WHEREAS it is enacted by section one hundred and fifty-eight of the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called “the said Act”), that where the foreshore outside the limits of a harbour is not vested in any Harbour Board or other local authority the Governor-General may, by Order in Council, grant for a period not exceeding twenty-one years, the control of such part or parts thereof as he thinks fit to any local authority, Domain Board, or persons acting as trustees for the inhabitants of the locality, upon such conditions as may be prescribed in the Order :

And whereas the foreshore hereinafter described is not vested in any Harbour Board or other local authority, and the Karitane Domain Board (hereinafter called “the Board”) has applied to the Governor-General in Council for the control thereof :

And whereas it is desirable that the control should be granted to the Board :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive

B

Council, doth hereby grant to the Board the control of those portions of the foreshore as described in the First Schedule hereto, and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

FIRSTLY, that portion of the foreshore of the Waikouaiti River commencing at the junction of Holburn and Heyskar Streets, and extending to the eastern side of Kilda Street; and, secondly, that portion of the foreshore of the Pacific Ocean commencing at the south-western corner of the Recreation Reserve and extending three-quarters of a mile south-westwards to the southern end of the Puketeraki Beach. As the same is shown, coloured red, on plan marked M.D. 7061, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term “Minister” means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. In these conditions the term “foreshore” means all land between high-water mark of ordinary spring tides and low-water mark of ordinary spring tides.

3. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore as shown, coloured red, on plan marked M.D. 7061, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress out and over the said foreshore without payment.

5. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provision of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are or may hereafter be in force.

6. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph cables that are at present or may be at any time laid down within the said area of foreshore.

7. The Board may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games, and may by by-law fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts : Provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed six in any one year.

8. The Board may, subject to the provisions of section 171 of the Harbours Act, 1923, erect, or license, or permit the erection of bathing-sheds or boat-sheds on the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto, and may make by-laws regulating the use thereof, and may fix charges for such use : Provided that the funds so received shall be expended in improving the foreshore for the benefit of the public.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to remove, or cause to be removed, any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

10. By-laws made by the Board under the said Act in respect of the foreshore shall not have effect unless and until approved in writing by the Minister.

11. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for twenty-one years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

12. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Board six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Board in New Zealand.

NEW INTERNATIONAL CODE OF SIGNALS.

THE British edition of the new International Code of Signals which it is intended shall be brought into force on 1st January, 1934, has been published.

The British edition will be followed in due course by the issue of six other standard editions of the code in French, German, Italian, Japanese, Norwegian, and Spanish.

Pending the coming into international operation of the new codes, it is hoped that masters and officers of British ships will take such opportunities as occur of familiarizing themselves with the new code and its procedure. A Notice to Mariners will be issued later suggesting that the code should be practised between British ships as from the 1st January, 1933, and indicating the procedure to be adopted by ships desiring to communicate in the new code. Later, when the various foreign editions are available, opportunities will occur for using the code between British ships and ships of other nationalities.

The new code, while mainly for the use of ships, provides also a considerable number of signals suitable for the use of aircraft. It consists of two volumes, Vol. I for visual and sound signalling, and Vol. II for radio signalling.

The new visual code makes use of twenty-six alphabetical flags, ten numeral flags, and three flags known as "substitutes," in place of the twenty-six alphabetical flags of the existing code. It thus enables numbers to be signalled directly. Further, by means of the "substitutes," signals can be made in which there are repeated letters or numbers. Such signals cannot, as a rule, be made by the present code unless a ship has two or more complete sets of the existing signalling flags. In the new code, new square flags have been introduced for the letters C, D, E, F, and G: and the pendants (or pennants), which in the existing code represent these letters, are used to denote the numerals 1 to 5 respectively, new pendants having been introduced to denote the remaining numerals 0 and 6 to 9.

Certain alterations in the meanings of the single-letter signals have been made in the new code, and the two-letter signals have been completely revised, though certain important two-letter signals such as NC, JD, and PT retain their old and well-established meanings. The three-letter signals have been completely revised and brought up to date. The geographical section has been entirely rewritten.

Vol. II (for radio signalling) is the first official international wireless telegraphy code issued specially for the use of the merchant and air services. It contains full instructions for use, including advice as to the best methods of compiling code messages so as to avoid difficulties of translation, a table for correcting corrupt groups, a general vocabulary, and a geographical section. An interesting feature of this volume is the case-stating system embodied in the medical

section. The object of this system is to enable ships which do not carry a doctor to send code messages to other ships or coast stations asking for medical advice or assistance. The system is quite complete in itself, and is so arranged that, when all the editions of the code are in operation, it will enable communications regarding medical matters to be made between ships of different nationalities, thus avoiding difficulties of language.

The code may be purchased at Mercantile Marine Offices in the Dominion, after about 31st October, 1932. Intending purchasers should make early application to the Marine Department.

NOTE.—On the whole a fine but cloudy autumn month. Precipitation was 24 per cent. below the mean of previous years. Total bright sunshine, 132.7 hours, 40 per cent. of the possible, and seven sunless days. Lightning was seen on the 8th, and fog was in evidence on the 28th. Mean dew-point at 9 hours, 50.4°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.365 in.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1932.

General.—The principal characteristics of the weather in April were mild and humid conditions and an absence of wind. The greater part of the country had more than the average rainfall, but southern Wairarapa is still very dry. The prospects for winter feed for stock in the latter district are very poor. There is some shortage, also, about Taihape. Otherwise, conditions in the North Island are remarkably good. Feed is abundant, particularly in northern Taranaki, Auckland, and Hawke's Bay. Milk yields are being well maintained for the time of year, and stock are in good condition. In the South Island there has never been a real recovery in some of the eastern districts, particularly parts of Canterbury, from the summer dry spell. Pests have been rather abundant, and the growth of pasture has been rather weak and with a lack of nourishing properties. Nevertheless, in the greater part of the Island, there has been good growth during April, and conditions are satisfactory. Mushrooms have everywhere been unusually plentiful.

Rainfall.—Rain was below normal in parts of the Bay of Plenty area, in all of Wellington except the eastern coastal portion, and in much of Nelson and the west coast of the South Island. Elsewhere there was an excess, which in many cases was considerable. Even when there was no rain, much of the weather was damp, and in the North Island, especially, showers were frequent.

Temperatures.—After a prolonged period with temperatures in nearly every month below normal, it is pleasing to record that April was almost everywhere somewhat warmer than the average. This was most noticeable in the interior of the North Island. A few frosts were recorded, but they were not severe. Vegetation was practically undamaged. The high ranges received a few light falls of snow.

Wind.—The absence of wind was one of the most pleasing features of the weather. There were very few strong northerly winds, and southerlies generally prevailed. A strong north-easterly gale blew in the North on the 27th and 28th.

Sunshine.—There was more cloud than usual, and sunshine was, in consequence, considerably below the average. There were, however, some very fine days.

Pressure Systems.—Intense anticyclones were a feature of the weather charts, the pressure exceeding 30.4 inches on several occasions.

Rain was widespread on the 4th and 5th, with heavy falls in the North, when a rather irregular westerly depression crossed the Dominion.

The next rainy period culminated on the 10th, when a shallow cyclone crossed the South Island. Rain was practically general, with many heavy falls. On this occasion there were some very heavy rains in Canterbury and Otago.

A series of westerly depressions passing between the 20th and 23rd brought rains to districts with a westerly aspect.

The most notable storm of the month was, however, one which began as a severe tropical cyclone in the New Hebrides on the 25th. This cyclone moved in a south-south-easterly direction, and on the 28th had reached the neighbourhood of Cape Maria van Diemen. Thence it passed slowly down the east coast. Heavy rain began in the far North on the 27th and extended southwards, conditions being still unsettled at the end of the month. In North Auckland the falls were very heavy on the 27th, and there was some flooding. On the 28th and 29th the area of heaviest rain had moved to Hawke's Bay, and most of the rivers in that Province were in high flood. At Anawai, near Havelock North, 9.47 inches was recorded on the 29th, and many places had over 4 inches in 24 hours. Considerable damage was done by the floods, but ample warning had been given, and at a critical stage the rain moderated. Marlborough and North Canterbury also experienced heavy rains during this period, and few places escaped altogether.
