Samoa Legislative Council (Elective Membership) Amendment Order, 1932.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 11th day of May, 1932.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority to make regulations for the peace, order, and good government of Samoa conferred upon him by the Samoa Act, 1921, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. (1) THIS Order may be cited as the Samoa Legislative Council (Elective Membership) Amendment Order, 1932, and shall come into force on the first day of June, 1932.

(2) This Order shall be read together with and form part of the Samoa Legislative Council (Elective Membership) Order, 1923 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order").

2. Clause 2 of the principal Order is hereby amended by deleting from the definition of "Public notice" the words "offices (if any) of the Resident Commissioners at Savai'i and Aleipata", and substituting therefor the words "office (if any) of the Resident Commissioner in Savai'i".

3. Clause 11 of the principal Order is hereby revoked, and the following clause substituted therefor :—

" 11. (1) Every person shall be deemed to be qualified to be registered as an elector pursuant to clause 15 of this Order and entitled accordingly to vote at any election of elected members pursuant to clause 23 of this Order if he—

" (i) Is a male person of or over the age of twenty-one years ; and

" (ii) Is a resident of Samoa and has continuously resided in Samoa for at least one year immediately preceding the date when the claim for enrolment is made ; and

- “ (iii) Is—
- “ (a) The legitimate son of parents of European descent ;
 - or
 - “ (b) The legitimate son of a father who is a European ;
 - or
 - “ (c) Registered as a ‘ European ’ under the Samoa Registration of Europeans Regulations, 1920 ; or
 - “ (d) The legitimate son of a father who is registered as a ‘ European ’ under the Samoa Registration of Europeans Regulations, 1920 ; and

- “ (iv) (a) Is possessed of freehold or leasehold property within Samoa in respect of which property he has during the current financial year become liable for and paid any tax by virtue of an ordinance in force in Samoa ; or

“ (b) Has during the current financial year become liable for and paid a store-tax or a business-license fee by virtue of an ordinance in force in Samoa ; or

“ (c) Is possessed of an annual income derived from salary of not less than £200 earned in Samoa upon which sum he has during the current financial year become liable for and paid any tax by virtue of an ordinance in force in Samoa :

“ Provided that in any case where a person is in receipt of an income from salary and it is not practicable to ascertain the annual value of such income it shall be sufficient qualification for the purposes of sub-paragraph (c) hereof if such person has paid such a tax upon an income of not less than £200 earned in Samoa for at least two years immediately preceding the date fixed in accordance with clause 21 hereof for the closing of the roll.

“ Provided also that, if at the time when a claim for enrolment is made no tax in respect of property or store tax or business-license fee or tax upon income respectively, as the case may be, shall have become payable by the claimant for the current financial year, it shall be sufficient compliance with paragraph (iv) of this subclause if he shall have paid such tax or fee for the then immediately preceding financial year.

“ (2) For the purposes of subparagraphs (a) and (b) of paragraph (iii) of subclause (1) hereof the word ‘ European ’ shall not have the meaning assigned to it by section 3 of the Samoa Act, 1921, but shall have its ordinary meaning.

“ (3) For the purposes of paragraph (ii) of subclause (1) hereof a person shall be deemed to have continuously resided in Samoa notwithstanding his occasional absence therefrom and notwithstanding his absence on leave from his occupation.

“ (4) The Samoa Legislative Council (Elective Membership) Amendment Order, 1926, is hereby revoked.”

4. Clause 15 of the principal Order is hereby amended by deleting the words “ and retained ”, and adding to the said clause the following words : “ and every person so qualified shall be entitled to have his name retained upon the said roll so long as he remains qualified to be registered as an elector.”

5. Clause 20 of the principal Order is hereby amended by omitting the words “ day of publication in the *Western Samoa Gazette* of the appointment by the Administrator of the day fixed for the election ”, and substituting therefor the words “ date fixed in accordance with clause 21 hereof for the closing of the roll until after the election in connection with which the roll has been closed ”.

6. Clause 21 of the principal Order is hereby amended by inserting after subclause (1) thereof the following additional subclause :—

“ (1A) At least fifteen days before the day so fixed the Returning Officer shall give public notice thereof.”

7. Clause 24 of the principal Order is hereby amended by omitting the words " offices of the Resident Commissioners in Savai'i and at Aleipata", and substituting therefor the words " office of the Resident Commissioner in Savai'i".

8. Clause 30 of the principal Order is hereby amended by omitting the words " twenty-eight", and substituting therefor the words " thirty-five".

9. Clause 31 of the principal Order is hereby amended—

- (a) By omitting the words " twenty-one", and substituting the word " thirty";
- (b) By omitting the word " five", and substituting the word " ten";
- (c) By omitting the word " ten", and substituting the word " fifteen".

10. Clause 33 of the principal Order is hereby amended by omitting from the proviso thereto the words " or a Commissioner of the High Court", and substituting therefor " or any elector".

11. The First Schedule to the principal Order is hereby amended by omitting Form No. 1 thereof, and substituting the following form therefor:—

Amendments to the Regulations under the Public Service Act, 1912.

IN pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor-General in Council, doth hereby, in respect of the regulations made under the said Act on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and the amendments thereof made from time to time under the provisions of the said Act, make the amendments shown in the Schedule hereto.

Such amendments shall have effect from and after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

SCHEDULE.

Regulation 8B is hereby amended by deleting the figures "£423" whenever they occur, and substituting therefor the figures "£380 14s."

Regulation 8E is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

Overtime shall be calculated to the nearest quarter of an hour.

Officers of the General Division whose cases are not met by special regulation in that behalf may be paid for overtime at such rate as may be fixed by the Commissioner from time to time.

Regulation 109 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

TRAVELLING-ALLOWANCES AND TRAVELLING-EXPENSES.

109. All salaried officers shall receive travelling-allowance for personal expenses at the following rates:—

(a) Officers drawing salaries not exceeding £123 19s. 6d. per annum: Actual expenses.

Regulation 111B is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

RELIEVING-ALLOWANCES.

111B. Officers called upon to perform relieving duty which necessitates their absence at night from home may be paid allowances at the following rates:—

To officers drawing salaries not exceeding £123 19s. 6d.: Actual and reasonable expenses.	
To officers drawing salaries exceeding £123 19s. 6d. and not exceeding £238 19s.	Per Diem. s. d. 9 0
To officers drawing salaries exceeding £238 19s. and not exceeding £380 14s.	11 3
To officers drawing salaries exceeding £380 14s.	13 6

Officers entitled to lodging-allowance, when appointed to relieving duty involving separate payment for such duty, will not be entitled to claim lodging-allowance for a longer time than one week after the relieving duty commences.

Officers are not entitled to draw travelling-allowance for any time during which they perform relieving duty, except as follows: When in performing relieving duty an officer is not required to stay more than three nights in the place where such duty is performed, he may be paid travelling-allowance instead of relieving-allowance. But travelling-allowance may be paid for the day occupied in travelling to or from headquarters, provided that the time occupied exceeds six hours on each occasion.

In any special case the Commissioner may authorize payment of an allowance at a higher or lower rate.

An allowance in accordance with this regulation shall be granted only in cases where an officer is required to perform purely relieving duty.

A relieving-allowance shall not be paid to an officer for any period in excess of one month, or in cases where the period of relief is likely to be in excess of one month, without the previous approval of the Commissioner thereto. In such cases, where practicable, a commuted allowance will be payable.

Regulation 117 is hereby amended by deleting the words "Officers receiving £382 10s. a year and over, 2s. 3d.; under £382 10s. a year, 1s. 9d.," and substituting therefor the words "Officers receiving £344 5s. a year and over, 2s. 3d.; under £344 5s. a year, 1s. 9d."

Regulation 197 is hereby amended by deleting the figures "£171," and substituting therefor the figures "£162 9s."

Regulation 201 is hereby amended by deleting the figures "£301 10s.," and substituting therefor the figures "£271 7s."

Regulation 209 (1) is hereby amended by deleting the figure "£9," and substituting therefor the figures "£8 2s."

Regulation 209 (3) is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

209. (3) An officer of the Seventh Class of the Clerical Division who is in receipt of a salary of not more than £132 10s. 6d. per annum shall be deemed to be performing the duties of a position of a higher class or grade than that in which he is classified if he performs the duties ordinarily performed by an officer of the same class who is in receipt of a salary of not less than £213 15s. per annum, and may be granted on the approval of the Commissioner, and subject to the provisions of this regulation, payment in addition to salary at a rate of not more than £21 7s. 6d. per annum: Provided that no such payment shall be authorized unless the Commissioner is satisfied that the duties so performed have been actually taken over by the officer claiming from an officer in receipt of a salary of not less than £213 15s. per annum, and are such as are ordinarily allotted only to officers of the Seventh Class in receipt of salaries of not less than £213 15s. per annum, and that such duties have been performed in a proper and efficient manner by the officer claiming payment of an allowance in respect thereof.

Regulation 213 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

LODGING-ALLOWANCE.

213. In addition to the salary payable to officers in Subdivisions 1, 2, and 3 of Class VII (c) of the Clerical Division, there shall be paid, if the officer is stationed away from his home, a lodging-allowance at the following rates:—

NOTE—A fine dry autumn month, with light south and south-easterly winds prevailing. Precipitation, which was 89 per cent. below the mean, was the lowest recorded for March since 1911. Total bright sunshine, 191.7 hours, 50 per cent. of the possible, and one sunless day. Lightning was seen on the 10th. Mean dew-point at 9 hrs., 51.8°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.384 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH, 1932.

General.—March was remarkable for the very dry weather experienced over the greater part of the Dominion and for the prevalence of southerly or south-easterly winds. Though temperatures were, on the average, rather below normal, the coolness was mitigated by a comparative absence of wind. Many days were beautifully warm.

Rainfall.—Several heavy rains were experienced in the Auckland Peninsula, especially the northern portion. The totals for the month exceeded the average in all parts, but in the far North were more than double. The districts east of the main range from Hawke's Bay to East Cape also had a continuance of the wet conditions prevailing in February, and the total falls were considerably above the average. The only other area which recorded more than the normal for March was that about Dunedin. In the remainder of the Dominion the rainfall was generally much below average. In the southern half of Taranaki, and in the Wellington, Marlborough, and Canterbury Provinces, very light falls were recorded. For example, Eltham had only 0.07 in., Foxton 0.61 in., Wellington 0.35 in., Spring Creek, Blenheim 0.24 in., and Christchurch 0.48 in.

Temperatures.—Though, as would be expected with southerly winds prevailing, most places had temperatures rather below the average for March, this was by no means invariably the case. In some localities, especially those protected from the direct effect of south-easterly winds, a warm month was experienced.

Sunshine.—As regards sunshine, conditions varied somewhat, but at the majority of places there was less than normal.

Winds.—There were strong south-easterly to north-easterly winds about Cook Strait and over the North Island between the 6th and the 10th, some rather heavy gales being reported from the North, but, on the whole, winds were unusually light during the month.

Weather Systems.—The outstanding feature of the weather charts during the month was the prevalence of anticyclones over New Zealand. This was particularly noticeable at the beginning and the end of the month. Generally, the centre of high pressure was in the south, and this accounted for the frequency of south-easterly winds. The usual westerly depressions were few in number and very poorly developed.

From the 6th to the 9th, while pressure was very high to the south and south-east, a depression moved from far to the north of New Zealand in a south-south-easterly direction, past Chatham Island. Heavy rains occurred in North Auckland and between Hawke's Bay and East Cape, many rivers being flooded.

Rains were caused in parts of the same districts between the 18th and 20th under rather similar conditions, pressure being high to the south and relatively low to the north.

Following this a cyclone gradually developed in the North Tasman Sea, while pressure remained very high to the east of New Zealand. The cyclone crossed the southern portion of the South Island on the 23rd, and northerly gales were experienced in some places. This storm was the only one during the month which produced anything approaching general rains, but on this occasion there were few localities which recorded no rain, and heavy falls occurred in most. The heaviest were in the northern and north-eastern portions of the North Island and the western and southern portions of the South Island. Some flooding again occurred.

By-law of the North Shore Boroughs (Auckland) Water Board made in pursuance of the Powers and Provisions contained in the North Shore Boroughs (Auckland) Water-supply Act, 1924, and the Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor-General issued on the 11th Day of January, 1928, and published in the Gazette under Date the 19th Day of January, 1928, and in Pursuance of every other Power and Authority enabling the said Board in that behalf.

THE North Shore Boroughs (Auckland) Water Board doth by special order hereby ordain as follows:—

1. This by-law shall, except where otherwise specially provided, come into operation on the first day of July, 1932, and shall (except as to such parts of sections, clauses, or provisions as are expressly or by implication limited in their operation) apply to the whole of the water-supply district constituted under the above-mentioned Act.

INTERPRETATION.

2. In this by-law, if not inconsistent with the context,—
The terms defined in section 2 of the said Act shall have the same meaning in this by-law:

“Local authority” means the Council of a Borough or County, Road Board, or Town Board;

“Gathering-area” means all that portion of the catchwater area surrounding the Lake comprised within lines following generally the crest of the main or leading ridge round the Lake wherever such crest lies within the inner or Lake sides of Shakespeare Road, Takaroto Road, Killarney Street, Hurstmere Road, and Kitchener Road, and following the inner or Lake side of those streets wherever such crest runs outside such inner or Lake side of such streets, such boundary-lines being delineated and coloured green on a plan prepared and certified as correct by C. L. V. Merton, a registered Surveyor, under date the thirtieth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, deposited at the office of the Board, at the Borough Council Chambers, Devonport, and precisely described as follows:—

3. No person shall after the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two take or draw water from the Lake by means of any pump or other mechanical contrivance excepting under and in pursuance of the terms and provisions of a license issued by the Board under this by-law. Such license shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of March following the date of issue, and may be renewed annually: Provided that the Board may suspend or cancel any such license for any breach of the terms or conditions therein contained or any breach of this by-law.

LICENSES TO LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

4. Any local authority desirous of obtaining or renewing a license authorizing the withdrawal of water from the Lake for purposes of public supply shall make application in writing to the Board in that behalf giving estimates of—

- The population within the district of the applicant local authority;
- The yearly supply required by such population;
- The maximum daily summer supply required by such population;
- The estimated amount of water to be supplied per day outside the district of such applicant local authority during the term or currency of the license; and
- The maximum daily summer supply required for use outside the district of such applicant local authority.

5. Upon application in manner aforesaid by any local authority, the Secretary may issue in the name and on behalf of the Board a license in the Form Number One in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect, but so that the same shall not take effect until the applicant local authority shall have duly executed and delivered to the Secretary a covenant in the said Form Number One or to the like effect.

6. The following provisions shall apply to every local authority whose district is within the water-supply district constituted by the said Act, and which supplies for public purposes water from the Lake whether taken or drawn directly by that local authority by virtue of any license issued by the Board or purchased or otherwise obtained from or through any other holder of a license from the Board, that is to say:—

- No such local authority shall, after notice in writing given by the Board prohibiting the use of water taken or drawn from the Lake for street-watering purposes, use or permit to be used any of such water for any such purpose;
- No such local authority shall, after notice in writing given by the Board prohibiting the use of water taken or drawn from the Lake for watering gardens or lawns, allow or permit any consumer within the district of such local authority to use any such water for any such purpose; and upon proof that any consumer has so done the onus of establishing that such use was not allowed or permitted by such local authority shall be upon the local authority;
- No such local authority shall knowingly allow any of the water mains, valves, or waterworks under its control containing water drawn from the Lake to be defective so as to waste such water.

CONSUMERS' LICENSES.

7. Any person desirous of obtaining or renewing a Consumer's License under this by-law shall make application in writing to the Secretary specifying the purposes for which the supply is required, the estimated average daily demand to be supplied, and particulars of the land upon which it is proposed to lay or construct pipes, pumps, windmills, or other contrivances to take, draw, or convey the water, and particulars of the applicant's title to or interest in such land.

8. Upon receiving such application the Secretary may grant to the applicant in the name and on behalf of the Board a license in the Form Number Two in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect, but so that the same shall not take effect until the applicant shall duly execute and deliver to the Board a covenant in the said Form Number Two or to the like effect.

9. Such licensee shall pay to the Board when demanded for all water taken or drawn from the Lake by the licensee during the continuance of the license at the rates from time to time prescribed by the Board by special order, and until otherwise prescribed, at the following rate, that is to say:—

1s. 6d. for each 1,000 gallons or part of 1,000 gallons taken or drawn from the Lake by or on behalf of the licensee.

10. Each holder of a consumer's license shall, before commencing to draw or take any water from the Lake, instal to the satisfaction of the Secretary and at all times maintain in good and effective working order and condition proper meters, governors, and appliances for measuring the water taken, and permit the Secretary or any Inspector or Engineer appointed by the Board to inspect from time to time all such meters, governors, and appliances. No holder of a license shall, excepting with the consent in writing of the Secretary first obtained, knowingly take or draw any water from the Lake unless through and correctly measured by such meters, governors, and appliances.

11. Each holder of a Consumer's License shall keep true and correct records of the quantity of water taken or drawn from the Lake each quarter ending on the last days of the months of June, September, December, and March during the continuance of the license, and within fourteen days after the expiry of each such quarterly period shall deliver to the Secretary a return in writing, certified as correct by such holder, specifying the quantity of water taken or drawn from the Lake by or on behalf of such holder during the quarterly period to which the return relates.

12. Each holder of a Consumer's License shall, within twenty-four hours after any meter, governor, or appliance belonging to him or under his control installed for the measurement of water to be taken or drawn from the Lake shall become defective, give notice in writing of such defect to the Secretary, and shall forthwith make good such defect to the satisfaction of the Secretary, or, if the Secretary shall so require, shall forthwith substitute a new and effective meter, governor, or appliance for measuring such water.

13. No holder of a Consumer's License shall, after notice in writing given by the Board forbidding during a period to be therein specified the use of water drawn from the Lake for watering gardens or lawns, use or allow to be used any such water for any such purpose during such period without the consent in writing of the Secretary first had and obtained.

PREVENTION OF CONTAMINATION.

14. No person shall—

- (a) Wade, bathe, or wash in the Lake; or
- (b) Wash or put any animal, house linen, clothing, or other offensive thing in the Lake; or
- (c) Pour, cast, or put in the water of the Lake or upon the shore thereof any carcase, dirt, refuse, rubbish, waste matter, foul liquid, or other thing which is or may become noxious or injurious to health or which tends to render offensive or dangerous to health or unfit or less suitable for domestic use the water of the Lake; or
- (d) Do or cause to be done in or upon the Lake or upon the shore thereof any other act tending to render the water of the Lake offensive or dangerous to health or unfit for domestic use.

15. (a) No person shall cause, suffer, or allow any dog, pig, horse, ox, or other animal belonging to him or under his control for the time being to wade, swim, enter, or stray into or be in the water of the Lake or to go or be upon the shore thereof.

(b) No person shall keep or depasture any horse, ox, or other animal of those species belonging to him or under his control on any part of the gathering-area which lies within 4 chains from the margin of the Lake.

(c) No person owning or occupying any land comprised within the gathering-area and situated within 4 chains from

the margin of the Lake shall allow, suffer, or permit any other person to keep or depasture thereon any horse, ox, or other animal of those species.

16. No person shall upon any land comprised within the gathering-area of the Lake—

- (a) Keep any dog or pig; or
- (b) Erect, establish, or maintain any stable, cowshed, or piggery; or
- (c) Keep in any pen, housing, or enclosure situate within 4 chains from the margin of the Lake any fowls, ducks, or geese; or
- (d) Make or maintain any cesspool, open ditch, or gutter for the reception, disposal, or conveyance of drainage from any house, factory, yard, or premises; or
- (e) Cause, suffer, or allow any sewerage or drainage of any description from any house, factory, yard, or premises of which he is the owner or occupier to flow in any open ditch, drain, or gutter towards the Lake or be upon or in the soil of the land whereon such house, factory, yard, or premises are situate in such a manner or position that such sewerage or drainage is likely by percolation or by mixture with rain water or other means to reach or contaminate the Lake; or
- (f) Allow or suffer any septic tank or any trap or manhole connected therewith to overflow; or
- (g) Knowingly allow or suffer any septic tank, grease-trap, soil pipe, waste pipe, drain, or sewer belonging to him or under his control and in use to be defective; or
- (h) Being the owner or occupier of any house, factory, or other premises, use, suffer, allow, or permit to be used any new privy, urinal, bath, sink, lavatory basin, or wash-tub, or any pipe or drain connected therewith, until the same shall have been completed in a proper and workmanlike manner and in accordance with this by-law to the satisfaction of the Secretary, and the person connecting, effecting, or doing such work shall have obtained a certificate under the hand of the Secretary that such work has been examined and found to have been completed in accordance with this by-law; or
- (i) Construct, establish, or maintain any new privy, urinal, bath, sink, lavatory basin, or wash-tub unless the same be so connected by pipes and closed drains made in accordance with this by-law with a public sewer situated and discharging outside the gathering-area as to enable the drainage from such new privy or other works aforesaid within the gathering-area to fall, flow, or, by existing and effective sanitary works, to be carried off to such outside sewer: Provided that nothing contained in the foregoing part of this subclause shall apply to any such new sanitary works serving houses existing at the date of coming into force of this by-law. No material shall be used for soil pipes, waste pipes, or closed drains within the gathering-area other than drawn lead, screwed galvanized wrought iron, cast iron, or other material approved by the Board. No person shall commence or construct or establish any such new privy, urinal, or bath, or commence to establish or lay any soil pipe, waste pipe, or drain from any such privy, urinal, or bath, or any new sink, lavatory basin or wash-tub within the gathering-area unless he be a plumber or drainer licensed by a local authority, nor until a written permit for the work shall have been obtained from the Secretary upon written application in that behalf. Every person on whose land with his consent or on whose behalf any such new privy, urinal, bath, sink, lavatory basin or wash-tub shall be commenced, erected, established, or maintained shall comply with, and cause all persons commencing, erecting, or constructing the same to comply with all the provisions of this by-law relating thereto; or
- (j) Cast, bury, or deposit any night-soil, refuse, rubbish, or noxious, noisome, or offensive animal or vegetable matter in any position where it is or is likely to become mixed with the water of the Lake or is likely to contaminate the water of the Lake or render the same unfit for domestic use.

17. No person shall except with a written permit from the Secretary, erect or establish any new building of any kind upon or over the Lake or upon or over any part of the shore thereof.

PENALTIES.

18. (a) Every person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5), or where the breach is a continuing one then for a penalty not exceeding two pounds (£2) for every day or part of a day during which such breach continues.

(b) The continued existence in a state contrary to any of the provisions of this by-law of any work or thing shall be deemed a continuing offence within the meaning of this clause.
