Amending Regulations under Part I of the Fisheries Act, 1908.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 7th day of September, 1932.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and published in the *Gazette* of the seventh day of the following month, at page 1598, regulations were made under the Fisheries Act, 1908:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said regulations in the manner hereinafter prescribed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the fifth section of the Fisheries Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend regulations seventy-nine, eighty, and eighty-one in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby prescribe that the regulations in the said Schedule shall be deemed to be incorporated in and form part of the hereinbefore-recited regulations of the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

SCHEDULE.

79. REGULATION 79 is amended by deleting the word "lower" in the second line of that regulation, and substituting the word "upper."

Regulation 80 is revoked, and the following regulation substituted in lieu thereof:—

"80. No person shall put, stake, set, drag, draw, or place or allow to be put, staked, set, dragged, drawn, or placed for any purpose whatsoever any net of any description, except a landing-net or hand net in the Waihemo and Pleasant Rivers: Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the placing or using of any net other than a stake net in the mouths or entrances of the said rivers and below a line one mile above the mouths or entrances of the said rivers."

Regulation 81 is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted in lieu thereof:—

"81. No person shall put, stake, set, drag, draw, or place or allow to be put, staked, set, dragged, drawn, or placed for any purpose whatsoever any net of any description except a landing-net or hand net in the Waikouaiti River: Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the placing or using of any net other than a stake net in the mouth of the Waikouaiti River or in any portion of such river below the place at which the railway from Christchurch to Dunedin crosses the said river."

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and its Amendments, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations in further amendment of and addition to the regulations made under the said Act on the tenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and published in the *Gazette* on the thirteenth day of the same month, at page nine (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations").

REGULATIONS.

THE principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting the following new regulations 30A, 30B, 30C, and 30D after Regulation 29:—

CONCILIATION COMMISSIONERS.

30A. These regulations shall apply on the resumption of the proceedings of any Council of Conciliation after such proceedings have been adjourned pursuant to the provisions of subsection (6) of section 46 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, or otherwise, and, in particular, after such proceedings have been adjourned pursuant to subsection (2) of section 7 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Amendment Act, 1932, and shall apply at any subsequent meeting of such Council of Conciliation.

30B. These regulations shall extend to a Council of Conciliation constituted prior to the enactment of these regulations, and to any case in which proceedings have been adjourned prior to the enactment hereof.

30C. On such resumption or at any such subsequent meeting any Conciliation Commissioner for the time being holding appointment under section 40 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and authorized to exercise his jurisdiction in the industrial district or districts concerned may from time to time be present and act as a member of the Council in place of the Commissioner who was originally a member of such Council.

30D. All the powers and jurisdiction vested in the Commissioner who was originally a member of such Council shall vest in any Commissioner for the time being present and acting as aforesaid, and such last-named Commissioner shall be deemed to be for the time being a member of such Council.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and published in the *Gazette* of the third day of the following month, at page 2535, regulations were made for trout-fishing in the Auckland Acclimatization District and the waters thereof:

And whereas it is desirable to amend the said regulations of the thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, in the manner hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke clauses three, seven, and thirteen of the hereinbefore-recited Order in Council of the thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and doth hereby substitute the following clauses in lieu thereof.

REGULATIONS.

3. DURING the period from 1st day of October, 1932, to the 30th day of September, 1933, no person shall take trout by any means whatsoever in that portion of the Wanganui River between the Matapuna Railway Bridge and the Victory Bridge at Taumarunui, nor in that portion of the Waipa River between the pit of the Otorohanga Gravel Company, Limited, and the eastern boundary of the Meadowlands Farm main drain, nor during the period from the 1st day of October, 1932, to the 30th day of September, 1934, in the Little Puriri, Omahine, Rapa Rapa, and Kauaeranga Streams.

7. No person shall use as bait any shell-fish, fish-ova, koura, houhou, or matai grub or earthworms, or any bait or lure other than natural or artificial fly, or natural or artificial minnow, or any small indigenous fish, insect, grasshopper, beetle, or spider: Provided that in respect of those rivers specified in Column One of the Schedule hereto no person shall use any bait or lure other than that specified in Column Two of the said Schedule.

13. Every trout not exceeding 12 in. in length from tip of nose to tip of tail taken or caught by any person shall immediately be returned alive, with as little damage or hurt as possible, into the water from which the same has been taken.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and published at page 2534 in the *Gazette* of the third day of the following month, regulations were made for trout and perch fishing in the Wellington Acclimatization District:

And whereas it is desirable to amend the said regulations: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its

amendments, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke Regulations 5, 6, 7, and 16 of the regulations made on the thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and doth hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof, and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall take effect as from the date of publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

"5. No person shall fish for trout, perch, or other acclimatized fish in the upper reaches of the Waikanae River and its tributaries from its junction with the Ngatiawa River.

"6. No lures or baits, other than artificial ones, shall be used in the following rivers and streams and their tributaries: The Wainui-o-Mata; the Wainui tributary of the Whakatiki; the Mungaroa and its tributaries; the Koro Koro; the Akatarawa and its tributaries; the Pukuratahi and its tributaries; the Belmont Stream; the Horokiwi; the Pahautanui and its tributaries (Hutt County); the South Karori; the Porirua; the Kaiwarra (Makara County); the Mangaone; the Otaki and its tributaries, above the railway-bridge; the Waitohu; the Waikawa; the Waikanae, above Buchanan's house; the Mangahao and its tributaries, above and including the dams (2); the Horipiti Dam; the Tokomaru; the Ohau and its tributaries, above the railway-bridge (Horowhenua County); Abbott's Creek; the Mangatarera and the Mangatiriri; the Waipoua and its tributaries; the Ruamahunga and its tributaries, from the Te Ore Ore Road Bridge to its source; the Kourarau Stream, including dams (2), (Wairarapa); the Kahutarawa; the Tiritea (Kairanga County); the Makakahi and its tributaries, within the boundaries of the Eketahuna County; the Mangatānoka and its tributaries, throughout the whole course; the Makuri and its tributaries (Pahiatua County); the Hautapu, southward from Waionuru; the Moawhango: Provided that in the Rangitikei River from the Moawhango Road crossing at the Hawke's Bay boundary to the sea, and in the Oroua River from the Awahuri Bridge to its junction with the Manawatu River, live baits may be used: And provided, further, that in the Hutt River from the Belmont Stream to the Moonshine Bridge no person shall use any lure or bait other than artificial bait and bully.

"7. No person shall use any sinker or weight exceeding the weight of 3 B.B. shot when fishing with live bait in waters where such bait may be used: Provided that weight sinkers may be used for perch-fishing in the Tauherenikau River up to the bridge crossing the river on the Featherston-Martinborough Road, and in the Ruamahunga River up to the bridge crossing the river on the Kahatura Road, and also in the Wairarapa Lake and lagoons.

"(NOTE.—One B.B. shot weighs one-fiftieth of an ounce (avoirdupois) and measures 18/100 of one inch, or between 5 and 6 to one inch.)

"16. No person shall take or catch more than fifteen trout in any one day."

Altering the Boundaries of Wellington and Wanganui Acclimatization Districts.

WHEREAS by a Warrant dated the fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, made under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22 (hereafter referred to as “the said Act”), and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of twelfth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, at page 749, the boundaries of, *inter alia*, the Wellington Acclimatization District and the Wanganui Acclimatization District were defined:

And whereas it is expedient that the boundaries of the said districts be altered:

Now, therefore, I, Charles, Baron Bledisloe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby alter the boundaries of the said districts

so that as on and from the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, the boundaries of the said districts shall be those described under their respective headings in the Schedule hereto.

WELLINGTON ACCLIMATIZATION DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, bounded on the north-west and north generally by the Wanganui Acclimatization District hereinafter described, from the mouth of the Wangaehu River to the Moawhango-Waioru Road; thence northerly along that road to the junction of the Waioru-Tokaanu Road; thence along a right line to Trig. Station and the confluence of the northern branch of the Waipawa River with the Makaroro River to the summit of the Ruahine Range; thence along the summit of the Ruahine Range to a point near the source of the Pourangaki Stream; thence to and along the middle of the Pourangaki Stream and the Kawhatau River to the Rangitikei River; thence down the middle of the Rangitikei River to its intersection by the Awahuri-Bulls Road; thence along the Awahuri-Bulls Road to the Oroua River; thence up the middle of the Oroua River to the North Island Main Trunk Railway; thence along that railway and Stony Creek Road to the Palmerston-Ashhurst Road; thence along that road to the road forming the north-eastern boundary of Sections 454 and 455, Block VIII, Kairanga Survey District; thence along that road to the Manawatu River; thence up the middle of the Manawatu River to a point in line with the northern boundary of Makuri Survey District; thence to and along the northern boundaries of Makuri Survey District, Mount Cerberus Survey District and Waimata Survey District to the mouth of the Waimata River; thence southerly, westerly, and northerly along the sea-coast to the mouth of the Wangaehu River, the place of commencement.

WANGANUI ACCLIMATIZATION DISTRICT.

by the southern side of the said road to its intersection with Alum Creek; thence towards the east generally by Alum Creek and Section 26A; thence by part Section 5 (as described in Schedule to a Proclamation setting apart certain land for State forest purposes, dated 15th February, 1911, and published in *New Zealand Gazette* of 23rd February, 1911, on page 701) across a public road; thence northwards along the western side of that road to the northern boundary of Suburban Section 80; thence towards the south and east by the said land to Sala Street; thence by the northern side of that street across the aforementioned public road; thence towards the east generally by Section 5A to the Puarenga Stream; thence by the said Puarenga Stream and Section 6 (State Forest Reserve) to the northern boundary of Moerangi No. 4 Block; thence towards the south generally by Crown land (the said Moerangi No. 4 Block) to the Rotorua-Taupo Road; thence across that road and by Tihiotonga Block to the westernmost corner of Section 54, Suburbs of Rotorua; thence towards the west generally by the western boundary-lines of Sections 54, 53, and 52, Suburbs of Rotorua, to the Utuhina Stream; thence by the said Utuhina Stream to the point of commencement.

By-laws under the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922, the control and ownership of electric light and power for supply of electric energy to the Borough of Rotorua is vested in the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, as incorporated by the Rotorua Town Act, 1907, and the Rotorua Borough Act, 1922: And whereas in respect of these works the said Department has all the power for the time being conferred by law on Borough Councils, except the power to borrow money or make and levy any special rate:

And whereas by the license granted by the Governor-General in Council as published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 5th November, 1931, the said Department is authorized to generate electricity and erect electric lines within the Borough of Rotorua and portion of the County of Rotorua as set out in the Schedule:

Now, therefore, the said Department, in pursuance of such powers and all other powers thereunto enabling it, doth hereby make the by-laws hereinafter set forth; and doth hereby revoke Part XIII of the Rotorua Town By-laws, 1909, as amended and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 12th October, 1922, and amendments as published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 1st July, 1926, 14th July, 1927, and 23rd January, 1930, and substitutes therefor the following new by-law, and doth hereby declare that the said new by-law and such revocation shall take effect and shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1932.

BY-LAWS.

PART XIII.—SUPPLY OF ELECTRIC ENERGY.

PART I.—GENERAL.

“The Department” means the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts.

“Departmental officer” means the officer for the time being in charge of the Department’s electrical supply at Rotorua, or any officer authorized by him.

“Wireman” means any person licensed under the Wiremen’s Registration Act, 1925.

System of Supply.

1. Energy will be supplied by the single-phase and three-phase alternating-current system at a frequency of 50 cycles per second, and at a pressure of 115 volts single-phase and 200 volts three-phase in the Rotorua Borough area. In the area outside the borough supply will be given at 230 volts single phase and 400 volts three phase.

Applications.

2. Applications for supply of electrical energy must be made on the official application form, obtainable at the Tourist Inquiry Office, or the substation.

3. This form, duly completed and signed by the consumer and the wireman, must be handed in to the substation, and written permission obtained from the Department before work is commenced. Applicants should first ascertain from the Department whether the supply is available; and, in event of any extension of the distributing main being necessary, whether such extension will be made by the Department free of charge.

4. The Department may require applicant to pay the whole or part cost of any lines, poles, fittings, &c., for any distance in excess of 60 ft. via route of wire from the property boundary to premises to be connected.

5. The consumer must provide the necessary insulators, mounted on the building, to carry the service lines.

6. Where considered necessary, pole-top fuses will be supplied by the Department.

7. At least fourteen days’ notice should be given to the Department by the wireman of supply required; and, while every effort will be made to give the supply by the date quoted, the Department is not bound in any way to do so.

8. Upon acceptance of the application a departmental officer will inspect the premises by appointment, and indicate to the wireman the position of the meter-board and the point of entry for the service mains. The Department has the sole right to determine the point where the main shall enter the building and where the meter shall be situated.

Installations.

9. The wiring and fittings in the consumers’ premises must be in accordance with the Electrical Supply Regulations, 1927, the Electrical Wiring Regulations, 1927, and the Electrical Wiremen’s Registration Act, 1925, and any amendments thereof, and to the entire satisfaction of a departmental officer, who shall be given free access to such premises during the

progress of the said work, and shall, if he deem it necessary, have the right to require the wireman to open up any joint or to remove any casing, conduit, wires, or fittings, for the purposes of ascertaining if the work has been properly executed. The wireman must reinstate at his own expense any work such officer may have examined in the manner set forth.

10. The main cutouts, main switch, and meters are to be placed as near to the point of entry of the mains as possible, and, provided such position is convenient, it is advisable that the distributing-board be placed in immediate proximity to the meter.

11. The board must be erected at such a height that the meter-dial will not be more than 7 ft from the floor and in a well-lighted position. The meter-board shall be drilled ready for the erection of the meters, and leads shall be provided for connecting up the meter. The connections on main-board must be in the order of main cutout, main meter, main switch.

12. All distribution-boards must be provided with suitable cutouts which can be sealed. These will be fixed and sealed by the Department, and must not be opened or the fuses changed by other than a departmental officer. Space must be provided on such board for the Department’s meters. The Department may make a charge for renewing any sealable fuse if the fuse has been blown by a fault in the consumer’s installation.

13. In heating-circuits each point must be reckoned as not less than 1 kilowatt, and the conductors shall not be less than 3-036 (7/23 S.W.G.). One plug only will be allowed on each circuit.

14. If in any premises there are (a) any temporary wires or fittings, or (b) if any instructions relative to the installation deemed necessary by the departmental officer have not been complied with, or (c) if the whole of the work is not completed with all fittings fixed and fuses in place, the Department will not supply energy to such premises unless written consent to such supply has previously been obtained from the Department.

Temporary Work.

15. Temporary wiring will only be allowed by special permission of the Department. Temporary work must not be connected up until it has been inspected and passed by a Departmental officer.

Motors.

16. Where a three-phase supply is available, motors of over 1 horse-power must be three phase. On single-phase mains connection of larger size motors will be granted only by special permission of the Department previously obtained. All motors shall be installed, and starting-devices provided so that a minimum of disturbance is caused in the supply-lines by the starting-current.

17. Energy used to drive motor generators for lighting purposes will be charged for at lighting rates.

Testing.

18. On completion of any work the wireman shall notify the Department in writing, and a test will then be made free of charge. If satisfactory, supply will be given; but should the installation be incomplete or the test prove unsatisfactory, supply will be refused until defects have been remedied. A charge of not less than 5s. will be made for each subsequent test. These tests are for departmental purposes only, and do not release the wireman from any liability to the consumer should a fault subsequently develop.

Inspection.

19. The consumer will at all reasonable times give the departmental officer access to his premises for the purposes of reading the meter or testing and examining all internal electric lines, meters, and other fittings. If in the opinion of such officer the electric lines, meters, or other fittings shall be deemed unsatisfactory, the Department may immediately cut off the supply until such defect is remedied.

20. The Department shall not be responsible for any delay in connecting a consumer to the supply mains.

Alterations or Additions.

21. The consumer shall not, after a supply of energy has been given, make or allow to be made any alterations or additions to the wiring, fittings, or apparatus connected thereto until a written application has been made to the Department and such application has been granted by the Department.

22. The alterations or extensions will be treated as if they formed part of a new installation, and must not be connected until they have been inspected and passed by the departmental officer.

23. If the above conditions are not complied with, the consumer’s supply is liable to be disconnected without notice.

Interruptions.

24. Electrical energy will be supplied continuously, but the Department will not be responsible for any inconvenience or loss that may be sustained by a consumer in consequence of interruptions or defects of supply caused by strikes, accidents to machinery, electric lines, or other apparatus, or on account of its being deemed necessary by the Department to cut off the supply for temporary repairs, or in consequence of any operation of the Department.

Formal Contracts and Deposits.

25. The Department may require any consumer to enter into a formal contract, or to pay a deposit as security for energy supplied.

26. In the event of no formal contract being entered into between the Department and the consumer, the latter, after the supply has commenced, shall be held to have agreed to, and shall be bound by, these conditions of supply.

Meters.

27. A meter or meters will be provided free of charge to measure the total power going into an installation, but if for the purposes of the consumer check-meters are installed, or the installation is divided into lighting, heating, or power circuits, and it is required to meter each separately, the consumer shall pay a monthly charge of 6d. for each extra meter.

28. Meters will be maintained free of charge. If the accuracy of the meter is questioned by the consumer, on depositing 5s. at the Tourist Office the meter will be tested. If it tests accurate within 2½ per cent., plus or minus, the meter shall be deemed to be correct, and the consumer shall bear the cost of the tests.

29. If the meter is not correct, adjustment will be made in the consumer's account for one month, and the deposit will be returned.

Change of Occupancy.

30. Each consumer will be held responsible for the electric energy consumed on the premises specified in the application until written notice has been received by the Department that the supply is to be discontinued or transferred. Such notice must be given to the Department forty-eight hours before the consumer wishes the supply to be cut off. In the event of a consumer ceasing to require the supply and failing to give the required notice in advance, such consumer shall be charged for all supply registered on the meter.

Disconnection.

31. (a) If the consumer makes use of the electrical supply for any other purpose than that set forth in his application, or uses or deals with the energy supplied by the Department in any manner so as to unduly or improperly interfere with the efficient supply of energy to other consumers; or

(b) If the consumer shall refuse access to his premises at any reasonable time to the departmental officer for the time being, or other person acting on his behalf, for the purpose of inspecting, testing, reading, removing, or fixing the meter, or of inspecting and testing the consumer's wiring and fittings; or

(c) If the consumer's installation shall, upon testing, show a test of less than thirty megohms divided by the number of points; or

(d) If the consumer or any person with his knowledge or connivance tamper with or wilfully damage any meter or apparatus on his premises, being the property of the Department, or shall fraudulently obtain a supply of electricity from the Department's service wires or apparatus; or

(e) If the consumer make default in paying for the electric energy supplied to him; or

(f) If the consumer shall in any way contravene the terms in his application;

the Department may, if it thinks fit, without prejudice to any other of the Department's rights against him, discontinue the supply.

Reconnection.

32. If the Department should discontinue the supply to the consumer for any of the reasons in clause 31, then a payment of 5s. shall be made for the reconnection of the installation.

33. When an installation has been disconnected, reconnection shall be made by a departmental officer only.

Saving.

34. In any matter relating to material or workmanship which forms part of any installation, connected or to be connected to the Department's mains, but which is not specially provided for in these by-laws, the decision shall be made by the Department, and such decision shall be final.

35. The Department reserves the right to decide the particular charge of those quoted in clause 37 which shall apply to any consumer; to restrict the use of any apparatus to defined hours; to refuse to give supply, or to continue to supply any apparatus the use of which is prejudicial to the supply given to other consumers; to make special charges for supply of energy in cases not provided for in these by-laws.

36. The Department may from time to time make, alter, amend, or revoke by-laws to regulate and determine—

- (1) The sale and distribution of electricity;
- (2) The terms and conditions under which electrical installations may be used by consumers.

Charges.

37. The price for electrical energy supplied by the Department will be calculated on the Board of Trade unit consisting of 1,000 watt-hours. All energy will be charged according to meter register, but should a supply be given before a meter is installed the consumer shall pay for current supplied during such period a sum based upon the number and capacity of lamps and other apparatus installed.

In all cases units may, at the option of the Department, be measured as kilovolt-ampere hours instead of kilowatt-hours if the power factor of the consumer's load falls below 90 per cent.

Should the meter prove defective in any way, or be removed for testing or repair, the consumer shall pay per month for energy supplied during such period a sum based on the average former reading of the meter.

If the revenue from any existing or proposed installation does not cover the cost of supply, the Department may impose a connected-load charge in addition to the charge by meter.

Prepayment meters may be installed in any installation at the discretion of the Department.

The charges for energy supplied shall be computed monthly, and shall be as follows:—

- (a) (1) For all lighting—

1 to 50 units ..	6½d. per unit.
51 to 250 units ..	6d. per unit.
251 to 500 units ..	5½d. per unit.
Units over 500 ..	5d. per unit.

(a) (2) Where prepayment meters are installed the charge shall be 7d. per unit for lighting, and 2½d. per unit for domestic heating and cooking purposes.

A minimum may be required where these meters are installed, as provided for in clause 37 (h).

- (b) For floodlights, or advertising-lighting, the following alternative to clause (a) is available: The consumer may pay a monthly charge at the rate of 2s. per 100-watt lamp, the energy consumed to be charged for at ordinary heating-rates (clause (e)).

- (c) (1) For domestic heating, power, and electrical appliances and supply of a similar nature—

1 to 20 units ..	3d. per unit.
21 to 100 units ..	1½d. per unit.
Balance of units ..	1d. per unit.

- (2) When the consumer installs an electric cooking range the charge for all the energy consumed by such range during the six-months immediately following its installation shall be 1d. per unit.

At the expiry of the six-months period energy supplied for the range will be charged as per scale. (c) (1).

- (3) Where in domestic installations supply is given to both lighting and heating through one meter, the consumption shall be charged per the following scale:—

Bathroom, scullery, pantry, linen press, halls, W.C., washhouse not to count as rooms.

Should a dispute arise as to what constitutes a room, the decision of the Department shall be final. Where residences are let as apartments or flats and require separate meters for various tenants, each set of rooms to be separately rated as per Schedule.

- (d) (1) For commercial or domestic hot-water heating, where the use is limited to "off peak" hours, supply will be given at a special net rate per unit of $\frac{1}{4}$ d., with an additional minimum charge for this service of 2s. 6d. per month.

Such minimum charge shall be additional to the minimum charges provided for in subclause (h) hereof.

- (2) If to control this use of energy it is necessary to use a time switch, the consumer shall supply an approved time switch.
 (3) If the switch is supplied by the Department the consumer shall pay rent for such at the rate of 12s. per annum.
 (4) Under special conditions this rate will be available for energy consumed for industrial purposes between the hours of 10.30 p.m. and 7 a.m. These conditions will be supplied on request.

- (e) (1) For industrial motor supply, office radiators, and similar appliances, where the supply is not used during the evening hours—

1 to 20 units	..	3d. per unit.
21 to 1,000 units	..	2d. per unit.
Balance of units	..	1d. per unit.

- (2) If the supply is used during evening hours as well as daylight hours the charges shall be for the whole consumption at the rate of 3d. per unit.
 (3) When a consumer installs a synchronous motor, and such motor is operated at not less than unity power-factor, a special and additional discount of 10 per cent. will be allowed.
 (4) For each unit for arc generators, for picture-theatres, or for similar supply, 4d. per unit.

- (f) For farms and milking plants the charge shall be as follows, such charges being subject to a special minimum charge based on the distance of the consumer's installation from the point of supply:—

Lighting: As per scale (a) (1).

Heating: As per scale (c) (1) and cooking.

Water-heating: Energy for water-heating in the milking-shed will be supplied at the rate of £5 per kilowatt per annum, provided that the water-heater is on a change-over switch with the motor, so that the heater and motor cannot be used simultaneously.

Pumping motor supply: £8 per horse-power per annum if on change-over with milking motor. £10 per horse-power per annum if unrestricted.

Power for milking and separating:—

- (1) Motors—

£4 per horse-power per annum for first 2 horse-power.
 £3 per horse-power per annum for balance of horse-power.

- (2) In addition the following monthly charges will be made for electrical energy consumed:—

1 to 20 units	..	3d. per unit.
21 to 1,000 units	..	2d. per unit.
Units used over 1,000	..	1d. per unit.

The annual horse-power charge may, at the option of the consumer, be charged in the accounts rendered for the quarters ending 31st December, 31st March, and 30th June in each year, instead of in four equal quarterly payments.

- (g) All charges are net monthly charges, and the net account will be computed on these charges.

The gross account payable will be the above net account plus a demand charge computed at fourpence (4d.) per one shilling (1s.) on the first twenty shillings (20s.) of the net account, and twopence (2d.) per one shilling (1s.) on the balance of the net account (parts of shilling not to be taken into consideration for demand-charge purposes).

If payment is made on or before due date (see clause (i)) the demand charge will be deducted as a discount.

- (h) The minimum charge to all consumers shall be 2s. 6d. per month, except that consumers in rural areas shall be charged an additional amount of 1s. 6d. per month on their net total charge for the month, and the minimum charge to such consumers shall be 4s. per month.

- (i) Discount will be allowed on current accounts only, and is subject to the following conditions, namely:—

(1) That the full amount of the account, including all arrears, is paid within fourteen days of the reading of the meter.

(2) Except that irrespective of date of reading of meter discount will be allowed only if payment is made on or before the last working-day of such month.

(3) Except that should the last day of the period allowed for discount be a Saturday, Sunday, or public holiday discount shall be allowed on the working-day immediately following.

(4) For accounts rendered under clause 37 (f) discount will be allowed if the account is paid on or before the twenty-fourth day of the month in which the account is issued.

(5) Discount shall be allowed for energy supplied to Government Departments or local bodies irrespective of date of payment.

(6) In any case of hardship the Minister in Charge of the Department may allow discount if payment is made within seven days after the last ordinary day for the allowance of discount.

Penalties.

38. Acts constituting breaches of by-laws: Every person who shall—

(a) Do or cause to be done, or be concerned in doing, anything whatsoever contrary to or otherwise than as provided by any of these by-laws;

(b) Omit to do anything which according to the true intent and meaning of any of these by-laws ought to be done by him at the time and in the manner therein provided;

(c) Refuse or neglect to comply with any notice duly given to him under any of these by-laws;

shall be guilty of a breach of such by-law.

39. Non-compliance with by-laws after notice to constitute further breach: Every person who shall—

(a) Construct, affix, or provide, or cause to be constructed, affixed, or provided, any work, appliance, or material of any description whatever contrary to or otherwise than is provided by any of these by-laws, and who shall not within a reasonable stated time after notice in writing or any renewal notice in writing shall have been given to him by the Department's local controlling officer so to do, open up, lay bare, take away, or remove such work, appliance, or material, or cause the same to be opened up, laid bare, taken away, or removed, or alter or cause to be altered the same so as to comply with such by-law and notice;

(b) Omit to construct, affix, or provide any work, appliance, or material required by any of these by-laws to be constructed, affixed, or provided by him, and who shall not within a reasonable stated time after notice in writing or any renewal notice in writing shall have been given to him by the Department's local controlling officer so to do, construct, affix, or provide such omitted work, appliance, or material so as to comply with such by-law and notice;

shall be guilty of a further offence against such by-law.

40. Case of purchase of premises where by-law broken:

(1) In every case where—

(a) A breach of any of these by-laws shall be made with respect to the construction of any building or work by the owner thereof, or any work, appliance, or material required by any of these by-laws to be provided in respect of any land or premises by the owner thereof shall not have been provided; and

(b) Any person shall thereafter become by purchase or otherwise the owner of such land, work, or premises;

it shall be lawful for the Department's local controlling officer by notice in writing (which notice may be renewed from time to time) to require such person to rectify the matter of such breach, or to provide such omitted work, appliance, or material (as the case may be), within a stated time.

(2) If the person served with any such notice shall fail to comply with the same he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against such by-law, but without relieving any other person from any liability in respect of the breach by him of such by-law.

41. Penalties: (a) Every person guilty of a breach of any of these by-laws for which no other penalty is provided is liable to a penalty not exceeding £20; or, where the breach is a continuing one, then to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every day or part of a day during which such breach continues.

(b) But the Department may, after conviction for the continuing breach of any by-law, apply to the Supreme Court for an injunction to restrain the further continuance of such breach by the person or persons so convicted.

(c) The continued existence in a state contrary to any of these by-laws of any work or thing shall be deemed a continuing offence within the meaning of this by-law.

(d) Where by any Act smaller maximum penalties than those mentioned in this clause are authorized to be imposed for the breach or continued breach of any of these by-laws, then a person guilty of any breach or continued breach of any such by-law shall (if such by-law is not authorized to be made under the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920) be liable only to such smaller penalty.

42. Removal of works executed contrary to by-laws:

(a) Whenever any work, material, or other construction or appliance, or anything whatever shall have been executed, erected, placed, laid, constructed, or affixed in contravention of any of these by-laws, or shall exist in a form or manner otherwise than as directed or authorized by any of these by-laws, it shall be lawful for the Department's local controlling officer by notice in writing under his hand to require the person by whom, or by whose authority or on whose behalf, the work shall have been done, or if he shall not at the time of the giving of the notice be either the owner or the occupier of the premises affected, then the person who shall at such time be the owner of such premises, to pull down, take up, or remove such work, material, construction, appliance, or thing as aforesaid, or alter the same so as to comply with the by-law or by-laws affecting the same within (in each case) a stated time.

(b) If such work, material, construction, appliance, or thing shall not be pulled down, taken up, or removed, or altered as aforesaid within such stated time, it shall be lawful for the Department's local controlling officer or any person authorized by him in that behalf to pull down, take up, and remove, or (as the case may be) alter as aforesaid the same work, construction, appliance, material, or thing, and to enter into and upon any land or building for that purpose and to do anything thereon or thereto necessary to effect such pulling-down, taking-up, removal, or alteration.

(c) The Department may recover in any Court of competent jurisdiction from the person who shall have committed the breach of any of these by-laws in respect of the execution, erection, placing, laying, constructing, or affixing, or existence of the said work, material, construction, appliance, or thing

or (as the case may be) from the person who was at the time of the giving of the notice the owner of the premises, all expenses incurred by the Department in connection with such pulling-down, taking-up, removal, or alteration.

(d) The exercise of the powers given by this by-law shall not relieve any person from liability to any penalty incurred under these by-laws.

43. Limitation of liability of succeeding owner: A person who has become, by purchase or otherwise, the owner of any premises shall not be liable under By-law No. 40 or by By-law No. 42 in respect of any breach of any of these by-laws which shall have been made before he became such owner if he shall prove that at the time of his becoming such owner the matter of such breach was not patent, and that he had no notice of the fact of such breach.
