Revoking the Reservation over Portion of a Scenic Reserve in the North Auckland Land District.

#### BLEDISLOE, Governor-General [L.S. ] A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is a reserve duly set apart for scenic purposes : And whereas the said land is no longer suitable for scenic

purposes by reason of the absence of scenic features thereon: Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section eight of the Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1910, do hereby revoke the reservation for scenic purposes over the land described in the Schedule hereto.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section twelve of the Finance Act, 1931 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said section.

### ' REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as "The Coined Silver Regulations, 1931."

2. These regulations shall come into force on the date of publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

3. In these regulations

3. In these regulations—
"Minister" means the Minister of Finance :
"Value" in the case of a coin which is legal currency in New Zealand or which purports to be of the same denomination as that of a coin which is legal currency in New Zealand, means "face value."
4. No person shall import or attempt to import into New Zealand, or export or attempt to export from New Zealand, any coined silver otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.
5. It shall be lawful for any person arriving in New Zealand

5. It shall be lawful for any person arriving in New Zealand to bring with him into New Zealand on such arrival any amount of coined silver not exceeding in value £2 or such

larger sum as the Minister may permit.
6. It shall be lawful for any person leaving New Zealand to take with him on his departure from New Zealand an amount of coined silver not exceeding £5 or such larger sum as the

Minister may permit. 7. It shall be lawful for any person leaving New Zealand with the intention of proceeding to Great Britain or Ireland by direct route, without transhipment from the vessel in which he leaves New Zealand, to take with him an amount of coined silver not exceeding £10 or such larger sum as the Minister may  $\mathbf{permit}$ 

8. The Minister may grant permission for the exportation of worn or mutilated coined silver which is or has been legal tender and is intended to be returned to the Royal mint.

9. The Minister may grant permission for the importation of supplies of new coined silver struck at the Royal mint for the purpose of increasing or replenishing the currency of the Dominion.

10. Any permission given by the Minister under the fore-going provisions of these regulations shall be in writing under the hand of the Minister, and may relate to any particular transaction or to any class of transactions therein described, and may be given subject to such conditions or restrictions as the Minister in his discretion thinks fit.

11. The Minister may in any special case by writing under his hand authorize the exportation or importation of coined silver subject to such conditions or restrictions as the Minister

in his discretion thinks fit. 12. These regulations shall not apply to the importation or exportation of any coincd silver, whether legal tender or not, which is more than one hundred years old, or any coined silver, whether legal tender or not, which is of a kind not in circulation in New York and States and Sta in New Zealand.

13. Every person who imports or attempts to import into New Zealand or exports or attempts to export from New Zealand any coined silver contrary to the provisions of these regulations commits a breach of these regulations.

IS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of Samoa conferred upon him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS.

SHORT TITLE.

1. THIS Order may be cited as the Samoa Notaries Order, 1931.

## Appointment of Notaries Public.

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor-General by Letters Patent under his hand and the Seal of New Zealand, in the form set out in the First Schedule hereto, from time to time, for the due convenience and accommodation of the public, to appoint fit persons to be Notaries Public in the Territory of Western Samoa.

## RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF NOTARIES PUBLIC.

3. Any person so appointed shall enjoy the like rights and privileges and be liable to discharge the same duties as Notaries Public are by custom, law, and usage wont to enjoy and discharge in New Zealand.

## APPOINTMENT WITHIN SAMOA ONLY.

4. No such appointment shall authorize the holder thereof to practise as a Notary in any place outside the Territory of Western Samoa.

## APPLICATION FOR APPOINTMENT.

5. No such appointment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Administrator of Western Samoa, and upon the written application of the person seeking appointment supported by at least one Notary Public (whether practising in Western Samoa or elsewhere) within or outside the British Dominions, and upon satisfactory evidence of the character, integrity, ability, and competency of the applicant.

## OATH.

6. No such Letters Patent shall be delivered to the applicant until he has taken before the Administrator an oath of office in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto, or made before the Administrator an affirmation in lieu of oath to the like effect, and until the Administrator has endorsed the Letters Patent with a statement signed by him that such oath has been taken or affirmation made, and the name of the Notary entered on the Roll of Notaries accordingly.

## FEES.

7. No such Letters Patent shall be issued until the applicant has paid to the Samoan Treasury a fee of  $\pounds 15$  15s.

## Roll.

8. The Administrator shall cause a Roll of Notaries to be kept and entry to be made therein of the name of every person to whom Letters Patent have been granted under this Order, the date of such Letters, the date of the delivery thereof, and the date of the death of every such person or other cause of his ceasing to be a Notary.

## EVIDENCE OF APPOINTMENT.

9. A certificate under the hand of the Administrator shall be conclusive evidence of the fact that any person is or is not a Notary, or of an entry in the said roll or of the absence of an entry therein, as the case may require.

## MISCONDUCT.

10. On the application of the Attorney-General the High Court may direct that the name of a Notary be struck off the Roll of Notaries for misconduct as a Notary or in any other professional capacity, or for fraud in his application, or for other good cause shown, and every person so struck off shall thenceforth for ever be wholly disabled from practising as a Notary or performing or certifying any notarial act.

## OFFENCE.

11. Any person who in his own name or in the name of any other person makes, does, acts, exercises, or executes or performs any act, matter, or thing, of or in any wise appertaining or belonging to the office, function, or practice of a Notary Public for or in expectation of any gain, fee, or reward without being able to prove, if required, that he is duly authorized to do so is liable to a fine of  $\pounds 50$ .

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said structure, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service, in the execution of their duty, shall

the Government service, in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of, the said structure without payment. 6. The licensees shall maintain the said structure in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the licensees' own cost, suitable and neces-sary lights for the guidance of vessels : Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said structure, and view the reasonable times, enter upon the said structure, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such structure, requiring the licensees, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensees shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed, or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or incon-sistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under 9. The rights, powers, and privileges conterred by or inder this Order in Council shall continue in force for the term of fourteen years, computed from the 1st day of August, 1931, unless, in the meantime, such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained. 10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.
