IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that as on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, the boundaries of the Town District of Johnsonville shall be altered by including therein the area described in the First Schedule hereto, such area being now portion of the County of Makara; and that the boundaries of the said town district with such alteration as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

Altering and redefining the Boundaries of the Manawatu and the Rangitoto Rabbit Districts.—(Notice No. Ag. 3012.)

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 14th day of January, 1932.

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. G. W. FORBES, PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section thirty-three of the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, it is enacted that the boundaries of two or more contiguous rabbit districts may from time to time be altered by the Governor-General in Council in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Board of each of the districts affected:

And whereas the districts known as the "Manawatu Rabbit District" and the "Rangitoto Rabbit District" have been constituted, and enure for the purposes of Part II of the said Act:

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Board of the Manawatu Rabbit District on the twenty-fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and a similar resolution was passed by the Board of the Rangitoto Rabbit District on the sixteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, praying in each case for the alteration of the boundaries of the said districts in the manner described in the said resolutions and set forth in the First Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter and redefine the boundaries of the said districts in accordance with the said resolutions and in the manner hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby alter and redefine the boundaries of the said districts so constituted as aforesaid, and doth hereby declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Manawatu Rabbit District, shall be added to and form part of the Rangitoto Rabbit District; that the boundaries of the Manawatu Rabbit District shall be those set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and that the boundaries of the Rangitoto Rabbit District shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule hereto; and doth further declare that this Order in Council shall take effect from the date of the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA EXCLUDED FROM THE MANAWATU RABBIT DISTRICT AND INCLUDED IN THE RANGITOTO RABBIT DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, situated in Block V, Te Kawau Survey District, being that part of the land in D.P. 6450, known as "The Island": Bounded towards the west, north, and east by the old channel of the Rangitikei River; and towards the south by the new channel of the said river.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

BOUNDARIES OF THE MANAWATU RABBIT DISTRICT.

COMMENCING at a point in the Rangitikei River, being the middle-line of the main channel of that river opposite where the Ohakea Terrace Road junctions with the Bulls-Sandon Road at the southern end of the Bulls Bridge; thence in a south-westerly direction to and along the said Ohakea Terrace Road to its junction with McDonnell's Road; thence in the same direction along McDonnell's Road to Gust's Road and the north-east boundary of Section 354, Block XV, Rangitoto Survey District; thence along the eastern boundaries of Sections 354, 355, 356, and 360, Block XV, Rangitoto Survey District, to Taylor's Road; thence eastward along Taylor's Road to Frecklington's Road; thence south-westerly along Frecklington's Road to the north-west boundary of Section 9s, Makowhai Soldier Settlement, Block II, Te Kawau Survey District; thence eastward along the northern boundaries of the said Section 9s and Section 10s and Section 11s to the north-west boundary of Section 12s; thence in a southerly direction to the north-west boundary of Section 17s; thence eastward along the northern boundaries of Sections 17s, 18s, and 19s to Section 35, Block III, Te Kawau Survey District; thence along the western and northern boundaries of Section 35 to the Foxton-Sandon Road; thence in a southerly direction along the said road to the Rongotea Road; thence in a south-easterly direction to north-east corner of Section 38, Block III, Te Kawau Survey District; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of the said Section 38 and in an easterly direction along the southern boundary of Section 42 to Tompkin's Road; thence in a southerly direction along Tompkin's Road to the northern boundary of Section 112, Block VII, Te Kawau Survey District; thence in an easterly and southerly direction along the northern and eastern boundaries of said Section 112 to the north-west corner of Section 47; thence along the northern boundaries of Sections 47 and 48 and the northern and eastern boundaries of Section 49, Block VII, Te Kawau Survey District, to Milner's

Road; thence eastward along Milner's Road to Couper's Road; thence in a southerly direction along the said road to the north-west corner of Section 101, Block XI, Te Kawau Survey District; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of Section 101 to the Main Drain Road; thence in a southerly direction to the middle-line of the Oroua River at the junction with the Foxton-Palmerston Road; thence southward along the middle-line of the Oroua River to the middle-line of the Manawatu River; thence southward along the middle-line of the Manawatu River to a point opposite the road running along the north-west boundary of Section 51 (ferry reserve), Block VII, Mount Robinson Survey District; thence south-westward to and along the said road to the Foxton-Shannon Road; thence along the said road to the eastern boundary of the Borough of Foxton; thence generally northward, westward, and southward along the boundaries of the said borough to a point in the middle-line of the Manawatu River; thence in a southerly and westerly direction along the middle-line of the said river to the sea-coast; thence northward along the sea-coast to the middle-line of the main channel of the Rangitikei River at its mouth; thence in a north-westerly direction along the middle-line of the main channel of the Rangitikei River to the point of commencement at the Bulls Bridge.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

BOUNDARIES OF THE RANGITOTO RABBIT DISTRICT.

2. UTILIZATION OF THE WATER.

The said water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity.

3. LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said water shall be taken from the said stream situated on Sections 20 and 21, Kinloch Settlement, Block VI, Akaroa Survey District, as indicated on the plans marked P.W.D. 82789 (hereinafter referred to as "the said plans"), deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions herein contained, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the position of the said works being indicated on the said plans :—

- (a) Headworks consisting of dam and necessary intakes :
- (b) Pipe-line leading from head-race to the power-house hereinafter referred to ; also tail-race from the power-house to the said stream :

5. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

The licensee shall maintain the works used under this license in proper working-order during the continuance of such license.

6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of twenty-one years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine, but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

7. RENTAL.

The licensee shall in respect of this license pay to the District Electrical Engineer, Public Works Department, Christchurch, a yearly rental of 4s. per kilowatt of maximum output generated during each and every year from 1st April, 1931, with a minimum of 8s. per annum. The output either shall be recorded by means of a watt-hour meter installed by the licensee, or, failing such installation, it shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating plant installed.

8. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said stream, except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it: Provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said stream.

9. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

10. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon remove from the ground (if so required by the Minister) all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided.

If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment of compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

11. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (c) of clause 5 of the regulations.

The generating and transmission voltage shall be approximately 110 volts between the terminals.

12. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to impose any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensee of the authority hereby granted ; but the licensee shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensee of any of the powers granted by this license.

13. BED OF STREAM NOT LEASED.

Nothing herein shall be held to constitute a lease from the Crown of the bed of the stream shown on the said plans, nor shall the provisions of Part IX of the Property Law Act, 1908, apply to this license.

14. DEFAULT.

If the licensee fails or neglects to observe any of the conditions or obligations imposed by this license, then and in any such case the provisions of clauses 229 and 230 of the regulations shall apply to the breach of any such condition or obligation.

15. ALTERATIONS TO WORKS.

Regulations as to the Constitution of the Ngaitahu Trust Board and Matters relevant thereto.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

THE RIGHT HON. G. W. FORBES, PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section sixty-five of the Native Purposes Act, 1931, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations with respect to the Ngaitahu Trust Board, and otherwise for the purpose of giving effect to the said section.

REGULATIONS.

- In these regulations—
"Board" means the Ngaitahu Trust Board;
"Member" means a member of the Board;
"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Board;
"Under-Secretary" means the Under-Secretary for Native Affairs;
"The said section" means section 65 of the Native Purposes Act, 1931.

MEMBERS.

2. The Board shall consist of eleven members, to be appointed by the Governor-General in Council as provided in paragraph (a) of the said section.

3. Subject to the provisions of these regulations as to resignation or forfeiture of office, a member shall hold office for two years, and thereafter until his successor has been appointed. A retiring member may be reappointed.

4. A member may at any time be removed from office by the Governor-General if the Governor-General is of opinion that that member is, from any cause, incapable of efficiently performing the duties of his office, or has been guilty of any misconduct which renders him unfit for office.

5. A member may at any time resign his office by notice in writing under his hand sent or delivered to the Under-Secretary.

6. The office of any member of the Board shall be vacated if he becomes bankrupt or is convicted of an offence punishable by imprisonment.

7. When a member of the Board dies, or resigns, or forfeits his office, or is removed from office, the Governor-General may appoint some person to fill the vacancy so created, who shall hold office for the unexpired term of his predecessor and thereafter until his successor is appointed.

8. The powers of the Board shall not be affected by any vacancy in the membership thereof.

MEETINGS.

9. The Board shall meet for the despatch of business at such times and places as the Board or Chairman may appoint, and a meeting may be summoned at any time by the Chairman.

10. The Native Minister may direct a meeting to be convened at any time, and thereupon such meeting shall be held.

11. (1) At the first meeting after every reappointment of the Board, the Board shall elect one of its members to be Chairman, and such member when so elected shall thereupon preside over the meeting of the Board at which he has been so elected, but he shall not come into office until his election as Chairman of the Board has been approved by the Native Minister.

(2) At every meeting for the election of a Chairman the Secretary of the Board shall preside, and in any case of an equality of votes shall determine the election by lot in such manner as the Board directs.

(3) The Secretary of the Board shall forthwith submit to the Native Minister the name and description of the member elected to be Chairman of the Board.

12. All questions coming before the Board at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present thereat.

13. At every meeting the Chairman, or, in his absence, some other member to be chosen by those present, shall preside, the Chairman or presiding member shall have a deliberative vote, and in case of equality of votes shall have a casting-vote also.

14. A quorum at any meeting of the Board shall consist of five members, and no business shall be transacted at any meeting unless a quorum is then present.

15. If within half an hour after the time for which a meeting of the Board has been appointed, whether by summons or by adjournment, a quorum is not present, the member or members present, or, if no member be present, an officer of the Board, may adjourn the meeting to such time and place as is thought fit.

16. All proceedings and resolutions of the Board shall be recorded in a minute-book to be kept for the purpose. At the end of each and every meeting the Chairman or Secretary of the Board shall supply a copy of or an extract from the minutes of the Board to the Under-Secretary.

SEAL.

17. The seal of the Board shall be such as is determined by the Board and approved by the Native Minister, and shall be kept in the custody of the Chairman or of such officer of the Board as it may appoint for the purpose.

18. The seal of the Board shall not be affixed to any document except in the presence of two members of the Board and of the Secretary or other responsible officer of the Board, all of whom shall attest the sealing of the document.

OFFICERS.

19. (1) The Board may from time to time, with the approval of the Native Minister, appoint some fit and proper person to be the Secretary of the Board, and, with the like approval, may at any time remove any such Secretary and appoint some other fit person in the place of the Secretary so removed.

(2) The Secretary of the Board shall be deemed to be the servant of the Board, and shall receive such salary or other remuneration as the Board, with the approval of the Native Minister, shall determine.

(3) The Secretary shall have all such powers and duties as the Board shall determine, and he shall at all times conform to the direction of the Board in that behalf.

20. The Board may from time to time appoint such other officers and workmen of the Board as shall be found necessary and expedient for the proper carrying-out of the business of the Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

THE RIGHT HON. G. W. FORBES, PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section twenty of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1926, it is provided that if in the opinion of the Governor-General it is expedient that any land vested in His Majesty and not reserved for any special purpose should be vested in any local authority in trust for the purpose of planting trees thereon, he may, by Order in Council, vest such land in that local authority for such purpose, with or without payment therefor, and subject to such terms and conditions as may be prescribed or imposed in such Order:

And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor-General, it is expedient to vest the land described in the Schedule hereto in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Alexandra for tree-planting purposes without payment therefor:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said section twenty, doth hereby declare that from and after the day of the date hereof the land described in the Schedule hereto shall become vested in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Alexandra for tree-planting purposes, subject to the special conditions herein-after contained, that is to say,—

(1) The Alexandra Borough Council shall, within six months of the date hereof, or within such extended period as the Commissioner of State Forests may decide, prepare a general forest working-plan of future operations to cover a period of not less than five years; such working-plan shall fully specify the silvicultural operations proposed to be carried on during the currency of the plan and such other matters as the Director of Forestry thinks fit.

(2) It shall not be lawful for the said Council to carry on such silvicultural operations unless and until such plan has been approved by the Commissioner of State Forests, and all such operations shall be carried on according to such plan as approved by the said Commissioner and under the supervision of the Director of Forestry.

(3) Any officer of the State Forest Service shall have free access to the said land at all times for the purpose of inspecting planting or other forestal operations, or for the purpose of reporting on proposed forest activities.

(4) The said Council shall, as soon as practicable after the date hereof, appoint some fit person to supervise and manage all tree-planting operations which may be undertaken by the said Council, and generally to advise the said Council on all matters pertaining to its forestry operations.

(5) The said Council may dispose of, by private sale, tender, or auction, any timber, trees, tree-seeds, firewood, or other forest produce on or from the said land.

(6) The payment of expenses of administration, management, and development of the said land for forestry and other purposes incidental thereto (including any expenses of supervision incurred by the State Forest Service) shall be a first charge on all moneys received therefrom, whether by way of rent, fees, proceeds of sales of forest produce, or from any other source whatsoever.

(7) In April of each year the said Council shall furnish to the Commissioner of State Forests a report for the year ending on the preceding 31st day of March, presenting in complete detail full particulars of the technical operations, and of the said administration of the land hereby vested in the said Council and the financial operations relating thereto, and shall at the same time submit a plan of operations and management for the ensuing year, which shall be effective on approval by the Commissioner of State Forests.
