W HEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twenty-seventh day of the same month, the boundaries of the Borough of Ohakune were altered by the exclusion of a certain area from that borough, and the inclusion of such area in the County of Waimarino:

area in the County of Waimarino: And whereas it is desirable that the area so added to the County of Waimarino should be included in the Ohakune Riding of that county: Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section twenty-one of the Counties Act, 1920, do hereby declare that the area included as aforesaid in the County of Waimarino shall be included in the Ohakune Riding of the said county, and that the boundaries of that riding shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto. in the Schedule hereto.

W. H. Hence South by the West Boundary of Section 4, Western boundary of Section 4, Block All, Makotuku Survey District; thence south by the west boundary of Section 4, Block XII, Makotuku Survey District, to the Oruakukuru-Karioi Road; thence west by the Oruakukuru-Karioi Road to the eastern boundary of the Parapara Riding; thence gene-rally north to the eastern boundary of the Parapara Riding as aforesaid to the proint of commencement. as aforesaid to the point of commencement.

#### 5. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined, whether by surrender by the licensee or by revocation under the pro-visions contained in the said regulations or in any amending or substituted regulations, continue in force for a period of twenty-one years from the date hereof.

The licensee shall, from time to time, rectify to the satis-faction of the Minister of Railways and Minister of Telegraphs respectively any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of any telegraph-line which is under the control of or in use by the Railway Department and the Post and Telegraph Department respectively, and which was erected before the erection of the lines hereby licensed.

The total live births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,078 as against 951 in April, an increase of 127. The deaths in May were 505, an increase of 21 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males con-tributed 238, females 267. Thirty-six of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 7.13 per cent. of the whole number. Thirty-two of these were under one year of age. The equivalent annual rates per 1,000 of mean population for May, 1930, and five months ended May, 1930, were as follows. The infant-mortality and still-birth rates per 100 births for the same period are also given.
