IN exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Mortgages Relief Act, 1931 (hereinafter called the said Act), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby apply the provisions of the said Act with the necessary modifications to leases of land granted before the commencement of the said Act of the following classes, whether or not the same also comprise property other than land:—

- (i) All such leases granted by a lessor other than the Crown and containing an optional purchasing clause;
- (ii) All such leases granted by a lessor other than the Crown and containing a compulsory purchasing clause;
- (iii) All such leases granted by the Crown as lessor and containing a compulsory purchasing clause.

Amending Regulations under the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Act, 1928.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Act, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations by way of amendment of the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Regulations, 1930, dated the fourteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and published in the *Gazette*, No. 30, at page 1430, on the seventeenth day of the same month (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations").

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Regulations Amendment No. 1.
2. These regulations shall apply to all contracts of insurance under the said Act for the year commencing on the 1st day of June, 1931, or any subsequent year or for any part thereof respectively, but shall not apply to any such contract expiring before the said 1st day of June, 1931.
3. The paragraph marked (a) contained in the description of motor-vehicles of Class 4 as set out in Part I of the Second

Schedule to the principal regulations is revoked and the following substituted:—

“(a) If used by any person for purposes of pleasure or for private or domestic purposes but not for business purposes:

“Provided that for the purposes of this paragraph ‘business purposes’ does not include the carriage of any person to and from his place of business or the place where he carries on his profession or calling.

4. The paragraph marked (b) contained in the said description of motor-vehicles of Class 4 as set out in Part I of the Second Schedule to the principal regulations is revoked and the following substituted:—

“(b) If used in person by the owner or owners (being an individual or individuals) for the purpose of making personal calls in relation to his or their profession, business, or calling.”

5. The paragraph marked (c) contained in the said description of motor-vehicles of Class 4 as set out in Part I of the Second Schedule to the principal regulations is revoked and the following substituted:—

“(e) If used by the owner being a farmer or by any person on his behalf in connection with the farming operations of the owner.”

6. The paragraph marked (a) contained in Part II of the Second Schedule to the principal regulations is revoked and the following substituted:—

“(a) In the interpretation of Part I of this Schedule—

“(i) ‘Private motor-car’ means any motor-car (as defined by the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924) not being a public motor-vehicle or a contract motor-vehicle (as hereinafter defined).

“(ii) Every term used therein (except the term ‘private motor-car’) which is defined in section 2 of the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, has the meaning assigned thereto by that Act.”

Regulations relating to Registration-plates under Motor-vehicles Act, 1924.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section thirty-six of the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations in amendment of the regulations (hereinafter referred to as "the said regulations") under the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, dated the twelfth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the same day at page 2943, and doth hereby revoke the regulations (hereinafter referred to as "the revoked regulations") relating to registration-plates under the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, dated the thirteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the twenty-second day of the same month at page 1681.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the said regulations.
2. The registration-plates in terms of the said regulations for motor-vehicles for the licensing year commencing on the 1st day of June, 1931, shall be in the form of metal plates having a ground coloured black, and border and characters (whether letters or numerals) embossed and coloured orange, the plates, numerals, and letters being in the respective shapes and sizes indicated in the Schedule (hereinafter described as "the said Schedule") to the revoked regulations save that the two dots separating the hundreds digits from the thousands digits shall be replaced by one centrally placed triangular-shaped mark also coloured orange.
3. The registration-plates for motor-vehicles other than motor-cycles shall comply with the following requirements :—
 - (a) Plates for attachment to motor-vehicles for which no other form is required by these regulations shall be in the form marked A in the said Schedule.
 - (b) Plates issued to manufacturers and dealers in motor-vehicles in terms of section 18 of the said Act shall be in the form marked B in the said Schedule.
 - (c) Plates for attachment to motor-vehicles exempted from license fees in terms of section 11 of the said Act (other than motor-vehicles the property of the Crown) shall be in the form marked C in the said Schedule.
 - (d) Plates for attachment to motor-vehicles the property of the Crown shall (unless permission to the contrary is obtained in such manner as may be prescribed by the Minister of Transport) be in the form marked D in the said Schedule.
 - (e) The numerals for such plates shall in all cases be as indicated respectively in the forms marked A, B, and C, in the said Schedule.
4. The registration-plates for motor-cycles shall comply with the following requirements :—
 - (a) Plates for attachment to motor-cycles for which no other form is required by these regulations shall be in the form marked E in the said Schedule.
 - (b) Plates issued to manufacturers and dealers in motor-vehicles in terms of section 18 of the said Act shall be in the form marked G in the said Schedule.
 - (c) The numerals for such plates shall in all cases be as indicated respectively in the forms marked E, F, and G in the said Schedule.

 - "Provided that no relieving teacher shall be appointed to a Grade I school for a less period than two complete weeks or to a Grade II school for less than one week.
 - "(3) In no case shall a relieving teacher be sent to a Grade 0 school, except at the same salary and on the same conditions as are attached to the position.

- “ (4) Except with the approval of the Director, no assistant teacher holding a permanent appointment in any school shall be appointed as a relieving assistant teacher in the same school.”
- (4) By deleting from subclause (1) of clause 43 the column of figures with the heading “ Annual Increment.”
- (5) By adding the following proviso to subclause (2) of clause 43 :—

Regulations for Trout-fishing in the Buller Acclimatization District.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for all that part of the Dominion known as the Buller Acclimatization District and the waters thereof, as the same is defined in the First Schedule hereof; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all other regulations for the said district, and such regulations are hereby revoked.

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout or other acclimatized fish in all waters within the said district may be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Buller Acclimatization Society, or any one authorized by the said Secretary in that behalf, and such license shall entitle the person named therein to fish in the said acclimatization district from the 1st day of October in any one year to the 30th day of April in the year following, subject to the said Acts, and any regulations made thereunder, and to these regulations: Provided that the Secretary may refuse to issue a license to any person who, within the previous two years, has been convicted of any breach of the provisions of any Act relating to fishing for trout or other acclimatized fish, or of any regulation made thereunder.

2. The fee to be charged for a license as aforesaid to each male person over the age of sixteen years shall be 10s., and every such license shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto. Licenses may also be issued to boys attending school or under the age of eighteen, or to women, at a reduced fee of 5s. for each such license so issued: Provided that day licenses may be issued on payment of a fee of 1s. for each day's fishing. No license shall confer any right of entry upon the land of any person without his consent.

3. Trout or other acclimatized fish shall not be fished for, taken, or killed, otherwise than with one rod and line, but a landing-net or gaff may be used to secure any trout or other acclimatized fish caught with such rod and line.

4. It shall be unlawful to fish for trout or other acclimatized fish with other than natural or artificial fly, natural or artificial minnow, silveries, bullies, grasshoppers, spiders, caterpillars, creepers, or worms.

5. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish.

6. No person shall have in his possession any of the salmonidæ or trout between the 1st day of May and the 30th day of September in any year, which period is hereby appointed the close season for all such fish: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the Marine Department, or the Department of Internal Affairs, or of any acclimatization society, or for the purpose of pisciculture or scientific research: Provided further that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect the provisions of any regulations now in force, or hereafter made, with respect to keeping trout or salmon in freezing or cool chambers during the close season hereinbefore mentioned.

7. No person shall cast or throw into any stream in which trout or salmon exist or have been liberated, or shall allow to flow into, or place near the bank or margin of any such stream, any sawdust, or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flaxmill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is noxious, poisonous, or injurious to fish: Provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to prohibit the depositing in such stream of debris from any mining claim.

8. No person shall take, fish for, catch, or kill, in any manner whatever, or have in his possession, any salmon, salmon-parr or smolts, or the ova, young, or fry of any salmon in any stage whatever; and any of the above named taken by accident or otherwise shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken: Provided always that this regulation shall not apply to fish caught by the officers of the Marine Department, or the Department of Internal Affairs, or of any acclimatization society, or for the purpose of pisciculture or scientific research.

9. No person shall fish for trout or other acclimatized fish without a license; and every person fishing shall, on the demand of any Ranger, constable, officer of the said society,

or of any person producing a license, produce and show to such Ranger, officer, constable, or person, his license, and the contents of his creel or bag, and the bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout or other acclimatized fish.

10. Every trout not exceeding 9 in. in length from nose to tip of tail, taken or caught by any person, shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

11. No cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing trout or other acclimatized fish; nor shall any of the above-mentioned baits be used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

12. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish with or use any net, or any instrument, or device, or means for taking trout or other acclimatized fish in any river or stream within the district aforesaid, or at the mouth or entrance of any such river or stream: Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the placing of any net other than a stake net at any place in the Buller River below a straight line drawn across the said river opposite Lyndhurst Street, or at any place in the Orowaiti River below the old bridge, for the purpose of taking sea fish only, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, and any regulations made thereunder, nor render any person liable to any penalty for so doing, or for taking sea fish by such means.

13. For the purposes of these regulations the mouth of every such river or stream shall be deemed to include every outlet of the same and the seashore between such outlets, and shall extend over a radius of one-quarter of a mile from the point or line where the waters of such river or stream meet those of the sea, or of any harbour at low water.

14. No person shall buy, sell, or expose, or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining, for sale, any trout or other acclimatized fish, or any part thereof, unless such person has a license to do so under regulations for taking trout or other acclimatized fish, or for selling them.

15. No person shall take or catch more than twenty trout in any one day.

16. If any person shall be convicted of an offence against these regulations, the license (if any) held by the offender shall thereupon become void.

17. The penalty for the breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than forty shillings or more than fifty pounds: Provided that in the case of any person found guilty of taking any salmon or trout illegally during the spawning season or of any person who uses dynamite, rifle, or other fire-arms, or any other explosive substance for the purpose of catching or killing salmon or trout, the minimum penalty shall not be less than ten pounds.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

BULLER ACCLIMATIZATION DISTRICT.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the thirteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and published in the *Gazette* of the twenty-second day of the same month, at page 1281, Messrs. Alfred Andrewes, George Andrewes, Frank Andrewes, and Arthur Edmund Andrewes, of Opononi, trading under the style or title of "A. S. Andrewes and Sons" (hereinafter called "the licensees," in which term is to be construed, unless the context requires a different construction, their executors, administrators, and assigns), were licensed to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Opononi, in Hokianga Harbour, as shown on plan marked M.D. 1491, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in order to erect and maintain thereon a wharf, to be erected in accordance with plan marked M.D. 1492, deposited as aforesaid, for the term of seven years, computed from the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, on the terms and conditions therein expressed; and dues and rates were prescribed to be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf:

And whereas the licensees have applied for a fresh license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a further term of fourteen years, and it is advisable to grant the same, and to prescribe the dues and rates which shall be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of using the wharf aforesaid in connection therewith, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, shall be charged and taken by the licensees for the use of the said wharf.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides;

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides;

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the

maintenance of the said wharf, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 1491, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensees shall pay to the Minister the sum of £1, and thereafter an annual sum of £5 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the 24th day of March, 1931, until the 31st March following to be paid on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at their own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the licensees, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensees shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, by the Harbourmaster at Hokianga, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the 24th day of March, 1931, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege, without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

12. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensees' part.

13. In case the licensees shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions;

then, and in any such case, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, right, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensees shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry,

as the case may be; and if the licensees fail so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensees.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

EVERY person who shall use the said wharf with any vessel shall pay to Messrs. A. S. Andrewes and Sons, or to their officer or other person appointed or authorized by them to receive the dues and rates hereby prescribed, for the use thereof, as follows, that is to say:—

NOTE.—A cold and unsettled month, with strong north-westerly winds prevailing. Precipitation at Karori Reservoir, near Kelburn, the greater part of which fell at night, was 15 per cent. above the mean of previous years. Total bright sunshine, 251.9 hours, 55 per cent. of the possible, and one sunless day. Lightning was seen on the 12th. Mean dewpoint 51.5°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.381 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1931.

General.—Conditions as regards crops and pastures underwent a considerable improvement during January owing to the increased rainfall. Even where the total precipitation was below the average and the soils were deficient in moisture, considerable relief was brought by the general rains which accompanied several of the storms. Much of the vegetation exhibited springlike features for a second time this season. On the whole the month was very stormy and wet. There was an unusual persistence of strong north-west or westerly winds, such as are usually characteristic of the late spring months. Temperatures were below normal, especially in western districts.

Rainfall.—The month was a very wet one for most of the western districts, but particularly so on the West Coast and the high country of the South Island. In Southern Westland it was perhaps the wettest January on record. Several stations received over 40 in. Less than the normal fall was experienced in the northern part of the Auckland Peninsula, the eastern side of the Coromandel Peninsula, from the eastern portion of the Bay of Plenty down the east coast of the North Island to Hawke's Bay and the Wairarapa, in North Canterbury, and on the Canterbury Plains. Everywhere else the rainfall was in excess of the normal, and in most places markedly so.

Temperature.—Except in the northern and east coast districts of the North Island temperatures were below the previous average. Owing to the Fohn effect, or warming of the westerly winds as they crossed the ranges, eastern districts generally were, relatively, considerably warmer than western districts. At Wellington and on the west coast of the South Island the amounts by which the mean temperatures fell below the January average have seldom been exceeded. A few frosts were experienced during the month, one on the 17th at Christchurch being the severest ever recorded in January.

Storm Systems.—As would be anticipated from the foregoing remarks, weather of the westerly type prevailed throughout the greater part of the month. There were a number of rather severe depressions and most of them were accompanied by several "secondaries." Anti-cyclones, on the other hand, passed mainly to the north of New Zealand. Consequently, though there was much fine weather with hot and dry winds in eastern districts, in those with a westerly aspect fine spells were few and of short duration. The month was generally regarded as a very unpleasant one for the time of year.

Depressions of the westerly type and of considerable depth passed on the 3rd, 7th, 9th, 15th, and the 19th to 21st, each bringing rain to the greater part of the Dominion, with many heavy falls. On the 3rd, north-westerly gales were experienced at many places, being particularly severe in Wellington and Canterbury.

On the 12th a moderate cyclone crossed the South Island, bringing heavy rain especially to the North Island. South-westerly gales followed on the 13th. Again, in the depression of the 21st, a slight low-pressure centre developed, this time crossing the North Island, where there were many very heavy rainfalls. Some flooding occurred, also, between Reefton and Greymouth. On both the 12th and the 21st sudden and very heavy downpours caused flooding in Auckland City.

The last depression also was cyclonic and crossed the South Island on the 27th. The most general rains experienced during the month were associated with this depression, particularly on the 27th. Rather severe floods occurred in Westland. As the storm passed eastwards, southerly gales and cold weather prevailed between the 28th and the 30th. On the 28th there were severe hailstorms in the Nelson district and a small tornado occurred at Riwaka.

A BILL INTITLED THE WANGANUI CHURCH ACRE AMENDMENT ACT, 1931.
