A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto was, by an order of the Native Land Court made on the twentieth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, duly laid off as a road-line, in pursuance of sections forty-nine and fifty of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913:

And whereas the said Court is of the opinion that it is in the public interest that the said road-line should be proclaimed as a public road, and a notification to that effect has been forwarded to the Minister of Lands, in terms of section fifty-one of the said Act:

And whereas one month's notice in writing of the intention to proclaim the said road-line as a public road has been given by the Surveyor-General to the local authority of the district concerned in terms of section fifteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914:

And whereas it is now expedient that the said road-line should be proclaimed as a public road:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by sections forty-nine and fifty of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, and in so far

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as each of these sections is applicable, do hereby proclaim as a public road the road-line described in the Schedule hereto.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made on the thirtieth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the eleventh day of January, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, setting apart lands for selection by

discharged soldiers under the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, in so far as it relates to the lands in the Schedule hereto.

Setting apart and defining Boundaries of Provisional State Forests under the Forests Act, 1921-22.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section seven of the Forests Amendment Act, 1926, certain timber licenses and other timber-cutting rights granted in the Karamea and Westland Mining Districts without authority or in excess of authority were validated, and the lands comprised therein were constituted provisional State forests under the Forests Act, 1921-22: And whereas the boundaries of the lands so constituted provisional State forests have nowhere been defined: And whereas it is desirable to define those boundaries and to set apart other lands within the said mining districts as provisional State forests:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on me by the Forests Act, 1921-22, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby declare that the lands comprised within the boundaries described in the Schedule hereto, in so far as such lands were not constituted provisional State forests by the operation of section seven of the Forests Amendment Act, 1926, shall be, and shall be deemed as from the passing of the last-mentioned Act to have been, provisional State forests under the Forests Act, 1921-22.

SCHEDULE.

NELSON LAND DISTRICT.—NELSON-MARLBOROUGH CONSERVATION-REGION.

Provisional State Forest No. 55.

ALL those areas in the Buller Coalfields Reserve containing 3,827 acres, more or less, and described generally as follows:—

Excluding all intersecting roads. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan No. 119/16, deposited in the Head Office of the State Forest Service, Wellington, and thereon bordered green.

Part of Provisional State Forest No. 1594.

Excluding all internal roads. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan No. 125/26, deposited in the Head Office of the State Forest Service, Wellington, and thereon bordered green.

(2) (a) Persons and companies in receipt of income which is assessable under section 4 (1) (a) of the Land and Income Tax Amendment Act, 1930, shall render returns of such income on Part D of form No. 3 as set out in the Schedule to the regulations made under the said Act on the 14th day of April, 1930.

(b) Persons and companies required to render returns under the foregoing provisions of this regulation shall also complete such other portions of the said form No. 3 as may in any case be applicable.

2. Any conditions inserted in such licenses shall be strictly complied with by such Board.
3. Such Board shall forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works such further plans and particulars as the Minister of Public Works may from time to time require.
4. The Board shall not, without the consent in writing of the Minister of Public Works, erect any electric lines along the routes of the Government main trunk transmission-lines.
5. The works hereby authorized shall be constructed so as to comply with the regulations made under section 2 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, dated the 11th day of July, 1927, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the 12th day of the same month, or any regulations made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor, which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein.
6. The Board shall substantially complete the works hereby authorized within a period of five years from the date hereof,

or within such further time as the Minister may allow in the event of the work being delayed by strikes, lock-outs, break-downs, or other unavoidable causes not due to any neglect by the Board.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said building without payment.

6. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned building in good order and repair.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

9. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said building and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such building, requiring the licensee within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same. The licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

10. In case the licensee shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
 - (2) Cease to use or occupy the said building for a period of thirty days;
 - (3) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
 - (4) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy;
- then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any

notice to the licensee or any other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

11. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove any building thereon entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said building to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensee.
