WHEREAS by section three hundred and two of the Land Act, 1924, as amended by section ten of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1926, it is enacted that on the disposal of any national-endowment land by way of sale or on the acquisition of the fee-simple of any such land, the Governor-General may by Proclamation declare that such land shall, as from a date to be specified in the Proclamation, cease to be national-endowment land:

And whereas the fee-simple of the lands described in the Schedule hereto (being lands heretofore held under the tenure specified in the said Schedule), has been acquired and it is expedient that the said lands should cease to be national-endowment lands:

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section eighteen of the Forests Act, 1921-22, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby set apart the Crown land described in the Schedule hereto as a permanent State forest.

SCHEDULE.

AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT—AUCKLAND FOREST-CONSERVATION REGION.

Part of State Forest No. 150 (Tairua Plantation).

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 912 acres, more or less, being Section 4, Block XII, Tairua Survey District, and bounded generally as follows: Towards the north-west by Section 7, Block XII, aforesaid (State Forest No. 150, *Gazette*, 1931, page 118); towards the east and north by Section 3, Block XII aforesaid; again towards the east by a reserve along the foreshore of the Bay of Plenty; and towards the south-west by a reserve along the foreshore of the Whangamata Harbour. Altering Boundaries of Hobson and Whangarei Counties, and including Areas in Mangakahia Riding, Whangarei County.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection two of section fourteen of the Counties Act, 1920, that the boundaries of any one or more counties may be altered in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Council of each of such counties in which the Counties Act is in force:

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Hobson County Council on the twentieth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, praying for the alterations of the boundaries of the Hobson and Whangarei Counties in the manner described in the said resolution and in the First Schedule hereto:

And whereas a similar resolution was passed by the Whangarei County Council on the thirteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one:

And whereas it is expedient to make such alterations in accordance with the said resolutions, and that the areas to be added to the Whangarei County should be included in the Mangakahia Riding of that county:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the areas described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Hobson County, shall be added to and form part of the Whangarei County; that the boundaries of the Hobson and Whangarei Counties as so altered shall be those set forth under the respective headings in the Second Schedule hereto; that the areas added as aforesaid to the Whangarei County shall be included in the Mangakahia Riding of the said county; and that the boundaries of that riding shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule hereto:

And I do also proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA EXCLUDED FROM HOBSON COUNTY AND INCLUDED IN WHANGAREI COUNTY.

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, bounded by a line commencing at the north-western corner of Section 14, Block XI, Tutamoe Survey District; thence generally easterly along the northern boundary of said Section 14 to its north-eastern corner; thence south-easterly along the

north-eastern boundaries of Sections 14, 13, 12, and 11, Block XI, Tutamoe Survey District, to the north-eastern corner of the said Section 11; thence along the south-eastern boundary of said Section 11 to its south-eastern corner; thence along the southern and south-western boundaries of Sections 11, 12, 13, and 14 to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the western boundary of Section 14 aforesaid to its north-western corner, the point of commencement.

Also all that area in the North Auckland Land District, bounded by a line commencing at the north-eastern corner of Section 1 of 10, Block XII, Tutamoe Survey District; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundary of Section 1 of 10 to its south-eastern corner; thence westerly along the southern boundary of Section 1 of 10 and that boundary produced to the western boundary of Section 9, Block XII, Tutamoe Survey District; thence northerly along that boundary to its north-western corner; thence easterly along the northern boundaries of Sections 9, 14, and 1 of 10 to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section, the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

HOBSON COUNTY.

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Waipoua River: thence up the middle of the Waipoua River to the western boundary of Block VIII, Waipoua Survey District; thence along the western boundaries of Blocks VIII and IV, Waipoua Survey District, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned block; thence easterly along the northern boundaries of the Waipoua and Tutamoe Survey Districts to the Mangakahia River; thence down that river to a point in line with the north-western corner of Section 13A, Block III, Tutamoe Survey District; thence along the road forming the north-western boundary of Section 13A to the western boundary of the said section; thence to and along that boundary and the western boundary of Section 14, Block III, Tutamoe Survey District, to the westernmost corner of the said Section 14; thence along the northern and eastern boundaries of Section 12A, Block II, and the eastern and south-eastern boundaries of Section 8, Block VI, Tutamoe Survey District, to the southernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the road forming the western and southern boundaries of Section 15 and the southern boundary of Section 10, Block VII, Tutamoe Survey District, to the north-eastern corner of Section 12, Block VI, Tutamoe Survey District; thence along the eastern boundaries of Sections 12, Block VI, and 4 and 5, Block X, Tutamoe Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the southern boundary of Section 14 and the south-western boundaries of Sections 13, 12, and 11, Block XI, Tutamoe Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the south-eastern boundary of Section 11 to a public road (Tutamoe Road); thence easterly along that road to the western boundary of Section 9, Block XII, Tutamoe Survey District; thence northerly along that boundary to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section 1 of 10, Block XII, Tutamoe Survey District; thence to and along that boundary to its south-eastern corner; thence along the south-eastern boundary of that section to its north-eastern corner; thence to and along the north-western boundaries of Section 24, Karaka Block, to its northernmost corner; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of Section 24 aforesaid, and Section 25, Karaka Block, to the southernmost corner of Section 22, Karaka Block, Block IX, Mangakahia Survey District; thence along the northern boundaries of Section 10 and the north-western boundary of Section 12, Karaka Block, to the northernmost corner of Section 12 aforesaid; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 12 and 13, Block IX, Mangakahia Survey District, to the westernmost corner of a Provisional State Forest Reserve of 473 acres; thence along the northern and north-eastern boundaries of that Provisional State Forest reserve as described in *New Zealand Gazette*, 1922, page 1921, to the road forming the northern and eastern boundaries of other part of said reserve; thence easterly and southerly along that road to the north-eastern boundary of part Maungaru Block (D.P. 3997); thence along that boundary to the middle of the Mangakahia River; thence down the middle of the Mangakahia River and up the middle of the Wairua River to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 1, Block IV, Maungaru Survey District; thence to and along that boundary and the northern boundary of Section 4 to its north-eastern corner; thence along the eastern boundary of Section 4, Block IV aforesaid, to the middle of the Waiotama River; thence up the middle of the Waiotama River to a point in line with the north-west boundary of the Ngawahakirikiriki Block; thence to and

along that boundary and the north-western and south-western boundaries of the Panekuri Block, the south-western boundary of the Te Wiri Block, and the south-western and southern boundaries of the Pukepukerau Block to the north-western boundary of Section 15, Block I, Tangihua Survey District; thence along that boundary to the south-western corner of said Section 15; thence along the south-western boundaries of Sections 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, 10, 9, and 8 to the north-western corner of Section 16, Block III, Tangihua Survey District; thence along the western boundaries of Sections 16, 15, and 14, Block III aforesaid, to Horokaka Trig. Station; thence along the south-western boundaries of Sections 14 and 9, Block III, Tangihua Survey District, to the eastern boundary of Block VII, Tangihua Survey District; thence along that boundary to the northern boundary of Section 43, subdivision of Walton's Grant; thence along the northern boundary of said Section 43 to the western boundary of said Section 43, subdivision of Walton's Grant; thence along the western boundary of Section 43 aforesaid and its production to the middle of the Tauraroa River; thence down the middle of the Tauraroa River to its confluence with the Mangonui River; thence up the middle of the Mangonui River to a point in line with the northernmost point of Section 166, Oamaru Parish; thence to and along the south-eastern boundaries of the Okahu and Whakahara Parishes to the Wairoa River; thence across that river and along its western side and the western side of Kaipara Harbour to the sea; thence north-westerly along the sea-coast to the Waipoua River, the point of commencement, and excluding therefrom the Borough of Dargaville.

WHANGAREI COUNTY.

All that area in the North Auckland Land District, bounded by a line commencing at the south-eastern corner of Section 1, Block II, Tutamoe Survey District; thence easterly along the Mangakahia River to the western boundary of Section 3, Block XV, Punakitere Survey District, and along that boundary and the northern boundary to the Mangakahia River, and along that river to the south-western boundary of Section 1, Block IV, Tutamoe Survey District; thence along that boundary to the Mangakahia River, down that river to the Awarua River, and up the last-mentioned river to a point in line with the northern boundary of the middle part of the Nukutawhiti Block; thence to and along that boundary, the western and northern boundaries of Kaikou No. 3 Block, the northern boundary of Mangakowhara Block, the western and northern boundaries of Section 13, Block XIII, Hukerenui Survey District, the western boundaries of Sections 24 and 23, Block IX, Hukerenui Survey District, the northern boundary of Section 23, the eastern boundaries of Sections 23 and 24, the northern boundaries of Sections 5, 4, and 3, Block XIII, Hukerenui Survey District, the western boundary of Section 32, Block X, Hukerenui Survey District, the south-western, western, and northern boundaries of Section 32, Block IX, Hukerenui Survey District, to the western boundary of Block X; thence northerly along said block-line, the western and northern boundaries of Te Mata Kauri-gum Extension and Te Mata Kauri-gum Reserve, the northern boundary of Section 38, Block X, Hukerenui Survey District, and the western boundary of Section 19, Block X aforesaid, to the Whangarei-Kawakawa Main Road; thence by the north-eastern side of that road to and along the south-eastern side of Tapuhi-Hukerenui Road to the middle of the Waiotu River; thence along the middle of that river to the road forming the western boundary of Section 49, Block VI, Hukerenui Survey District; thence along that road to the closed road forming the northern boundary of Sections 49 and 50, Block VI aforesaid, to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the western boundary of Puhipuhi No. 4 A1, the western boundary of Section 4, Block VII, Hukerenui Survey District, the western and northern boundaries of Section 3, the western boundaries of Sections 6 and 5, Block VII, and Sections 13, 12, and 11, Block III, the northern boundaries of Section 11, Block III, and Section 11, Block IV, to the western boundary of Block IV, Hukerenui Survey District; thence along the said block-line to the south-western boundary of the Paremata-Mokau Block, and along the said boundary of that block, the western and north-western boundaries of the Punaruku No. 2 Block, the western boundaries of the Punaruku No. 1 Block, Waikopu Block, Sections 5 and 6 (Scenic Reserve) in Block XII, Russell Survey District, and the Tutamatai Block; thence along the western boundary of the Whangaroa Ngaiotonga No. 4 Block, to and along the northern boundary of Subdivision 9 of that block to the ocean; thence bounded by the ocean to Bream Tail at the north-eastern boundary of Section 91, Parish of Waipu, and along the south-eastern boundaries of the said Section 91 and Section 330, Parish of Waipu, to the southernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence across the Mangawai-McKenzie Cove Road, and along

Open Seasons for Red Deer Shooting in Portions of North Canterbury, Southland, Wellington, and Westland Acclimatization Districts.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, Adam Hamilton, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the period from the 1st day of March, 1932, to the 30th day of April, 1932 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in those portions of the North Canterbury, Southland, and Westland Acclimatization Districts described in the First, Second, and Third Schedules hereto respectively, and the period from the 15th day of March, 1932, to the 15th day of May, 1932 (both days inclusive), to be an open season in those portions of the Wellington Acclimatization District described in the Fourth Schedule hereto, for the taking or killing of the following imported game—viz., red deer stags and hinds—subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

(1) Licenses to take or kill red deer stags and hinds may be issued as follows:—

- For the area described in the First Schedule hereto, by the Secretary of the North Canterbury Acclimatization Society on payment of a license fee of £5.
- For the area described in the Second Schedule hereto by the Chief Postmaster at Invercargill on the recommendation of the Secretary of the Southland Acclimatization Society on payment of a license fee of £1 1s.
- For the area described in the Third Schedule hereto, by the Postmaster at Hokitika on the recommendation of the Secretary of the Westland Acclimatization Society on payment of a license fee of £5.
- For the area described in the Fourth Schedule hereto by the Secretary of the Wellington Acclimatization Society on payment of a license fee of £1.

Such licenses shall be generally in the form prescribed in the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall be subject to the said Act and the regulations thereunder and to this notification.

2. No licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

3. Nothing in any license to take or kill red deer stags and hinds shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill red deer stags or hinds on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes or on any sanctuary or public domain, nor shall authorize the holder thereof to enter any State forest for the purpose of taking or killing red deer stags or hinds without the consent of the Conservator of Forests at Christchurch, Invercargill, Hokitika, or Palmerston North (as the case may require) first had and obtained.

4. Any person committing a breach of any of these conditions is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £20.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Rakaia Gorge Deer Forest.

THE watershed of the Rakaia River and tributaries on the north side of the main stream from Lake Coleridge to the main alpine range.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

5. That the boundaries of the said Kaihu, Awakino, Tangowahine, and Maungaru Ridings be so altered as to give effect to above resolution; the amended boundaries to be shown as in the Schedule hereunder.
