Amending a Proclamation setting apart Land as a Provisional State Forest.

BLEDISLOE, Governor-General. [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the tenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, and published in the Gazette of the seventeenth day of Proclamation"), an area of national-endowment land containing four hundred and seventy-four acres, more or less, situated in Block III, Mawheranui Survey District, Westland Land District, was set apart as a provisional State forest in terms of section eighteen of the Forests Act, 1921-22:

And whereas two errors were made in the said Proclama-tion—viz., the area was not described as national-endowment

tion—viz., the area was not described as national-endowment land and the Forest number was shown as 1726 instead of 1730, and it is desirable that these errors be rectified:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section three of the Forests Amendment Act, 1925, do hereby amend the said Proclamation by declaring the land therein described to be national-endowment land and by substituting the Forest number 1730 for the number 1726 the Forest number 1730 for the number 1726.
