That such suspension of the existing tariff shall not apply to any unmanufactured tobacco entered to be manufactured as aforesaid into cigars which pursuant to any Order in Council made under section 25 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1930, are liable to excise duty at a higher rate than that set out in section 24 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act,
- 2. That such suspension of the existing tariff shall not apply to any unmanufactured tobacco unless the Collecter of Customs is satisfied that such tobacco is to be used in New Zealand and for no other purpose than in the manufacture of cigars, and is not to be used to be manufactured into cigars liable to excise duty at the higher rate referred to in the last preceding proviso hereof

3. That nothing in this Order shall be deemed to affect the provisions of section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1930, or the liability for payment of any duty imposed thereby or prescribed thereunder.
