PURSUANT to section fifty-five of the Finance Act, 1931 (No. 4), His Excellency the Governor-General, being of opinion that compliance with the provisions of subsection four of section fifty of the Friendly Societies Act, 1909, by the Auckland District of the New Zealand Branch of the Manchester Unity Independent Order of Oddfellows Friendly Society, being a registered branch within the meaning of the last-named Act (hereinafter called "the said branch"), in respect of the period of two years ending on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, would impose undue hardship on the said branch, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant to the said branch exemption to the extent hereinafter set out from the obligations of the said subsection four in respect of the period aforesaid—that is to say, that in lieu of the interest at the rate of not less than four per centum per annum payable by the said branch into any benefit fund of the said branch in terms of the said subsection four, it shall be sufficient compliance with the obligations of the said subsection four relating to moneys forming part of any benefit fund of the said branch invested in the purchase of the land referred to in the Schedule hereto, and/or the erection of offices or buildings on the said land, if there be paid by the said branch into any such benefit fund as aforesaid by way of interest for the period of two years aforesaid a sum equal to the net amount received by the said branch by way of rents and premiums paid (whether before, during, or after the period of two years aforesaid) for any lease, letting, or other tenancy or license of, or relating to, any part of the said premises during the period of two years aforesaid, and by way of any other revenue obtained from the said premises during the period of two years aforesaid.

ON the recommendation of the Native Land Purchase Board, referred to in section three hundred and sixty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909, and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon him by that section, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby extend for a further period of six months the Order in Council dated the twelfth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and gazetted the eighteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, prohibiting all alienation of the Native land specified in the Schedule hereto, other than alienation in favour of the Crown.

Order in Council consenting to the Raising of a Loan of £1,175 by the Pukekohe Borough Council.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Pukekohe Borough Council (hereinafter called "the said local authority") proposes to raise, pursuant to the terms of a Warrant issued under section one hundred and thirty-five of the Public Works Act, 1928, the sum of one thousand one hundred and seventy-five pounds by a loan to be known as "Tuakau Bridge Loan, 1931," for the purpose of meeting its share of the cost of constructing a bridge (together with approaches thereto) over the Waikato River, at Tuakau, on the Pukekohe - Glen Murray via Tuakau Main Highway :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities

conferred on him by the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the said local authority of the said loan up to the amount of one thousand one hundred and seventy-five pounds for a term not exceeding thirty-six and a half years, at such rate or rates of interest as shall not produce to the lenders a rate exceeding the rate of five pounds per centum per annum, subject to the condition that the said local authority shall, before borrowing the said sum or any part thereof, make provision for the repayment thereof by establishing a sinking fund under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and shall thereafter make to such sinking fund payments at intervals of not more than one year at a rate or rates which shall be not less than the rate of one pound per centum, such payments to be made in respect of every part of the said sum for the time being so borrowed and not repaid, and the first payment to be made not later than one year after the first day from which interest to the lender is computed on any moneys so borrowed, and subject to the further condition that no portion of interest or sinking fund shall be paid out of loan-moneys.

WHEREAS the Paradales Town Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority") is desirous of raising the sum of two thousand five hundred pounds pursuant to the provisions of section fifty-one of the Hawke's Bay Earthquake Act, 1931, by a loan to be known as "Earthquake Rehabilitation Loan, 1931, No. 1," for the purpose of rebuilding the Town Hall :

And whereas the said local authority has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council under the said Act should be given to the raising of the said loan, on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising by the said local authority of the said loan up to the amount of two thousand five hundred pounds, subject to the following conditions upon which the said loan may be so raised :—

- (1) The term of the loan shall not exceed thirty years.
- (2) The loan shall be free of interest for a period of five years from the date of the advance of the loan-moneys.
- (3) The rate of interest thereafter payable shall be at such rate or rates as shall not produce to the lender a rate exceeding the rate of four pounds per centum per annum.
- (4) The loan shall not be borrowed otherwise than on terms that the loan and the interest thereon shall be repaid by half-yearly instalments over a term of years (not exceeding twenty-five) calculated from the date on which interest first commences to accrue on any portion of the loan-moneys.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Act, 1928, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the following resolution passed by the Waimea County Council on the fifth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, the portions of roads affected by such resolution being more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, viz. :—

"That the Waimea County Council, being the local authority having control of the roads within the Waimea County, by resolution declares that the provisions of section one hundred and twenty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1928, shall not apply to the following roads—

3. (a) For a distance of 2545 links to the eastern side of the road along the south-western boundary of Section 200, Block II, Waimea Survey District, marked "A-B" on plan prepared by C. M. Hoult, Registered Surveyor, and coloured red thereon ;
(b) For a distance of 1545.5 links to the north-western side of the road along the south-eastern boundary of Section 200, Block II, Waimea Survey District, marked "C-D" on plan prepared by C. M. Hoult, Registered Surveyor, and coloured red thereon ;

subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land fronting the portions of roads (described in the Schedule hereto) within a distance of thirty-three feet from the centre-lines of the said portions of roads.

Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the above-mentioned wharf, and any buildings erected thereon or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Council shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said wharf shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf, any buildings or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the thirty-first day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account, when balanced, to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

11. The Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the said wharf.

12. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

13. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue to be in force until the 9th day of January, 1941, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

14. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the Council in New Zealand.

B

15. The Council shall be liable for any injury which may be caused by the said wharf to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.

16. In case the Council shall—

(1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or

(2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days;

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council, and the licenses, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

17. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Council shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the Council fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Council.

Classification of Assistant Teachers in Technical Schools and of Manual-training Teachers.

Attention is drawn to the regulations relating to appeals of teachers against their classification and grading, under which any teacher who considers he has good grounds for objection to his classification may lodge an appeal to reach the Director of Education not later than forty clear days after the publication of this list in the *New Zealand Gazette*—i.e., such appeals must reach the Director not later than the 19th January, 1932, and must contain an explicit statement of the grounds on which the appeal is based.

NOTE.—In the last column of the classification list T.S. stands for "Technical School," E.B. for "Education Board," S. of A. for "School of Art," J.H.S. for "Junior High School," and C.S. for "Combined School."

Such special rate to be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the first day of August in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of five (5) years, or until the loan is fully paid off.
