Portland Cement Limited a duly incorporated company having its registered office at Auckland in the Provincial District of Auckland in New Zealand (hereinafter called "the company" which expression shall where the context so requires or admits be deemed to mean include and bind the company and its successors and assigns) of the one part and Ernest Hall of Warkworth in the Provincial District of Auckland aforesaid Farmer (hereinafter called "the purchaser" which expression shall where the context so requires or admits be deemed to mean include and bind the said Ernest Hall his executors administrators and assigns) of the other part Whereby it is agreed as follows:—

1. The company agrees to sell and the purchaser agrees to purchase all that piece or parcel of land more particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written and delineated by the plan drawn hereon edged red together with all the rights and appurtenances thereto belonging at or for the price or sum of one thousand and seventy-two pounds ten shillings of which sum the company hereby acknowledges to have received the sum of fifty pounds

2. The purchaser shall pay to the company the balance of the said purchase-money in manner following that is to say two hundred pounds on the thirty-first day of December one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three and the remainder namely the sum of eight hundred and twenty-two pounds ten shillings on the thirtieth day of September one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one

3. The purchaser shall pay to the company interest at the rate of six pounds per centum per annum from the thirtieth day of September one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one upon the balance of purchase-money from time to time owing by equal quarterly payments on the last days of December March June and September in each year the first of such payments to be made on the last day of December one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one

4. The purchaser shall be at liberty on the execution of these presents to enter into the occupation and possession of the said premises or any part thereof

5. The company will pay all rates taxes and outgoings payable in respect of the said premises up to the thirtieth day of September one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one after which the same shall be borne and paid by the purchaser

6. The purchaser shall during the continuance of this agreement insure and keep insured in the name of the company all buildings erected or that may hereafter be erected on the said land in some responsible insurance office to be nominated by the company against loss or damage by fire in the full insurable value thereof or to the amount owing from time to time hereunder and will at the request of the company

hand over and deposit with it the policy or policies issued for every such insurance and will seven days before the same respectively fall due and payable produce and hand over to the company the receipt or receipts for the annual premiums in respect of such insurance and in default thereof it shall be lawful for (but not obligatory upon) the company to insure and keep insured the said buildings as aforesaid and the purchaser shall on demand pay to the company all premiums and sums of money expended by it in or about every such insurance together with interest thereon at the rate of eight pounds per centum per annum to be computed from the time or respective times of advancing the same and until repaid all such sums of money with interest thereon as aforesaid shall be a charge upon the said lands and hereditaments in addition to the said purchase-money and all sums of money received under or by virtue of any such insurance against fire as aforesaid shall be forthwith applied in or towards rebuilding reinstating and repairing the buildings or building for the destruction or damage whereof such moneys may be received

7. The purchaser shall and will during the continuance of this agreement keep and maintain the said premises and all buildings fences hedges gates ditches drains and all other erections and improvements that now are or may hereafter be made or erected on the said land in good clean and substantial repair order and condition

8. The purchaser will keep the said land free and clear of all gorse briar brambles Californian and Canadian thistles and other noxious vegetation and from rabbits and will comply with and indemnify the company against all liability under the provisions of the Noxious Weeds Act 1908 and every statutory amendment or modification thereof for the time being subsisting

9. The company reserves to itself its successors and assigns—

(a) The right to carry on its business as a cement-manufacturer at its manufactory or at any other factory or works that may be established by the company on its property at Mahurangi being allotments thirty-eight and forty-seven and parts of allotments forty-six forty-eight forty-nine sixty-seven sixty-eight sixty-nine and seventy of the Parish of Mahurangi in the usual way and without interference from the purchaser his executors administrators or assigns and to discharge and let escape aerially over and upon the piece of land firstly above described from the smoke stacks chimneys and other parts of the said manufactory without let or hindrance and for all time hereafter smoke soot ashes fine sand portland cement dust clinker hydraulic lime and other lime dust and other like matter and noxious fumes and vapours created and arising and escaping from the smoke stacks chimneys and other parts of the said manufactory in the ordinary course of the quarrying and mining of limestone and other rock and the crushing burning grinding manufacture and preparation for sale by the company of Portland cement clinker hydraulic and other limes and other similar substances or materials without being liable or responsible for any damage that may be occasioned thereby to the land described in the Schedule hereto and such aerial discharge of smoke soot ashes fine sand Portland cement dust clinker hydraulic and other lime dust and noxious fumes and vapours as aforesaid shall in no wise be construed a nuisance now or hereafter and this reservation shall be and be deemed to be appurtenant to the property of the company above described being allotments thirty-eight and forty-seven and parts of allotments forty-six forty-eight forty-nine sixty-seven sixty-eight sixty-nine and seventy of the Parish of Mahurangi provided always and the company doth hereby for itself and its assigns covenant with the purchaser his executors administrators and assigns that the company and its assigns shall and will at all times thereafter use all reasonable efforts and adopt all reasonable means so as to cause as little inconvenience annoyance or injury as practicable to the purchaser and to the aforesaid land of the purchaser and to minimize the injurious effect to the purchaser and his said land of the company's operations in the course of the said business

(b) All limestone marl clay coal and other mineral stone or earth formations now being in upon or under the said land the sole right liberty and license to work quarry excavate or in other manner extract the same from the earth and also the right liberty and license at any time or from time to time to erect plant and machinery on and tramways (aerial or otherwise) on or over the said land or any part thereof and from time to time to take down and remove and re-erect or reconstruct the same and from time to time hereafter to enter upon the said land with or without workmen and others and with or without horses carts or other vehicles and to pass and repass over the said land or any part thereof and to win remove and carry away and convert to its or their own use all such limestone marl clay coal mineral stone or earth formation which may be extracted from the said land provided that the company its successors and assigns shall do as little damage as possible to the surface of the said land or any buildings or

improvements on the same and (subject as hereinafter mentioned) any damage so caused and the amounts to be paid in respect of any temporary or permanent loss of the use of the said land through or by the exercise of the rights hereby conferred shall be the subject of compensation to be paid by the company its successors or assigns and to be ascertained if the parties cannot otherwise agree by arbitration of two arbitrators one to be appointed by the company and the other by the purchaser such arbitration to be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration Act 1908 such compensation however as regards land used or taken as aforesaid shall in no case exceed a sum which will bear the same proportion to the total purchase-money paid to the company for the whole of the said land as the area of the land so used and taken bears to the total area sold to the purchaser and as regards buildings shall be limited to and assessed and payable only in respect of one dwellinghouse and farm buildings erected on such land

(c) The full and free right for all time of entering upon and passing and re-passing with or without horses carriages carts and other vehicles at all times over the said land to and from any other adjoining land belonging to the company or over or in respect of which the company may have or possess any right easement or grant to the end and intent that the right of way herein reserved shall enable the company to exercise without hindrance the right easement or grant vested in it over or in respect of such other land and obtain the full benefit and advantage therefrom

(d) The right liberty and license to take and convert to its own use the water from all or any of the streams running over or through the said land and to enter upon the said land at all times for the purpose of taking such water and to erect upon the said land any plant or machinery water-pipes or races in such manner as may be considered advisable for the purpose of taking and conducting such water and to enter on such land from time to time for the purpose of inspecting renewing repairing relaying or removing any of such pipes or water-races and it is hereby agreed and declared that the provisions of this section including the right of entry herein granted shall *mutatis mutandis* apply to any machinery plant water-pipes or water-races already existing on the said land provided that in the exercise of this right the company shall not deprive the purchaser of such amount of water as the purchaser shall require for all his own reasonable domestic purposes as occupant of such land

10. The company shall upon payment by the purchaser in manner aforesaid of the whole of the said purchase-money and interest that may be due and owing thereon execute to the purchaser at his request a proper conveyance transfer or other assurance of the said land free from encumbrances except as provided by clauses nine and eleven hereof such conveyance transfer or other assurance to be prepared by and at the expense of the purchaser

11. The company shall not be liable to erect or maintain or contribute towards the cost of erecting or maintaining any dividing or boundary fence between the said piece of land and any adjoining land owned by the company but this proviso shall not enure to the benefit of any purchaser of such adjoining land from the company

12. In case the purchaser shall make default in payment of the balance of the said purchase-money on or before the thirtieth day of September one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one or of the interest thereon at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed and provided for payment thereof or within twenty-eight days thereafter respectively or in case the purchaser shall fail or neglect to observe and perform the several agreements on his part contained in these presents then in any of such cases it shall be lawful for the company at its option to enforce this present sale and in such case the whole of the unpaid purchase-money and interest shall then be due and at once payable or rescind this agreement in which case all moneys theretofore paid shall be forfeited to the company as and for liquidated damages or to resell the said land at such times and places and in such manner upon credit or for cash by public auction or private contract as it shall think fit and in case of a resale the increase (if any) in the purchase-money shall be retained by the company and the deficiency (if any) shall be made good by the purchaser and be recoverable as liquidated damages

13. In case this agreement shall be rescinded under the power in that behalf contained in the preceding paragraph hereof the purchaser shall immediately on being requested so to do by the company by notice in writing signed by it and served upon the purchaser either personally or by being affixed to some conspicuous part of the said premises deliver up to the company possession of the said land and premises and the purchaser shall on every such default and after service of such notice have no right title or license whatsoever to remain in possession of the said land and premises or any part thereof and it shall be lawful for the company at any time

thereafter to take possession as it would be lawfully entitled to do if the purchaser had been a person in possession of the said land and premises without right title or license

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Town District of Johnsonville shall be altered by including therein the area described in the First Schedule hereto, such area being now portion of the County of Makara; and that the boundaries of the said town district, with such alteration as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

Imperial Economic Conference, 1932.

WITH reference to the Imperial Economic Conference which is to be held this year, at which it may be necessary to consider the conclusion of trade agreements between New Zealand and other parts of the British Empire, the New Zealand Government desires that it should be in possession of the fullest possible information that might assist them in dealing with the matters which may arise.

The necessary statistical data have either been obtained or are in process of being obtained. The Committee of Cabinet which has been appointed has now entered upon a consideration of the general principles which will form the basis of the policy to be adopted by the Government at that Conference.

To assist them in their work it has been decided to afford those interested an opportunity of supplying information regarding—

(1) Any goods or any classes of goods upon which or with respect to which it is considered—

- (a) That the duties in any other part of the Empire on New Zealand goods should be altered; or
- (b) That the duties in New Zealand on goods produced or manufactured in any other part of the Empire or in any foreign country should be altered; or
- (c) That any action at present taken by way of restriction, limitation, or control respecting the importation or exportation of goods into or from any part of the Empire or otherwise should be altered; or
- (d) That any action by way of quota schemes, bulk-purchase schemes, or otherwise should be adopted in any part of the Empire to restrict, limit, or control the quantity of goods which may be imported into or exported from any other part of the Empire.

(2) Any other matters affecting the trade of New Zealand or any other part of the Empire which would be of assistance in dealing with the various matters which may arise.

It is desired that in any representations which are made the reasons therefor should be fully stated, and that all such representations should reach this office not later than 30th April, 1932.
