A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Scenery Preservation Board, constituted pursuant to the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), has recommended that the land described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be a scenic reserve under the said Act, and subject to the provisions thereof.

SCHEDULE.

WELLINGTON LAND DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, containing by admeasurement 151 acres 0 roods 5 perches, more or less, being Section 86, Block VI, Hunua Survey District, and known generally as Whakapapa Island: Bounded towards the north generally by the Wanganui River; towards the east and south-east generally by the right branch of the Whakapapa River; and towards the west and north-west generally by the left branch of the Whakapapa River to its eastern confluence with the Wanganui River: excepting from the within-described boundaries portion of the Tongariro Timber Company's tramway. Amending Regulations under the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1928, governing the Removal of certain Plants and Bees from the North Island to the Rest of New Zealand.—(Notice No. Ag. 2987.)

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 3rd day of August, 1931.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby further amend, to the extent and in the manner hereinafter provided, the regulations under the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1908, enuring under the said Act, governing the removal of certain plants and bees from the North Island into any other portion of New Zealand, made on the sixth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and published in the *Gazette* on the ninth day of the same month at page 1987 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"), and doth hereby declare that the amendments hereby made shall come into force on the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. CLAUSE 1 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting therein the following definitions:—

"Fireblight Area" means the North Island and that portion of the South Island comprising the County of Kaikoura and the Christchurch Commercial Fruitgrowing District, declared as such pursuant to the provisions in that behalf of the Fireblight Act, 1922.

"Prohibited Area" means all that portion of the South Island comprising the Counties of Waimea, Marlborough, Kowai, Ashley, Oxford, Eyre, Rangiora, Taieri, Tuapeka, and Vincent, and all boroughs and town districts enclosed by the said counties.

2. The principal regulations are hereby consequentially amended as follows:—

(a) By deleting the words "North Island" wherever those words occur in the following clauses of the principal regulations (that is to say, in clause 2, in subclauses (1) and (3) of clause 3 and in subclauses (1), (2), (4), and (5) of clause 4 thereof), and substituting therefor the words "fireblight area."

(b) By deleting the words "any other portion of New Zealand" wherever those words occur in the following clauses of the principal regulations (that is to say in clause 2, in subclauses (1) and (3) of clause 3, and in subclauses (1) and (4) of clause 4 thereof), and substituting therefor the words "the prohibited area."

(c) By deleting the words "North Island" wherever those words occur in the Second and Third Schedules to the principal regulations and substituting therefor the words "Fireblight Area to the Prohibited Area."

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting the following as clause 5 thereof:—

5. (1) Subject to the provisions of clause 2 hereof no person shall send or bring any package containing any plant or any portion thereof of any variety of apple, pear, quince, cotoneaster, medlar, or crataegus (hawthorns) from the fireblight area to any other portion of the South Island unless such package is accompanied by a certificate in the form set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture, and certifying that he has examined all such plants contained in the package and found them to be, to the best of his knowledge, clean and free from disease.

(2) The certificate shall be endorsed on a tag or label securely attached to the package in a prominent position.

(3) No person shall carry or despatch or deliver for purposes of despatch to any officer of the Post Office or the Railway Department or any other person any package containing any of the plants referred to in this regulation or any portion of such plants intended to be sent from the fireblight area to any other portion of the South Island, and not having attached thereto as herein provided the certificate required by this regulation.

4. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting after the Third Schedule thereto the following additional Schedule:—

FOURTH SCHEDULE.

OFFICIAL CERTIFICATE TO ACCOMPANY PACKAGES CONTAINING APPLE, PEAR, QUINCE, COTONEASTER, MEDLAR, OR CRATAEGUS (HAWTHORNS) TREES OR PLANTS FROM THE FIREBLIGHT AREA TO ANY PORTION OF THE SOUTH ISLAND EXCLUSIVE OF THE PROHIBITED AREA.

Electrical energy shall be received in bulk from the Public Works Department's Addington substation at a pressure of approximately 11,000 volts between phases.

2. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating stresses as provided in clause 108 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

3. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

The licensee shall maintain the works used under this license in proper working-order during the continuance of such license.

4. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force until the 3rd July, 1964. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine, but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

5. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes; and provided further that if accounts are paid within fourteen days of due date the charges shall not exceed 10d. per unit for lighting purposes and 5d. per unit for motor-power, cooking, and heating purposes.

In the case of wholesale supply the charge shall not exceed £12 per kilovolt-ampere of maximum demand per year. "Wholesale supply" for this purpose shall be held to be a supply in respect of which the consumer shall guarantee to pay not less than £120 per annum.

6. VARIATIONS IN CONDITION OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may be at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

7. BARE WIRES.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, no bare wires shall be erected unless in accordance with clause 151 (3) of the regulations.

8. LOCATION OF OVERHEAD LINES.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, one side of every road or street shall be left free by the licensee for telegraph-lines. Lines shall not be erected on both sides of a road or street unless the permission of the Minister of Telegraphs or the Post and Telegraph Department is first obtained in accordance with clause 9 of the regulations.

9. CONVERSION OF LINES FROM EARTH-WORKING TO METALLIC.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the licensee shall bear the cost of converting the Post and Telegraph Department's lines which are now erected from earth-working to metallic if required by the Minister of Telegraphs.

And whereas the said Frederick Waller, being deceased, his widow, Ida Waller, and Edward Glenlivet Elliott, both of Auckland (hereinafter called "the licensees," in which term is to be construed, unless the context requires a different construction, their executors, administrators, and assigns), have applied for a fresh license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a further term of fourteen years, and it is advisable to grant the same:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto, which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of using the said wharf in connection therewith, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the maintenance of the said wharf, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 4761, so deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensees shall pay to the Minister the sum of £1, and thereafter an annual sum of £1, in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the 14th day of May, 1931, until the 31st day of March following to be paid on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of, the said wharf without payment.

6. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at the licensees' own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof, and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the licensees, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensees shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the 14th day of May, 1931, unless, in the meantime, such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

12. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensees' part.

13. In case the licensees shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions;

then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, and privilege thereby conferred may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council, without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees and to all other persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensees shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be, and if the licensees fail so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensees.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at the company's own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the company within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the company shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark or at such places as may be approved by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

10. - then, and in any of the said cases, this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council, without any notice to the company or any other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

13. The company shall be liable for any injury which may be caused at the said wharf to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the company.

In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the company shall, if required so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the company fails so to do the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the company.

If any member is convicted, whether in New Zealand or elsewhere, of any offence punishable by imprisonment which, in the opinion of the Council, is derogatory to the profession or calculated to dishonour him in the public estimation, or if any member is, in the opinion of the Council, a person of bad character or guilty of malpractice or improper or unprofessional conduct in his profession as a surveyor, the Council may, after inquiry, expel him from the Institute or declare that he be not entitled to the privileges of membership for such period as the Council thinks fit, or fine him a sum not exceeding £2.

12. Before expelling or suspending from the privileges of membership or fining any member under the last preceding by-law, the Council shall give to such member not less than two calendar months' notice of the place, hour, and date of such inquiry, specifying the ground of complaint. The time and place for inquiry may at any time, on notice to the member, be postponed or altered, and such inquiry may from time to time be adjourned. At such inquiry the member shall be entitled to be heard, with such witnesses as he may produce, and may be represented by counsel, and counsel may be present to advise the Council in the conduct of the inquiry.

13. If the member is resident in New Zealand the Council shall apply to the local branch of the district in which such member resides for its opinion on the matter, but shall not be bound by any recommendation of the local branch. If in the opinion of the Council a reasonable time has been afforded to the local branch to furnish its opinion, the Council may proceed with the inquiry notwithstanding that such opinion has not been furnished.

14. No member shall be expelled or suspended from the privileges of membership or fined under By-law No. 11 hereof unless five members of the Council present at the inquiry shall certify in writing that, in their opinion, sufficient grounds have been proved to justify the Council in expelling such member or suspending him from the privileges of membership, or fining him.
