NOTWITHSTANDING anything to the contrary contained in the Law Practitioners Act, 1931, where any solicitor who was practising within the earthquake area on the 3rd day of February, 1931, is unable by reason of the loss of his records by or in consequence of the earthquake on that date to comply with the provisions of the said Act relating to bills of costs, it shall be lawful for such solicitor to commence and maintain an action for the recovery of any fees, charges, or disbursements for any business done by him prior to the said 3rd day of February, 1931, without being required to comply with the provisions of the said Act relating to bills of costs, provided that he shall furnish his client at least thirty days before commencing such action with a statement in writing signed by him giving reasonable information of the business so done by him, in respect of which such fees, charges, and disbursements are sought to be recovered, and sufficient to allocate them to the particular business in respect of which they are sought to be recovered.

Regulations for the Licensing of Dealers in Gold Coins.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 26th day of September, 1932.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Board of Trade Act, 1919, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, being of opinion that the provisions of the regulations hereby enacted are necessary in the public interest for the purposes set out in paragraphs (a) and (e) of subsection one of section twenty-six of the said Act, doth hereby, on the recommendation of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, make the following regulations for the purposes of the said section.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATION 1.—PRELIMINARY.

- (1) THESE regulations may be cited as the Board of Trade (Coined Gold) Regulations, 1932.
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the date of publication hereof in the *Gazette*.
- (3) In these regulations—

“Gold-coin dealer” means a person who carries on the business of purchasing, selling, or exchanging gold coins, but does not include any bank authorized by law to issue bank notes in New Zealand or any person purchasing, selling, or exchanging gold coins as a servant of any such bank; and does not include any person for the time being the holder of a license issued under the Pawnbrokers Act, 1908;

“Gold coin” means any gold coin coined in any of His Majesty's Mints or lawfully current under any Proclamation or otherwise in any part of His Majesty's Dominions.

REGULATION 2.—REQUIREMENT OF LICENSE.

- (1) It shall not be lawful for any person at any time after the 30th day of September, 1932, to carry on the business of a gold-coin dealer unless he is the holder of a license issued under these regulations,

- (2) It shall not be lawful for any person at any time after the 30th day of September, 1932, to carry on the business of a gold-coin dealer, or to purchase, sell, or exchange gold coin elsewhere than at a place of business named in a license issued under these regulations.

- (3) A license may be granted to an individual or to two or more persons carrying on business in partnership, but shall not be granted to a corporate body.

- (4) A license may be granted to any person therein declared to be the manager of a corporate body carrying on the business of a gold-coin dealer, and such corporate body may thereupon, so long as such person remains the manager thereof, carry on the business of a gold-coin dealer as if such corporate body were the holder of the said license.

- (5) Every license shall be granted in respect of one or more fixed and specified places of business, and shall not authorize the carrying-on of the business of a gold-coin dealer at any place other than a place named in such license.

- (6) In any proceedings for an offence against these regulations the onus shall lie on the person charged of proving that he was in fact the holder of a license under these regulations or (as the case may require) that he was authorized by the terms of his license to carry on the business of a gold-coin dealer at any place of business in question.

REGULATION 3.—APPLICATION AND GRANT OF LICENSES.

- (1) Any person desiring to obtain a license under these regulations may make application in that behalf to a Stipendiary Magistrate by writing under his hand setting out his full name and the exact address of the place or places of business at which he desires to carry on business.

- (2) The Magistrate may require such evidence as he thinks fit as to the moral character and suitability of the applicant, and may obtain from any officer of police a written report as to the applicant, and the applicant shall be entitled to know the terms of any such report.

- (3) A license under these regulations shall be granted by a Magistrate, and shall be in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

- (4) A license may be granted subject to such conditions as the Magistrate granting the same thinks fit to impose: Provided that such conditions shall be set out in the license.

- (5) No license shall be issued until payment of the fee hereinafter prescribed.

REGULATION 4.—REGISTER OF LICENSES.

- (1) The Clerk of every Magistrate's Court shall keep a register of all licenses issued under these regulations, setting out the date of such license, the name of the licensee, and the premises at which the licensee is authorized to carry on business.

- (2) Such register shall be open for inspection during office hours on payment of the fee hereinafter prescribed.

- (3) The Clerk of the Magistrate's Court shall enter in the Register of Licenses against the record of every license issued particulars of every endorsement made under Regulation 6 hereof, and of every order of revocation or suspension or order for the endorsement of conditions made under Regulation 7 hereof.

- (4) If any endorsement made under Regulation 6 hereof or order made under Regulation 7 hereof is made by a Magistrate sitting elsewhere than where the license was issued, particulars of such endorsement or order shall forthwith be forwarded to the Clerk of the Magistrate's Court where the license was issued, so that such last-named Clerk may make the entry prescribed by clause (3) of this regulation.

REGULATION 5.—TERM OF LICENSE.

- (1) Except as provided by the next succeeding clause hereof, every license shall, unless previously determined, have effect from the date of issue thereof until the 31st day of March then next ensuing and shall then lapse.

- (2) Upon application at any time during the months of February and March made by any person who is for the time being the holder of a license, a further license may be granted to such person to have effect unless previously determined for a period of twelve months from the 31st day of March then next ensuing.

REGULATION 6.—ENDORSEMENT OF LICENSES.

- (1) Upon the application of the licensee a Magistrate may endorse upon any license for the time being in force a memorial to the effect that the license shall authorize the carrying-on of business at some address to be stated in the memorial in addition to or in substitution for the place or any one of the places mentioned in the license, and such license shall thereafter have effect according to the tenor of the memorial so endorsed.

(2) Upon the application of any person to whom a license for the time being in force has been granted as manager of a corporate body, a Magistrate may endorse thereon a memorial to the effect that the benefit of the license is assigned to some other person named in the memorial and therein declared to be the manager of the said corporate body, and such license shall thereafter have effect as if it had been issued to the assignee named in such endorsement, and upon any such application the provisions of clause (2) of Regulation 3 hereof shall apply.

(3) No endorsement shall be made on a license pursuant to this regulation till the prescribed fee has been paid.

(4) Except as hereinbefore provided, a license granted under these regulations shall not be assignable or transferable.

REGULATION 7.—REVOCATION OF LICENSE.

(1) Any officer of police may at any time apply to a Magistrate by way of complaint under the Justices of the Peace Act, 1927, to revoke a license upon any of the following grounds:—

- (i) That the licensee has been convicted of a breach of these regulations; or
- (ii) That the licensee has been convicted of any crime or offence punishable summarily; or
- (iii) That the licensee has admitted in writing that he has committed an offence against the Customs Act, notwithstanding that no conviction may have been entered; or
- (iv) That by reason of the personal character or behaviour of the licensee it is in the public interest that his license be revoked.

(2) Upon the hearing of such complaint the Magistrate may make an order—

- (i) Revoking the license;
- (ii) Suspending the license for such period as he thinks fit;
- (iii) For endorsement on the license of any conditions or further conditions, and in that case the license shall thenceforth take effect as if such conditions had been inserted in the license.

(3) Upon the hearing of any information against a licensee, whether determinable summarily or upon indictment, a Magistrate may without the need of any such complaint as aforesaid exercise the powers conferred by this regulation.

(4) When an order for revocation, suspension, or endorsement of a license has been made under this regulation, the licensee shall within twenty-four hours thereafter if he is present at the making of the order, and otherwise within twenty-four hours after a copy of the order has been served upon him, deliver his license to the Clerk of the Magistrate's Court, and the Clerk shall cancel the same or retain the same during the period of suspension or make an endorsement thereon, as the case may require.

REGULATION 8.—REGISTER OF DEALINGS.

(1) Every licensee shall keep a register and make or cause to be made therein the record herein prescribed of every transaction carried out by him, comprising or including the purchase, sale, or exchange of gold coin.

(2) Every such record shall set out the following particulars:—

- (i) The date of the transaction;
- (ii) The nature of the transaction, whether by way of purchase, sale, or exchange;
- (iii) The denominations of the gold coins involved in the transaction, and the number of gold coins of each denomination so involved;
- (iv) The full name, residence, and calling of the person from whom he purchased, to whom he sold, or with whom he exchanged such gold coin;
- (v) If such gold coin was actually received from or delivered to an agent or servant of the person selling, purchasing, or exchanging the same, then (in addition to the particulars of the person so selling, purchasing, or exchanging as hereinbefore prescribed) the full name, residence, and calling of such agent or servant.

(3) Every licensee shall make the record aforesaid or cause the same to be made on the day on which the transaction recorded takes place.

(4) Every licensee shall procure the record aforesaid to be verified by the signature thereto of the person from whom he purchased, to whom he sold, or with whom he exchanged the gold coin referred to in the record or (as the case may require) the agent or servant of such person who delivered or received such gold coin.

(5) Every licensee shall procure any record in the register which is not made by him personally to be verified by the signature of the person by whom on his behalf the record is made.

(6) Every licensee shall procure the record aforesaid to be verified as prescribed by clause (4) and clause (5) (if applicable) of this regulation at the time when such record is made.

(7) No licensee shall make or cause or permit to be made in his register any entry which is untrue in any particular.

(8) Every licensee shall at all reasonable times on demand of any officer of police produce to such officer the register aforesaid, and permit him to make copies thereof, and, on the like demand, shall produce his license and all gold coins in his possession and also produce or cause to be produced to any such officer all gold coins held in the custody or possession of any other person on his behalf.

REGULATION 9.—OFFENCES.

(1) No licensee, or any agent or servant employed by him, shall at any time purchase or receive any gold coin from any person who is under the age of sixteen years or who is apparently intoxicated.

(2) No licensee shall receive or take in or permit or suffer to be received or taken in any gold coin before eight of the clock in the forenoon, or after six of the clock in the evening.

REGULATION 10.—FEES.

(1) The fee for a license to take effect for any period of not less than six months shall be ten shillings.

(2) The fee for a license to take effect for any period of less than six months shall be five shillings.

(3) The fee for an endorsement made under Regulation 6 hereof shall be two shillings and sixpence.

(4) The fee for inspection of a register of licenses shall be one shilling.

(5) All fees shall be payable to the Clerk of the Magistrate's Court where the relevant application is made.

(i) Any lure or bait other than an artificial fly:

(ii) Any spinning fly, or fly with a spinning attachment, whether such fly be an artificial fly or not:

(iii) Any artificial fly in the manner known as 'trolling' or 'harling.'

(2) This regulation shall apply to the following places:—

(a) The Kaituna River between Lake Rotoiti and the electric-power station at the Okere Falls.

(b) The Taahunaatara Stream.

(c) Every part of Lake Rotoiti lying within 200 yards of that portion of the lake-shore which commences at a point 300 yards north of the Tapuaecharuru Stream and extends thence in a southerly and westerly direction to a point 300 yards north-north-west of Haupara Stream.

(d) Every stream, spring, and river flowing into or from that part of Lake Rotoiti described in paragraph (c) hereof.

(e) The Ohau Channel.

(f) Every part of Lake Rotorua lying within 300 yards of that portion of the lake-shore which commences at a point 200 yards south-east of the Waiohiro or Fairy Springs Creek and extends northerly to a point 200 yards north of the Awahou Stream.

(g) Every stream, spring, and river flowing into or from that part of Lake Rotorua described in paragraph (f) hereof.

(h) Every stream, spring, and river flowing into or from the lakes and portions of lakes hereinafter mentioned, and the waters of such lake lying within a radius of 300 yards shore to shore from the centre of the meeting-line of every such stream, spring, or river, and the lake into or from which it flows.

(i) That portion of Lake Rotorua not comprised in the area described in paragraph (f) hereof:

(ii) That portion of Lake Rotoiti not comprised in the area described in paragraph (c) hereof:

(vi) Lake Tarawera.

(i) The Waikaretaheke River.

(j) The Hopuruahine, Mokau, and Aniwaniani Rivers, and the waters of Lake Waikaremoana within a radius of 400 yards shore to shore from the respective centres of the meeting-line of each of the said rivers and the said lake.

(k) That part of the Waikato River lying between the point where the Whangapoa or Taahunaatara Stream enters the said river and a landmark approximately two miles and a half below the bridge at Atiamuri.

- (e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.
