shall be 9.30 p.m.; (3) on the evening of the working-day immediately preceding Christmas Day the closing-hour shall be 11 p.m.; (4) on the evening of the working-day immediately preceding New Year's Day the closing-hour shall be 10 p.m.; (5) there shall be no fixed closing-hour on Anzac Day; (6) should the occupier of any shop affected by this notice observe a whole or half-holiday and close his shop from not later than one o'clock in the afternoon until seven o'clock in the evening of any of the special days mentioned in section 26 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, or of 2nd January, or of the Anniversary Day of the Auckland Province, or of any day generally observed in the district in lieu thereof, then the closing-hour for such shop in the evening of such day shall be 9 p.m.:
