Duty on Leaf Tobacco used in the Manufacture of Cigars. (C. No. 88.)

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 22nd day of December, 1931.

THE RIGHT HON. G. W. FORBES, PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section twelve of the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby suspend the existing tariff (being the First Schedule to the Customs Amendment Act, 1927, as amended by the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1930, and the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1931) in so far as it relates to tobacco, unmanufactured, entered to be manufactured in New

Zealand in any licensed tobacco factory, for manufacturing purposes only, into cigars: And in lieu thereof doth impose on such unmanufactured tobacco a Customs duty of two shillings per pound provided as follows:—

1. That such suspension of the existing tariff shall not apply to any unmanufactured tobacco entered to be manufactured as aforesaid into cigars which pursuant to any Order in Council made under section 25 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1930, are liable to excise duty at a higher rate than that set out in section 24 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1931.
2. That such suspension of the existing tariff shall not apply to any unmanufactured tobacco unless the Collector of Customs is satisfied that such tobacco is to be used in New Zealand and for no other purpose than in the manufacture of cigars, and is not to be used to be manufactured into cigars liable to excise duty at the higher rate referred to in the last preceding proviso hereof.
3. That nothing in this Order shall be deemed to affect the provisions of section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1930, or the liability for payment of any duty imposed thereby or prescribed thereunder.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and sixty-two of the Land Act, 1924, it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Order in Council on the recommendation of the Land Board, declare that any land comprised in

a kauri-gum reserve shall, from a date to be specified in the Order, cease to be subject to the Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1908, and on and after the date so specified, the land to which the Order relates shall become subject to the provisions of the Land Act, 1924:

And whereas the Land Board of the North Auckland Land District has duly passed a resolution recommending that portion of the Mangakahia Kauri-gum Reserve and portion of the Purua Kauri-gum Reserve, as described in the Schedule hereto, be excepted from the operations of the Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1908, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Hawke's Bay Earthquake Act, 1931, and of all other powers (if any) it enabling, the Taradale Town Board hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing moneys required to repay a special loan of £2,500 (known as "Earthquake Rehabilitation Loan, 1931, No. 1"), and to pay the interest thereon at the rate of four pounds (£4) per centum per annum, which loan is authorized to be raised by the Taradale Town Board under the above-mentioned Acts for the purpose of repairing damage caused by earthquake on the 3rd day of February, 1931, to and the consequent rebuilding of the Taradale Town Hall, the said Board hereby makes and levies a special rate of five-sixteenths (5/16) of a penny in the pound upon the rateable value of all rateable property within the Taradale Town District, on the basis of the unimproved value, and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, calculated from the date on which interest first commences to accrue on any portion of the said loan-moneys, and be payable yearly on the first day of August in each and every year during the currency of such loan, calculated from the date aforesaid, being a period of twenty-five (25) years from such date, or until the said loan is fully paid off.
