

Notice respecting Native and Imported Game.

Department of Internal Affairs, Wellington, 20th March, 1930. THE attention of sportsmen and others is called to the L following provisions of the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22.

THE ANIMALS PROTECTION AND GAME ACT, 1921-22. SECTION 6 (3). Every reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, shall be deemed to be a sanctuary under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22.

(4) Every person who unlawfully takes or kills any animal within a sanctuary is liable to a fine of ten pounds for every such offence, and to a further fine of one pound for each animal so taken or killed. Section 9. The season for taking and killing imported or native game opens on the 1st day of May, 1930, and closes on the 31st day of July, 1930, unless otherwise specified in the Warrant fixing the open season in any district. Section 11 (1). No imported or native game shall be trapped or taken by means of traps or by any other means than by hunting or shooting, nor shall any trap, net, or snare be erected or set for the purpose of such trapping or taking at any time whatever, except by any person duly authorized under section thirty-one of the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22. Section 12 (1). No person shall kill or destroy any imported

Section 12 (1). No person shall kill or destroy any imported game or native game, or shoot at, or attempt to shoot at, A

any imported game or native game, with any swivel gun or pump gun, or use any gun other than a shoulder gun. (2) No gun shall be used for the purposes aforesaid the bore of which is larger than the size known as number twelve at the muzzle, nor shall any gun be used which exceeds ten pounds in weight.

In addition to the above the use of any automatic or auto-loading gun has been prohibited unless it is converted into a gun capable of carrying two cartridges only.
The use of any rifle or pea-rifle, or punt-gun, in the taking or killing of game is also prohibited.
Section 13 (1). No person shall use any cylinder for the purpose of taking or killing imported or native game in any lake or river; nor shall the apparatus known as a silencer be used on any gun in the taking or killing of imported game or native game.
(2) No person shall use any live decoys for the purpose

(2) No person shall use any five decoys for the purpose of taking or killing imported game or native game. Section 14 (1). No person shall take or kill any imported game or native game during an open season in any district unless he is the holder of a license under the Animals Pro-tection and Game Act, 1921-22, to take or kill imported game or native game in such district during that season : Provided, however, that the occupier of property, and any one son or daughter of such occupier, may take or kill without license on such property during an open season imported or

The fee for a license to take or kill both imported and native game is one pound  $(\pounds)$ : Provided that in the Lakes District, North Canterbury, Otago, and South Canterbury

Acclimatization Districts a separate license to take or kill native game only may be issued at a fee of ten shillings (10s.); and a similar fee is payable in the case of the Ashburton, Southland, Waimate, and Waitaki Districts wherein native game only may be taken or killed during the present season; in the Grey District Acclimatization District a license is obtain-able to take or kill imported game only—viz., hares—at a fee of ten shillings (10s.), and a license to take or kill native game only at a similar fee.

Section 15. Nothing in any license to take or kill imported game or native game shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill imported game or native game on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or on any land excepted from the operation of the notification declaring an open season for the district district.

Section 39. Except as otherwise expressly provided, nothing Section 39. Except as otherwise expressly provided, nothing in any license or other authority under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921–22, shall entitle the holder thereof to enter upon any private land without the consent of the owner or occupier thereof, or upon any State forest or provisional State forest.

Particulars regarding the number and kinds of imported game and native game that may be taken or killed by any one person in any one day and the period and area within which such game may be taken or killed are specified in the notifica-tion fixing the open season in each district.

Shooting may begin not earlier than one hour before sunrise and must cease not later than one hour after sunset.

A short open season for paradise duck has been declared from 1st to 7th May in certain South Island acclimatization districts.

A close season is being observed this year for pukeko.

Native pigeon is absolutely protected.

#### Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22 .- Protection of | Parrakeet-Native Birds.

Department of Internal Affairs, Wellington, 20th March, 1930. THE public are carnestly requested to assist in preserving for posterity the native birds of New Zealand.

Under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, it is illegal for any person to take or kill any protected birds, or have in possession the skins, feathers, or eggs of any such birds, without the consent of the Minister of Internal Affairs.

It is also illegal for any person to rob or destroy the nest of any bird to which the Act applies.

Every person who offends against such provisions is liable to a fine of £25 for every such offence.

#### NATIVE GAME.

Native game can only be shot during the open season, and then only such kinds of native game as are specified in the annual shooting-season warrants.

#### SANCTUARIES.

It is illegal, without the authority of the Minister of Internal Affairs, to take any dog or firearm on to a sanctuary, or to discharge any firearm or explosive thereon, or to do anything likely to cause any bird or animal to leave a sanctuary.

Every person who unlawfully takes or kills any bird or animal on a sanctuary is liable to a fine of £10 for such offence, and to a further fine of £1 for each animal or bird so taken or killed.

#### Open Season for Native Game, License Fee, &c., Ashburton Acclimatization District.

N exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animais Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, Philip Aldborough L Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, Philip Aldborough de la Ferrelle, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 1st day of May to the 31st day of July, 1930 (both days inclusive) to be an open season in the Ashburton Acclimatization District, as described in the First Schedule hereto, except in the areas referred to in condition No. 3, and in the Second Schedule hereto for the taking or killing of the following native game—viz., grey duck and black swan, and the period from the 1st day of May to the 7th day of May, 1930 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in the said district except as above for the taking or killing of the following following native game—viz., Paradise duck—subject to the following conditions.

#### CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill such native game within the said district will be issued to any person on payment of ten shillings (10s.) each; and the Secretary of the Ashburton Acclimatization Society, or any person authorized by such Secretary in that behalf, is hereby authorized to sign and issue the said licenses.

2. The number of such native game that may be taken or killed by any one person in any one day shall not exceed twenty-five head of grey duck and black swan, and five head of paradise duck : Provided that not more than ten head of grey duck and paradise duck may be taken or killed by any one person in any one day.

Nothing in any license to take or kill native game shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill native game on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain.
4. No person shall kill or destroy any such native game, or

shoot at or attempt to shoot at any such native game, with any should be of a trend to should a tany such hadve game, with any automatic or auto-loading gun, unless it is converted into a gun capable of carrying two cartridges only, or with any rifle or pea-rifle, swivel-gun, punt-gun, or pump-gun, or shall use any gun other than a shoulder gun; and no gun shall be used for the purpose aforesaid the bore of which is larger than the size large the purpose aforesaid the bore of which is larger than the size known as No. 12 at the muzzle, nor shall any gun be used which exceeds 101b. in weight. 5. Shooting may begin not earlier than one hour before sunrise and must cease not later than one hour after

sunset.

6. No live birds of any species shall be used as decoys, nor shall more than twenty-five artificial decoys be used at any one time (whether by one or several persons) on any particu-lar water within an area of less than 100 yards square.

7. No person shall use any aeroplane, power boat, or launch in connection with the taking or killing of imported or native game.

8. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of  $\pounds 20$ .

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

All that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded on the north-west by the summit of the Southern Alps; on the north-east by the Rakaia River from its mouth to its source at Whitcombe Pass; on the south-east by the sea; and on the south-west generally by the middle of the Rangitata River to Forest Creek, by the Forest Creek to its source in the Two Thumbs Range; thence by a line along the summit of the Two Thumbs Range to the summit of the Southern Alps, the point of commencement.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

All that area of land in the Canterbury Land District intersected by the Wakanui Creek, being Rural Sections 15104, 15510, 17411, and 16673, the property of Mr. G. W. Leadley. As witness my hand this 20th day of March, 1930.

Open Season for Imported Game and Native Game, License Fees, &c., Auckland Acclimatization District.

N exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, Philip Aldborough de la Perrelle, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 1st day of May to the 30th day of June, 1930 (both days inclusive) to be an open season in the Auckland Acclimatization District,

as described in the First Schedule hereto, except in the areas referred to in Condition No. 3, and in the Second Schedule referred to in Condition No. 3, and in the Second Schedule hereto, for the taking or killing of the following imported game--viz., cock pheasants, Californian quail and Australian quail, grey duck, spoonbill duck, mallard duck, and black swan; and the period from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of March, 1931, to be an open season in the said district for the taking or killing of the following native game---wing goduits and herets, subject to the following exceptions viz., godwits and knots-subject to the following conditions.

#### CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill such imported game and native same, including godwits and knots, within the said district will be issued to any person on payment of the sum of twenty shillings (20s.) each, and licenses to take or kill the belowing native game only—viz, godwits and knots—will be issued to any person on payment of ten shillings (10s.) each; and the Secretary of the Auckland Acclimatization Society, or any person authorized by such Secretary in that Society, or any person authorized by such Secretary in that behalf, is hereby authorized to sign and issue the said licenses: Provided that any person who claims a stand for the purpose of taking or killing imported or native game must first have obtained a license duly authorizing him in that behalf, and must also affix to a stake planted on such stand a board containing his name and address, and the number of the license held by him: Provided further, that no person shall be allowed more than one stand, and that no stand shall contain. more than two persons or more than stand shall contain more than two persons or more than

two guns. 2. The number of such imported game and native game that may be taken or killed by any one person in any one day shall not exceed nine cock pheasants and twenty-five head in all of grey duck, spoonbill duck, mallard duck, and black even black swan.

3. Nothing in any license to take or kill imported game and native game, including godwits and knots (or the followand native game, including godwits and knots (or the follow-ing native game only—viz., godwits and knots), shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill imported game or native game, including godwits and knots (or godwits and knots only), on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or any land mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto.

No live birds of any species shall be used as decoys, nor shall more than fifteen artificial decoys be used at any one time (whether by one or several persons) on any particular water within an area of less than 100 yards square.

5. No person shall use any aeroplane in connection with the taking or killing or imported or native game or shall use or cause to be used on any lake, pond, lagoon, mere, estuary, or other dead water any power-boat for the purpose of taking or killing, whether by himself or any other person, by driving, killing, whether by himself or any other person, by driving, chasing, frightening, or stalking any imported or native game. For the purposes of this clause "power-boat" means and includes any launch, boat, cance, or other similar craft propelled either wholly or partly by mechanical power: Provided that this clause shall not be so construed as to prohibit the use of any power-boat for camping purposes, or for the purpose of travelling, to or from a rendezvous, or generally or to prohibit shooting from a moored power-boat

6. It shall be an offence for any person to aid, incite, abet, or procure the commission of any act prohibited under section 5 hereof.

7. Shooting may begin not earlier than one hour before

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

Station; thence north-easterly along a right line (in the direction of Ngakuriwhare Trig. Station, Block I, Katikati North Survey District) to the western boundary of the Tauranga Confiscation Block; thence south-easterly by right lines from hill to hill along the summit of the range forming the western boundary of the aforesaid Tauranga Confisca-tion Block, and passing over Ngatamahinerau, Mimiotohanga, and Waianuanu to Te Weraiti Trig. Station; thence south-easterly along a right line to Puwhenua Trig. Nothing in any license to take or kill imported game and native game, including godwits, (or the following native game only—viz., godwits), shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill imported game or native game including godwits (or godwits only), on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or any land mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto. 4. No person shall kill or destroy any such imported game

mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto.
4. No person shall kill or destroy any such imported game or native game, or shoot at or attempt to shoot at any such imported game or native game, with any automatic or auto-loading gun, unless it is converted into a gun capable of carrying two cartridges only, or with any rifle or pea-rifle, swivel-gun, punt-gun, or pump-gun, or shall use any gun other than a shoulder-gun; and no gun shall be used for the purpose aforesaid the bore of which is larger than the size known as No. 12 at the muzzle, nor shall any gun be used which exceeds 10 lb. in weight.
5. Shooting may begin not earlier than one hour before sunrise and must cease not later than one hour after sunset.
6. No live birds of any species shall be used as decoys, nor shall more than twenty-five artificial decoys be used at any one time (whether by one or several persons) on any particular

one time (whether by one or several persons) on any particular water within an area of less than 100 yards square. 7. No person shall use any aeroplane, power-boat, or launch in connection with the taking or killing of imported or native

game.

8. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of  $\pounds 20$ .

And whereas it is expedient to revoke such last-mentioned regulation and make other provision in lieu thereof: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulation num-bered twenty-five made by Order in Council dated the twenty-second day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and published in the New Zealand Gazette on the twenty-fifth day of the same month, at page 2756; and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulation set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth order that the regulation hereby made shall form part of and be read together with hereby made shall form part of and be read together with

  - (iii) Temporary, 10s. for each week of seven days. For a period of less than seven days the fee shall be 10s.

- (c) For an experimental-station license, 2s. 6d. per month, with a minimum of 7s. 6d.

(3) If in the case of renewals payment of the above-mentioned fees be not made on or before the due date, the license shall automatically lapse.

(4) The fee for a duplicate copy of a license shall be 5s.
