And whereas it is now expedient that the said road-line should be proclaimed as a public road:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section forty-eight of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, do hereby proclaim as a public road the road-line described in the Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the seventeenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, and the twenty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twentieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, and the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, at pages 1719 and 2226, respectively, regulations were made under the authority of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), for the transmission of bullion and jewellery by post :

And whereas it is desired to amend such regulations in the manner hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made by the above-described Orders in Council, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto ; and doth further order and declare that the said revocations and the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the sixteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one.

LETTERS AND LETTERCARDS.

6. BULLION weighing not more than 3 lb. may be sent in registered letters to such places outside the Dominion as receive gold by post. Except in regard to weight and insurance the acceptance of such letters shall be subject to the conditions of acceptance of parcels containing bullion contained in Regulation 16 hereof.

REGISTERED ARTICLES : POSTMASTER-GENERAL'S LIABILITY.

(3) Bullion.

PARCEL POST : BULLION AND JEWELLERY.

16. Parcels of bullion may be accepted for inland transmission and, subject to the provisions of any law prohibiting the exportation of gold from New Zealand, for transmission to such places beyond New Zealand as receive gold by post. Parcels containing bullion addressed to any place in New Zealand or Australia shall not exceed 11 lb. in weight ; in all other cases they shall not exceed 3 lb. Parcels containing bullion shall be insured if the contents are over 10s. in value ; but such insurance is limited to a maximum of £2. The Postmaster-General reserves the right to refuse to accept any package of bullion for despatch by any particular mail, or to despatch any such package by any particular mail, on the ground that the mail may, by such acceptance or such despatch, be exposed to the risk of violation, or on the ground that the acceptance or despatch of any such package would be a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation. No parcel addressed to Great Britain and Ireland or for any place served through Great Britain and Ireland may contain bullion exceeding £5 in value. Packages containing gold addressed to countries beyond New Zealand may be posted (if not prohibited as aforesaid) only at money-order offices, and senders must pay thereon the export duty of 2s. per ounce troy for gold mined in the North Island, and also a duty of 6d. per ounce troy for gold mined in any part of New Zealand other than gold produced by alluvial mining or dredging, in addition to the usual postage.

Parcels containing jewellery, watches, articles of manufactured gold or silver, and suchlike valuables should be insured and specially packed as instructed in Regulation 9, under the heading "Insurance of Parcels," in the Schedule to the Order in Council dated the 26th December, 1907, and published at page 3615 of the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 31st December, 1907 ; but such parcels, if addressed to any place within New Zealand, may be registered if desired in lieu of being insured, but their insurance or registration is not compulsory unless the contents are over 10s. in value.

1. EVERY person whose application for registration has been declined by the Survey Board, or whose name has been removed from the register, or whose registration has been suspended, shall be notified by the Registrar in writing. The notice shall specify the reason for such refusal, removal, or suspension, if and so far as such reason is expressed in any resolution of the Board, and the section and subsection (if any) of the Act under which action has been taken.

BOARD OF APPEAL.

2. Of the assessors to be appointed under section 15 of the said Act one shall be appointed by the Board, by resolution duly passed, and the other shall be appointed by the appellant, in writing, as hereinafter provided.

3. No person shall be capable of acting as an assessor except a surveyor duly registered under the said Act.

4. If by reason of death, sickness, removal, or any other cause the Magistrate named as provided by Regulation 8 hereof shall be unable to discharge the duties laid down in these regulations, any other Magistrate may discharge such duties in the place of the Magistrate so named.

5. If by reason of death, sickness, removal, or any other cause the Magistrate so named as aforesaid shall not be present at the time and place fixed for the hearing of the appeal, any other Magistrate for the time being present may act in the place of the Magistrate so named, and if no other Magistrate be available the assessors may from time to time adjourn the hearing of the appeal for such period, not exceeding fourteen days, and to such place as they think fit.

6. If by reason of death, sickness, or any other cause any assessor appointed as aforesaid shall not be present at the time and place fixed for the hearing of the appeal, then the Board or the appellant, as the case may be, shall either at the time of hearing or previously thereto make a fresh appointment of an assessor, and give notice in writing thereof forthwith to the Magistrate and to the other party, and the Magistrate may adjourn the hearing of the appeal for such time, not exceeding fourteen days, as he thinks fit.

the name of the person whom he appoints to act as assessor on his behalf at the hearing of the appeal, and such assessor shall give in writing his consent to act.

8. Within a period of twenty-one days after receipt of such notice of appeal the Board shall inform the appellant of the name of the Magistrate before whom the appeal will be heard and of the assessor appointed by the Board, and shall at the same time forward to such Magistrate a copy of the Board's decision and the notice of appeal therefrom, together with a notice of the appointment of an assessor by the Board.

TIME OF HEARING.

9. The Magistrate shall fix a convenient time and place for the hearing of the appeal, such time to be not more than forty-two days after the receipt by the Board of the notice of appeal referred to in Regulation 7 hereof.

10. The Magistrate shall cause at least seven days' previous notice of such time and place to be given to each assessor, the Board, and the appellant.

PROCEDURE AT HEARING.

11. The Board of Appeal may, in its discretion, receive any evidence that it thinks fit (whether on oath or otherwise), and may act on any statement, document, information, or matter which in the opinion of the Board of Appeal may assist it to deal with the matters before it, whether the same would be legally admissible in a Court of law or not.

12. In the matters not expressly provided for in the said Act or by these regulations the procedure of the Board of Appeal shall be such as the Magistrate may determine.

13. The Board of Appeal may from time to time adjourn the hearing or consideration or determination of the appeal as it thinks fit.

14. At the hearing of the appeal the appellant may himself appear or may be represented by some other person on his behalf, and the Board may be represented by any member thereof appointed by the Board, or by some other person appointed by the Board.

15. If the appellant or his representative fails to appear at the hearing, the Board of Appeal may determine the appeal in his absence on such evidence as is available. If he appears, the evidence shall be taken in his presence or in the presence of his representative or both.

16. The determination made in respect of an appeal shall be in writing signed by the Magistrate, and a copy of such determination shall be forwarded by the Magistrate to the appellant and to the Board, and the Board shall forthwith give effect to such determination. The Magistrate shall advise the Board whether or not the determination was unanimously arrived at.

17. The assessors hearing any appeal may be paid such fee and allowances as may be considered reasonable by the Board of Appeal, but so that in no case shall the fee payable to any assessor exceed £2 2s. per diem, together with such reasonable travelling-expenses as are actually incurred by the assessor in attending a sitting of the Board of Appeal.

18. Any notice required to be given or document required to be served by these regulations may be given or served personally, or by registered letter addressed to the person to be served at his last known place of business or abode, and in the latter case shall be deemed to be served at the time when it would reach its address in the ordinary course of registered post.

The Taupo Slipway Regulations, 1931.

BLEDISLOE, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 16th day of February, 1931.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), that in harbours where there is no Harbour Board the Governor-General in Council shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities by the said Act conferred upon Harbour Boards, and may, in cases where such powers would be exercised under by-laws to be made by a Board, exercise the same under regulations to be made in the manner provided in section two hundred and thirty-four of the said Act:

And whereas there is no Harbour Board having jurisdiction in Lake Taupo, which is a harbour within the meaning of that term as defined by the said Act:

And whereas by section three of the Land Act, 1924, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time by Order in Council make regulations for the purposes of that Act as therein provided, and the Landing Reserve at Taupo hereinafter referred to is a reserve in respect of which regulations may be so made:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority conferred upon him by section nine of the said Act and by section three of the Land Act, 1924, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter contained, and doth order that the same shall, on and after the date of this Order in Council apply to the Government slipway erected at Taupo and hereinafter described.

REGULATIONS.

INTERPRETATION.

1. (a) IN these regulations, where not inconsistent with the context,—

"Department" means the Minister of Internal Affairs, and includes any person acting for, by, or under the direction of the Minister:

"Master boatman" includes any person, licensed or otherwise, from time to time for the time being in charge of any vessel:

"Slipway" and "slip" mean the slipway erected partly upon the Landing Reserve at Taupo described in the Third Schedule to the Taupo Landing Reserve Regulations, 1927, and partly in the Waikato River adjoining the said reserve, together with any additions to the said slipway that may hereafter be made, and includes first the cradle—that is to say, the mechanism for raising vessels from the water and the ways and supports of such mechanism; and secondly, the skids—that is to say, the structure extending laterally from the cradle, and intended to carry vessels when raised from the water and removed from the cradle:

"Slipmaster" means any person appointed to control the slipway:

"Vessel" includes steamer, ship, launch, and boat.

(b) These regulations may be cited as "the Taupo Slipway Regulations, 1931."

CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT.

2. The slipway shall be under the control of the slipmaster.

3. The master boatman of a vessel entering or leaving the slip, or whilst in or upon the slip, shall attend to and obey the directions of the slipmaster.

4. Neither the Department nor the Crown nor any officer of the Government shall be responsible for any accident occurring or injury done to any person, vessel, or other property before any vessel is slipped, or while it is in the process of slipping, or is on the slipway or is leaving the slipway.

5. Any alteration of the position of the vessel on the slip, or the shifting or taking out of blocks whether at the request of the slipmaster or of the master boatman or other person in charge of the vessel shall be at the sole risk of the owner of the vessel.

6. Any person who accidentally or otherwise damages or destroys any of the Department's property shall be liable for the cost of repair or removal thereof.

VESSELS ENTERING SLIP.

7. No person shall put or cause to be put, or assist to put, any vessel on the slipway until the master boatman or owner thereof has obtained from the slipmaster a permit in the form numbered 1 in the Schedule hereto, and has paid the fee hereafter provided.

8. Every application for a permit shall be made in writing in the form numbered 2 in the Schedule hereto, and shall immediately it is received be registered in a book kept for that purpose by the slipmaster.

9. The slipway shall be available for use according to priority of registration. Any vessel not arriving at the slipway at the time appointed for that vessel to enter may, at the discretion of the slipmaster, forfeit the benefit of priority.

10. Every master boatman shall allow the cradle to be used for another vessel to be taken on at the same time, as occasion may require, if, in the opinion of the slipmaster, there is room on the cradle for such other vessel.

11. Notwithstanding anything herein contained the slipmaster shall be entitled absolutely or conditionally to refuse to permit any vessel to be put on the slipway if he thinks that by reason of her size, weight, or design the slipway may be liable to damage or the use of the slipway by other vessels may be unduly delayed.

12. No master boatman shall place such vessel on the slip whilst there is on board of such vessel any explosive, fuel oil, petroleum, petroleum oil, petroleum spirit, or other dangerous goods as defined by the Explosive and Dangerous Goods Act, 1908, and its amendments.

VESSELS REMAINING AND LEAVING SLIP.

13. If in the opinion of the slipmaster, wind and weather, or sea, or the circumstances that another vessel is using the slipway, will not permit of a vessel being launched, the vessel may be allowed or required to remain on the slip for such time as the slipmaster may think necessary. No additional charge shall be made for the time during which the slipway is being so used, and no demand for demurrage shall be made in respect of the vessel so remaining on the slip, nor shall any person be entitled to make any claim for delay or otherwise arising out of the detention of the vessel.

14. No person shall keep a vessel longer than fourteen days upon the slip except under special circumstances and by or under special agreement with the Department.

15. The slipmaster shall have power where the occasion requires it, of which matter he shall be the sole judge, to order the master boatman of any vessel to remove such vessel from the slip or from any position on the slip to any other position, and every master boatman shall forthwith comply with such order. If in any case a master boatman fails or neglects to comply with an order of the slipmaster made under this regulation the slipmaster may arrange for the work of such removal, and the cost thereof shall, without prejudice to the liability of any person to the penalties hereinafter provided, be recoverable in the same way as fees for the use of the slipway.

16. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, it shall be lawful for a vessel to be taken upon the slip and moved laterally and remain on the skids for the period specified when making application for permission to enter the slipway:

Provided that should the master boatman desire to remove such vessel from its position for any specified purpose permission to do so may be granted on application, stating the grounds therefor, being made to the slipmaster, if the slipmaster considers that it is expedient to grant the same:

Provided further that on the vessel returning, it must take up the position indicated by the slipmaster, notwithstanding that such position is not that originally occupied by the vessel. No fee in addition to that hereinafter provided for shall be payable in respect of the authority granted under this regulation notwithstanding that a vessel may depart from and return to its position periodically or otherwise during the currency of the term.

WORK TO BE DONE ON SLIP.

17. No person shall make any repairs to any vessel on the slipway which can, in the opinion of the slipmaster, be done off it, when another vessel is waiting to go on. So soon as the slipmaster considers that the vessel on the slip is repaired, so far as the use of the slip is required, he may order the removal of such vessel from the slip and the master boatman shall forthwith comply with such order and the provisions of Regulation 15 hereof shall apply.

18. No person shall break up, lengthen, or scuttle any vessel upon the slip without the written authority of the slipmaster, and subject to such conditions as the slipmaster thinks fit to impose.

19. No person shall do work of any description on the slip on Sundays, except upon proved emergency, and only with the express written consent of the slipmaster.

20. No person shall throw, discharge, place, or permit to be thrown, discharged, or placed any sewage, garbage, or refuse in or upon the slip.

21. The master boatman of any vessel shall from time to time, and as often as the slipmaster may so require, cause to be removed from the slipway and its vicinity all chips, dirt, refuse, or rubbish of any sort arising from the repair or cleaning of any vessel, and shall cause the adjoining buildings and premises and the ways of the slip to be properly swept and cleaned before the vessel is launched from the slip. If in any case the master boatman neglects to comply with the provisions of this regulation, the slipmaster may arrange for the carrying-out of the work, and the cost thereof shall, without prejudice to the liability of any person to the penalties hereinafter provided, be recoverable in the same way as fees for the use of the slipway.

FEES AND PENALTIES.

22. Fees for the use of the slipway shall be paid in advance to the Department according to the following scale:—

- (a) For a period of twenty-four hours—£1; and for every succeeding twenty-four hours or portion thereof—1s.
- (b) For a period not exceeding one calendar year expiring on the 31st day of December (flat rate)—£3.

23. The cost of any work arranged for by the slipmaster arising out of a default by a master boatman shall include all sums paid for labour specially engaged, together with a reasonable sum for the services of any officer or employee of the Department engaged on the work.

24. The owner and the master boatman of any vessel in respect of which any fees or costs payable under these regulations are incurred shall be jointly and severally liable for payment thereof, and the same shall be recoverable in any Court of competent jurisdiction as a debt due to the Crown.

25. Any person who commits or attempts to commit a breach of any of the foregoing regulations shall, in addition to the liability to make good any loss, damage, or injury which may have been caused, sustained, or occasioned by such breach, be liable to a penalty of £5 for every such breach or attempted breach.

WHEREAS by Order in Council of the fourteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 30, of the seventeenth day of the same month, regulations for trout-fishing in the Nelson Acclimatization District described in such Order in Council were made:

And whereas it is desirable that such regulations be amended: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke regulations number seven and number eighteen made by the hereinbefore-recited Order in Council, and doth make the following regulations in lieu thereof.

REGULATIONS.

7. No person shall fish for, take, or kill any trout otherwise than with one rod and line, but a landing-net or gaff may be used to secure any trout caught with such rod and line; and no lures or baits other than natural or artificial flies, insects, worms, or fish shall be used with such rod and line.

7A. No person in or on any power-boat, or in or on any other boat or vessel towed by a power-boat shall troll for trout on Lake Rotoroa.

18. No person shall take or catch more than twenty trout in any one day: Provided that no person shall take or catch more than ten trout in any one day from the waters of the Matai River, and provided still further, no person shall take or catch more than six trout in any one day from the waters of Lake Rotoroa, the D'Urville, Sabine, and Gowan Rivers.

Special Provision with respect to Red Deer in Portions of Wellington Acclimatization District.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare that red deer shall be deemed to be included in the Second Schedule of the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, with respect to those portions of the Wellington Acclimatization District described in the Schedule hereto:

And I do hereby further declare that this Warrant shall come into force on the second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and shall expire on the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and that from and after the last-mentioned date red deer shall cease to be included in the Second Schedule of the said Act with respect to such areas.

Open Season for Deer-shooting, Wellington Acclimatization District.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, Philip Aldborough de la Perrelle, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 2nd day of March, 1931, to the 30th day of April, 1931 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in those portions of the Wellington Acclimatization District described in the First Schedule hereto, for the taking or killing of the following imported game—viz., red-deer stags and hinds—subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. LICENSES to take or kill red-deer stags and hinds may be issued by the Secretary of the Wellington Acclimatization Society, on payment of a license fee of £1, in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and regulations thereunder and this notification: Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.

2. No licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

3. Nothing in any license to take or kill red-deer stags and hinds shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill red-deer stags or hinds on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, nor shall authorize the holder thereof to enter upon any State forest for the purpose of taking or killing red-deer stags or hinds without the express written permission of the Conservator of Forests, Palmerston North, first had and obtained.

4. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £20.
