and the southerly winds in the rear of the depression brought particularly heavy rain to the eastern districts of the South Island. Had the cyclone not moved away so quickly severe flooding would have been inevitable. As it was, the Leith Stream again threatened to inundate Dunedin, and parts of Christchurch were under water. At Kaikoura the phenomenal fall of 3 in. in sixty-five minutes was registered. Thunder and hail storms were very violent and widespread in connection with this storm, especially on the 22nd. Wireless operators again experienced trouble from "atmospherics."

The last of the month's cyclones moved over Southern Otago on the 29th. Boisterous weather and almost general rain accompanied its passage. At Wellington over seventy miles per hour was registered in a northerly gale on the 29th. Each of the cyclonic storms described was responsible for falls of snow on the ranges in the South Island, and a number of frosts occurred.


