Regulations as to the Constitution of the Maori Arts and Crafts Board and Matters relevant thereto.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 26th day of January, 1932.

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. G. W. FORBES, PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section forty-eight of the Native Purposes Act, 1931, and of all other powers and authorities him enabling, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations with respect to the Board of Maori Arts made on the sixth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and doth hereby make the following regulations with respect to the Maori Arts and Crafts Board for the purpose of giving effect to the said section forty-eight.

REGULATIONS.

1. IN these regulations—

- "Board" means the Maori Arts and Crafts Board;
- "Chairman" and "Deputy Chairman" mean respectively the Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Board;
- "Member" means a member of the Board;
- "Under-Secretary" means the Under-Secretary of Native Affairs;
- "The said section" means section forty-eight of the Native Purposes Act, 1931.

MEMBERS.

2. The Board shall consist of the following members:—

- (a) The Native Minister, who shall be Chairman;
- (b) The Under-Secretary of Native Affairs, who shall be Deputy Chairman;
- (c) The Under-Secretary of Internal Affairs;
- (d) Such other persons as may from time to time be appointed in that behalf by the Governor-General.

3. Subject to the provisions of these regulations as to death, resignation, or removal from office, a member appointed under paragraph (d) of clause 2 shall hold office for a period of two years, but a retiring member may be reappointed: Provided, however, that the members of the Board of Maori Arts appointed and holding office at the date of commencement of these regulations shall be deemed to have been appointed under these regulations, and shall continue to hold office until such time as members are appointed under these regulations.

4. For any cause which may seem to him sufficient, the Governor-General may at any time remove from office any member appointed under paragraph (d) of clause 2, and may fill any vacancy caused by the death, resignation, or removal of any such member.

5. The powers of the Board shall not be affected by any vacancy in the membership thereof.

MEETINGS.

6. The Board shall meet for the despatch of business at such times and places as the Board, the Chairman, or Deputy Chairman may from time to time direct.

7. Once at least in every year a meeting (hereinafter called "the annual meeting") shall be held at such time and place as shall be fixed by the Chairman.

8. At every meeting the Chairman, or in his absence the Deputy Chairman, shall preside. If neither of these members is present, then some member chosen by the members present shall preside.

9. A quorum at any meeting of the Board shall consist of three members, and no business beyond adjournment of the meeting shall be transacted unless a quorum is then present.

10. The Board shall decide all questions before it by a majority of votes. In case of an equality of votes the Chairman or other member presiding shall have a casting-vote as well as a deliberative vote.

11. Subject to the said section and to these regulations, the Board may regulate its own proceedings.

12. All proceedings and resolutions of the Board shall be recorded in a minute-book to be kept for the purpose by the Secretary of the Board.

SEAL.

13. The seal of the Board shall be such as is determined by the Native Minister, and shall be kept in the custody of the Secretary or such other person as the Board may appoint for the purpose.

14. The seal of the Board shall not be affixed to any document except in the presence of either the Secretary or other responsible officer of the Board and one member, or in the presence of two members, who shall attest the sealing of the document.

ACCOUNTS.

15. All moneys received by the Board shall forthwith be paid into an account to be kept in the Bank of New Zealand at such place as the Native Minister shall direct, and shall be paid out by cheque signed by the Under-Secretary or such person as he may appoint, and countersigned by the Accountant of the Department of Native Affairs or some officer acting for him.

16. All claims upon the Board shall bear the certificate of the Secretary or other responsible officer that the claim is in order, and shall be approved for payment by the Chairman or Deputy Chairman or some person acting for either of them. The Secretary shall at each meeting of the Board submit a list of all claims paid since the previous meeting or which require to be paid.

17. Proper books of account and other books shall be kept in which shall be entered correct records of all moneys received and paid out of the account. Such books shall be open at all reasonable times to inspection by members of the Board or by an authorized officer of the Board.

18. At the close of each financial year ending on the 31st day of March there shall be prepared a statement showing the total receipts and payments, and income and expenditure of the Board during that year, together with a balance-sheet showing the Board's assets and liabilities, which shall be audited by the Audit Office.

19. The Secretary of the Board shall place the statements and balance-sheet referred to in the last preceding clause before the Board at the annual meeting. The Secretary shall prepare and submit to the Board at such meeting a report of the operations and commitments of the Board during the same period, together with an estimate of the probable financial requirements of the Board for the next financial year.

20. A sum not exceeding £10 may at any time be advanced to the Secretary, who shall account therefor to the Board, for the purpose of paying postages, telegrams, and other incidental expenses.

TRAVELLING-ALLOWANCE AND LOCOMOTION EXPENSES.

21. The Board may, out of its funds, pay to its members a travelling-allowance of one pound one shilling (£1 1s.) for every day or part of a day the member is necessarily absent from his usual place of residence in transacting any business of the Board: Provided that when a member leaves and returns to his usual place of residence on the same day his actual and reasonable expenses only shall be paid. A member who is an officer of the Public Service and any other officer of the Public Service concerned with the business of the Board shall be paid according to the scale prescribed under the Public Service Act, 1912, or other regulation affecting such officer.

22. The Board may also pay the actual and reasonable locomotion expenses incurred by members and officers in transacting any business of the Board, including, where necessary, the provision of deck-cabins on steamers and sleeping-berths on trains.

23. The expenditure for travelling-expenses shall not in any financial year exceed £100, except with the consent in writing of the Native Minister.

PURPOSES AND OBJECTS OF BOARD.

24. The Board may undertake the promotion of the purposes and objects defined by the said section in such manner, by such means, and under and subject to such terms and conditions as in its discretion it thinks expedient or desirable.

OFFICERS OF BOARD.

25. The Board may appoint and employ all such officers and servants as it thinks expedient. The remuneration, travelling-allowance, and expenses of such officers and servants of the Board as are not officers of the Public Service may be determined and paid by the Board.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto was by Warrant published in *Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, permanently reserved for a Native burial-ground: And whereas it is expedient that the control of the said reserve should be vested in a special Board as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section seventeen of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928, doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto, for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously amended or revoked under the said Act), in the undermentioned persons, namely,—

Ngatai te Tuhi,
Arawhiti Mehaka,
Raimona Heretaunga,
Patiti Paerau, and
Te Whainoa Raureti,

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Moura Native Burial-ground Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business at two o'clock p.m. on the first Saturday in the months of February, May, August, and November in each year, at

Matata, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Saturday, the fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of any such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself without reasonable cause from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

8. The Board is hereby empowered to do all things which may be requisite for the proper and beneficial management and administration of the said reserve.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorize further burials being made within the boundaries of the said reserve.

WHEREAS it is desirable in the public interest that the public expenditure should be reviewed, having regard to the general financial position of the Dominion: Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, and acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby constitute and appoint you, the said

to be a Commission to review and report on the public expenditure in all its aspects, to indicate the economies that might be effected if particular policies were either adopted, abandoned, or modified, and generally to make recommendations to the Government for effecting forthwith all possible reductions in public expenditure, having regard especially to the present and prospective position of the public revenues:

And with the like advice and consent I do further appoint you

to be Chairman of the said Commission:

And for the better enabling you, the said Commission, to carry these presents into effect, you are hereby authorized and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry under these presents at such places as you may deem advisable and at such times as you may deem expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and from place to place as you think fit, and to call before you and examine on oath or otherwise, as may be allowed by law, such person or persons as you think capable of affording information in the premises; and you are also empowered to call for and examine all such books or records as you deem likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject-matter of the inquiry hereby directed to be made, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all lawful means whatsoever:

And you are hereby strictly charged and directed that you shall not at any time publish or otherwise disclose, save to me in pursuance of these presents or by my direction, the contents or purport of any report so made or to be made by you:

And it is hereby declared that these presents shall continue in full force and virtue although the inquiry is not regularly continued from time to time or from place to place by adjournment:

And, lastly, it is hereby further declared that these presents are issued under and subject to the provisions of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908.

Selwyn Plantation Board Regulations.

BLEDISLOE, Governor-General.

WHEREAS by section seventy-seven of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1910 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1910"), the Selwyn Plantation Board is constituted to administer and control the reserves enumerated in the said section:

And whereas by subsection three of section thirteen of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal Act, 1931 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1931"), the Board is declared to be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal:

And whereas in pursuance of the power conferred by paragraph (b) of section seventy-seven of the Act of 1910 the Governor-General is empowered to appoint one member of that Board, and each of the several local authorities specified in that paragraph, including the Spreydon Borough Council, is also empowered to appoint one member of the said Board:

And whereas the Borough of Spreydon has since the said enactment been with another borough then called the City of Christchurch constituted one united borough by the like name of the City of Christchurch, and by virtue of subsection three of section one hundred and thirty-nine of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, the power conferred on the Spreydon Borough Council by the said paragraph (b) is now exercisable by the Christchurch City Council:

And whereas it is provided by paragraph (c) of the said section seventy-seven of the Act of 1910 that the Board shall meet at such times and places, and shall exercise such rights and powers and administer and control the said reserves in such manner as the Governor-General from time to time determines by regulations to be gazetted:

And whereas by subsection (5) of section thirteen of the Act of 1931 the power of the Governor-General to make such regulations was enlarged:

And whereas by section eighty-two of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1917, it is enacted that the regulations made pursuant to section seventy-seven of the Act of 1910, and for the time being in force shall, in addition to the reserves shown in the Schedule thereto, extend and apply to any areas set apart for plantation purposes that may have been or may hereafter be vested in the Selwyn Plantation Board as constituted under that section:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers so conferred upon me, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the regulations referred to in the table of regulations revoked hereinafter contained, and do hereby make the regulations hereinafter set out and do hereby declare that such revocation shall take effect and the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the day following the publication hereof in the Gazette.

REGULATIONS.

PRELIMINARY.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as "The Selwyn Plantation Regulations, 1931."

2. In these regulations, if not inconsistent with the context,—

"Board" means the Selwyn Plantation Board:

"Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Canterbury Land District:

"Reserves" means the reserves enumerated in section 77 of the said Act, and also any areas set apart or purchased for plantation purposes that may have been or may hereafter be vested in the Board:

"The said Act" means the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1910:

"The Secretary" means the Secretary for the time being of the Board appointed in pursuance of these regulations.

3. All appointments, contracts, documents, determinations and generally all matters, things, and acts of authority which originated under any of the regulations hereinbefore revoked and are subsisting on the coming into force of these regulations shall enure for the purposes of these regulations as fully and effectually as if they had originated under the corresponding provisions of these regulations, and shall where necessary be deemed to have so originated.

4. All matters and proceedings commenced under any of the regulations hereinbefore revoked, and pending or in progress on the coming into force of these regulations, may be continued, completed, and enforced under these regulations.

MEETINGS.

5. If and whenever the Commissioner is a member of the Board then he shall be the Chairman of the Board.

6. The Chairman of the Council of each of the Counties of Malvern, Paparua, Heathcote, Halswell, Springs, Ellesmere, Selwyn, Waimairi, and Tawera, and the Mayor of the Christchurch City Council shall from time to time notify the Chairman of the Board of the name of the person who has been appointed by such local authority as a member of the Selwyn Plantation Board. Such appointment shall be in force until the receipt of a subsequent notification of the appointment of some other person in place of the member so appointed.

7. No act or proceeding of the Board, or of any person acting as a member of the Board, shall be invalidated in consequence of there being a vacancy in the number of the Board at the time of such act or proceeding, or of the subsequent discovery that there was some defect in the election or appointment of any person so acting, or that he was incapable of being such member.

8. The Board shall meet at the offices in Christchurch for the time being fixed by the Board as the Board's offices, on the fourth Monday in each month or such other time or place as the Board by resolution shall determine.

9. Five members shall form a quorum at any meeting of the Board.

10. Special meetings may be called by the Chairman or by the Secretary when so directed by the Chairman, provided that not less than four days' notice shall be given to each member of the Board of the intention to hold the special meeting.

11. Only such business shall be transacted at any special meeting as is notified in the notice calling such meeting.

12. The Board shall cause minutes of the proceedings at its meetings to be kept and from time to time authenticated as the Board prescribes, and minutes so authenticated shall be *prima facie* evidence of such proceedings and the regularity thereof.

ADMINISTRATION.

13. All moneys payable to the Board shall be remitted to the Secretary and paid by him in the specie in which they are received into a special account at the Bank of New Zealand, Christchurch, to be called "The Selwyn Plantation Account," which account is expressly declared to be the same account as the Selwyn Plantation Account established under the regulations hereinbefore revoked made on the 12th day of May, 1911, and referred to in section 90 of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1922, and in section 171 of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1924.

14. All receipts for moneys received by the Board shall be given by the Secretary and headed "Selwyn Plantation Account."

15. All disbursements by the Board shall be made by payment out of the said account to be by cheque signed by the Secretary and one of the members appointed by the Board for that purpose. The Board shall from time to time appoint certain members of the Board who may sign cheques. The Secretary and any member so appointed or, if the Board from time to time so directs, the Secretary alone may endorse for collection for the credit of the said account negotiable and transferable instruments payable to the order of the Board.

16. As soon as possible after the 31st day of March in each and every year a statement of accounts shall be drawn up by the Secretary and submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the first meeting held after the 21st day of April following. Such statement of accounts shall be audited and certified by the Audit Office under Part XIV of the Public Revenues Act, 1926, either before or after the meeting at which the said statement is submitted.

17. Such statement of accounts shall comprise—

- (a) An income and expenditure account for the financial year ended on such 31st day of March;
- (b) A summary of cash receipts and disbursements during the said financial year; and
- (c) A balance-sheet of the Board as at the close of that financial year.

18. The Board shall forward such statement of accounts, when duly audited and certified as aforesaid, to the Minister of Lands, together with a report on the operations of the Board for the twelve months ended on the 31st March preceding.

19. The Board may from time to time appoint a Secretary and other officers or servants as it thinks necessary for the proper carrying-out of the duties of the Board, and the same may from time to time be dismissed and another or others appointed in his or their stead.

20. All records, books, and correspondence of the Board shall be kept in the office of the Secretary, and he shall sign all letters and other documents on behalf of the Board other than documents required to be executed under the common seal of the Board, and shall be entitled to receive all letters addressed to the Board.

21. The Board may lease any of the reserves in manner hereinafter provided.

22. The Board may erect such buildings as are necessary for the accommodation of any person employed by it on any reserve under its control, and may charge such rents and impose such conditions for the occupation of the said buildings as it thinks fit.

23. The cost of erection and maintenance of the said buildings shall be defrayed out of the revenue of the Board, and shall be deemed to form part of the expenses of administration.

THE SEAL.

24. The common seal of the Board shall not be affixed to any instrument except by the authority of a resolution of the Board and in the presence of the Chairman and one other member of the Board and of the Secretary or, in the event of the absence of the Chairman, then in the presence of two members of the Board and of the Secretary.

LEASING.

25. The whole or any portion of any reserve administered by the Board and not immediately required for planting, may be let by public tender or by public auction, as may be decided by the Board. Notice of the land so available for leasing, the term of the lease, and the time and place for the receipt of tenders, or the time and place at which the auction will be held shall be given by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district thirty days prior to the expiration of the time fixed for the receipt of tenders or for the auction sale, as the case may be. The purchaser of any lease offered at auction shall, immediately on the fall of the hammer, sign an agreement to accept such lease and deposit an amount equal to six months' rent at the rate offered, together with one guinea (£1 ls.) lease fee.

26. Tenders for a lease of any of the said land offered for lease by public tender shall be addressed to the Chairman, and shall specify the land tendered for, and shall be accom-

panied by a deposit equal to six months rent at the rate offered and one guinea (£1 ls.) lease fee. The Board shall give notice to the successful tenderer of the acceptance of his tender, and the deposit and lease fee paid by unsuccessful tenderers shall be refunded to them by the Board immediately after the tenders have been opened and decided upon.

27. All leases shall be without premium, fine, or foregift, and shall be for a term not exceeding fourteen years, and rent shall in all cases be payable half-yearly in advance.

28. All leases and counterparts shall be prepared by the Board at the cost of the lessees, not exceeding one guinea (£1 ls.) in each case, exclusive of costs out of pocket, and shall contain all usual and proper covenants and conditions for leases of a like nature, including a proviso for re-entry on default of payment of rent for three months, or immediately upon the breach of any other expressed or implied covenant by the lessee. Such re-entry shall not prejudice the lessor's right to recover moneys payable under the lease or damages for breach of covenant.

29. All leases shall, in addition to such covenants and conditions as in the preceding regulation mentioned, contain special covenants and conditions embodying the provisions hereinafter set forth, that is to say,—

- (a) The lessee shall not be at liberty to break up, plough, or otherwise cultivate in any one year more than one-half of the lands included in his lease, and shall not be at liberty to use the remaining half part thereof for any purpose except grazing. The form and position of the one-half available for cultivation shall be determined by the lessor.
- (b) The lessee shall fence the whole of the land included in his lease with a good and substantial fence, sufficient in all respects to comply with the provisions of the Fencing Act, 1908, or any other law for the time being in force regulating the fencing of land. All fences shall be kept and maintained in good order and condition, and at the expiration or sooner determination of the term, shall be so given up. All live fences or hedges shall be cut, dressed, and cleaned once in each year of the term: Provided that such portion of a reserve as the lessee shall actually use for grazing purposes only may be fenced or not, at his option, if the lessee is the owner or tenant for a term of at least three years or pastoral tenant of the land immediately adjoining such portion.
- (c) The lessee shall not take more than two crops of grain in each of the first two periods of five years, and shall not at any time during his term take more than two crops of grain in immediate succession off any part of the land which he is permitted to cultivate.
- (d) Four-fifths of the land broken up or cultivated by the lessee during the term of the lease shall, not later than the spring of the eleventh year of a fourteen-year term, and the fourth from last year of any shorter term, be sown and laid down by the lessee, at his own expense, with good white or red clover and ryegrass, cowgrass, or other grass approved by the lessor. The proportion of seed sown to the acre shall, in the case of clover, be not less than six pounds; and in the case of ryegrass or other grass, not less than fifteen pounds. After the land is sown and laid down in grass as aforesaid, it shall be so kept and maintained, and at the expiration or other sooner determination of his term, shall be given up by the lessee well and sufficiently laid down in permanent artificial grass pasture. During the remainder of the term of his lease, after the eleventh or corresponding year as aforesaid the lessee may, if he thinks fit, annually cultivate the remaining fifth of the land so broken up or cultivated as aforesaid for the production of root crops, but not otherwise.
- (e) The lessor shall be at liberty at any time during the term to resume possession of the whole or any part of the land which the lessee is permitted to use for grazing purposes only, as and when the lessor shall require so to do, for the purposes for which the whole land was originally reserved: Provided that the rent payable in respect of the land included in the lease shall be reduced proportionately for every acre or part of an acre possession of which is so resumed by the lessor.
- (f) It shall be lawful for the lessor, its agents or servants, at any time or times during the term to enter upon any part or parts of the lands included in any lease which may be planted with trees or which may be required to give access thereto, and temporarily resume possession thereof for the purpose of felling or topping the trees planted thereon or cutting firewood therefrom, and at the termination of such operations the possession of any such lands may be restored to the lessee as tenant under the original lease. No compensation or allowance or rebate of rent shall be paid by the lessor to the lessee in respect of any such temporary resumption of possession.

(g) The lessee shall not assign, sublet, or otherwise part with the possession of the land included in his lease, or any part thereof, without the consent in writing of the lessor first having been obtained.

30. In addition to the covenants and conditions referred to in the two last preceding regulations it shall be lawful for the Board to embody in any lease a special covenant that the Board shall pay to the lessee compensation for any fences erected by the lessee with the consent of the Board, such compensation to be ascertained by valuation or in such other manner as the Board may decide.

31. In the event of any lessee of the Board being unable at any time by reason of any natural disaster or other sufficient cause to pay the rent due under his lease the Board, on being satisfied that it would be reasonable or equitable to afford relief, may remit the rent payable in respect of any period or periods not exceeding three years in the aggregate or may postpone until such date or dates as the Board may determine the payment of rent in respect of any period or periods not exceeding three years in the aggregate. Interest at such rate, not less than 4 per cent. as the Board may determine, shall be payable half-yearly on the amount or amounts of rent so postponed, and such interest shall be added to the rent and shall be recoverable in like manner as the rent in arrear.

32. If any person whose tender for a lease has been accepted by the Board fails to execute his lease within twenty-one days from the date of the delivery to him or of the posting to his post-office address of a notice of acceptance of his tender his deposit shall be absolutely forfeited to the Board, and his right to obtain a lease by virtue of such tender and acceptance shall absolutely cease and determine, and thereupon the lands specified in such tender may be offered again, or the Board may declare the next highest tenderer to be the successful tenderer.

DISPOSAL OF REVENUE.

33. Each member of the Board shall be entitled to be repaid out of the revenue of the Board any money expended by him in payment for omnibus, motor, railway, steamboat, or other conveyance whilst on the Board's business, and shall also be entitled to receive the sum of ten shillings (10s.) per day for every day during which he may be engaged upon the Board's business.

34. The Board is empowered to pay such remuneration as it thinks fit to those persons who may act as Secretary, Auditor, Superintendent, or as officers of the Board in any other capacity.

35. The Board may in any financial year out of the revenue of the Board expend for purposes not authorized by these regulations or by any Act or law for the time being in force any sum or sums of money not amounting in the whole to more than fifty pounds (£50).

36. The Board may from time to time make grants of money towards research or investigation of any matters relating to forestry and planting: Provided that the moneys so granted shall not in any financial year exceed the sum of twenty-five pounds (£25).

37. The net revenue of the Board after the expenses of administration and upkeep and other payments authorized by these regulations have been defrayed shall be directed towards planting, fencing, cutting and milling of timber, purchase of implements and plant, and general maintenance and improvement of the property of the Board.

CONTROL OF RESERVES.

38. No person shall, save on the business of the Board or with the express permission of the Board, enter upon any of the reserves for any purpose whatsoever, and any person so entering save on such business or with such express permission shall be deemed to be a trespasser, and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five pounds (£5), recoverable at the suit of any person appointed by the Board in that behalf.

39. No person shall, except with the permission of the Board, shoot, snare, or destroy any bird, or take or destroy the nest or eggs of any bird, within the limits of the reserves.

40. No person shall take, carry, or use firearms or any fireworks or explosive, or any weapon or instrument of a dangerous nature, or bows and arrows, or catapult, or shanghai, within the limits of the reserves, except with the permission of the Board.

41. No person shall leave bottles, glass, crockery, paper, remnants of food, or other litter within the limits of the reserves.

42. No person shall cause, permit, or suffer any horse, donkey, sheep, goat, cattle, or pig to be in the reserves without the permission of the Board.

43. No person shall go through, climb, or ride over or through, or damage any buildings, fence, locked gate, or barrier, or other property belonging to or in the custody of the Board or shall light a fire, or take, deposit, or remove any wood, earth, sod, grass, or gravel or break or cut any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or disturb the surface of the soil from or within the limits of the reserves without the permission of the Board.

44. No person shall remove, disturb, break, destroy, cut names, letters, words, figures, or devices on, or deface any fixed or moveable seats, gates, bridges, or trees or any building or erection or other property of the Board within the limits of the reserves.

45. No person shall within such limits as aforesaid use any obscene or profane language, or commit any breach of the peace, act of indecency, or other impropriety, or insult or annoy any person. No person shall behave riotously or boisterously or in any other objectionable manner so as to annoy others within the reserves.

46. No person shall destroy, deface, or injure any inscription, or any label attached to or connected with any article, tree, or plant within the reserves, or any copy of these regulations hung up or affixed at any entrance to or in any part of the reserves.

47. No person shall post, stick, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix or cause to be affixed any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, roadway, or path within the limits of the reserves without the consent of the Board.

48. No person shall erect any swing, post, or fence in any part of the reserves unless with the permission in writing of the Board.

49. Every person who commits a breach of any of the regulations numbered from 38 to 48 hereof is liable on summary conviction to a fine of five pounds (£5), recoverable at the suit of any person appointed by the Board in that behalf.

NOTE.—A fine summer month. Total bright sunshine, 255 hours, 54 per cent. of the possible, which was a good deal above the average for December of 227.5 hours. There were three sunless days. Rainfall was 5 per cent. below the mean of previous years. Temperatures were normal. Lightning was seen on 1st, 2nd, 19th, and 20th, and thunder was heard on the 20th. Mean dew-point at 9 hrs., 50.6°; and mean vapour pressure 0.369 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1931.

General.—December was, generally speaking, a pleasant month, with abundant sunshine. There were three periods during which large parts of the country received very beneficial rains. Their value was all the greater owing to the fact that they fell in warm weather. In many cases, indeed, they resembled tropical downpours, and were associated with thunderstorms. Rain is still badly wanted in Hawke's Bay and Poverty Bay, and still more in Canterbury and Central Otago. The higher levels are generally in fairly good condition, but the plains are very dry, and feed is scarce. In other parts there is ample feed and the prospects are favourable. Stock are in fair to good condition.

Rainfall.—Owing to the fact that much of the rain came in heavy downpours of a local character, the distribution was irregular. On the whole, however, the more exposed portions of the country tended to have more than the average for December, while in the interior and in eastern districts deficits largely predominated. Nelson Province experienced a wet month, especially the area around Tasman Bay. Nelson City had 11.00 in., the highest total recorded in any single month since 1883. North Auckland and parts of the East Cape districts also had much more than the average. The deficits were most serious in Poverty Bay, Hawke's Bay, the Wairarapa, and in Canterbury. In the last-mentioned province the amounts were approximately half only of the December normal.

Temperatures.—There were some exceptions, but over most of the Dominion the mean temperature was high for December.

Winds.—A considerable amount of northerly wind was experienced, especially in the middle of the month, but since it was generally north rather than north-west, its character was not so unpleasant as usual. In the southern half of the South Island, however, there was a considerable proportion of westerly wind which accentuated the effect of the dry weather.

Sunshine.—The number of hours of sunshine recorded was generally high, but was below the average at Hokitika and parts of Canterbury.

Storm Systems.—Most of the rain during the month was caused by storms of cyclonic type, and occurred during three periods. The first was associated with a cyclone which was deep when over the Tasman Sea on the 6th, but which decreased in intensity next day and, moving north-eastwards, crossed the Dominion at its northern extremity. Rain was widespread and over the North Island almost general, but the falls were, in many cases, light or moderate. On the whole it was rather disappointing.

The second spell occurred about the middle of the month. A series of shallow cyclones came from the westward between the 13th and the 21st. At one stage there were as many as five centres in procession. From the 14th to the 17th pressure was high at Chatham Island, and the combination of circumstances was favourable for heavy rain. Strong northerly winds blew, gales being experienced in many parts, especially of the North Island. General rains fell, and the totals for the whole period were practically everywhere heavy. The fact that they were warm rains added to their value. On the 18th thunderstorms occurred in many places, and there were some rainfalls of the nature of cloudbursts. Flooding was caused by such rains at Masterton and at Earnsclough in Central Otago. Similar phenomena were experienced at Dusky in Southern Otago on the 16th, and in Taranaki and Golden Bay on the 20th. On the latter day, especially, considerable damage was done to electric-power lines.

The third rainy period was from the 22nd onward. A cyclone was centred east of Tasmania on the 21st, but thereafter the weather gradually approached the westerly type. Heavy rains occurred in many parts of the South Island from the 22nd to the 24th. Over the North Island precipitation was mainly light and scattered. Northerly gales blew on the 23rd, some damage being done in the Manawatu and Wairarapa districts.
