A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of section one hundred and thirty-one of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, a petition was presented to the Governor-General, praying that the area described in the said petition be constituted a new borough :

And whereas a Commission appointed under the said section one hundred and thirty-one held inquiries, and recommended that the area as prayed for be constituted a borough :

And whereas the provisions of the said section one hundred and thirty-one have been complied with in respect thereto, and the result of the poll taken on the proposal contained in the said petition was in favour thereof :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, I, Sir Michael Myers, the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be constituted a borough under the said Act on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty; that the name of such borough shall be the Borough of One Tree Hill; and that the number of Councillors to be elected to the Council of the said borough shall be six, exclusive of the Mayor :

And I do further proclaim and declare that Arthur Leese, of One Tree Hill, shall be the Returning Officer to conduct the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said borough; and that the said Arthur Leese shall be the Town Clerk and the person to prepare the district electors roll for the purposes of the said first election :

And, lastly, I do proclaim and declare that the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said borough shall be held on Wednesday, the fourteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and that the first meeting of the Council of the said borough shall be held on Wednesday, the twenty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon, at the Board's Office, 456 Manukau Road, Auckland.

*Regulations for Trout-fishing in the Tauranga Acclimatization District.*

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT  
IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for all that part of the Dominion known as the Tauranga Acclimatization District and the waters thereof, as the same is defined in the First Schedule hereof; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all other regulations for the said district, and such regulations are hereby revoked.

## REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout or other acclimatized fish in all waters within the said district may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Tauranga Acclimatization Society, or any one authorized by the said Secretary in that behalf, and such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish in the said acclimatization district from the first day of October in any one year to the thirtieth day of April in the year following, subject to the said Acts, and any regulations made thereunder, and to these regulations: Provided that the Secretary may refuse to issue a license to any person who, within the previous two years, has been convicted of any breach of the provisions of any Act relating to fishing for trout, or other acclimatized fish, or of any regulations made thereunder.

2. The fee to be charged for a license as aforesaid to each male person over the age of sixteen years shall be £1, and every such license shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto. Licenses may also be issued to boys attending school or under the age of sixteen, or to women, at a reduced fee of 5s. for each license so issued: Provided that it shall be lawful for any Secretary or his deputy, in any case where application is made for a license on or after the first day of February in any year, to issue a license to any man for the sum of 12s. 6d., but so that such license shall extend only from the time of granting the same until the termination of the then trout-fishing season. No license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

3. The Secretary of the said society may issue day-licenses to *bona fide* travellers and strangers not resident within the district aforesaid on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d. for each day's fishing, and 7s. 6d. for each week's fishing.

4. No person shall take, kill, or fish for trout or other acclimatized fish otherwise than with one rod and line, but a landing-net or gaff may be used to secure any trout or other acclimatized fish caught with such rod and line, and no lures or baits other than natural or artificial flies, insects, or fish, or spoon bait shall be used with such rod and line; nor shall any of the said lines or baits be used except upon a running line attached to a rod and reel; nor shall any set rod or line be used for taking trout or other acclimatized fish in any of the waters or streams aforesaid. Any person who uses huhu, grub, or earthworm as bait shall commit a breach of these regulations.

5. No person shall fish with more than two flies, or one fly and one minnow, devon, or spoon bait, or one fly and one natural bait, or two natural baits affixed to any trace. No fly shall have more than one hook, and no person shall use more than one lead or sinker, and such lead or sinker shall be tied above all flies, minnow, or natural bait used: Provided that the restrictions imposed by this regulation shall not apply to single-hooked flies of size 10 (old numbers) or smaller.

6. No person shall use any trace made of gimp or of either plain or twisted wire having a greater gauge than 21 standard wire gauge, or having a greater length than 6 ft.: Provided that the maximum length of wire herein prescribed shall not apply to traces of wire having a gauge not exceeding 28 standard wire gauge.

7. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish.

8. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ or trout between the first day of May and the thirtieth day of September in any year, which period is hereby appointed the close season for all such fish: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the Marine Department or of an acclimatization society, or the General Manager of the Department of Tourists and Health Resorts, for the purpose of pisciculture or scientific investigation: Provided further, that nothing herein con-

tained shall be deemed to affect the provisions of any regulation now in force or hereafter made with respect to keeping trout or salmon in freezing or cool chambers during the close season hereinbefore mentioned.

9. No person shall cast or throw into any stream in which trout or salmon exist or have been liberated, or shall allow to flow into or place near the bank or margin of any such stream, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flax-mill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is noxious, poisonous, or injurious to fish: Provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to prohibit the depositing in such streams of debris from any mining claim.

10. No person shall fish for trout or other acclimatized fish without a license; and every person fishing shall, on the demand of any ranger, constable, officer of the said society, or of any person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, officer, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout or other acclimatized fish.

11. Any person taking or catching any trout not exceeding 10 in. in length from nose to tip of tail shall immediately return it alive into the water from which the same is taken.

12. No person shall use, or make use of, a torch, acetylene lamp, or other artificial light when fishing for trout or other acclimatized fish.

13. No person shall cross-line fish, stroke-haul, or use any other unsportsmanlike device for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout or other acclimatized fish; nor shall any person use any of the above-mentioned baits with any medicated or chemical preparation whatsoever.

14. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish with or use any net, or any instrument, or device or means for taking trout or other acclimatized fish in any river or stream within the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream.

15. For the purpose of these regulations the mouth of every river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the sea-shore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of 500 yds. from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea, or of any harbour at low water.

16. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any trout or other acclimatized fish, or any part thereof, unless he has a license to do so under regulations for taking trout or other acclimatized fish, or for selling them.

17. No person shall take or catch more than fifteen trout in any one day.

18. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than £2 or more than £50.

19. If any person shall be convicted of an offence against these regulations, the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

WHEREAS by section three of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is provided that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Act, it shall not be lawful or competent for any local authority to borrow or contract to borrow any money (otherwise than in anticipation of its revenue within the limits of its powers, if any, in that behalf), whether from the State Advances Office or from any other source whatever, and whether in pursuance of a special Act or under any authority whatever, without the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council given after compliance with the provisions of the said Act :

And whereas section eleven of the said Act provides that the Governor-General in Council, in giving his consent to the borrowing of moneys by the local authority, may impose such conditions with respect to the time at which such moneys may be borrowed, the rate of interest that may be paid in respect thereto, the term for which they may be borrowed, and provisions for repayment thereof as he thinks fit, and that it shall not be lawful for the local authority to borrow such moneys save in accordance with the conditions so imposed :

And whereas the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto are desirous of raising the respective amounts set out opposite their names therein :

And whereas the said local authorities have complied with the provisions of the said Act, and it is expedient that the aforesaid precedent consent should be given to the raising of the loans on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth :

The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 987 as against 1,109 in January, a decrease of 122. The deaths in February were 457, a decrease of 50 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 250, females 207. Thirty-nine of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 8.53 per cent. of the whole number. Twenty-seven of these were under one year of age.

*Alterations to Scale of Charges upon the New Zealand Government Railways.*

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1926, and its amendments, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, William Burgoyne Taverner, Minister of Railways, do hereby make the following alterations in the scale of charges in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic, made on the 10th day of August, 1925, and published in the *Gazette* of 11th August, 1925.

PART I.—PASSENGERS.

1. GENERAL FARES AND REGULATIONS.

*By omitting the following:—*

3. Tickets may be obtained at the booking-office at stations where there are officers in charge fourteen days in advance of the day on which passengers desire to travel.

*And substituting the following:—*

3. Tickets may be obtained on the day or in advance of the day the passenger desires to travel, at any railway-station where there is an officer in charge, the city or central booking offices at Auckland, Rotorua, Napier, Wellington, or Christchurch, or duly authorized booking agencies.

3. RESERVED SEATS.

*By omitting the following:—*

6. Seats may be reserved at any officered station fourteen days in advance of the day on which the passenger desires to travel.

*And substituting the following:—*

6. Seats may be reserved on the day or in advance of the day the passenger desires to travel, at any station where there is an officer in charge, the city or central booking offices at Auckland, Rotorua, Napier, Wellington, or Christchurch, or duly authorized booking agencies. The Department reserves the right to cancel trains or alter train time-tables without notice, and reservations of seats will be made subject to such cancellation or alteration.

*By adding the following:—*

9. Passengers holding first-class rail tickets may occupy and reserve seats in the special "Lounge" car, on payment of the following charges:—

For distances not exceeding 150 miles, 4s. per seat.

For distances exceeding 150 miles and not exceeding 300 miles, 6s. per seat.

For distances exceeding 300 miles, 7s. 6d. per seat.

A "Lounge" car is attached to the following trains:—

7.53 a.m. Auckland-Wellington express train.

7.52 a.m. Wellington-Auckland express train.

4. SLEEPING-BERTHS.

*By omitting the following:—*

7. Subject as hereinbefore provided, sleeping-berths may be reserved at any officered station fourteen days in advance of the day on which the passenger desires to travel.

*And substituting the following:—*

7. Sleeping-berths may be reserved on the day or in advance of the day on which the passenger desires to travel, at any station where there is an officer in charge, the city or central booking offices at Auckland, Rotorua, Napier, Wellington, or Christchurch, or duly authorized booking agencies. The Department reserves the right to cancel trains and alter train time-tables without notice, and reservations of sleeping-berths will be made subject to such cancellation or alteration.

- (e) When racehorses, hunters, or polo-ponies for one consignee are booked two in a box going to the race or hunt meeting or polo-match, they must be returned together loaded in one box, otherwise freight at ordinary rates will be charged for the additional box used for the return journey.
- (f) Racehorses, hunters, or polo-ponies, which on the outward journey have been conveyed in UG trucks by express, mail, or passenger trains will, when returning from the races, hunt club meeting, or polo-match

by other than express, mail, or passenger trains, be conveyed at half rates, under the same conditions as horses conveyed by other than express, mail, or passenger trains. When horses or ponies have been conveyed on the outward journey by ordinary trains and are returned by express, mail, or passenger trains, full rates will be charged for the return journey less half the amount of the railrage paid in respect of the outward journey.

20. Racehorses, hunters, or polo-ponies not coming within the provisions of paragraph 16 of this regulation, and which compete at two or more race or hunt-club meetings or polo-matches between the time of their departure from the original forwarding station and their return thereto, will be charged full ordinary or express-train rates (according to the class of train transported by) for all rail journeys made.

21. On the return of such racehorses, hunters, or polo-ponies to the original forwarding station, and on production of a certificate on the prescribed form obtainable at any officered railway-station, duly signed by the secretary of each jockey, racing, or polo club, or master of the hunt at which the horses were entered to compete, or the owner or trainer of the horses, a refund will be made of 25 per cent. of the total amount of the railrage paid for horses, hunters, or ponies which have completed a circuit of journeys.

22. The return journey must be made within two months from the date when the horses were consigned from the original forwarding station, and not later than fourteen days from the concluding day of the last race or hunt-club meeting or polo-match at which the racehorses, hunters, or polo-ponies were entered to compete.

23. For all horses which have been sold or exchanged no refund will be made on the railrage charges paid for such horses, irrespective of the points between which they were carried.

24. Full rates will be charged for all animals received at the original forwarding stations in excess of the number forwarded from such station, and no refund will be made of the railrage charges on such horses.

By inserting the following :—

16. Racehorses, hunters, and polo-ponies travelling to and from a race meeting, hunt-club meeting, or polo-match will be charged 25 per cent. less than the appropriate rate under this regulation, provided that the necessary certificate in one of the forms following is endorsed on the consignment note, and signed by the owner or trainer, and provided further that, in the case of horses forwarded from a race or hunt-club meeting or polo-match, the journey is commenced not later than fourteen days after the concluding day of such meeting or match.

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Lower Hutt Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the principal, interest, and other charges on a loan of £1,620, authorized to be raised by the Lower Hutt Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of constructing certain sewage works, pursuant to a requisition of the Board of Health, the said Lower Hutt Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of 15/675ths of a penny in the pound upon the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property of the Borough of Lower Hutt, comprising the whole of the Borough of Lower Hutt, and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the 1st day of April in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty years, or until the loan is fully paid off.
