*Altering the Boundaries of the Egmont National Park.*

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section four of the Egmont National Park Act, 1924, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Egmont National Park as described in the First Schedule to the said Act by including therein the land described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District, containing by admeasurement 16.4 perches, more or less, being Section 35, Block VII, Egmont Survey District: Bounded towards the north-east by Egmont Road, 100 links; towards the south-east by Forest Road, 102.6 links; towards the south-west by Egmont National Park, 100 links; and towards the north-west by Section 33, Block VII, Egmont Survey District, 102.6 links: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less. As the same is delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 4/342A, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon bordered pink.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Malvern and Springs-Ellesmere Electric-power Districts by excluding the area described in the First Schedule hereto from the Malvern Electric-power District, and including such area in the Springs-Ellesmere Electric-power District, and do hereby declare that the altered boundaries of the Malvern and Springs-Ellesmere Electric-power Districts shall be those described in the Second and Third Schedules hereto respectively.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded by a line commencing from the centre of the intersection of the Burnham-Aylesbury Road and the Great South Road, and proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of the Great South Road to the centre of the Selwyn River; thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of the said river to the Main South Road to a point where the traffic-bridge crosses the said river; thence in a north-easterly direction along the Main South Road to the intersection of the Burnham Road and the Main South Road; from thence to the starting-point. As the said area is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 77921, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, and thereon coloured blue.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

MALVERN ELECTRIC-POWER DISTRICT.

Station S, Block IX, Upper Ashley Survey District; thence easterly by a right line to the said trig. station; thence generally north-easterly and north-westerly along the summit of the Puketeraki Range, the water-shed between the Waimakariri and Ashley Rivers, and the water-shed between the Waimakariri and Hurunui Rivers to the summit of the Southern Alps; thence generally south-westerly along the summit of the Southern Alps to the westernmost corner of Block I, Davie Survey District; thence generally southerly and south-westerly along the summit of the Southern Alps to Whitcombe Pass; thence generally southerly, south-westerly, and south-easterly along the Louper Stream to the middle of the Rakaia River; thence generally easterly and south-easterly along the middle of the Rakaia River to its intersection with the Great South Road; thence north-easterly along the centre of the Great South Road to its intersection with the Dunedin-Christchurch Railway line in Block XI of the Selwyn Survey District; thence north-easterly along the said railway-line to the centre of the road forming the south-western boundary of Rural Section 9281 and Reserve 2287; thence north-westerly along the centre of that road to the centre of the Great South Road aforesaid; thence north-easterly along the centre of the Great South Road to its intersection with the centre of Wright's Road; thence north-westerly along the centre of that road to the centre of Two-chain Road at the northern corner of Rural Section 29306; thence north-easterly along the centre of Two-chain Road to the centre of the Dunsandel Road; thence north-westerly along the centre of Dunsandel Road to a point in line with the centre of Sheat's Road; thence north-easterly along the centre of Sheat's Road and on to the middle of the Hororata River; thence westerly and north-westerly along the middle of the Hororata River to a point in continuation of the north-western boundary of Rural Section 4249, Block II, Selwyn Survey District; thence north-easterly to and along the said north-western boundary of Rural Section 4249 to the northern boundary-line of the Selwyn Survey District; thence easterly along that boundary-line to the centre of the Selwyn or Wakaepa River; thence south-easterly along the middle of that river to the intersection of the Great South Road with the middle of the Selwyn River; thence north-easterly along the centre of the said Great South Road to the commencing-point. As the said area is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 77921, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, and thereon coloured yellow.

Road; thence north-easterly along the centre of the Great South Road to its intersection with the Dunedin-Christchurch Railway line in Block XI, Selwyn Survey District; thence north-easterly along the said railway-line to the centre of the road forming the south-western boundary of Rural Section 9281 and Reserve 2287; thence north-westerly along the centre of that road to the centre of the Great South Road aforesaid; thence north-easterly along the centre of the Great South Road to its intersection with the centre of Wright's Road; thence north-westerly along the centre of that road to the centre of Two-chain Road at the northern corner of Rural Section 29306; thence north-easterly along the centre of Two-chain Road to the centre of Dunsandel Road; thence north-westerly along the centre of Dunsandel Road to a point in line with the centre of Sheat's Road; thence north-easterly along the centre of Sheat's Road and on to the middle of the Hororata River; thence westerly and north-westerly generally along the middle of the Hororata River to a point in continuation of the north-western boundary of Rural Section 4249, Block II, Selwyn Survey District; thence north-easterly to and along the said north-western boundary of Rural Section 4249 to the northern boundary-line of the Selwyn Survey District; thence easterly along that boundary-line to the centre of the Selwyn or Wakaepa River; thence south-easterly along the middle of that river to the intersection of the Great South Road with the middle of the Selwyn River; thence north-easterly along the centre of the said Great South Road to a point, being the intersection of the centre of Hawkins and Burnham Roads with the centre of Sandy Knolls Road, near the easternmost corner of Rural Section 27724; thence north-easterly and northerly along the centre of Sandy Knolls Road to the centre of Halkett Road near the north-eastern corner of Rural Section 6281, Block X, Rolleston Survey District; thence north-westerly along the centre of Halkett Road to its intersection with the centre of the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Rural Section 8752; thence north-easterly along the centre of that road and the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Rural Sections 9917, 12536, to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned section; thence north-westerly to and along the said north-eastern boundary of Rural Section 12536 to the south-western corner of Reserve 1053; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundary of that reserve and its production to the middle of the Waimakariri River; thence generally in an easterly direction along the middle of the said river to the commencing-point, the same being the north-westerly corner of the Waimairi County, Rural Section 17621, Block VI, Christchurch Survey District. 2. The Orders in Council described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby revoked as from the dates of the next general elections of the representatives of the constituent districts, and thereafter the following provisions shall have effect:—

(a) The constituent districts which are bracketed together in the First Column of the Second Schedule hereto shall be constituted a combined district for the purposes of the Act.

(b) The local authority of the constituent district distinguished in the First Column of the Second Schedule hereto by the letter "p" shall be the principal local authority of the combined district in which that constituent district is included.

(c) The number of representatives of each constituent district or combined district on the Board shall be the number specified in the Second Column of the Second Schedule hereto opposite the name of that constituent or combined district.

(d) Each representative of a combined district holding office immediately before the above provisions take effect shall continue in office until his successor is elected in accordance with these provisions or appointed in accordance with the Act.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, John Thompson, of Queenstown (who, with his executors, administrators, and assigns, is hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore at Queenstown, Lake Wakatipu, as a site for a jetty, to be built in the position and in accordance with plan marked M.D. 6405, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department of Wellington:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is desirable that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the fore-

shore on which the said jetty is to be erected, as shown on plan marked M.D. 6405, deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said structure thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seaman Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore occupied by the said jetty-site, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 6405.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £2 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the date hereof until the 31st March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said jetty, without payment.

5. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said jetty, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon or therefrom.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned jetty in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the licensee's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said jetty, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such jetty, requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels trading at the said jetty shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege, without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the jetty at the licensee's cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said jetty may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said jetty for a period of thirty days;
- (3) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said jetty entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said jetty to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensee.

15. The erection of the said jetty shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

*License authorizing the Christchurch Tramway Board to erect Electric Lines along certain Routes in the City of Christchurch.*

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth—subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and dated the eleventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twelfth day of the same month, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof (and hereinafter collectively referred to as “the regulations”), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein—hereby authorize the Christchurch Tramway Board (hereinafter referred to as “the licensee”) to erect and maintain electric lines along the routes described in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of supplying power to trackless electric cars.

SCHEDULE.

1. ALL those routes shown by red and blue lines on the plans deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington, and marked P.W.D. 77920 (sheets I to V), the said routes being generally described as follows:—

A. Lines for two-way traffic commencing at junctions with existing lines at points near the intersection of Manchester and Worcester Streets, and proceeding thence easterly along Worcester Street to the intersection of Linwood Avenue; thence generally in a north-easterly direction along Worcester Street, Rochester Street, Gloucester Street, River Road, Joyce Street, Kerr's Road, and Wainoni Road, and terminating in a balloon loop at the junction of another road with Wainoni Road near the north-eastern boundary of R.S. 4779, being a distance of 4 miles 11 chains, more or less; as more particularly shown on sheets D. I, D. II, D. III, and D. IV of above plan.

B. Lines for two-way traffic commencing at junction with above lines near the intersection of Fitzgerald Avenue and Worcester Street, and proceeding thence southerly along Fitzgerald Avenue, being a distance of 54 chains, more or less; as shown more particularly on sheet D. V of above plan.

2. The trolley-wires shall not be less than No. 2/0 S.W.G. hard-drawn solid copper or cadmium-copper wires, firmly attached to approved insulators, and erected on supports placed not more than 130 ft. apart.

Trolley-wire feeder-cables, if carried overhead, shall be covered with weatherproof triple braiding: Provided that, where circumstances permit, the Minister may approve of bare conductors being used; and provided that where electric feeder-cables intersect the Post and Telegraph Department's lead-covered cables, vulcanized indiarubber insulation of not less than 600 megohm grade shall be substituted for weatherproof triple braiding.

Double insulation shall be provided between the positive and negative trolley-wires and between the positive trolley-wire and earth. Single insulation shall be provided between the negative trolley-wire and earth on all span wires and pull-offs.

The maximum difference of potential between the positive and negative trolley-wires, and between trolley-wire feeders and the ground shall not exceed 650 volts.

The spacing of trolley-wires shall be such as to prevent bridging by the trolley-wheel or pole.

The best means available shall be adopted for preventing the occurrence of undue sparking at the rubbing or rolling contacts in any place.

3. The conductors shall be carried on substantial and durable supports, which shall be designed to have a factor of safety of four in the case of steel, iron, or ferro-concrete, and five in the case of wood, calculated upon the ultimate strength of the material, assuming the wind-pressure to be 30 lb. per square foot upon a plane surface and 18 lb. per square foot upon a diametral plane upon a cylindrical surface.

4. The trolley-wire shall not in any part thereof be at a less height than 18 ft. from the surface of the ground.

5. (1) Where telegraph, telephone, or electric fire-alarm wires (hereinafter referred to as “the first-mentioned wires”) are carried along either overhead or underground on one side of the road to be used by the trackless electric car, the said electric lines (either overhead or underground) of the trackless electric-car system shall be carried along on the other side thereof unless otherwise approved by the Minister of Telegraphs.

(2) At all points where it is necessary for the said electric lines to be carried across the first-mentioned wires, they shall be carried across and under the same at right angles if possible, and the first-mentioned wires shall be carefully insulated at the expense of the licensee over a sufficient length to prevent any contact in the event of accident to either line, and proper guard-wires effectively earthed shall be provided where necessary, at the like expense, to prevent the first-mentioned wires or any other overhead wires from getting into contact with the said electric lines. Where the first-mentioned wires run parallel to and higher than the said electric lines, and the poles supporting the pull-off or span wires are on the same side of the road as those supporting the first-mentioned wires, and wherever it is considered that by reason of accident or otherwise there is a danger of the first-mentioned wires falling across the said electric lines or their supports, guard-hooks and approved insulators, or other approved protective devices, shall be provided and erected by and at the expense of the licensee to the satisfaction of the Minister.

(3) Where poles are erected on both sides of the road, those on the one side of the road must comply with the requirements of the Minister of Telegraphs in order to provide reasonable facilities for their joint use.

6. The design of all poles, posts, standards, brackets, and other attachments used in connection with the said electric lines shall be subject to the approval of the Minister, and they shall be constructed in accordance with such approved design, and erected in such manner, as is approved in writing by the Minister.

7. The licensee shall take all reasonable precautions in constructing, placing, and maintaining the said electric lines and other works of all descriptions, and also in working the undertaking so as not to injuriously affect by fusion or electrolytic action any gas or water pipes, sewers, drains, or conduits, or other pipes, structures, or substances, or to injuriously interfere with the working of any telegraph, telephone, electric-lighting, or electric fire-alarm lines or apparatus.

8. This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of ten years from the date hereof. Upon expiry of the said term, or upon sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

9. The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs or the Minister of Railways any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of the telegraph-lines which are the property of the Telegraph or Railways Departments and which were erected prior to the licensee's lines.

10. Notwithstanding anything contained in the regulations incorporated herein, no extensions or lines other than those along the routes hereinbefore described shall be deemed to be authorized by this license.

11. No electric car shall be supplied with electric power from the lines hereby authorized to be erected unless the licensee first receives from the Minister of Public Works a warrant authorizing the use of that car.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Regulations, 1930.
2. (1) Except as provided in subclause (2) hereof, every insurance company willing to undertake insurance business in terms of the said Act shall give to the Registrar of Motor-vehicles at Wellington, in the manner prescribed by section 4 of that Act, a notice in the form numbered 1 in the First Schedule hereto.  
(2) Every notice heretofore given by an insurance company under the regulations hereby revoked and subsisting at the commencement of these regulations shall continue in force until revoked in the manner prescribed by section 4 of the said Act.
3. The nomination, pursuant to section 5 of the said Act, of the insurance company with which the contract of insurance in respect of any motor-vehicle is to be made shall be in the form numbered 2 in the First Schedule hereto.
4. (1) The notice of the sale or other disposal of a motor-vehicle, required to be given pursuant to section 7 of the said Act, shall be given to the insurance company concerned by the former owner in the form numbered 3 in the First Schedule hereto.  
(2) Every person who, being required by section 7 of the said Act to give any such notice as aforesaid, fails to give such notice in accordance with the said section shall be liable to a fine of £5.
5. (1) The annual premiums payable in respect of contracts of insurance under the said Act for the year commencing on the 1st day of June, 1930, or for the year commencing on the same day in any subsequent year shall be as set out in Part I of the Second Schedule hereto.  
(2) When a contract of insurance in respect of any motor-vehicle is entered into for a period of less than a year the amount of the premium as prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto shall be reduced by the one-twelfth part thereof for every complete month by which the term of the contract is less than one year.  
(3) Any premiums hereafter becoming payable for any period expiring before the 1st day of June, 1930, shall be fixed in accordance with the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Regulations, 1929, and the Second Schedule thereto, as if these regulations had not been revoked.
6. If any motor-vehicle (other than a motor-cycle or a motor-vehicle used exclusively as a mourning coach) belongs to Class 8 or to Class 9 of the classes specified in the Second Schedule to these regulations, and also belongs to any other of those classes, the premium payable in respect of that vehicle shall be the premium prescribed in respect of Class 8 or of Class 9, as the case may be.
7. Where the premium payable in respect of any motor-vehicle is fixed by reference to its seating-accommodation, the following rule shall be applied to determine the number of seats in any case where a division between individual seats is not clearly marked, namely:—  
Every complete 16 in. of the length of an undivided seat shall be deemed to be a separate seat and a length of seating-space less than 16 in. shall not be deemed to be a seat.
8. Where, pursuant to section 15 of the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, the registration of any motor-vehicle is cancelled on the ground that the vehicle has been destroyed, or has become permanently useless as a motor-vehicle, or has been permanently removed from New Zealand, and at the time of such cancellation there is in force in respect of the motor-vehicle a contract of insurance under the said Act, the insurance company with which such contract of insurance

has been effected shall, on application in writing made by the owner of the motor-vehicle, and on being satisfied that the registration of the motor-vehicle has been cancelled as aforesaid, refund to the owner a sum equal to the one-twelfth part of the prescribed premium for every complete month between the date of the happening of the event which led to the cancellation of registration and the end of the term of the contract of insurance.

9. From every premium paid in respect of any contract of insurance under the said Act, the sum of sixpence shall be deducted for administration expenses in accordance with the provisions of subsection (2) of section 15 thereof.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make

the following regulations for all that part of the Dominion known as the East Coast Acclimatization District and the waters thereof, as the same is defined in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all other regulations for the said district, and such regulations are hereby revoked.

## REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish in all waters within the said district may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the East Coast Acclimatization Society, or any one authorized by the said Secretary in that behalf, and such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish in the said acclimatization district from the 1st day of October in any one year to the 30th day of April in the year following, subject to the said Acts, and any regulations made thereunder, and to these regulations: Provided that the Secretary may refuse to issue a license to any person who, within the previous two years, has been convicted of any breach of the provisions of any Act relating to fishing for trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish, or of any regulations made thereunder.

2. The fee to be charged for a license as aforesaid to each male person over the age of sixteen years shall be £1, and every such license shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto. Licenses may also be issued to boys attending school or under the age of sixteen, or to women, at a reduced fee of 5s. for each license so issued: Provided that it shall be lawful for any Secretary or his deputy, in any case where application is made for a license on or after the first day of January in any year, to issue a license to any man for the sum of 12s. 6d., but so that such license shall extend only from the time of granting the same until the termination of the then current trout-fishing season. No license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

3. The Secretary of the said society may issue day-licenses to *bona fide* travellers and strangers not resident within the district aforesaid on payment of a fee of 5s. for each day's fishing, and to *bona fide* residents of the said district on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d. for each day's fishing.

4. No person shall take, kill, or fish for trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish otherwise than with one rod and line, but a landing-net or gaff may be used to secure any trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish caught with such rod and line; and no lures or baits other than artificial flies shall be used with such rod and line; nor shall the said lures or baits be used except upon a running line attached to a rod and reel; nor shall any set rod or line be used for taking trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish in any of the waters or streams aforesaid.

5. No person shall fish with more than two artificial flies affixed to any trace. No fly shall have more than one hook, and no person shall use more than one lead or sinker, and such lead or sinker shall be tied above the flies: Provided that the restrictions imposed by this regulation shall not apply to single-hooked flies of size 10 (old numbers) or smaller.

6. No person shall use any trace made of gimp or of either plain or twisted wire having a greater gauge than 21 standard wire gauge, or having a greater length than 6 ft.: Provided that the maximum length of wire herein prescribed shall not apply to traces of wire having a gauge not exceeding 28 standard wire gauge.

7. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish.

8. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidae or trout between the 1st day of May and the 30th day of September in any year, which period is hereby appointed the close season for all such fish: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the Marine Department or of an acclimatization society, or the General Manager of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, for the purpose of pisciculture or scientific investigation: Provided, further, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect the provisions of any regulation now in force, or hereafter made, with respect to keeping trout or salmon in freezing or cool chambers during the close season hereinbefore mentioned.

9. No person shall cast or throw into any stream in which trout or salmon exist or have been liberated, or shall allow to flow into or place near the bank or margin of any such stream, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flax-mill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is noxious, poisonous, or injurious to fish: Provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to prohibit the depositing in such streams of debris from any mining claim.

10. No person shall fish for trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish without a license; and every person fishing shall

on the demand of any ranger, constable, officer of the said society, or of any person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, officer, constable, or person, his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish.

11. Any person taking or catching any trout not exceeding 10 in. in length from nose to tip of tail shall immediately return it alive into the water from which the same is taken.

12. No person shall use, or make use of, a torch, acetylene lamp, or other artificial light when fishing for trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish.

13. No person shall cross-line fish, stroke-haul, or use any other unsportsmanlike device for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish; nor shall any person use any of the above-mentioned baits with any medicated or chemical preparation whatsoever.

14. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish with or use any net, or any instrument, or device or means for taking trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish in any river or stream within the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream.

15. For the purpose of these regulations the mouth of every river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the seashore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of 500 yds. from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea, or of any harbour at low water.

16. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish, or any part thereof, unless he has a license to do so under regulations for taking trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish, or for selling them.

17. No person shall take or catch more than twenty trout or more than twenty pounds weight of trout in any one day.

18. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than £2 or more than £50.

19. If any person shall be convicted of an offence against these regulations, the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for all that part of the Dominion known as the Nelson Acclimatization District and the waters thereof, as the same is defined in the First Schedule hereof, and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all other regulations for the said district, and such regulations are hereby revoked.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout in all the waters within the said district may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Nelson Acclimatization Society, or any one authorized by the said Secretary in that behalf, and such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish in the said Acclimatization District from the 1st day of October in any year to the 30th day of April in the year following, both inclusive, subject to the said Acts and any regulations made thereunder and in force in the said district, and to these regulations: Provided that the Secretary may refuse to issue a license to any person who, within the previous two years, has been convicted of any breach of the provisions of any Act relating to fishing for trout, or of any regulations made thereunder.

2. The fee to be charged for a license as aforesaid to each male person over the age of sixteen years shall be £1, and every such license shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto. Licenses may also be issued to boys attending school or under the age of sixteen, or to women, at a reduced fee of 5s. for each license so issued: Provided that it shall be lawful for the said Secretary, or his deputy, in any case where application is made for a license on or after the first day of January in any year, to issue a license to any man for the sum of 12s. 6d., but so that such license shall be in force only for the unexpired period of the fishing season during which the said license is issued. No license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

3. The Secretary of the said society may issue day licenses to *bona fide* travellers and strangers not resident within the district aforesaid on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d. for each day's fishing.

4. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish with more than two flies, or one fly and one minnow, or one fly and one natural bait, or two natural baits affixed to any trace. No fly shall have more than one hook, and it shall not be lawful to use more than one lead or sinker, and such lead or sinker must be tied above all flies, minnow, or natural bait used: Provided that in the Maitai and Riwaka Rivers and in the Happy Valley Stream only artificial fly shall be used.

5. It shall be unlawful to use any wire, either plain or twisted, or gimp trace of a greater gauge than 21 standard wire gauge.

6. It shall be unlawful to use any wire or gimp trace of a greater length than 6 ft. The provisions contained in this regulation and the two regulations immediately preceding shall not apply to single hooked flies size 10 (old numbers) or smaller, or to wire traces not exceeding 28 standard wire gauge.

7. Trout shall not be fished for, taken, or killed otherwise than with one rod and line, but a landing-net or gaff may be used to secure any trout caught with such a rod and line; and no lures or baits other than natural or artificial flies, insects, worms, or fish shall be used with such rod and line.

8. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish.

9. No person shall take, kill, or have in his possession any of the salmonidæ or trout between the first day of May and the thirtieth day of September in any year, which period is hereby appointed a close season for all such fish: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the Marine Department or of an Acclimatization Society or the General Manager of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, for the purpose of pisciculture or scientific investigation.

10. No person shall cast or throw into any stream in which trout or salmon exist or have been liberated, or shall allow to flow into or place near the bank or margin of any such stream, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flax-mill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is noxious, poisonous, or injurious to fish: Provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to prohibit the depositing in such stream of debris from any mining claim.

11. Save as provided herein or by any other regulations under the said Acts, no person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

12. No person shall fish for trout without a license; and every person fishing shall on the demand of any ranger, constable, officer of the said society, or of any person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, officer, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout.

13. Every trout not exceeding eleven inches in length from nose to tip of tail taken or caught by any person shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

14. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, wilful foul-hooking, spearing, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout; nor shall any of the above-mentioned baits be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

15. Except as provided in these or other regulations under the said Acts, no person shall put, throw, drag, draw, or place or allow to be put, thrown, dragged, drawn, or placed for any purpose whatever any net of any description or any instrument, or device, or means for taking trout in any river or stream within the district aforesaid, or in the outlet, mouth, or entrance of any such river or stream.

16. For the purposes of these regulations the mouth or entrance of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the seashore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of 500 yds. from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea or of any harbour at low water.

17. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any trout, or any part thereof.

18. No person shall take or catch more than twenty trout in any one day: Provided that in the case of the Maitai River it shall be unlawful to take or catch more than ten trout in any one day.

19. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than 40s. or more than £50.

20. If any person shall be convicted of an offence against these regulations, the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish (being fish not indigenous to New Zealand waters) within the said district may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Ashburton Acclimatization Society or any one authorized by the said Secretary in that behalf, and such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish in the

said acclimatization district from the 1st day of October in any one year to the 30th day of April in the year following, subject to the said Acts, and any regulations made thereunder and in force in the said district, and to these regulations: Provided that the Secretary may refuse to issue a license to any person who (within the previous five years) has been convicted of any breach of the provisions of any Act relating to fishing for salmon, trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish, or of any regulations made thereunder.

2. The fee to be charged for a license as aforesaid to each male person over the age of sixteen years shall be £1, and every such license shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto. Licenses may also be issued to boys attending school or under the age of sixteen, or to women, at a fee of 5s. for each license so issued. No license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

3. The Secretary of the said society may issue day licenses to *bona fide* travellers and strangers not resident within the district aforesaid on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d. for each day's fishing.

4. Trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish shall not be fished for, taken, or killed otherwise than with one rod and line, but a landing net or gaff may be used to secure any trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish caught with such rod and line, and no lures or baits other than natural or artificial flies, insects, worms, or fish shall be used with such rod and line.

5. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish with more than two flies, or one fly and one minnow, or one fly and one natural bait, or two natural baits affixed to any trace. No fly shall have more than one hook, and it shall not be lawful to use more than one lead or sinker, and such lead or sinker must be tied above all flies, minnow, or natural bait used.

6. It shall be unlawful to use any wire, either plain or twisted, or gimp trace of a greater gauge than 21 standard wire gauge, or a rod consisting of only one piece of a greater length than 11ft.

7. It shall be unlawful to use any wire or gimp trace of a greater length than 6ft. The provisions contained in this and the two regulations immediately preceding shall not apply to single-hooked size 10 (old numbers), or smaller, or to wire traces not exceeding 28 standard wire gauge.

8. It shall be unlawful for any person to use bare hooks or set rod or line for the purpose of taking trout.

9. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish.

10. No person shall take, kill, or have in his possession any trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish between the 1st day of May and the 30th day of September in any year, or any salmon between the 15th day of May and the 30th day of September, which periods are hereby appointed the close seasons for such fish respectively: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the Marine Department or of an acclimatization society, or the General Manager of the Department of Tourists and Health Resorts for the purpose of pisciculture or scientific investigation: Provided, further, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect the provisions of any regulation now in force or hereafter made with respect to keeping such fish in freezing or cool chambers during the close season hereinbefore mentioned.

11. No person shall cast or throw into any stream in which salmon, trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish exist or have been liberated, or shall allow to flow into, or place near the bank or margin of any such stream, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flax-mill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is noxious, poisonous, or injurious to fish: Provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to prohibit the depositing in such stream of debris from any mining claim.

12. Save as provided herein or by any other regulations under the said Acts, no person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon-parr, or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above-named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

13. No person shall fish for trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish without a license; and every person fishing shall, on the demand of any ranger, constable, officer of the said society, or of any person producing a license, produce and show to such ranger, officer, constable, or person his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such salmon, trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish.

14. Every trout not exceeding 10 in. in length from nose to tip of tail taken or caught by any person shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

15. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, wilful foul-hooking, spearing, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used

for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing salmon, trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish; nor shall any baits be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

16. Except as provided in these or other regulations under the said Acts, no person shall put, throw, drag, draw, or place, or allow to be put, thrown, dragged, drawn, or placed, for any purpose whatsoever any net of any description except a landing-net, bully, or silvery net, or whitebait net in any of the waters, lakes, rivers, or streams in the said district in which salmon, trout, perch, tench, or other acclimatized fish have been placed or exist, or in the outlet, mouth, or entrance of any such waters, lakes, rivers, or streams.

17. It shall be unlawful for any person to troll from any launch or boat on any lake or river.

18. For the purpose of these regulations the mouth or entrance of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the seashore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of 500 yds. from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea, or of any harbour at low water.

19. No person shall sell, or expose or offer for sale, trout, perch, tench, or any part thereof.

20. Any regulation regarding the number or weight of trout which a person may take or catch in any one day or other specified period which has been made by general regulations under the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments or regulations shall not apply to the said district.

21. If any person shall be convicted of an offence against these regulations the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

22. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be more than £50.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

*Rules under the Industrial and Provident Societies Act, 1908.*

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the fifth section of the Industrial and Provident Societies Act, 1908, the Chief Justice of New Zealand and two other Judges of the Supreme Court of New Zealand do hereby, subject to the approval of the Governor-General in Council, make the rules set forth in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the like approval do hereby declare that the said rules shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

RULES RELATING TO PROCEDURE UNDER THE INDUSTRIAL AND PROVIDENT SOCIETIES ACT, 1908.

1. ANY society which is dissatisfied in point of law or of fact with the decision of the Registrar to refuse to register the said society or any rules thereof may, within twenty-one days after notice of the decision of the Registrar has been given to it, deliver to the Registrar a notice requiring him to state a case for the opinion of the Supreme Court.
2. The Registrar shall thereupon state and sign a case accordingly, setting forth the questions of law or of fact in issue and the decision given by him, and shall deliver the case so signed to the society (hereinafter referred to as the appellant).
3. The appellant shall within fourteen days after receiving the case transmit the same to the Registrar of the Supreme Court in such judicial district as the appellant thinks fit, and such Registrar of the Supreme Court shall thereupon enter the case for hearing at the first practicable sitting of the Court, and shall give notice thereof to the appellant and to the Registrar.
4. On the hearing of the case the Supreme Court shall determine the questions of law or fact submitted.
5. If the refusal of registry is overruled on appeal a sealed copy of the order containing the Court's decision shall be served upon the Registrar. Thereupon an acknowledgment of registry shall be given to the society by the Registrar.
6. The costs of any such appeal to the Supreme Court shall be in the discretion of the Court.
