WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and published in the *Gazette* of the eighth day of the same month at page 466, the Ohinemuri County Council (hereinafter called "the Council," in which term is to be construed, unless the context requires a different construction, its successors or assigns) was licensed to use and occupy part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Kaimanawa, Waihou River, in order to erect and maintain a wharf and shed thereon in accordance with the plans marked M.D. 4666 and 4733, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington for the term of fourteen years, computed from the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen:

And whereas the Council has applied for a fresh license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a further term of fourteen years, and it is advisable to grant the same:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the Council as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the Council to use and occupy that part of the foreshore as shown on plans M.D. 4666 and 4733, so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said wharf and

shed, such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the erection of the said wharf and shed, as shown on the plans marked M.D. 4666 and 4733, and deposited as aforesaid.

3. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf and shed, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said wharf and shed without payment.

5. The Council shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit from the wharf and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and shed and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf and shed, requiring the Council within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Council shall, with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the first day of February, 1931, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority, and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.

11. The Council shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf and shed may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.

12. In case the Council shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf and shed for a period of thirty days;

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Council or any other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred have been revoked and determined.

13. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Council shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove any structure thereon entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the Council fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said structure to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Council.

And whereas the Council has applied for a fresh license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a further term of fourteen years, and it is advisable to grant the same:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the Council as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the Council to use and occupy that part of the foreshore as shown on plan M.D. 4589, so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said wharf and shed, such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

6. The Council shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf and shed in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit from the wharf and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharf by the Council shall be applied to keeping the said wharf and shed and all erections on or in connection with such wharf and shed in good order and repair.

8. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and shed and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf and shed, requiring the Council within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Council shall, with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf and shed any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister.

11. The Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and shed and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the 31st day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

12. The Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the wharf and shed.

13. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or with any regulations thereunder, and that are now or many hereafter be in force.

14. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the 7th day of March, 1930, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority, and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

15. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.

16. The Council shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf and shed may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.

17. In case the Council shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf and shed for a period of thirty days;

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Council or any other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

18. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Council shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove any structure thereon entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry as the case may be, and if the Council fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said structure to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Council.

The Samoa Vagrancy Order, 1931.

HIS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of Samoa conferred upon him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. THIS Order may be cited as "The Samoa Vagrancy Order, 1931."

VAGRANT DEFINED.

2. Every person in Samoa (other than a Samoan born in Samoa) who has no lawful means of support or has insufficient lawful means of support shall be deemed a vagrant, and shall be liable to imprisonment for six months.

APPREHENSION OF VAGRANTS.

3. Where any constable has reasonable cause to believe that any person is a vagrant he may arrest such person, either with or without warrant, and bring him before the High Court as soon as possible thereafter.

ONUS OF PROOF.

4. (1) If any person arrested under the last preceding clause fails to prove to the satisfaction of the High Court that he has sufficient lawful means of support or that such means of support are lawful, he shall be deemed to be a vagrant within the meaning of this Order, and liable accordingly.

(2) The fact that any person charged under this Order can produce or prove that he possesses money or property shall not be taken into account in deciding such charge unless he shows by his own or other evidence that he honestly obtained such money or property.

DISORDERLY PERSONS.

5. (1) Every person shall be deemed a disorderly person and liable to imprisonment for one year who is found armed with any offensive or dangerous weapon, instrument, or thing, unless such person can prove to the satisfaction of the High Court that he was so armed for a lawful purpose.

(2) Every such weapon, instrument, or thing, shall by the conviction of the offender, become forfeited to His Majesty.

MISCELLANEOUS.

6. Notwithstanding the revocation of "The Samoa Immigration Consolidation Order, 1924," clause fourteen thereof shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect from the date of the said repeal until the coming into force of this Order, but no longer.

Open Season for the Taking or Killing of Opossums in the Auckland Acclimatization District.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that opossums may be taken or killed within the Auckland Acclimatization District, described in the Schedule hereto, except in any sanctuary other than a scenic reserve, from noon on the sixteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, to noon on the second day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, subject to the general regulations made by Order in Council dated the thirteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty.

And, with the like advice and consent, doth hereby further order and declare that licenses to take or kill opossums within the said district shall be issued to any person on payment of the sum of two pounds ten shillings each; and doth hereby appoint the Chief Postmaster at Auckland and the Postmaster at Paeroa to sign and issue such licenses to take or kill opossums.

SCHEDULE.

AUCKLAND ACCLIMATIZATION DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the North Auckland, Auckland, Taranaki, and Wellington Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Mokau River, and proceeding thence along high-water mark, Tasman Sea, in a northerly direction generally (crossing the mouths of all rivers and harbours by the way) to the Kaipara Harbour entrance to a point midway between Kaipara Heads; thence up the centre of the channels, Kaipara Harbour, leading to the mouth of the Oruawhero River; thence by the southern boundaries of the Hobson and Whangarei Acclimatization Districts as described in *New Zealand Gazette*, 1925, pages 750 and 754, to the Mangawhai Harbour; thence by the middle of that harbour to the sea; thence along high-water mark of the sea, Hauraki Gulf, Firth of Thames, and Pacific Ocean (crossing the mouths of all rivers and harbours by the way) to the mouth of the Waihi River, in Block III, Waihi North Survey District; thence south-westerly along a right line to Mount Te Aroha Trig. Station; thence north-easterly along a right line (in the direction of Ngakurivhare Trig. Station, Block I, Katikati North Survey District) to the western boundary of the Tauranga Confiscation Block; thence south-easterly by right lines from hill to hill along the summit of the range forming the western boundary of the aforesaid Tauranga Confiscation Block and passing over Ngatamahinerau, Mimiotohanga, and Waianuanu to Te Weraiti Trig. Station; thence south-easterly along a right line to Puwhenua Trig. Station, in Block VII, Tapapa East Survey District; thence south-westerly along a right line to Pureora Trig. Station; thence southerly along a mountain range passing through Weraroa, Tuhingamata, Motere, and Hauhangaroa Trig. Stations to Maungaku Trig. Station; thence southerly along the Western boundary of the Waione Block to the Wanganui River; thence down the middle of that river to its confluence with the Ohura River; thence up the middle of the Ohura River to the 39th parallel of south latitude; thence westerly along the said parallel of latitude to the western boundary of Block IV, Pouatu Survey District; thence due north along that boundary and the western boundary of Block XVI, Waro Survey District, to the confiscation-line; thence north-easterly along that line to the Tangarakau Stream; thence up the middle of that stream, and up the middle of the Waitaanga Stream to the Kotare Road, at the southern boundary of Section 2, Block VII, Waro Survey District; thence westerly along the Kotare Road to the south-west corner of Section 1, Block VII; thence along the south-west boundary of the said section and along the southern, western, and northern boundaries of Section 3, Block VI, Waro Survey District, to the western boundary of Section 4, Block VI, Waro Survey District; thence along the western boundaries generally of Sections 4 and 5, and along the south-western and northern boundaries of Section 6 (all in Block VI, Waro Survey District) to the Mohakatino Road; thence northerly along that road to a stream which crosses the Mohakatino-Paraninihi 1b East Block, and flows into the Mohakatino Stream near the westernmost corner of Section 1, Block III,

Waro Survey District; thence down that stream to the said confluence and up the said Mohakatino Stream and along the northern boundary of Section 3, Block III, Waro Survey District, to Tawhitiraupaka Trig. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which is particularly shown and delineated on plan M.D. 4710, so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said sawmill, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the terms—

"Foreshore" means such part of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark occupied by the said sawmill as shown on plan marked M.D. 4710.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £1, and thereafter an annual sum of £5 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the 19th day of March, 1931, until the 31st March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said sawmill without payment.

5. The licensee shall maintain the said sawmill in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit from the said sawmill and maintain at the licensee's own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said sawmill and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in the said sawmill requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for one year from the 19th day of March, 1931, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the said sawmill at the licensee's cost

without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

10. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said sawmill may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

11. In case the licensee shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein-before set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said sawmill for a period of thirty days;
- (3) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4) Fail to pay the sum specified in clause 3 of these conditions—

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

12. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said sawmill entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said sawmill to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensee.

Restricting the Importation into New Zealand of Poultry from any Country.—(C. No. 78.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section forty-six of the Customs Act, 1913, as amended by the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, and of every other power and authority enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Order in Council restricting the importation of poultry from all countries other than the Commonwealth of Australia, made under the said Act on the fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and published in the *Gazette* on the seventh day of the same month, at page 1364, and doth hereby prohibit, save with the consent of the Minister of Agriculture, the importation of any live poultry (including domestic fowls, ducks, geese, and turkeys) from any country, unless—

(a) Each consignment is accompanied by a certificate dated not more than one month before the exportation of the poultry to which it relates and signed—

(i) In the case of poultry intended for introduction from any State in the Commonwealth of Australia, by a responsible officer of the Government of the State of export certifying that he has examined the poultry to which such certificate relates and found them healthy and free from disease, that Pseudo-fowl Pest (or Newcastle Disease) has not existed in that State during a period of two years immediately preceding the date of the certificate, that the poultry are the product of that State, and that they have not been in contact with any poultry affected with Pseudo-fowl Pest (or Newcastle Disease) during the period of twelve months immediately preceding the date of such certificate; or

(ii) In the case of poultry intended for introduction from any country other than the Commonwealth of Australia, by a responsible officer of the Government of the country of export or other person approved by the Minister of Agriculture, certifying that he has examined the poultry to which such certificate relates and found them healthy and free from disease, that Fowl Pest (*Pestis gallinarum*) and Pseudo-Fowl Pest (or Newcastle Disease) have not existed in that country during a period of two years immediately preceding the date of the certificate, that the poultry are the product of that country, and that they have not been in contact with any poultry affected with Fowl Pest (*Pestis gallinarum*) or Pseudo-fowl Pest (or Newcastle Disease), during a period of twelve months immediately preceding the date of such certificate; and

(b) Every such certificate is produced at the port of landing to an Inspector under the Stock Act, 1908; and

(c) A permit for the poultry to be landed is issued by such Inspector upon being satisfied that the certificate is in order and that it relates to the consignment of poultry intended to be introduced, and that the poultry are healthy and free from disease.

This Order in Council shall come into force on and from the date of the publication of the same in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

"Wharf" has the same meaning as in the Harbours Act, 1923; and includes, for the purpose of these conditions, a road-metal hopper or ferry-slip.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the said wharves, at the sites shown on the plans marked M.D. 2378; 2161, 2489 and 5203; 1940, 5708 and 5758; 459, 460, 3327, 3632 and 4043; 425 and 4072; 5709 and 5774; 2374 and 2489; 4058; 3556 and 3738; 2918 and 4723; 6554; 2460, 4195, 5283, 6272 and 6757; 5901; 6923; 4298; 2991, 4486, 4497 and 6552; 3086; respectively.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the Council shall pay to the Minister, in respect of the sites of the said wharves, an annual rental of 1s., payable on demand, such rent to date from the date of this Order in Council.

4. All His Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharves, and rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said wharves, without payment.

6. The Council shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharves, and all erections on or in connection therewith, in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the Council's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharves, by the Council shall be applied to keeping such wharves, and all erections on or in connection therewith, in good order and repair.

8. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon any of the above-mentioned wharves, and any buildings erected thereon or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharves, or buildings, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Council shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharves, shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharves, any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharves, and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the 31st day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

12. The Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the said wharves.

13. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

14. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue to be in force for a period of fourteen years, computed from the 28th day of August, 1930, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

15. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the Council in New Zealand.

16. The Council shall be liable for any injury which may be caused by the said wharves to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.

17. In case the Council shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharves for a period of thirty consecutive days—

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the licenses, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

18. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Council shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf or wharves, entirely from the site or sites, and restore the site or sites to its or their original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the Council fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf or wharves to be removed and the site or sites so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Council.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS.

1. IN these regulations, if not inconsistent with the context,—
 - “Council” means the Otamatea County Council, its successors and assigns.
 - “Boat” means any open, decked, or half-decked boat, punt, or barge attached to or used in connection with any ship or other vessel lying in or belonging to or visiting the Kaipara Harbour, and also any such boat, punt, or barge used for the purposes of business or pleasure by residents of the district of Kaipara, in which the means of propulsion is either exclusively by oars or partly by oars and partly by sails:
 - “Master” means and includes the person actually in charge of any vessel, whether or not he is certificated:
 - “Vessel” means and includes every description of launch or ship whether used in navigation or in any way kept or used as a hulk or storeship, or for any other purpose whatsoever, whether business or pleasure, and not coming within the above definition of “boat”:
 - “Wharf” has the same meaning as in the Harbours Act, 1923; and includes for the purpose of these regulations a road-metal hopper or ferry-slip:
 - “Wharfinger” includes every person actually in charge of any wharf for the time being.
2. The master of any vessel loading or discharging at any wharf shall be deemed responsible for the proper slinging and landing of all goods, and responsible for all damage that may occur either from the breakage of slings or from the goods being improperly slung or improperly handled.
3. It shall be the duty of the master to cause proper tarpaulins to be stretched from the wharf to the vessel loading or discharging as aforesaid, and to be there maintained while cargo or ballast is being handled or shipped.
4. In case any vessel does or causes any damage to any wharf or any part thereof, or to any machinery or building thereon or appertaining thereto, then, and in any such case, the master of such vessel shall forthwith report the occurrence to the wharfinger by telegraph, or by at once reporting to the wharfinger in person, or should there be no wharfinger, then shall he report to the Council in like manner.
5. Any damage done or caused as aforesaid may be repaired by the Council, and the cost thereof shall be recoverable by the Council from the master and owner of any such vessel, or either of them, in any Court of competent jurisdiction.
6. All goods landed on any wharf, or brought thereon for shipment, shall be placed as the wharfinger or other authorized person directs, and so as to keep all mooring posts or rings free and all rails or tramways clear.
7. Before any vessel or boat is removed from any wharf, the master or other person in charge of the said vessel or boat shall cause all dirt or rubbish to be thoroughly cleared from the portion of the said wharf occupied by such vessel or boat, and to be deposited at such places as may be appointed by the wharfinger or other person in charge.
8. No boat shall be made fast to any steps or landing-place or so near thereto as to obstruct the approach of other vessels, nor shall any boat lie longer alongside than is required for landing passengers.
9. (a) No person shall take, drive, or work, or cause to be driven, taken, or worked, any cart, vehicle, or horse on any wharf on which carts, vehicles, or horses are permitted by the wharfinger or person in charge to be taken at other than a walking pace.

(b) If such cart or vehicle is drawn by one horse, the person in charge shall walk at the head of and lead the horse, and no person shall ride on any wharf, but shall dismount and lead his horse.

(c) Every person driving or taking any vehicle on any such wharf shall remain in attendance thereon, so as to have control of his horse or horses.

10. All watermen, stevedores, carters, and other persons employed on any wharf or any public landing-place shall be under the control of the wharfinger or other person in charge, and shall obey all orders given by such person in charge.

11. No person shall in any way obstruct or impede traffic on any wharf, nor make use of any provoking, abusive, obscene, or other improper language thereon.

12. (a) No person shall, otherwise than as specifically permitted by these regulations, obstruct or impede ingress to or egress from any wharf by any vessel, boat, or cable, or in any other way.

(b) If in breach of this clause any person obstruct or impede ingress or egress as aforesaid, and does not, upon being ordered so to do by the wharfinger or other person in charge, remove such obstruction, then, irrespective of the penalty to which such person is liable for such obstruction, the officer in charge may remove, cast off, or cut any such obstruction, and may recover the cost of so doing from such person.

13. The wharfinger shall have power, on authority of the Chairman of the Council, to close the wharves, or any of them or any portion thereof whenever in his opinion it is advisable so to do, and no person shall enter upon any wharf or portion of the wharf so closed without the consent of the wharfinger.

14. The master of every vessel lying at a wharf shall give way to any mail steamer, whether discharging cargo or passengers, and shall either vacate his berth or assist the master of the mail steamer to moor alongside his vessel, and allow the cargo and passengers to be shipped or unshipped over and across the deck of his vessel, as the case may require, under such conditions as the wharfinger may impose.

15. The master of every vessel, whether carrying passengers or not, when lying alongside any wharf shall fix, and at all times keep fixed, a safe and proper gangway from such vessel to the wharf. Such gangway shall have side rails and stanchions, with ropes rove taut through same, the top rail or rope being not less than 3 ft. high; and he shall also keep a gangway net properly secured beneath the gangway, and shall at all times throughout the night—that is to say, from sunset to sunrise—show and exhibit a proper light fixed at each gangway, and shall conform to and obey all orders the wharfinger may give regarding the position, size, and kind of such gangways and lights.

16. The master, owner, or agent of every vessel shall produce the certificate of registry of his vessel, and shall give to the wharfinger or other person in charge a copy of the bill of lading, freight list, or manifest of the cargo, or other proper accounts of the weights and measurements of all goods according as freight is payable, intended to be unshipped from the vessel on to a wharf, and also of all goods shipped from the wharf on to his vessel.

STORAGE.

2. Every person, firm, or company whose goods are stored in any shed upon any wharf shall pay before receipt of such goods, and when called on by the Council or wharfinger so to do, storage for such goods as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

For the first twelve hours, free.

After the first twelve hours the rates as set out in the foregoing schedule of storage charges shall be payable for every week or part of a week that goods remain in the sheds.

3. No person shall remove goods from any wharf without having previously paid the dues payable thereon.

4. In the absence of the consignee the wharfinger may take delivery of all goods landed on the wharf, and place such goods in the wharf-shed, and keep same until payment to the Council of the expenses of such removal, wharfage, and storage dues herein provided for, together with any other charges due to the Council thereupon, and in default of payment may, in the manner and in the time provided in section 195 of the Harbours Act, 1923, sell the same, and may exercise on behalf of the Council all the powers contained in the said section 195: Provided, however, that goods as mentioned in clauses 9 and 11 hereafter shall not be stored in any wharf-shed.

5. If any goods, which in the opinion of the wharfinger it is not expedient to put in the wharf-shed, are stored on the wharf, then the owner of such goods shall pay storage for same at the same rate as mentioned in clause No. 2.

6. If any cargo remains on any wharf for a longer period than forty-eight hours, or where such cargo in any way hinders the loading or unloading of any vessel, or is an impediment to the approaches, the wharfinger may have such cargo removed at the expense of the shipper, and in the case of inward cargo at the expense of the consignee or owner: Provided that if any timber remains on any wharf for a longer period than twelve hours the wharfinger or other person in charge may have such timber removed at the expense of the shipper, consignee, or owner, as the case may be.

7. No timber, coal, produce, or cargo of any description shall be shipped or unshipped except at such time and places, and in such order or mode as may be directed and deemed expedient by the wharfinger for the proper working of any boat.

8. No person shall deposit any ballast, coal, coke, patent or other fuel on any wharf or in any shed without special permission of the wharfinger.

9. No goods or articles of any description which, in the opinion of the wharfinger, are likely to occasion damage to any wharf or shed, or anything for the time being on such wharf or in any such shed, shall be discharged or landed on any such wharf or placed in any such shed.

10. No person shall place or leave upon any wharf or in any shed any vegetable or animal matter or goods which are in a state of decay or putrefaction. Any goods which are, in the opinion of the wharfinger unfit to remain on wharf, or harmful to other goods stored on the wharf, or in any shed, may be removed from the wharf or any shed by the wharfinger, and the consignee or owner shall, upon demand, repay to the Council the cost of such removal, and also in addition the amount of any damage done by such goods to any other goods on such wharf or in such shed.

11. All explosives, kerosene, and all goods of a dangerous or inflammable character shall be removed by the owner, agent, or consignee immediately on being landed, and such owner, agent, or consignee failing so to do will be held responsible for any damage or loss that may accrue from any accident arising therefrom, in addition to the penalty provided for breach of these regulations, and the Council shall not be responsible for any damage or loss which may accrue to such goods.

SHIP'S WHARF DUES.

12. The following dues, tolls, and charges shall be paid for the use of each and every wharf that now is or may hereafter come under the jurisdiction of the Otamatea County Council, viz. :—

PENALTIES.

If any person, firm, or company fails or refuses, or neglects to do anything by these regulations required to be done, observed, or performed, or in any manner obstructs, impedes, or interferes with the doing of anything enjoined, required, or authorized to be done, or does anything prohibited by these regulations, shall in each and every case so offending be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
