Amending Regulations for Trout-fishing in the Nelson Acclimatization District.

HEREAS by Order in Council of the fourteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and published in the Gazette of the seventeenth day of the same month, at page 1434, regulations for trout-fishing in the Nelson Acclimatization District described in such Order in

And whereas by Order in Council dated the sixteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and published in the Gazette of the nineteenth day of the same month, at page 385, the hereinbefore-recited regulations of the fourteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, were amended:

And whereas it is desirable that such regulations be further amended:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made by the hereinbefore-recited Order in Council of the sixteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and doth make the following regulations in lieu thereof.

7. No person shall fish for, take, or kill any trout otherwise than with one rod and line, but a landing-net or gaff may be used to secure any trout caught with such rod and line: and no lures or baits other than natural or artificial flies, insects, worms, or fish shall be used with such rod and line.

7a. No person in or on any power-boat, or in or on any other boat or vessel towed by a power-boat, shall troll for trout in the waters of Lake Rotoroa between the entrances to the D'Urville and Sabine Rivers, and a straight line drawn from a point one half-mile west of the mouth of the D'Urville River to a point one mile east of the mouth of the Sabine from a point one half-mile west of the mouth of the D'Urville River to a point one mile east of the mouth of the Sabine River; or within those waters between the entrance to the Gowan River and a straight line drawn from a point on the shore of the lake approximately one mile and a half distant from the entrance to the Gowan River to a point on the opposite shore approximately two miles distant from the entrance to the said Gowan River, as the said points are indicated by white posts near the shore of the lake.

18. No person shall take or catch more than twenty trout in any one day: Provided that no person shall take or catch more than ten trout in any one day from the waters of the Matai River; and provided still further, no person shall take or catch more than six trout in any one day from the waters of Lake Rotoroa, the D'Urville, Sabine, and Gowan Rivers.

(2) Every person, being the occupier of a supplying dairy, shall cause all cans used for the conveyance of milk or cream to any manufacturing dairy to be properly washed and scalded with boiling water or steamed immediately after being returned to the supplying dairy, excepting any such cans which have been so treated at the manufacturing dairy and returned empty to the supplying dairy.

(3) Every person, being the owner or occupier of a supplying dairy at which seven or more cows are milked, the milk or cream from which is intended for delivery to a manufacturing dairy, shall provide or cause to be provided an adequate water supply and plant adjacent to the dairy to enable the foregoing requirements of this clause to be complied with.

Clause 16 of the principal regulations, as amended by Amendment No. 1 and Amendment No. 2, is hereby further amended by deleting all the words following the words "strained through some apparatus sufficient for the purpose" in subclause (1) thereof, and substituting therefor the following words: "and then so cooled by being run over a water cooler or by setting the containers in cold water that its temperature on delivery at the manufacturing dairy does not exceed 70 degrees Fahrenheit."

(6) Nothing in this Order in Council shall be deemed to affect any provisions in an award or industrial agreement relating to preference of employment.
