IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, and of every other power in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke, as from the date hereinafter mentioned, the Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirtieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, fixing the apportionment of representation on the Hobson Electric-power Board (now the North Auckland Electric-power Board—see Proclamation dated the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the tenth day of the same month), and doth hereby add the Hikurangi Town District to the constituent districts of the North Auckland Electric-power District; and doth hereby make the following provision for the election of representatives of the said constituent districts:—

(1) The first election of the representative of the constituent district of Hokianga Town District shall be held on the day appointed for the next general election of members of the Hikurangi Town Board.

(2) The number of representatives of each constituent district on the said Electric-power Board shall be the number specified in the Second Column hereto opposite the name of that constituent district.

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the trustees under the said Act for the purpose last aforesaid on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the trustees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the trustees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore on which the said wharf is erected, as shown on plan M.D. 7076 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said wharf in accordance with the said plan; such license to be held and enjoyed by the trustees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

1. IN these conditions the terms—

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the maintenance of the said wharf at the site shown on the plan marked M.D. 7076.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the trustees shall pay to the Minister an annual rent of one shilling, payable on demand, such rent to date from the date of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times and upon payment of the proper dues have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf and all rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government Service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The trustees shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections on or in connection with the wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the trustees' own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharf by the trustees shall be applied to keeping such wharf and all erections on or in connection with such wharf in good order and repair.

8. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the above-mentioned wharf and any buildings erected thereon or in connection therewith and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the trustees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings requiring the trustees, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the trustees shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

9. The master of all vessels discharging ballast at the said wharf shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The trustees shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The trustees shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and shall cause such account to be balanced to the 31st day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account, when balanced, to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

12. The trustees shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the said wharf.

13. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the trustees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation thereunder and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

14. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the trustees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

15. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the trustees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the trustees in New Zealand.

16. The trustees shall be liable for any injury which may be caused by the said wharf to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the trustees.

17. In case the trustees shall—

- (1) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days;

then, and in either of the said cases, this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the trustees or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the trustees and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in

Council and the licenses, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred have been revoked and determined.

18. Regulations under the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, relating to the Destruction of Rabbits in the Waihopai Rabbit District.— (Notice No. 3062).

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations relating to the destruction of rabbits in the district under the jurisdiction of the Waihopai Rabbit Board, and doth hereby declare that the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the Gazette.

B

REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING any other means adopted by him, every owner of land on whom a notice to destroy rabbits is served in terms of section 6 of the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, shall adopt one or more of the following means of destroying rabbits—namely, the laying of poison, the fumigation of burrows, the filling-in of burrows:

Provided that if an owner is of opinion that none of the principal means prescribed is the most suitable in his case, he may apply to the Board for permission to use some other means, and the decision of the Board shall be final as to the means to be adopted.

2. Not later than seven days after the service of such notice on an owner of land all trapping on his land shall cease, and thereafter for a period of three months from the date of service of the notice the owner shall not, except with the written permission of the Board and subject to the conditions specified therein, trap rabbits or allow rabbits to be trapped on his land.

3. Every person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £10.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Prisons Act, 1908 (as amended by section sixteen of the Statute Law Amendment Act, 1917), by the Prisons Amendment Act, 1912, by the Prisons Amendment Act, 1919, and by the Crimes Amendment Act, 1910 (as amended by the Crimes Amendment Act, 1920), and of all other statutory and other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter set out.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Prisons Regulations, 1932.
2. These regulations shall be read together with and deemed to form part of the Prisons Regulations, 1925, and these regulations and the Prisons Regulations, 1925, may together be cited as the Prisons Regulations, 1925 and 1932.
3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of August, 1932.
4. Regulations No. 384 to No. 411 (both inclusive) of the Prisons Regulations, 1925, comprising Part XII and Part XIII respectively of those regulations, and the amending Regulations No. 389 and No. 389A, published in *Gazette* No. 31, of 2nd May, 1929, are hereby revoked.
5. Any marks and earnings heretofore allotted or credited to prisoners under the regulations hereby revoked shall remain so allotted or credited as if they had in the first place been allotted or credited under the regulations hereinafter set out.
6. The following regulations are enacted and shall be read as comprising Part XII and Part XIII respectively of the Prisons Regulations, 1925.

PART XII.

MARKS SYSTEM.—PAYMENT TO PRISONERS FOR GOOD CONDUCT AND INDUSTRY.

384. Persons undergoing sentences of imprisonment with or without hard labour, including those sentenced to or ordered to undergo terms of reformatory detention, or declared habitual criminals or habitual offenders, shall be employed at such labour as may be assigned to them by the Controlling Officer.

385. Subject to the exceptions hereinafter contained, there shall be allotted to every prisoner while so employed industry marks as hereinafter provided.

386. No marks shall be allotted to any prisoner in respect of his labour during the first three months of his sentence nor (if he is required to commence his sentence in the probationary grade) until he has passed out of the probationary grade.

387. After a satisfactory record of good conduct and industry for the first three months of his sentence, and after having passed out of the probationary grade, a prisoner who is placed at labour by the Controlling Officer shall be allotted up to eight marks per day, such allotment to be based on the conduct and diligence with which the prisoner applies himself to the tasks assigned to him, and to be made daily by the officer in charge of the prisoner.

388. No prisoner who having escaped from custody is recaptured and returned to prison, or who having been released on probation is returned to prison whilst on probation, either for a breach of the conditions of his probationary license or for a further offence, shall be allotted any marks during the next four months after his return to prison unless the Controller-General otherwise directs.

389. Any prisoner who through physical incapacity or infirmity is deemed to be unable to earn full marks for industry may be allotted such lesser number of marks than eight as the Controlling Officer considers fair and reasonable.

390. On Saturdays and other days when only half a day's work is done, marks shall be allotted at one-half of the full daily rate for the time being allotted to any prisoner, and on wet days or on occasions when for any reason work is interrupted the number of marks allotted shall be computed so as to be in the opinion of the Controlling Officer proportionate to the number of hours of work done.

391. A prisoner who is absent from labour on account of illness shall not be allotted any marks during such absence, except where, on a report from the Controlling Officer, the Controller-General directs that marks at the rate theretofore allotted to the prisoner or at any lower rate shall be allotted to the prisoner in respect of such period of absence.

392. No marks shall be allotted for Sundays, prison holidays, or days on which for any reason prisoners do not proceed to labour, except that, under the authority of a General Order, marks may be allotted to prisoners fully employed on such days, or except under the next succeeding regulation.

393. Cooks, cleaners, and others whose duties require them to work for the greater part of each Sunday or holiday may be allotted for such days the same number of marks as for ordinary working-days unless the Controller-General otherwise directs.

394. Stablemen, drivers, dairymen, and others whose duties require them to work longer hours than those provided for in the routine of the prison may, with the approval of the Controller-General, be allotted additional marks at the rate of one mark for every full hour worked in excess of the routine hours, and, in especially deserving cases, the Controller-General may authorize the allotment of further additional marks.

395. Visiting Justices may, in addition to or in lieu of any punishment imposed under the Prisons Act, direct as a punishment for a prison offence that from the industry earnings credited or to be credited to a prisoner in respect of marks theretofore or thereafter allotted to him there shall be deducted a sum not exceeding ten shillings.

396. On the last Saturday of every month and at the expiration of his sentence there shall be credited to every prisoner in an account kept by the Controlling Officer a sum herein referred to as "industry earnings," computed at the rate of $\frac{3}{4}$ d. for each mark allotted to him.

397. The number of marks allotted to a prisoner and the amount of industry earnings for the time being standing to his credit shall be notified to each prisoner as soon as conveniently may be after the end of every month.

398. Prisoners who are skilled in any trade or occupation upon reception, or who afterwards become so skilled when regularly and continuously employed at such trade or occupation, may, with the prior approval of the Controller-General, be credited with industry earnings at a rate not exceeding 1d. per mark.

399. Subject to the approval of the Controller-General, there may be deducted from the industry earnings theretofore credited or thereafter to be credited to a prisoner the value of any article of departmental property which in the opinion of the Controlling Officer was wilfully damaged, destroyed, or lost through the carelessness or improper conduct of the prisoner, and any expenses incurred in connection with the escape or recapture of the prisoner.

400. The purchase of educational books and equipment, dentures, spectacles, and personal necessities out of industry earnings credited or to be credited to a prisoner may be made with the approval of the Controller-General: Provided that in each case the prisoner shall make an application in writing for any such purchase to be made.

401. The Minister may at any time direct that the amount of the industry earnings credited to a prisoner or any portion thereof shall be paid in special cases to the dependants of the prisoner.

402. Subject to any such direction, and after making allowance for any other authorized disbursements, the balance of industry earnings standing to a prisoner's credit shall be paid to him upon or after his discharge in a lump sum, or by such instalments and subject to such conditions as the Minister may direct.

PART XIII.

PAYMENT OF MAINTENANCE FOR THE SUPPORT OF PRISONERS'
DEPENDANTS.

403. All prisoners (except female prisoners) engaged in productive or useful labour and having dependants in necessitous circumstances who were dependent upon and maintained by the prisoner immediately prior to his arrest or conviction and who are resident in the Dominion shall be known as "wages men."

404. Maintenance grants will be paid to or for the benefit of the dependants of wages men to such amounts and by such instalments and in such manner as the Minister may from time to time generally or in regard to any particular case determine.

405. The Minister may in his discretion determine whether any person is to be deemed a dependant of a wages man, or whether a dependant is in necessitous circumstances or is resident in the Dominion, or any other matter relevant to the payment of a maintenance grant under these regulations.

406. Except as provided by the next succeeding regulation, the amount of maintenance grants paid in respect of any wages man shall not exceed an amount computed at the rate of 6d. for each mark allotted to him under Part XII of these regulations.

407. The amount of maintenance grants paid in respect of any wages man classed as skilled in terms of Regulation 398 shall not exceed an amount computed at 7d. per mark allotted as aforesaid.

408. Maintenance grants to or for the benefit of dependants of female prisoners will be paid to such extent and under such terms and conditions as the Minister shall in any particular case direct.

The University National Bursary Regulations, 1932.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section thirty-six of the Finance Act, 1931 (No. 2), and by the Education Act, 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

I. INTERPRETATION.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the University National Bursary Regulations, 1932.

2. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context,—

"The said Act" means section 36 of the Finance Act, 1931 (No. 2) :

"The Director" means the Director of Education :

"College" includes—

(a) A constituent college of the University of New Zealand ;

(b) A college established in connection with the University of New Zealand ; and

(c) A professional school maintained by a constituent college and for the time being recognized by the University pursuant to its statutes :

"University National Bursary" and "Bursary" mean a bursary awarded and held under the said Act and these regulations :

"Permitted course of study" means a course of study leading to—

(a) A degree of the University ;

(b) A diploma of the University ;

(c) The final diploma of a recognized professional school ; or

(d) A professional examination in Law or Accountancy conducted by the University :

“Date of qualification” means the date of commencement of the University Entrance Scholarship examination conducted by the University at which any person qualifies for a bursary irrespective of the date on which during the course of such examination he first presented himself for examination :

“Supervising Authority” means—

(a) The Chairman of the Professorial Board of a constituent college or college established in connection with the University ;

(b) In other cases, the Principal of any recognized professional school not subject to the Professorial Board of a constituent college :

“University Bursary” means a bursary heretofore awarded pursuant to section 27 of the New Zealand University Amendment Act, 1914, and its amendments.

II. QUALIFICATIONS.

3. No University National Bursary shall be awarded to any person unless—

- (a) He has been resident in the Dominion for three years immediately preceding the date of qualification :
- (b) He has produced to the Director satisfactory evidence of character :
- (c) He was under nineteen years of age on the first day of December nearest to the date of qualification :
- (d) He has qualified for a bursary in accordance with clauses 5 to 8 hereof.

4. Every person seeking to obtain a University National Bursary shall, not later than the 1st day of February in the year following the date of qualification, make application to the Director on the form provided, and such form shall be accompanied by evidence of the qualifications specified in clause 3 hereof.

III. AWARD OF BURSARY.

5. All bursaries shall be awarded to candidates selected in order of merit according to the University Entrance Scholarship examination, subject, however, to the next three succeeding clauses hereof.

6. A candidate may offer himself for examination in subjects the maximum award of marks for which is not less than 1,800 or does not exceed 3,000, and the marks gained by the candidate shall for the purposes of these regulations be adjusted to a maximum of 2,800 marks in such manner as the Director deems equitable.

7. Any person to whom prior to the coming into force of these regulations a University Bursary has been awarded shall be entitled to a University National Bursary in continuation of the benefits of such University Bursary subject to the following conditions :—

- (a) The term thereof shall be computed and all the provisions of these regulations shall apply thereto in like manner as if a University National Bursary under these regulations had been granted to such person at the date when he was awarded a University Bursary.
- (b) The provisions of this clause shall apply where such University Bursary has been postponed, suspended, or rendered dormant pursuant to the statutes of the University in force in that behalf.
- (c) The provisions of this clause shall not apply where such University Bursary has expired, lapsed, or been forfeited.

8. Any person who during the years 1930 and 1931 has qualified for a University Bursary but to whom such University Bursary has not yet been awarded shall be entitled to apply for a University National Bursary upon sitting for the next University Entrance Scholarship Examination to be held after the coming into force of these regulations, and no such person shall be debarred from an award by reason only of not being under nineteen years of age on the 1st day of December next.

IV. TERM OF BURSARY.

9. Except as hereinafter provided, a bursary shall be given for a period of three years.

10. The Director may in his discretion extend any bursary for one additional year on the recommendation of the Supervising Authority.

11. The term for which a bursary is held shall be continuous, save that—

- (a) The Director may in his discretion permit the holding of any bursary to be suspended for a period or periods not longer in the aggregate than one year during its currency ;

- (b) The Director may in his discretion permit the holding of a bursary to be suspended during any period or periods the holder thereof was the holder also of a Teacher's Training College Studentship which does not provide for payment in whole or in part of University tuition fees.

V. LAPSE OF BURSARY.

12. If at the end of any year a report from the Supervising Authority to the Director shows that the bursar has failed—

- (a) Regularly to attend the classes in his course of study ; or
 (b) To make satisfactory progress in the work of those classes ; or
 (c) To be credited by the University with passes in the minimum number of subjects required for the respective year in his permitted course of study—

then the bursary shall forthwith be determined, unless it be shown to the satisfaction of the Director that such failure in regular attendance, satisfactory progress, or being credited as aforesaid was due to illness or other sufficient cause.

13. On receipt of an unfavourable report from the Supervising Authority to the Director on the attendance, progress, diligence, or conduct of a bursar, the Director may at any time determine the bursary.

14. Subject to clause 11, any bursary shall lapse if the bursar does not within fourteen days after notice of the award has been given to him notify the Director of his intention to enter upon a permitted course of study at a college.

15. Any bursary shall lapse if the bursar without the written approval of the Director given on the recommendation of the Supervising Authority does not in due course pursue, or ceases to pursue, the permitted course of study which he first commenced to pursue ; but on such recommendation and with such approval as aforesaid a bursar may change from one permitted course of study to another.

16. If any University tuition fees are with the knowledge of a bursar paid for the benefit of a bursar while he is debarred from enjoying the benefit of a bursary pursuant to these regulations his bursary shall immediately cease and determine.

17. Any University tuition fees paid for the benefit of a bursar while he is debarred from enjoying the benefit of a bursary pursuant to these regulations may be deducted by the Director from any subsequent moneys payable in respect of bursar's tuition fees to the college to which such first-named fees were paid.

VI. CONCURRENT AWARDS.

18. No bursar shall enjoy any pecuniary benefit from a University National Bursary during any period in which he is the holder of any other bursary or any scholarship, exhibition, studentship, or similar award which in the opinion of the Director is reasonably sufficient to provide in whole or in part for the payment of University tuition fees ; but if during the term of the bursary he ceases to be the holder of such scholarship or similar award, and no event has happened to cause the bursary to lapse or be determined under these regulations, then during the remainder of the term of the bursary he shall be entitled to the benefits thereof as hereinafter provided.

VII. BENEFITS OF BURSARY.

19. Every bursary shall be of such an amount (not exceeding £20 in any year) as may be approved by the Minister of Education to be applied towards payment of the tuition fees of the bursar at the college on whose books his name is entered in connection with his permitted course of study.

20. The Minister of Education may from time to time vary the amount of any bursary.

21. Except in a special case and with the approval of the Director, no payment shall be made towards fees for more than one year in connection with tuition in any subject at any one stage.

22. Payments may be made towards fees for tuition not in connection with the bursar's permitted course of study if such tuition is in subjects recommended by the Supervising Authority as being accessory to an Honours Course.

23. All payments in respect of bursaries shall be made directly to the Registrar or Treasurer or other proper officer of the college at which the tuition fees are payable in satisfaction *pro tanto* of the liability of the bursar for payment of such fees.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of the Treaty of Peace with Germany which was signed at Versailles on the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Order, 1920, His Majesty, in right of the Government of New Zealand, is entitled to retain property situated in Western Samoa, and at one time belonging to German nationals or German companies :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority in that behalf conferred upon him by the Treaties of Peace Act, 1921, the Western Samoa Order in Council, 1920, made by His Majesty in Council, and all other powers and authorities in this behalf him enabling, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the New Zealand Reparation Estates Amendment Order, 1932.

2. The New Zealand Reparation Estates Amendment Order, 1930, is hereby amended by deleting subclause (2) of clause 2 thereof, and substituting therefor the following subclauses :—

“(2) All references in the New Zealand Reparation Estates Order, 1920, and its amendments, or in any other Order, or in any ordinance, regulation, or other instrument to the New Zealand Reparation Estates Board or to the Manager of the New Zealand Reparation Estates shall hereafter be deemed to be references to the General Manager of the New Zealand Reparation Estates.

“(3) All references in the New Zealand Reparation Estates Service Order, 1926, and its amendments, to the Administrator of Western Samoa (except the reference thereto in clause 10 of the New Zealand Reparation Estates Service Amendment Order, 1926) shall hereafter be deemed to be references to the General Manager of the New Zealand Reparation Estates.”

Regulations under the Stock Act, 1908, governing the Importation of Sausage-casings into New Zealand.—(Notice No. Ag. 3060).

THE RIGHT HON. G. W. FORBES, PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Stock Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations under the said Act, governing the importation of sausage-casings into New Zealand, made on the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and published in the *Gazette* on the fourth day of the same month, at page 2926, and doth hereby absolutely prohibit the importation into New Zealand of any sausage-casings of animal origin, except where such importation takes place in accordance with the following regulations; and doth hereby declare that such revocation shall take effect and the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. SUBJECT to the provisions of these regulations, sheep, lamb, or hog sausage-casings produced or prepared in the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia, or in any State in the United States of America other than the States of California, Oregon, Nevada, Arizona, or New Mexico may be imported into the Dominion at the ports of Auckland, Gisborne, Napier, New Plymouth, Wellington, Lyttelton, Port Chalmers, Dunedin, or Bluff.

2. Subject to the next succeeding clause of these regulations, every shipment of casings must be accompanied by a declaration in the Form No. 1 in the First Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, signed by the owner, secretary, or manager of the premises where such casings were produced or prepared, declaring that such casings were derived from animals which received ante-mortem and post-mortem veterinary inspection at the time of slaughter, and were found to be healthy and suitable in every way for human consumption; that such casings are sound, healthful, wholesome, and otherwise fit for human consumption, and have not been treated with chemical preservatives or other foreign substances injurious to health, and that the said casings have been handled only in a sanitary manner and were not subjected to contagion prior to exportation.

3. In the case of every shipment of such casings as may by these regulations be imported into the Dominion from the United States of America, such declaration shall include a declaration that such casings were derived from animals which had not been domiciled in any of the States of California, Oregon, Nevada, Arizona, or New Mexico at any time during the period of six months immediately preceding the date of slaughter.

4. On every such declaration there shall be inscribed a certificate in the form No. 2 in the First Schedule hereto, signed by a Government Veterinarian, certifying that he has no reason to doubt the correctness of the above-mentioned declaration in any particular.

5. Notwithstanding that the foregoing provisions of these regulations have been complied with, no sausage-casings for introduction into the Dominion shall be landed in the Dominion without the written permit of an Inspector in the form or to the effect of the Second Schedule hereto.

6. If any sausage-casings are introduced or attempted to be introduced into the Dominion without the prescribed declaration or certificate, or otherwise contrary to these regulations, such casings may be seized by an Inspector, Officer of Customs, or a member of the Police Force, and shall thereupon be destroyed or otherwise dealt with as the Minister of Agriculture directs.

2. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of any such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

6. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself without reasonable cause from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

8. The Board shall have prepared and submitted at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement,

certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserve and the building erected thereon for the purposes of a public library, and shall also afford settlers and residents of Rimu and the surrounding district such facilities for meeting within the said building as may from time to time be determined by the Board: Provided that the Board shall have power to fix reasonable charges for the use of the said building.
