1. PLANS.

THE licensee shall forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister")—

- (a) Full detailed drawings and specifications of the diverting weirs;
- (b) Drawings showing how and in what manner the water is diverted;
- (c) Contour-plans showing difference in level of water due to the construction of the headworks;
- (d) Drawings giving full particulars of any tunnels, aqueducts, and pipe-lines used in conveying the water from the headworks to the power-station;
- (e) Drawings showing the arrangement of the generating, switching, and transforming plant in the power-station.

2. UTILIZATION OF THE WATER.

The said water shall be used under this license solely for the purpose of generating electricity.

3. LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said water shall be taken from Scott's Creek, situated in Pt. Run 2230, Block II, Lauder Survey District, Vincent County, Otago Land District, as indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 83441 (hereinafter referred to as "the said plan"), deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized, subject to the conditions herein contained, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the position of the said works being indicated on the said plan:—

- (a) Headworks consisting of dam and necessary intakes;
- (b) Pipe-line leading from head-race to the power-house hereinafter referred to; also tail-race from the power-house to Scott's Creek;
- (c) Power-house with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity;
- (d) Transmission and other lines over the routes shown on the said plan;

(e) Such further transmission and other lines within the premises of the licensee as may from time to time be required. Any extensions or alterations of lines pursuant to this paragraph shall be made only after compliance with the provisions of clauses 21, 22, and 23 of the regulations.

5. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

The licensee shall maintain the works used under this license in proper working-order during the continuance of such license.

6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of twenty-one years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine, but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

7. RENTAL.

The licensee shall in respect of this license pay to the District Engineer, Public Works Department, Dunedin, a yearly rental of 4s. per kilowatt of maximum output generated during each and every year from 1st April, 1932, with a minimum of 7s. per annum. The output either shall be recorded by means of a watt-hour meter installed by the licensee, or, failing such installation, shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generating plant installed.

8. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said creek, except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it: Provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said creek.

9. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

10. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon remove from the ground (if so required by the Minister) all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment of compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

11. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (c) of clause 5 of the regulations.

The generating and transmission voltage shall be approximately 115 volts between the terminals.

12. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to impose any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensee of the authority hereby granted; but the licensee shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensee of any of the powers granted by this license.

13. BED OF CREEK NOT LEASED.

Nothing herein shall be held to constitute a lease from the Crown of the bed of the creek shown on the said plan, nor shall the provisions of Part IX of the Property Law Act, 1908, apply to this license.

14. DEFAULT.

If the licensee fails or neglects to observe any of the conditions or obligations imposed by this license, then and in any such case the provisions of clauses 229 and 230 of the regulations shall apply to the breach of any such condition or obligation.

15. ALTERATIONS TO WORKS.

In the event of the licensee at any time desiring to make alterations to the works involving a departure from the location or type of construction shown on the approved plan, she shall first submit for the Minister's approval plans showing such new location and [or] type of construction as it is proposed to adopt, and with such approval the alterations may be carried out.

16. INSPECTION OF WORKS.

The Inspecting Engineer of the Public Works Department or any other person empowered in that behalf by the Minister shall at all times, both during and after the construction of the works, have free access to and liberty to inspect such works so as to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

17. CONTRACT BETWEEN LICENSEE AND CROWN.

This license shall be deemed to constitute a contract as between the licensee and His Majesty the King, and may be enforced by and against either party accordingly.

18. REQUIREMENTS OF OTAGO CENTRAL ELECTRIC-POWER BOARD AND THE VINCENT COUNTY COUNCIL.

Any Electric-power Board, duly constituted in terms of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, or any Act passed in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof, if its district or outer area includes the area on which this plant is installed or which is supplied therefrom, or the Crown, shall have the right, at any time during the currency of this license, to purchase and take over the licensee's installation at a valuation to be agreed upon between the said Board or the Crown, as the case may be, and the licensee; and, failing such agreement, at a valuation to be fixed by a single arbitrator to be appointed pursuant to the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1908, and thereupon the Governor-General may by Order in Council revoke this license.

Regulations under the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1929, and Section 3 of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1932, governing the Purchase of Private Lands, Advances for Improvements on same, and Advances for the Purchase of Stock and Chattels.

THE RIGHT HON. G. W. FORBES, PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section eleven of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1929, and by section three of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1932, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said sections of the said Acts, and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall come into force on the day of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

PART I.

Regulations governing the Purchase of Private Lands pursuant to Section 3 of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1932.

INTERPRETATION.—In this Part of these regulations "Board" means the Dominion Land Purchase Board.

1. Any person who is "landless" within the meaning of section 113 (3) of the Land Act, 1924, may make application to the Dominion Land-purchase Board for an advance for the purchase of private rural land as hereinafter provided.

2. Every application for an advance under section 3, subsection (1), of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1932, shall be in such form as the Board may from time to time require, and shall be forwarded to the Land-purchase Controller, Wellington.

3. Every application shall be for an advance to complete the purchase from the owner or owners of part only of a property held as an estate in fee-simple, and shall be accompanied by an option to purchase the fee-simple of that part of such property in such form as the Board may from time to time require, given by or on behalf of the owner or owners thereof to the applicant; such option shall be open for a period of not less than eight weeks, and shall be deemed to have lapsed and become void in the event of the application for an advance being declined by the Board. Two or more properties held in fee-simple in the same district, though not adjoining or adjacent to one another, but owned and farmed by the same owner or owners, shall each be deemed to form part of an estate in fee-simple for the purposes of these regulations.

4. The applicant, on lodging his application, shall submit to the Board a plan showing the proposed scheme of subdivision as between himself and the vendor(s); and, when called upon to do so, shall deposit with the Commissioner the sum of £2 2s., being valuation fee.

5. No application shall be accepted if the residue of the vendor's property, after the disposal of the land the subject of the application, shall be insufficient for the adequate maintenance of the vendor and his family. The decision of the Board in this respect shall be final.

6. The amount advanced hereunder to any applicant for the purchase of land shall not exceed such percentage of the purchase-price (as ratified by the Board) as the Board may approve, and in no case shall the percentage be greater than 90 per centum.

7. All moneys advanced under this Part of these regulations shall, together with interest thereon at the rate of 6 per cent., be repayable by half-yearly instalments over a period of thirty-six years and a half. Every half-yearly instalment shall consist partly of interest and partly of principal, and shall be calculated and apportioned in accordance with the table in the Second Schedule to these regulations.

8. All moneys advanced shall be secured by first mortgage over the land purchased, such mortgage to be in such form as the Minister may from time to time approve, including covenants, conditions, and provisions to the following effect:—

(a) The mortgagor shall reside continuously upon the land, the subject of the mortgage, so long as any portion of the moneys secured by the mortgage remain unpaid. Non-residence or the leasing or subleasing of the land, without the written consent of the Land Board having been first had and obtained, shall be deemed to be a breach of the covenants of the mortgage.

(b) The transfer or other disposition of the mortgagor's interest in the land, the subject of the mortgage, shall not be permitted (save pursuant to the will or on the intestacy of the mortgagor) without the written consent of the Minister on the recommendation of the Board; and any transfer without consent shall be deemed to be a breach of the covenants of the mortgage.

(c) The mortgagor shall pay all rates, taxes, and other outgoings, and will keep the mortgagee indemnified in respect thereof.

(d) All the covenants, powers, and provisions implied in mortgages by the Land Transfer Act, 1915, shall be deemed to be included in all mortgages pursuant to these regulations, save where the same are expressly modified or negatived therein.

(e) If the mortgagor shall make default for fourteen days in the full and punctual payment of any moneys intended to be secured by the mortgage, or the interest thereon, the power of sale and incidental powers conferred upon mortgagees by the Land Transfer Act, 1915, may be exercised upon giving to the mortgagor one calendar month's notice of the intention of the mortgagee.

(f) If and whenever the mortgagor makes any default as in the last preceding clause or in the faithful observance and performance of any other covenant or condition on his part contained or implied in the mortgage, it shall be lawful for the mortgagee to call up and compel payment of all principal, interest, and other moneys for the time being owing under the security, notwithstanding that the time or times appointed for payment thereof may not have arrived.

(g) The mortgagor will not further mortgage his estate or interest in the land except with the written consent of the Minister on the recommendation of the Board.

9. In order to encourage the early payment of the instalments of principal and interest payable for any advance granted under this Part of these regulations the following provisions shall apply with respect to every such instalment:—

(a) If the mortgagor (not being in arrears with any previous instalment or other payment due for any advance made under these regulations) pays an instalment on or before its due date, or not later than the first day of the next succeeding month, he shall be entitled to a rebate of interest of one-half per centum per annum.

(b) For the purposes of this clause an instalment shall be deemed to have been paid within the aforesaid period if within that period it is in course of transmission by post to the Receiver of Land Revenue though not actually received by him.

10. The mortgagor may at any time, without previous notice of intention so to do, pay to the mortgagee the amount (in no case less than £10) of principal included in any number of consecutive half-yearly instalments next succeeding the instalment corresponding to the half-yearly period then current. The payment of any such amount shall not affect the continuity of half-yearly instalments, but the amount of principal and interest included in the succeeding instalments shall be calculated according to the table as if the half-yearly periods corresponding to the instalments of principal so paid had expired, and the period of years during which instalments of principal and interest would have been payable shall be reduced accordingly.

11. A mortgagor may reduce his mortgage debt by payment of a sum of not less than £100, and upon payment being made the unpaid balance of the said debt may be reduced accordingly. A memorandum of adjustment adjusting the half-yearly charges shall be registered, and shall be deemed to vary the terms of the original mortgage to the extent stated in the memorandum of adjustment.

12. It shall not be lawful for any applicant to pay or promise to pay to a vendor any sum or sums in excess of the purchase-price as ratified by the Board or to secure by means of promissory notes or other documents, instruments, or securities the payment of any such sum. If any such payment or promise to pay is made in contravention of this clause the Board shall immediately reject the application; or if an advance shall have been made the Board may immediately call up and demand payment of all advances, together with interest thereon, up to and including the date of payment.

13. No advance shall be made pursuant to this Part of these regulations except upon execution by the vendor of a registrable memorandum of transfer to the applicant of the land.

14. (a) For every application for consent to the transfer of the estate or interest of any mortgagor of any property subject to a mortgage for advances under this Part of these regulations shall be paid a fee of £1 ls.

(b) There shall be paid on every occasion of the production of certificates of title held by the Commissioner a fee of 5s. for the first title and 2s. for each subsequent title.

PART II.

Advances for the Development of Land purchased under Section 3 of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1932.

Interpretation.—In this Part of these regulations “Board” means the Lands Development Board constituted under Part I of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1929.

15. (1) For the purpose of assisting the purchasers of undeveloped land acquired under Part I of these regulations in the development of their holdings the Board may, on the application of the purchaser, authorize the making of advances for the erection of buildings on such land, or for the clearing, draining, fencing, cultivation, grassing, or general improvement thereof. The decision of the Board that any lands are or are not undeveloped within the meaning of this clause shall be final.

(2) No moneys shall be advanced under this Part of these regulations unless and until the Board has received a report on the application from the Land Board of the district in which the land to which the application relates is situated.

(3) No advance shall be made under this Part of these regulations of an amount exceeding 80 per centum of the estimated value of the completed improvements to effect which the advance is made.

16. (1) The amount of any advance for improvements may be paid from time to time by progress payments.

(2) Applications for advances for improvements shall be made on the proper form, and shall be lodged with the Commissioner, together with a valuation fee of £2 2s.: Provided that in the case of any application made in respect of a newly purchased property no fee shall be payable.

(3) If the application is refused without a valuation of the proposed security having been made, the fee so paid shall be refunded.

(4) Advances shall be made on current account and shall bear interest at the rate of 6 per centum per annum, and shall be secured by mortgage in such form, and containing such conditions, as the Minister may from time to time approve.

17. (a) On the cessation of progress payments in respect of advances for improvements the amount owing in respect of such advances may be discharged from the flat mortgage securing such advances, and the amount so discharged shall thereupon be secured by an instalment mortgage over the land in such form and containing such conditions as the Minister may from time to time approve.

(b) All moneys so secured by the last-mentioned mortgage, together with interest thereon at the rate of 6 per centum per annum, shall be repayable by half-yearly instalments over a period of thirty-six years and a half. Every instalment shall consist partly of interest and partly of principal, and shall be calculated and apportioned in accordance with the table in the Second Schedule to these regulations.

(c) The provisions of clauses 9, 10, and 11 of these regulations shall apply to all mortgages executed pursuant to this clause.

18. As an alternative to the execution of a fresh mortgage as provided in clause 17 hereof, the Board may require any advances made for the purpose of effecting improvements to be added to the balance of the principal sum secured by the mortgage under Part I hereof, and the instalments payable thereunder shall be increased accordingly. A memorandum of adjustment adjusting the half-yearly charges shall be registered and shall be deemed to vary the terms of the original mortgage to the extent stated in the memorandum of adjustment.

PART III.

Advances for the Purchase of Stock and Chattels pursuant to Sections 7 and 14 of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1929, as amended by Section 10 of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1932.

Interpretation.—In this Part of these regulations “Board” means the Lands Development Board constituted under the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1929.

19. (1) The Board may, on the application of the lessee or licensee of undeveloped Crown land or settlement land or of the owner of the fee-simple of land in respect of which an advance has been made pursuant to Part I of these regulations, authorize the making of advances for the purchase of live-stock and chattels. The Board shall be the sole judge of the eligibility or otherwise of an applicant under this Part of these regulations to receive such advances.

(2) No advance under this Part of these regulations shall exceed 60 per centum of the estimated value of the stock and chattels upon the security of which the advance is made.

(3) All moneys advanced under this Part of these regulations shall bear interest at the rate of 6 per centum per annum, payable half-yearly on the first days of January and July in each and every year, and shall be secured by an instrument by way of security duly registered under the Chattels Transfer Act, 1924, and shall be collaterally secured by a memorandum of mortgage over the applicant's interest in the land. Such instrument and memorandum of mortgage shall be in such form and contain such conditions as may from time to time be approved by the Minister.

(4) All moneys advanced as aforesaid shall be deemed to be on current account, and shall be repayable on demand, or, if no demand is made, then at the expiration of a period of five years from the date of making the first advance: Provided that the Board may in its discretion extend the period for repayment by a further term not exceeding five years, and may make such conditions as it thinks fit in regard to the reduction of the indebtedness by periodical payments on account of principal.

(5) Applications for advances under this Part of these regulations shall be made in writing to the Commissioner, and shall be accompanied by a fee of £1 ls. to cover cost of valuation and other expenses: Provided that if no valuation is made or expense incurred in connection with the application the fee so paid shall be refunded.

GENERAL REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO PARTS I, II, AND III HEREOF.

20. For the purposes of these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“Commissioner” means Commissioner of Crown Lands for the land district in which is situated the land affected by the subject matter:

“Minister” means the Minister of Lands.

21. All mortgages or other deeds or documents securing repayment of advances or discharging, renewing, or varying any mortgages or other documents as provided in these regulations shall be prepared by such solicitors or other persons as the Dominion Land-purchase Board (in the case of advances under Part I hereof) or the Lands Development Board (in the case of advances under Parts II and III hereof), may from time to time designate.

22. The costs and fees for the preparation and completion of mortgages and other documents shall be determined in accordance with the scale set forth in the First Schedule to these regulations and shall be paid by the mortgagor.

23. All powers conferred upon his Majesty the King as mortgagee by any mortgage to secure repayment of moneys as advanced under these regulations, or pursuant to any law as such mortgagee, may be exercised in his name by the Commissioner, and all actions and proceedings for the recovery of moneys advanced or interest thereon may be taken by the said Commissioner in his own name.

24. All costs, stamp duties, registration fees, and other disbursements in connection with any transfer, mortgage, instrument, or other document prepared pursuant to these regulations shall be paid by the applicant.

25. It shall not be lawful for any person acting as solicitor or agent for any applicant for a loan hereunder to charge any procuration fee in respect thereof.

Hawke's Bay Earthquake (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

BLEDISLOE, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 5th day of July, 1932.

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. G. W. FORBES, PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section sixty-six of the Hawke's Bay Earthquake Act, 1931 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following miscellaneous regulations for the purposes of the said Act.

REGULATIONS.

PART I.

LAND AGENTS' AND AUCTIONEERS' LICENSES.

THE regulations made under the said Act on the 17th day of August, 1931, and published in the *Gazette* on the 20th day of the same month, at page 2314, as amended by the regulations made under the said Act on the 10th day of February, 1932, and published in the *Gazette* on the 18th day of the same month, at page 320, with respect to Land Agents' and Auctioneers' Licenses, shall, in so far as they apply to licenses in the Magistrates' Court at Wairoa, be deemed to have continued in force and to remain in force until the 31st day of March, 1933.

PART II.

NAPIER TOWN-PLANNING.

1. This part of these regulations may be cited as "The Napier Town-planning Regulations, 1932."

2. This part of these regulations shall be read together with and be deemed to form part of the Napier Town-planning Regulations, 1931 (hereinafter called "the principal regulations").

3. Regulation 31 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by deleting the words "by a Compensation Court constituted as provided by that Act", and by substituting therefor the following words: "under Part V of these regulations".

4. The principal regulations are hereby amended by adding thereto the following regulation:—

"51. In determining the amount of any compensation to be awarded, the Court shall take into account by way of deduction from the amount of compensation to be awarded any betterment increase found by the Court to exist in respect of any land of the claimant, notwithstanding that no claim for betterment increase may have been made by the Council under or within the time provided by Regulations 15 and 16 hereof."

PART III.

STATUTORY LAND CHARGES.

1. This part of these regulations shall be read together with the Hawke's Bay Earthquake (Rehabilitation Securities) Regulations, 1931.

2. In this part of these regulations—

"Charge" means a charge on land arising under section 47 of the said Act in respect of moneys lent or granted under Part II of that Act, and includes every separate charge arising upon the apportionment of a charge as hereinafter provided:

"Registered," in relation to any charge or to any release of a charge, means registered in accordance with the provisions of the Statutory Land Charges Registration Act, 1928.

3. The powers conferred on the Minister of Finance by subsection (2) of section 49 of the said Act shall be deemed to include and always to have included the power to release from any charge any part of the land affected thereby, and the power to apportion any charge between two or more parts of the land affected thereby.

4. Where any part of the land affected by a charge has been released therefrom a release of the charge may be registered in respect of such part of the land.

5. (1) When any charge has been apportioned a release thereof may be registered in respect of the whole of the land affected thereby or in respect of any part of such land to which a part of the charge has been apportioned, and each separate charge may be registered at any time after the land affected thereby has been released from the original charge.

(2) Every such separate charge shall when registered have the same priority as the original charge:

Provided that such separate charge shall, so far as regards any land affected thereby, be void as against a purchaser under any deed, contract, or instrument duly registered after the registration of the release of the original charge but before the registration of the separate charge:

Provided, further, that if such separate charge becomes void against a purchaser in accordance with the last preceding proviso, it shall thereupon lose its priority over all mortgages, encumbrances, charges, and interests (if any) that have priority over the interest of such purchaser.

6. (1) For the purpose of registering any release or any separate charge pursuant to clause 4 or clause 5 of this part of these regulations, the forms in the Schedule to the Statutory Land Charges Registration Act, 1928, shall be used with such modifications as may be necessary.

(2) No fee shall be charged for registering any such release or separate charge.

7. (1) No lease, easement, or other encumbrances affecting any land subject to a charge shall be binding upon His Majesty the King except so far as His Majesty has consented thereto.

(2) Any such consent may be executed, for and on behalf of His Majesty, by the State Advances Superintendent.

(3) The State Advances Superintendent may charge such fee as he deems reasonable in respect of any such consent.

8. This part of these regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Gazette*.

PART IV.

PROCEDURE FOR EXECUTING SECURITIES.

1. (1) Where the consent of His Majesty the King is required to any lease, agreement to lease, grant of easement, or other deed, document, or instrument affecting land subject to any mortgage, caveat, deed of covenant, agreement, instrument, or other security for a loan taken in the name of His Majesty the King under Part II of the said Act, such consent may be executed, for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, by the State Advances Superintendent.

(2) The State Advances Superintendent may charge such fee as he deems reasonable in respect of any such consent.

2. Any caveat intended to be lodged to protect a mortgage, deed of covenant, agreement, instrument, or other security taken in connection with any loan granted under Part II of the said Act in respect of any land may be executed, for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, by the State Advances Superintendent.

PART V.

“356B. Any member of the Forces who travels by air, other than by the order of one of the officers mentioned in sub-para. (i) of para. 356A, will so travel at his own risk, and no liability for pension, compensation, or medical expenses will be accepted by the Department in the event of misadventure.

“356C. Paras. 356A and 356B of these regulations do not apply to the N.Z. Permanent Air Force or the N.Z. Air Force (Territorial).”
