IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Cinematograph Films Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make for the purposes of the said Act the following regulations in amendment of the Cinematograph Films (Censorship and Registration) Regulations, made on the seventeenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the seventeenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, at page 3527.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Cinematograph Films (Censorship and Registration) Regulations Amendment No. 1.

2. Clause 8 of the said Cinematograph Films (Censorship and Registration) Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

“8. (1) The renter of any film shall, before he delivers the same to an exhibitor, give notice in writing to such exhibitor of the nature of the certificate of approval issued by the Censor in respect of such film.

“(2) Every exhibitor exhibiting any film shall notify for public information the nature of the certificate which has been issued by the Censor in respect of such film. Such notification shall consist of the exhibition in the lobby or entrance of the theatre or other place which such film is being exhibited, at all times while such theatre or place is open to the public, of a notice of not less size than eleven inches by fourteen inches, erected in a conspicuous position over every place where tickets of admission are sold. Such notice shall, where all the films to be exhibited during any performance have been given by the Censor a certificate of approval in the form No. 2 in the First Schedule hereto, consist of the words, ‘Programme approved by the Censor for UNIVERSAL EXHIBITION,’ and the words ‘universal exhibition’ shall be printed in letters not less than two inches in height; and, where any of the films to be exhibited during the performance have been given by the Censor a certificate of approval in the form No. 2A in the First Schedule hereto, the notice shall consist of the words, ‘Programme recommended by the Censor for ADULT AUDIENCES,’ and the words ‘adult audiences’ shall be printed in letters not less than two inches in height.

“(3) The exhibitor of any film who advertises the exhibition of such film in any newspaper, shall include in such advertisement a notification as to the nature of the certificate issued by the Censor in respect of such film. Such notification shall in the case of a film to which the Censor has given approval in the form No. 2 in the First Schedule hereto, consist of the words, ‘Approved for universal exhibition’; and in the case of a film to which the Censor has given approval in the form No. 2A in the First Schedule hereto, consist of the words, ‘Recommended by Censor for adults.’

“(4) It shall be an offence against these regulations for any person to include in any advertisement relating to any film in respect of which the Censor has given approval in form No. 2 or in form No. 2A in the First Schedule hereto, any reference to the Censor’s action in connection with such film other than the notification prescribed in the last preceding paragraph.

“(5) Every exhibitor exhibiting a film which has been given a certificate of approval in the form No. 2B in the First Schedule hereto, shall take all such measures by way of advertisement or otherwise as may be necessary to restrict such exhibition to the class or classes of persons named in the certificate of approval, and the exhibition of such film to any other class or classes of persons shall be deemed to be a breach of these regulations.

“(6) For the purposes of these regulations and of any certificate of approval given by the Censor, the term ‘adult’ shall include all persons over sixteen years of age.”

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 21 of the said Cinematograph Films (Censorship and Registration) Regulations, and the Second Schedule thereto, the fee payable for examination and registration of any film not exceeding three hundred feet in length and used for the advertisement of any quota film shall be one shilling.

*Prescribing Time and Method of Election of Members of Auckland Metropolitan Fire Board by Local Authorities.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Fire Brigades Amendment Act, 1932 (hereinafter referred to as “the said Act”), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby prescribe that the time and method of the election of members of the Auckland Metropolitan Fire Board under section seven of the said Act shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(1) The electors of the two members of the Board elected to represent the Auckland City Council shall be the members of the Auckland City Council.

(2) The electors of the two members of the Board elected to represent the other local authorities whose districts are within the united fire district (hereinafter referred to as “the said local authorities”), shall be the members of the said local authorities acting so that the members of each of the said local authorities form one voting unit.

(3) In the succeeding clauses hereof “special resolution” means a resolution passed at a special meeting of the Auckland City Council or any of the said local authorities respectively.

(4) It shall be the duty of every Mayor or Chairman of the Auckland City Council and each of the said local authorities respectively, whenever the case shall so require, to cause a meeting to be called for the time and date fixed by the Returning Officer hereunder.

(5) For the purposes of the first election, the Under-Secretary of Internal Affairs shall be the Returning Officer.

(6) The Auckland City Council shall elect two members by special resolution and shall on or before the seventeenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, advise the Under-Secretary of the names of the persons so elected. Nothing further prescribed herein shall apply to the Auckland City Council, and future biennial elections, or elections to fill extraordinary vacancies, shall be carried out by special resolution passed within the time limited by the Fire Brigades Act, 1926.

(7) The Under-Secretary shall forthwith give notice in writing to each of the said local authorities that an election is required to be held and that nominations will be accepted not later than the thirty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three. At the same time he shall state the number of votes which each of the said local authorities is entitled to exercise.

(8) Each of the said local authorities may nominate not more than two candidates, and such nomination shall be effected by a special resolution, a sealed copy of which shall be delivered to the Under-Secretary together with the written consent of each nominee to his nomination not later than the thirty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three.

(9) If the total number of nominations so received exceeds two in number the Under-Secretary shall prepare a list of nominated candidates and send a copy thereof to each of the said local authorities and each of the said local authorities shall hold a meeting at eight p.m. on Thursday, the ninth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and allocate by resolution its prescribed number of votes to each of not more than two candidates. A copy of such resolution shall be forwarded to the Under-Secretary within forty-eight hours after the time hereby fixed for the meeting, and the names of the elected candidates shall be notified by the Under-Secretary in the *Gazette*.

(10) For subsequent elections the Secretary for the time being of the Auckland Metropolitan Fire Board shall be the Returning Officer.

(11) In the month of April in each alternate year commencing in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five or so often as an extraordinary vacancy may occur, the Returning Officer shall give notice in writing to each of the said local authorities that an election is to be held in the month of May following, or within one month of the date of the occurrence of an extraordinary vacancy, as the case may be.

(12) The Returning Officer shall at the same time fix and notify as aforesaid the date and time of the meetings at which the votes of the said local authorities will be recorded. Such date and time shall be the same in respect of each of the said local authorities and such date is hereinafter referred to as "the date of the election."

(13) The Returning Officer shall in his notice given to the said local authorities also state the number of votes exercisable by each of the said local authorities in terms of the said section seven.

(14) Each of the said local authorities may nominate candidates (not exceeding in number the number required to be elected) by special resolution, a sealed copy of which together with the written consent of each nominee to his nomination shall be lodged with the Returning Officer not less than seven days prior to the date of the election.

(15) The Returning Officer shall thereupon prepare a list of nominated candidates and send a copy thereof to each of the said local authorities, which shall at the meeting fixed as aforesaid, by resolution allocate its prescribed number of votes to each of not more than two candidates, and lodge a sealed copy of such resolution with the Returning Officer within forty-eight hours after the time fixed for the meeting.

(16) In the event of an equality of votes the Returning Officer shall have a casting-vote, or two casting-votes if necessary, to enable the issue to be decided.

(17) The Returning Officer shall report the result of the election to each local authority and to the Minister of Internal Affairs.

(18) No failure on the part of any of the said local authorities to hold a meeting as hereby prescribed, or to carry at such meeting a resolution allocating its votes, or to lodge a sealed copy of such resolution with the Returning Officer within the time hereby prescribed, or otherwise to exercise its power of voting shall affect the regularity of any election.

any description whatsoever within those waters of Oriental Bay, Wellington Harbour, inside a straight line drawn from the north-eastern corner of the Te Aro Baths to a point on the foreshore approximately 200 yards north-east of the Band Rotunda.

2. Any person committing a breach of the foregoing regulation shall be liable to a fine of £20.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman for such meeting.

7. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting, to be held in the month of April in each year, a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserve in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.

NOTE.—A fine, warm, and sunny month, with moderate to strong north-westerly winds prevailing. Rainfall was 54 per cent. below the mean of previous years. Total bright sunshine, 257.9 hours, 40 per cent. of the possible, and no sunless days. Thunder was heard on the 8th and 9th, and lightning was seen on four days. Mean dew-point at 9 a.m., 48.0°; and mean vapour pressure, 0.334 in.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER OF NOVEMBER, 1932.

General.—The outstanding feature of November's weather was the very low rainfall experienced in most districts. It was a typical spring month in the prevalence of north-westerly winds, gales being recorded on several occasions in the South Island and the southern half of the North. During the past few years these spring north-westerly winds have been rather less prominent than usual, so that last month's experience was rather in the nature of a return to normal. The amount of sunshine was almost everywhere much above the average. Temperatures were rather below normal over most of the North Island and especially in Hawke's Bay, but in the Wellington Province and all the South Island, except the west coast, they were above normal. The dry weather and strong winds have caused the growth of pastures to be checked, but following on the October rains, feed for stock was perhaps more plentiful than it has ever been before in New Zealand, and in most places showers occurring at opportune times have been just sufficient to maintain good conditions. In a few districts there has been a slight falling off in the milk yield, but otherwise stock are doing particularly well. Reports regarding crops are also, on the whole, favourable. Haymaking has been commenced unusually early, and a great deal of ensilage has already been laid down. Except for the prevalence of the grass-grub beetle, there is less complaint than usual regarding pests. Good soaking rains within the next few days will be needed if the effects of the persistent dry weather are not to become serious.

Rainfall.—The dearth of rainfall was especially marked in the North Island, most localities receiving less than half the average, while in many parts of the Auckland Province, including North Auckland, the central interior, and the Gisborne districts, less than a quarter was the rule. Since most of the rain was associated with westerly depressions, the western districts from Kawhia southwards and the high levels fared rather better than the remainder of the country.

In the South Island, Nelson, Marlborough, North Canterbury, and Central Otago had a very dry month. Heavy rains occurred on several occasions on the west coast and the deficits there were generally small and unimportant. Similar remarks apply to most of Southland and Stewart Island. In South Canterbury heavy local downpours, often accompanied by thunder, occurred on two or three occasions when a southerly change followed a warm north-wester. As a result, most of this area received more than the average fall.

Temperatures.—Some reference has already been made to temperature conditions. The mean was about 1° F. below normal in Hawke's Bay and about the same amount above it in the South Taranaki Bight area. In other parts of the North Island the departures were small. In the South Island, conditions were about average on the west coast, but east of the ranges the north-westerly brought high temperatures, means being 1° F. to 2° F. or even more above normal.

A few frosts were recorded, but most of them were light. Some damage was done to tender vegetation, many tomato plants being killed, for instance, in Hawke's Bay by a frost on the morning of the 10th.

Sunshine.—Most stations recorded twenty to thirty hours more than the average sunshine. Nelson had 298.2 hours and Blenheim 287.2.

*Pressure Systems.*—A series of westerly depressions, six in all, crossed the Dominion during the month. The same type of weather was maintained throughout until the last two days when disturbances in the Pacific Island region caused a break in the succession of westerlies. Pressure remained high to the west and low to the east of New Zealand, and strong, cold, southerly winds persisted. None of the westerly depressions referred to was particularly noteworthy, though a distressing feature was that they generally brought unsettled conditions during the week-ends. Rains were widespread on the night of the 5th to 6th as one of these depressions passed. Many heavy falls were recorded in districts with a westerly aspect. On the 8th, in association with a fast-moving depression, a good deal of rain was again experienced in western districts. This was one of the occasions, too, when heavy local rains occurred in Canterbury. Thunderstorms were experienced from North Otago to Wellington and even at a few places farther north. The 26th saw another and even more violent visitation of the same nature. Thunderstorms were particularly violent in South Canterbury, a house being struck at Temuka and several persons receiving mild shocks. Some very severe hailstorms occurred in the same district, while violent rains were reported as far north as Kaikoura. Thunderstorms were, indeed, unusually numerous during the month in Canterbury, being recorded on the 23rd, 27th, and 19th in addition to the days mentioned.

As already stated, north-westerly gales were experienced on several days. Those of the 23rd and 28th were the most widespread.
