W HEREAS it is enacted by section two hundred and W twenty-six of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that a Harbour Board shall have power, by by-laws made under the said Act, to do all or any of the things in the said section mentioned within the limits of the harbour, including, amongst other things, power to regulate the use of wharves and other landing-places, and generally regulate the traffic on the same, fix scales of dues, tolls, and charges to be paid for the use of wharves, and fix scales of dues for the storage of goods, and otherwise as mentioned in the said section:

And whereas it is enacted by section nine of the said Act that in harbours where there is no Harbour Board the Governor-General in Council shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities by the said Act conferred upon Harbour Boards, and may exercise the same in accordance with the said Act under regulations to be made in the manner provided in section two hundred and twenty-six

And whereas there is no Harbour Board at Puriri or Whangamata, and it is desirable to make the following regulations with respect to the said wharves and landing-places which are under the control of the Thames County Council:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the

Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the hereinbefore-recited power and authority, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations with respect to the said wharves and landing-places therein which are under the control of the Thames County Council (hereinafter called "the Council").

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. In these regulations, if not inconsistent with the context, at" means any open, decked, or half-decked boat attached to or used in connection with any ship or other vessel lying in or belonging to or visiting Puriri or Whangamata, and also any such boat used for the purposes of business or pleasure by residents of the Thames County, in which the means of propulsion is either exclusively by oars or partly by oars and partly

by sails:
"Council" means the Thames County Council:
"Master" means and includes the person actually in charge
of any vessel, whether or not he is certificated:
"Vessel" means and includes every description of launch
whether used in navigation or in any way or ship, whether used in navigation or in any way kept or used as a hulk or storeship, or for any other

kept or used as a hulk or storeship, or for any other purpose whatsoever, whether business or pleasure, and not coming within the above definition of "boat":

"Wharf" means the County Wharf at Puriri or Whangamata and includes the foreshore and land below low-water mark extending for one chain on each side of the said wharf necessary for the working thereof:

"Wharfinger" includes every person actually in charge of any wharf for the time being.

2. The master of any vessel loading or discharging at any wharf or jetty shall be deemed accountable for the proper slinging and landing of all goods, and responsible for all

damage that may occur either from the breakage of slings or from the goods being improperly slung or improperly handled,

3. It shall be the duty of the master to cause tarpaulins to be stretched from the wharf to the vessel loading or discharging as aforesaid, and to be there maintained while cargo or ballast is being handled or shipped.

4. In case any vessel does or causes any damage to any wharf or any part thereof, or to any machinery or building thereon or appertaining thereto, then and in any such case the master of such vessel shall forthwith report the occurrence to the wharfinger by telegraph, or by at once reporting to the wharfinger in person, or should there be no wharfinger, then shall he report to the Council in like manner.

5. Any damage done or caused as aforesaid may be repaired, by the Council, and the cost thereof shall be recoverable by the Council from the master and owner of any such vessel, or either of them, in any Court of competent juris-

diction

6. All goods landed on any wharf, or brought thereon for

6. All goods landed on any wharf, or brought thereon for shipment, shall be placed as the wharfinger or other authorized person directs, and so as to keep all mooring posts or rings free and all rais or tramways clear.
7. Before any vessel or boat is removed from any wharf, the master or other person in charge of the said vessel or boat shall cause all dirt or rubbish to be thoroughly cleared from the portion of the said wharf occupied by such vessel or boat, and to be deposited at such places as may be appointed by the wharfinger or other person in charge.
8. No boat shall be made fast to any steps or landing-place or so near thereto as to obstruct the approach of other

or so near thereto as to obstruct the approach of other vessels, nor shall any boat lie longer alongside than is required

for landing passengers.

9. (a) No person shall drive, take, or work, or cause to be driven, taken, or worked, any cart, vehicle, or horse on any wharf on which carts, vehicles, or horses are permitted by the wharfinger or person in charge to be taken at other than a walking-pace

(b) If such cart or vehicle is drawn by one horse, the person in charge shall walk at the head of and lead the horse; and no person shall ride on any wharf, but shall dismount and

lead his horse.

(c) Every person driving or taking any vehicle on any such wharf shall remain in attendance thereon, so as to have control

of his horse or horses.

10. All watermen, stevedores, carters, and other persons employed on any wharf or any public landing-place shall be under the control of the wharfinger or other person in charge, and shall obey all orders given by such person in charge.

11. No person shall in any way obstruct or impede traffic on any wharf, nor make use of any provoking, abusive, obscene, or other improper language thereon.

12. (a) No person shall, otherwise than as specifically permitted by these regulations, obstruct or impede ingress to or egress from any wharf by any vessel, boat, or cable,

to or egress from any wharf by any vessel, boat, or cable, or in any other way.

(b) If in breach of this clause any person obstruct or impede ingress or egress as aforesaid, and does not, upon being ordered so to do by the wharfinger or other preson in charge, remove such obstruction, then, irrespective of the penalty to which such person is liable for such obstruction, the officer in charge may remove, cast off, or cut any such obstruction, and may recover the cost of so doing from such person.

13. The wharfinger shall have power, on authority of the Chairman of Council, to close the wharves, or any of them or any portion thereof, whenever in his opinion it is advisable

or any portion thereof, whenever in his opinion it is advisable to do so, and no person shall enter upon any wharf or portion of the wharf so closed without the consent of the wharfinger.

14. The master of every vessel lying at a wharf shall give way to any mail-steamer, whether discharging cargo or passengers, and shall either vacate his berth or assist the master of the mail-steamer to moor alongside his vessel, and allow the cargo and passengers to be shipped or unshipped over and across the deck of his vessel, as the case may

require, under such conditions as the wharfinger may impose.
15. The master of every vessel, whether carrying passengers or not, when lying alongside any wharf shall fix, and at all times keep fixed, a safe and proper gangway from such vessel to the wharf. Such gangway shall have side rails and stanchions, with ropes rove taut through same, the top rail or rope being not less than 3 ft. high; and he shall also keep a gangway-net properly secured beneath the gangway, and shall at all times throughout the night—that is to say, from sunset to sunrise—show and exhibit a proper light fixed at each gangway, and shall conform to and obey all orders the wharfinger may give regarding the position, size, and kind of such gangways and lights.

Where the lower end of any fire-escape is more than 6 ft, above the ground it shall be connected with the ground by means of a telescopic sliding ladder, cantilever ladder, counter-balance stairs, expanding pole ladder released from the upper end, or other efficient contrivance other than a hinged drop-ladder or a folding ladder, and such ladder or stairs shall, as regards width and general construction, comply with all the requirements of this by-law relating to fire-escapes so far as applicable.

4. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £20.

#### CONVENTION.

Convention between His Majesty and His Majesty the King of Spain regarding Legal Proceedings in Civil and Commercial Matters.

London, 27th June, 1929.

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and His Catholic Majesty, the King of Spain.

Being desirous to render mutual assistance in the conduct of legal proceedings, in their respective territories, in civil and commercial matters which are being dealt with or which it is anticipated may be dealt with by their respective judicial authorities: authorities:

anthorities;

Have resolved to conclude a Convention for this purpose and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland, all British Colonies and Protectorates and territories under His suzerainty and all mandated territories administered by His Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

The Right Honourable Arthur Henderson, M.P., His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and
His Catholic Majesty the King of Spain:

His Excellency the Marques de Merry del Val, Knight Grand Cross of the Order of Carlos III, G.C.V.O., His Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at the Court of His Britannic Majesty,

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

#### I.—PRELIMINARY.

#### ARTICLE 1.

(a) This Convention applies only to civil and commercial

(a) This convention applies only to civil and commercial matters, including non-contentious matters.
(b) In this Convention the words "territory of one (or of the other) High Contracting Party" shall be interpreted as meaning at any time any of the territories of such High Contracting Party to which the Convention at that time applies applies.

# II.—SERVICE OF JUDICIAL AND EXTRA-JUDICIAL DOCUMENTS.

#### ARTICLE 2.

When judicial or extra-judicial documents drawn up in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties are required by a judicial authority situated therein to be served on persons, partnerships, companies, societies, or other corporations in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such documents may, without prejudice to the provisions of Article 5, be served on the recipient, whatever his nationality, in any of the ways provided in Articles 3 and 4.

## ARTICLE 3.

(a) A request for service shall be addressed by a Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the documents to be served emanate, to the competent authority of the country where the documents are to be served, requesting such authority to cause the documents to be served. The request shall be sent by such Consular Officer to such authority.

(b) The request for service shall be drawn up in the lan-

guage of the country where service is to be effected.

The request for service shall state the full names and descriptions of the parties, the full names, address and description of the recipient, and the nature of the document to be served, and shall enclose the documents (originals or copies)

to be served in duplicate.

(c) The document to be served shall either be drawn up in the language of the country in which it is to be served, or be accompanied by a translation in such language in duplicate. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory

the document emanates.

(d) Requests for service shall be addressed and sent:—
In Spain to the President of the competent Territorial Court:

In England to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of

If the authority to whom a request for service has been sent is not competent to execute it, such authority shall of his own motion transmit the document to the com-

petent authority of his own country.

(e) Service shall be effected by the competent authority of the country where the document is to be served, who shall serve the document in the manner prescribed by the municipal law of such country for the service of similar documents, except that, if a wish for some special manner of service is expressed in the request for service, such manner of service shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of that country.

(f) The execution of the request for service duly made in

(f) The execution of the request for service duly made in accordance with the preceding provisions of this Article shall not be refused unless (1) the authenticity of the request for service is not established, or (2) the High Contracting Party in whose territory it is to be effected considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.

(g) The authority by whom the request for service is executed shall furnish a certificate proving the service or explaining the reason which has prevented such service and

explaining the reason which has prevented such service, and setting forth the fact, the manner and the date of such service or attempted service, and shall send the said certificate to the Consular Officer by whom the request for service was made. The certificate of service or of attempted service shall be placed on one of the duplicates or attached thereto.

#### ARTICLE 4.

(a) Service may be effected without any request to or intervention of the authorities of the country where it is effected :--

(1) By a Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party

from whose territory the document emanates:

(2) By an agent appointed for the purpose either by the judicial authority by whom service of the document is required or by the party on whose application the document was issued:

but in neither of these cases can any measures of compulsion

be employed.

(b) All documents served in the manner provided in the (b) All documents served in the manner provided in the preceding paragraph shall, unless the recipient is a subject of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document to be served emanates, either be drawn up in the language of the country in which service is to be effected or accompanied by a translation into such language, certified as correct, as prescribed in Article 3 (c).

#### ARTICLE 5.

Nothing in this Convention shall render illegal or inad-Party of documents drawn up in the territory of the other High Contracting Party of documents drawn up in the territory of the other High Contracting Party by any one of the following methods of service in any case where such method is recognized as valid by the law of the country from which the documents emanate :-

(a) By the competent officials or officers of the country where they are to be served acting directly at the request of the parties concerned in cases where such officials or officers are not prohibited from so acting by the law of that country;

(b) Through postal channels; or

(c) By any other mode of service which is not illegal under the law existing at the time of service in the country where it is to be effected.

#### ARTICLE 6.

(a) In any case where documents have been served in accordance with the provisions of Article 3, the High Contracting Party, by whose Consular Officer the request for service is addressed, shall pay to the other High Contracting Party any charges and expenses which are payable under the law or regulations in force in the country where the service is effected to the persons employed to effect service, and any charges and expenses incurred in effecting service in a special manner. These charges and expenses shall not exceed such as are usually allowed in the Courts of that country.

as are usually allowed in the Courts of that country.

(b) Repayment of these charges and expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the service has been effected from the Consular Officer by whom the request was addressed when sending to him the certificate provided for in Article 3 (g).

(c) Except as provided above, no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the service of any documents.

#### III .-- TAKING OF EVIDENCE.

#### ARTICLE 7.

When a judicial authority in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties requires that evidence should be taken in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such evidence may be taken in any one of the ways prescribed in Articles 8, 9, and 10.

#### ARTICLE 8.

ARTICLE 8.

(a) The judicial authority by whom the evidence is required may, in accordance with the provisions of its law, address itself by means of "Letters of Request" to the competent authority of the country where the evidence is to be taken, requesting such authority to take the evidence.

(b) The "Letters of Request" shall be drawn up in the language of the country where the evidence is to be taken, or be accompanied by a translation in such language. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose judicial authority the request emanates. The "Letters of Request" shall state the nature of the proceedings for which the evidence is required, the full names and descriptions of the parties thereto, and the full names, addresses, and descriptions of the witnesses. They shall also either be accompanied by a list of interrogaand the full names, addresses, and descriptions of the witnesses. They shall also either be accompanied by a list of interrogatories to be put to the witness or witnesses and a translation thereof certified as correct in the manner heretofore provided or, if this procedure is recognized by the law of the country from which the letters emanate, request the competent authority to allow such questions to be asked viva voce as the parties or their representatives shall desire to ask.

(c) The "Letters of Request" shall be transmitted—
In England by a Spanish Consular Officer to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature;
In Spain by a British Consular Officer to the President of the competent Territorial Court.
In case the authority to whom "Letters of Request" are transmitted is not competent to execute them, the "Letters of Request" shall be forwarded without any further request to the competent authority of his own

further request to the competent authority of his own country.

(d) The competent authority to whom the "Letters of Request" are transmitted or forwarded shall give effect thereto and obtain the evidence required by the use of the same compulsory measures and the same procedure as are employed in the execution of a commission or order emanating from the authorities of his own country country to the latter than the employed in the execution of a commission or order emanating from the authorities of his own country, except that if a wish that some special procedure should be followed is expressed in the "Letters of Request" such special procedure shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of the country where the evidence is to be taken.

(e) The Consular Officer by whom the "Letters of Request" are transmitted, shall, if he so desires, be informed of the date and place where the proceedings will take place, in order that he may inform the interested party or parties who shall be permitted to be present in person or to be represented if they so desire.

(f) The execution of the "Letters of Request" can only be refused-

(1) If the authenticity of the "Letters of Request" is not established.

not established.

(2) If in the country where the evidence is to be taken the execution of the "Letters of Request" in question does not fall within the functions of the judiciary.

(3) If the High Contracting Party in whose territory the evidence is to be taken considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.

(g) In every instance where the "Letters of Request" are not executed by the authority to whom they are addressed, the latter will at once inform the Consular Officer by whom they were transmitted, stating the grounds on which the execution were transmitted, stating the grounds on which the execution of the "Letters of Request" has been refused, or the judicial authority to whom they have been forwarded.

#### ARTICLE 9.

(a) If the law of the country where the evidence is to be taken authorizes such procedure, the judicial authority by whom the evidence is required may, in the "Letters of Request "addressed to the competent authority of the country where the evidence is to be taken, request such authority to appoint to take the evidence a person specially designated in

appoint to take the evidence a person speciarly designated in the "Letters of Request."

A Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party whose judicial authority requires the evidence, or any other suitable person may be so designated.

person may be so designated.

(b) Where this procedure is adopted the provisions of paragraphs (b), (c), (f), and (g) of Article 8 shall apply, but the following paragraphs shall be substituted for paragraphs (d) and (e) of that Article.

(c) The competent authority to whom the "Letters of Request" are transmitted or forwarded shall give effect thereto, and shall appoint the person designated to take the evidence unless such person shall be unwilling so to act. In addition, if necessary, such authority shall make use of such compulsory powers as it possesses under its own law to secure the attendance of and the giving of evidence by the witnesses and the persons to be examined and the production of documents before the person so appointed.

(d) The person thus appointed shall have power to ad-

(d) The person thus appointed shall have power to administer an oath, and any person giving false evidence before him shall be liable in the Courts of the country where the evidence is taken to the penalties provided by the law of that

country for perjury.

(e) The evidence shall be taken in accordance with the law of the country for whose judicial authority the evidence is required, provided such method is not contrary to the law of the country where the evidence is being taken, and the parties shall have the right to be present in person or to be represented by barristers or solicitors or by any other persons who arecom petent to appear before the Courts of either of the countries concerned,

#### ARTICLE 10.

(a) The evidence may also be taken, without any request to or the intervention of the authorities of the country in which it is to be taken by a person in that country directly appointed for the purpose by the Court by whom the evidence is required. A Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party whose Court requires the evidence or any other suitable records may be appointed.

person may be so appointed.

(b) A person so appointed to take evidence may request the individuals named by the Court appointing him to appear before him and give evidence or to produce any document. He may take all kinds of evidence which are not contrary to the law of the country where the evidence is being taken, and shall have power to administer an oath, but he shall have no compulsory powers.

(c) Requests to appear issued by such person shall, unless

(c) Requests to appear issued by such person shall, unless the recipient is a subject of the High Contracting Party for whose judicial authority the evidence is required, be drawn up in the language of the country where the evidence is to be taken, or be accompanied by a translation into such language.

(d) The evidence may be taken in accordance with the procedure recognized by the law of the country for whose judicial authority the evidence is required, and the parties will have the right to be present or to be represented by barristers or solicitors of that country, or by any persons competent to appear before the Court of either of the countries concerned. concerned.

#### ARTICLE 11.

The fact that an attempt to take evidence by the method laid down in Article 10 has failed owing to the refusal of any witness to appear, to give evidence, or to produce documents does not preclude a request being subsequently made in accordance with Articles 8 or 9.

## ARTICLE 12.

- (a) Where evidence is taken in either of the ways provided in Articles 8 or 9 the High Contracting Party by whose judicial authority the "Letters of Request" are addressed shall repay to the other High Contracting Party any expenses incurred by the competent authority of the latter in the execution of the request in respect of any charges and exexecution of the request in respect of any charges and expenses payable to witnesses, experts, interpreters, or translators, the costs of obtaining the attendance of witnesses who have not appeared voluntarily, and the charges and expenses payable to any person whom such authority may have deputed to act in cases where the law of his own country permits this to be done, and any charges and expenses incurred by reason of a special procedure being requested and followed. These expenses shall be such as are usually allowed in similar cases in the Courts of the country where the evidence has been taken.
- has been taken.

  (b) The repayment of these expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the "Letters of Request" have been executed from the Consular Officer by whom they have been executed from the documents estawere transmitted when sending to him the documents establishing their execution.

(c) Except as above provided, no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the taking of evidence.

-JUDICIAL ASSISTANCE FOR POOR PERSONS, IMPRISON-MENT FOR DEBT AND SECURITY FOR COSTS.

#### ARTICLE 13.

The subjects of one High Contracting Party shall enjoy in the territory of the other High Contracting Party a perfect equality of treatment with subjects of that High Contracting Party as regards free judicial assistance for poor persons and imprisonment for debt; and provided that they are resident in any such territory, shall not be compelled to give security for costs in any case where a subject of such other High Contracting Party would not be so compelled.

#### V.-GENERAL PROVISIONS. ARTICLE 14.

Any difficulties which may arise in connection with the operation of this Convention shall be settled through the diplomatic channel.

ARTICLE 15.

The present Convention, of which the English and Spanish

The present Convention, of which the English and Spanish texts are equally authentic, shall be subject to ratification. Ratification shall be exchanged in Madrid. The Convention shall come into force one month after the date on which ratifications are exchanged and shall remain in force for three years after the date of its coming into force. If neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice through the diplomatic channel to the other not less than six months before the expiration of the said period of three years of his intention to terminate the Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of six months from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to terminate it. to terminate it.

#### ARTICLE 16.

(a) This Convention shall not apply *ipso facto* to Scotland or Northern Ireland, nor to any of His Britannic Majesty's Colonies or Protectorates, nor to any territories under his suzerainty, nor to any mandated territories administered by his Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, but His Britannic Majesty may at any time, while the Convention is in force, under Article 15, by a notification given through his Ambassador at Madrid, extend the operation of this Convention to any of the abovementioned territories.

(b) Such notification shall state the authorities in the territory concerned to whom requests for service or for the taking of evidence are to be transmitted, and the language in which communications and translations are to be made. The date of the coming into force of any such extension shall

the date of the coming into force of any stein extension shall be one month from the date of such notification.

(c) Either of the High Contracting Parties may, at any time after the expiry of three years from the coming into force of an extension of this Convention to any of the territories referred to in paragraph (a) of this Article, terminate such extension on giving six months' notice of termination through the dislogantic shapped.

the diplomatic channel.

(d) The termination of the Convention under Article 15 shall, unless otherwise expressly agreed to by both High Contracting Parties, ipso facto terminate it in respect of any territories to which it has been extended under paragraph

(a) of this Article.

## ARTICLE 17.

(a) This Convention shall not apply ipso facto to any of the colonies or protectorates of His Catholic Majesty the King of Spain, but his Government may at any time extend this

or spain, but his Government may at any time extend this Convention to any of such colonies or protectorates by a notification given through his Ambassador in London.

(b) The provisions of paragraph (b) of Article 16 shall apply to any such notifications.

(c) The provisions of paragraphs (c) and (d) of Article 16 shall apply to any colonies or protectorates of His Catholic Majesty to which this Convention has been extended.

#### ARTICLE 18.

(a) His Britannic Majesty may at any time, while the present Convention is in force, either under Article 15 or by virtue of any accession under this Article, by a notification given at Madrid through the diplomatic channel, accede to the present Convention in respect of any of his self-governing Dominions or India, provided that no notification of accession may be given at any time when His Catholic Majesty has given notice of termination in respect of all the territories of His Britannic Majesty to which the Convention applies. The provisions of Article 16 (b) shall be applicable to such notification. Any such accession shall take effect one month after the date of its notification. (b) After the expiry of three years from the date of the coming into force of any accession under paragraph (a) of this Article, either of the High Contracting Parties may, by giving a six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel, terminate the application of the Convention to any country in respect of which a notification of accession

The termination of the Convention under Article 15 shall not affect its application to any such country.

(c) Any notification of accession under paragraph (a) of this Article may include any dependency or mandated territory administered by the Government of the country in respect of which such notification of accession is given: and any notice of termination in respect of any such country under paragraph (b) shall apply to any dependency or mandated territory which was included in the notification of accession in respect of that country.
