Amending Regulations under the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1928, relating to the Sale for Consumption within the Dominion of New-Zealand-grown Fruit.—(Notice No. Ag. 3082.)

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 21st day of November, 1932.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations in amendment of the regulations under the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1908, enuring under the said Act, governing the sale for consumption within the said Dominion of New-Zealand-grown fruit of the kinds mentioned therein, made on the twelfth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and published in the *Gazette* on the fifteenth day of the same month, at page 1136 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"), and doth declare that the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. REGULATION 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting after the word "nectarines" the words "apricots, cherries, tomatoes."

2. Regulations 4, 5, and 6 of the principal regulations are hereby revoked, and the following regulation is substituted therefor:—

"4. The packages in which fruit of the several kinds set forth in the Second Schedule hereto may be sold shall be constructed of timber in accordance with such one or other of the respective types of packages set opposite the several kinds of fruit in the said Second Schedule :

"Provided that, if the Director is satisfied that any person, on the coming into operation of this Order in Council, has on hand any packages of a type prescribed by Regulation 4 or Regulation 5 of the principal regulations hereby revoked, or stocks of timber specially sawn or prepared for making such packages, he may authorize such person to use packages of such type in lieu of packages of the type prescribed by this regulation, but no such authority shall authorize the use of such first-mentioned packages after the 31st day of October, 1933."

3. Regulation 13 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted therefor:—

"13. The Director may cancel the registration of the owner of any registered number in any of the following events:—

"(a) If the registered owner so requests; or

"(b) If the Director is satisfied that the owner has not used his registered number for a period of two years immediately preceding; or

"(c) If during the period of twelve months immediately preceding the owner has been convicted of any offence under the said Act or these regulations; or

"(d) If the Director is satisfied, on such documentary or other evidence as he shall deem sufficient, that the registration of the owner of any registered number should be cancelled."

4. Regulation 14 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the figure and words "1 in. block type," and substituting therefor the words and figures "not less than ½ in. nor more than 1 in. block type."

5. The principal regulations are hereby amended by adding the following as the Second Schedule thereto:—

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section two hundred and forty-six of the Native Land Act, 1931, it is enacted that the Governor-General may by Order in Council, in any case in which he deems it expedient in the public interest so to do, authorize any acquisition, alienation, or disposition of any land, or any interest therein, notwithstanding the statutory provisions therein referred to :

And whereas it appears expedient to authorize the acquisition, alienation, or disposition of the land hereinafter mentioned :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority hereinbefore mentioned, and all other powers him enabling, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the alienation by way of transfer to and the acquisition thereof by Timberlands Woodpulp Extended, Limited, of the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto, notwithstanding the provisions of Part XII of the Native Land Act, 1931, or of sections 72 to 76 of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section sixty-six of the Hawke's Bay Earthquake Act, 1931, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Napier Harbour Board (Finance) Regulations, 1932, and the Napier Harbour Board is hereinafter referred to as "the Board."

2. The Board is hereby authorized to use the unexpended balance—viz., six thousand eight hundred and thirty-six pounds two shillings and eightpence (£6,836 2s. 8d.), of the allocation of eight thousand pounds (£8,000) of the Earthquake Relief Loan, 1931, of twenty-two thousand pounds (£22,000) for the purpose of completing repairs to the Glasgow Wharf and for carrying on dredging operations at the Breakwater Harbour and between the piers at the Inner Harbour.

3. The payment by the Board out of the allocation of fourteen thousand pounds (£14,000) of the Earthquake Relief Loan, 1931, of twenty-two thousand pounds (£22,000), of the sums of eight hundred and thirteen pounds five shillings and tenpence (£813 5s. 10d.) for providing lightering facilities at the Breakwater Harbour, and four hundred and thirty-five pounds six shillings and ninepence (£435 6s. 9d.) for plant for the dredge "Kaione," is hereby validated.

4. The remission by the Board during the financial year ended 30th September, 1931, of harbour dues amounting to five hundred and four pounds five shillings and ninepence (£504 5s. 9d.) is hereby validated.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Opossum Regulations (Amendment No. 2), and shall be read together with and form part of the principal regulations.

2. Regulation 12 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked and the following regulation substituted in lieu thereof:—

"12. DISPOSAL OF REVENUE.

"(1) Except as provided in section 42 of the said Act, all fines recovered under these regulations shall be paid into the Public Account, and shall be applied—

"(a) In the first instance, in or towards defraying the costs of and incidental to the recovery of such fines; and

"(b) The balance shall be paid to the registered acclimatization societies in whose districts the offences were committed.

"(2) Any opossums, opossum-skins, traps or other contrivances used for the taking of opossums, or any stamping machine, device, tool, or other instrument for the purpose of counterfeiting the official mark, forfeited to the Crown under the provisions of these regulations shall be sold or otherwise disposed of in such manner and under such conditions as the Minister may direct.

"(3) All moneys derived from the disposal of anything sold pursuant to this regulation shall be paid into the Public Account and shall, after deducting expenses, be paid over to the registered acclimatization society in whose district the seizure was made."

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the British Nationality and Status of Aliens (in New Zealand) Act, 1928, and every other power him enabling, His Excellency the Governor-General with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and with the concurrence of the Right Honourable the Chief Justice and seven of the other members of the Rules Committee constituted under the Judicature Amendment Act, 1930 (four of such other members being Judges of the Supreme Court), doth hereby make the following rules.

RULES.

1. THESE rules may be cited as the Naturalization Revocation Rules, 1932.

2. These rules shall take effect on the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

3. Where any case is referred by the Minister of Internal Affairs to the Court for inquiry pursuant to subsection (4) of section 7 of the First Schedule to the British Nationality and Status of Aliens (in New Zealand) Act, 1928, the Court shall cause at least seven days' notice of the inquiry in such form as the Court thinks fit to be sent by post to the last known address of the person to whom the inquiry relates.

4. Such notice shall state—

(a) The grounds on which the certificate of naturalization is proposed to be revoked.

(b) The time when the inquiry will be held.

(c) The place at which the inquiry will be held.

5. Such notice shall inform the person concerned that he will be entitled to be present at the inquiry and to be represented thereat by counsel or solicitor.

6. Such notice may require the person to whom the inquiry relates to file an answer to the same and to furnish in writing to the Court any information which the Court considers material, to be verified in such manner as the Court may require.

7. If the Court considers that a notice so sent by post is unlikely to reach the person to whom it is addressed the Court may cause notice to be given in such manner as it thinks fit of the time when and the place at which the inquiry will be held, the name of the person affected, and any other particulars which the Court thinks should be so notified.

8. The inquiry may be adjourned from time to time as the Court thinks fit.

9. The Court may act on and may receive as evidence any statement, document, information, or matter which in the opinion of the Court may assist the Court to deal effectually with the matters before it, whether the same would, apart from this provision, be legally admissible evidence or not.

10. The Court may if it thinks fit invite the Minister of the Crown in charge of any Government Department which appears to the Court to be interested to appoint a person to represent him at any inquiry and a person so appointed may attend such inquiry accordingly.

11. The Court may allow or refuse to allow the public or any portion of the public to be present during any proceedings under these rules.

12. In all matters not hereby expressly provided for the rules contained in the Code of Civil Procedure set forth in the Second Schedule to the Judicature Act, 1908, with the amendments of the said rules which are now or may hereafter be in force, shall apply.

WHERE a disabled member of the Forces in receipt of a pension is, with the approval of the Commissioner of Pensions, an inmate of a hospital or other institution, or is an inmate of an institution under the Mental Defectives Act, 1911, whose mental disability has been accepted by the War Pensions Board as attributable to or aggravated by his war service, the maximum amount that shall be paid to him by way of pension either directly or by arrangement with the authorities of the institution shall be 10s. a week, and any balance shall be retained and paid to him on his discharge, or paid, at the discretion of the War Pensions Board, to the wife or such other person as may be determined by the War Pensions Board :

Provided that no payment by way of pension shall be made to or on behalf of any disabled member of the Forces detained in an institution under the Mental Defectives Act, 1911, without the prior consent of the Public Trustee.

Regulations under the Government Railways Acts.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Government Railways Act, 1926, and its amendments, the Government Railways Board hereby resolves to amend the regulations made under the Government Railways Act, 1908, on the 12th day of June, 1922, and published in the *Gazette* of the 15th day of June, 1922 (as from time to time amended and as the same are enuring under the Government Railways Act, 1926), in the manner following:—

By omitting Regulation 125, and substituting the following:—

"125. (1) Every employee who is required to be and is on duty on any of the following days in any year—namely, Christmas Day, Good Friday, Sovereign's Birthday, Labour Day, or Anzac Day—shall, except in the case of an employee who is continuing a shift (whether involving overtime or not) commenced on the previous day, be entitled to have one day added to the period of his ordinary leave of absence for such year for each of such days on which he is so required to be and is on duty, or one day off duty at any time before the granting to such employee of his ordinary leave of absence next after the time when he is required to be and is on duty as aforesaid in each case, and no addition shall be made to the period of such employee's ordinary leave of absence in respect of any of the aforesaid days for which he has been so granted a day off duty.

"(2) Every employee who is laid off duty by the Department on any of the aforesaid days may elect not to receive any pay for each such day on which he is so laid off duty, and such employee shall be entitled to have one day added to the period of his ordinary leave of absence for each of the aforesaid days on which he is so laid off duty and in respect of which he receives no pay."

By omitting subparagraphs (b) and (c) of paragraph (3) of Regulation 143, and substituting the following:—

"(b) The General Manager may in any year, at his discretion, award one or more scholarships tenable for four years in each case.

"(c) The scholarships shall be open to tradesmen who shall have completed their apprenticeship not more than two years before the award, and to apprentices who prior to the due date of the award shall have completed not less than four years of the period of their apprenticeship."

THE attention of the persons or person within the Dominion of New Zealand in whom is vested ecclesiastical authority over any of the religious bodies enumerated in the Third Schedule annexed to an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intitled the Marriage Act, 1908, and of all other persons concerned, is directed to the 11th section of the above-mentioned Act, requiring the several ecclesiastical authorities as aforesaid to send in to the Registrar-General, in the month of December in every year, a correct list of their Officiating Ministers within the meaning of the Marriage Act, 1908, of each of the said religious bodies.

The following are the religious bodies above referred to:—

- The Church of the Province of New Zealand, commonly called the Church of England.
- The Presbyterian Church of New Zealand.
- The Roman Catholic Church.
- The Methodist Church of New Zealand.
- All Congregational Independents.
- Baptists.
- The Lutheran Church.
- All Hebrew Congregations.
- The Society of Friends.
- The Salvation Army.

In default of any person having ecclesiastical authority over any of the religious bodies named above, the name of the Officiating Minister of any congregation of such religious body may be certified to by two recognized office-bearers thereof.

A minister of religion not connected with any of the aforesaid bodies must send to the Registrar-General in the month of December in each year a certificate signed—

- (a) By the recognized head in New Zealand of the religious body to which he belongs; or
- (b) By two duly recognized ministers of such religious body; or
- (c) By ten adult members thereof, who append to their signatures their description as being such members, declaring that such minister is their Officiating Minister, the said signatures and descriptions being attested by some person who shall verify the signatures to the certificate as the genuine signatures of the persons whose they purport to be, by a statutory declaration signed by such person and appended to the certificate.

In each case enumerated under paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) above, the Minister of Justice must be satisfied that the body of persons named in the certificate is a religious body, and that the applicant is a minister of religion and is a person of good character and otherwise qualified to act as an Officiating Minister. In the case of the religious body known as "Brethren" a special form of certificate will be supplied on application.

Neglect in sending the certificate will deprive the minister of his status as an Officiating Minister under the Marriage Act.

N.B.—It is requested that the *Christian names* and the *addresses* of the several ministers may be specified in the lists sent in to the Registrar-General.

In order to obviate the necessity for further inquiry, it is also requested that the reason for omitting the name of any minister be stated (such as on account of death, absence from New Zealand, or as the case may be).

- (c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.
- (d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house breaking or pocket picking, forgery, uttering, or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

Provided always that the Executive Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Otanomomo River Board hereby resolves as follows:—

That for the purpose of providing the interest, sinking fund, and other charges on a loan of three hundred and fifty pounds (£350) authorized to be raised by the Otanomomo River Board under the above-mentioned Act for the purposes of river-erosion protection, the said Otanomomo River Board hereby makes and levies a special rate of 1/20d. in the £1 upon the rateable value of all the rateable property of the said Otanomomo River Board, and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the thirty-first day of March in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty (20) years, or until the loan is fully paid off.
