Regulations under the Government Railways Acts.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Government Railways Act, 1926, and its amendments, the Government Railways Board hereby resolves to amend, as from and including the 1st day of July, 1931, the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1908, on the 12th day of June, 1922, and published in the *Gazette* of the 15th day of June, 1922 (as from time to time amended, and as the same are enuring under the Government Railways Act, 1926), by omitting Regulation 64 and substituting the following regulation in lieu thereof:—

64. (a) Employees in Division I, when absent from their headquarters on other than relief duty, shall, subject to paragraph (c) of this regulation, be paid travelling-allowance for personal expenses at the following rates in each case:—

- (i) An employee whose salary does not exceed £139 10s. per annum: Actual reasonable expenses.
- (ii) An employee whose salary exceeds £139 10s. but does not exceed £342 per annum, if absent for not more than six days, shall be entitled to 13s. 6d. per day. If the absence exceeds six days but the employee is not more than six days in any one locality he shall be entitled to the allowance of 13s. 6d. per day throughout the whole of the period of absence. If, however, while so absent, the employee remains in any one locality for more than six days he shall only be entitled to 12s. per day while in such locality, provided that the total allowance payable in respect of the employee's stay in such locality shall not be less than £4 1s.

(b) An employee in Division I, while absent from his headquarters on relief duty, shall, subject to paragraph (c) of this regulation, be paid relieving-allowance for personal expenses at the following rates in each case:—

- (i) An employee whose salary does not exceed £139 10s. per annum: Actual reasonable expenses.
- (ii) An employee whose salary exceeds £139 10s. but does not exceed £265 10s., if absent for not more than six days shall be entitled to 11s. 3d. per day. If the absence exceeds six days but the employee is not more than six days in any one locality he shall be entitled to the allowance of 11s. 3d. throughout the whole of the period of absence. If, however, while so absent, the employee remains in any one locality for more than six days he shall only be entitled to 9s. per day while in such locality, provided that the total allowance payable in respect of the employee's stay in such locality shall not be less than £3 7s. 6d.
- (iii) An employee whose salary exceeds £265 10s. per annum but does not exceed £423 per annum shall be entitled to 11s. 3d. per day.
- (iv) Employees whose salaries exceed £423 per annum: At the rate prescribed for travelling-allowance in each case.

(c) If any employee in Division I, while travelling on relief or other duty, is provided with a berth in a sleeping-car, or sleeping-accommodation on sea journeys which do not occupy more than twenty-four hours, the claim for travelling or relieving allowance, as the case may be, shall be reduced by an amount equal to one-quarter of the prescribed daily rate for each occasion on which a berth or other sleeping-accommodation as aforesaid is provided.

(d) "Day," for the purposes of this regulation means a period of twenty-four hours, and no distinction between Sunday and any other day is recognized in such period. The period for which travelling or relieving allowance shall be payable shall in each case be calculated from the time of departure of the employee concerned from his headquarters in pursuance of the duty on which he is required to travel until his return thereto. For any portion of a day the rate

shall be one twenty-fourth of the prescribed daily rate for each hour's absence from headquarters. In computing the period of such absence a fraction of an hour, if less than half an hour, shall not be taken into account, but half an hour or more shall be reckoned as one hour.

(e) No employee who is entitled to be paid lodging-allowance shall be entitled to claim such allowance concurrently with travelling or relieving allowance for any continuous period exceeding one week. When any such employee becomes entitled to payment of travelling or relieving allowance for any continuous period exceeding one week the amount paid or payable to him as lodging-allowance for such period shall be deducted from the amount payable to him by way of travelling or relieving allowance for the same period.

(f) No employee who is entitled to be paid relieving-allowance shall also be paid travelling-allowance in respect of the same absence from headquarters: Provided, however, that when an employee performs relieving duty, and in the course thereof is absent from his headquarters for not more than three days at the same place, he may be paid travelling-allowance instead of relieving-allowance in respect of the time during which he is relieving at such place: Provided, further, that if an employee is occupied for not less than six hours in travelling to or from his headquarters on relieving duty, he may be paid travelling-allowance instead of relieving-allowance in respect of each day on which he is so occupied.

(g) The rates of salary mentioned in this regulation refer to the rates payable after the reduction prescribed by the Finance Act, 1931, has been made therein. The allowances prescribed in this regulation shall be deemed to be the appropriate allowances as reduced by the said Act.

NOTE.—A mild winter month, with moderate to strong north-west winds prevailing. Total bright sunshine, 121 hours, 41 per cent. of the possible, and six sunless days. Precipitation was 14 per cent. above the mean of previous years. Frost was recorded on the grass on four mornings, lightning was seen on the 18th and 19th, and fog was in evidence on the 3rd, 8th, and 11th. There was a thunderstorm with hail in the early morning of the 31st. Mean dew-point at 9 hrs., 41.2°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.258 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JULY, 1931.

General.—July will be remembered for several severe storms, which were responsible for boisterous and prolonged westerly or south-westerly gales and for heavy and widespread snowfalls. Heavier snow has been experienced in the North Island, but in the South it is many years since similar conditions have been reported. New Zealand is liable to occasional series of cold years, and it is generally in them that the most noteworthy snowfalls occur. Temperatures were below normal from 1877 to 1879, from 1901 to 1906, and have been so, also, since the middle of 1929. 1877 and 1878 were years of record snowfall in some districts, and it is to these years that local residents on the West Coast of the South Island and in Southland, respectively, have to look back for falls comparable with that of the 19th to 20th July of this year. The years 1902 to 1904 were also ones of very heavy snow, especially in the interior of Canterbury and Otago, and the falls of last month were about equal to the heaviest in those years.

Severe frosts followed the snows in the South Island, but in the North Island conditions were, on the average, rather milder than usual.

Rainfall continues to be deficient in South Canterbury and Northern Otago, but in most other parts July was a very wet month. This was particularly the case in places which receive their rain mainly from the west. There, the persistent and almost daily rains kept the rivers high during the greater part of the time. Though the floods were nowhere severe, the Manawatu River eroded portion of its banks in the Foxton district. Several houses were undermined and much of the low-lying country is under water.

Stock and pastures are generally in fair order, especially in the North Island, some growth of grass having taken place in most localities. The saturation of the soil by continuous rains in Taranaki, and the snow and frosts in parts of the South Island, caused a slight deterioration in conditions, especially of cattle. There has been much hand feeding.

Rainfall.—Isolated places in North Auckland and in South Westland experienced less than the average rain for July, as did also the central eastern portion of the South Island—from Christchurch to Oamaru. Elsewhere, the normal was exceeded, and in most cases by large amounts.

Temperatures.—Though temperatures were still generally below normal in the South Island, the departures were not so large as they have been in numbers of recent months. In the far North the month was a fairly warm one, and though the normal was approached in the southern part, most of the North Island recorded temperatures slightly above it. This was due principally to the absence of low minimum temperatures. The South Island, on the other hand, while having some warm and sunny days, experienced frequent and severe frosts. A minimum temperature of 11.9° on the grass was observed at Christchurch on the morning of the 20th, which constitutes a record. In parts of Otago, also, the frost was unprecedented. Much trouble was experienced from frozen water-pipes.

Pressure Systems.—The month opened with a spell of comparatively fine weather during which pressure was high to the north, while several westerly depressions of slight intensity passed in the south. On the 8th, however, a cyclone which had been developing during the preceding two days on the coast of New South Wales, moved from the west towards the centre of the North Island. The centre passed during the night, but secondary centres developed behind it, the last not crossing the North Island until the 10th. During these three days rain was fairly general. The North Island, and especially the Central Provinces, experienced very heavy falls. Many rivers in Nelson, Marlborough, and Wellington reached flood levels, but the rain was not sufficiently intense at any time to cause serious damage. There was heavy snow on the high levels in the South Island, train traffic being interfered with at Arthur's Pass.

A second but shallower cyclone which crossed the South Island on the 14th brought rain again to much the same districts. This was followed by a rather vigorous depression of the westerly type on the 16th. After the main depression had passed, a severe spell of weather set in. Though barometers were high far to the west, they continued to fluctuate about very low values in southern New Zealand. The wind chopped and changed between west and south-west. Snow fell on all the high levels and, in the South Island, was almost general. Many places had the heaviest fall on the 19th to 20th for the past thirty to fifty years. Severe hailstorms also were experienced. The hail and snowstorms were preceded on the night of the 18th by a very violent and unusually widespread westerly gale. It was not until the 21st that conditions began to improve, and even on that day some of the central districts of the North Island had snow.

Between the 23rd and the 25th a cyclone, which became very deep, crossed North Auckland in the neighbourhood of Russell, and moved in an east-south-east direction. Its passage was accompanied by rain which, however, failed to reach the southern and western portions of the South Island. In the North there were some heavy falls. North-easterly gales blew from Auckland northwards as the cyclone approached, while in its rear there were southerly gales.

From the 27th to the end of the month occurred a similar spell of weather to that between the 16th and 21st. Following a series of westerly depressions, pressure again became high to the west and north-west while fluctuating about very low levels to the south and south-east. South-westerly gales blew continuously in the eastern portion of the Tasman Sea for several days from the 30th onwards, rising to unusual violence. Districts with a westerly aspect experienced persistent rain. Snow again fell on the high levels for several days consecutively, but the low levels were little affected.
